





Helpful Hints

PEOPLE NEEDED FOR ASSEMBLY: **1-2** ESTIMATED ASSEMBLY TIME: **30 MINUTE**

- Open your item in the area you plan to keep it to avoid excessive heavy lifting. \gtrsim
- Identify, sort and count the parts before attempting assembly.
- Compression dowels are lightly tapped in with a hammer.
- Slides are labeled with a R (right) and L (left) for proper placement.
- Make sure to always face the point on the top of the Cam Lock towards the outer edge.
- Use all the nails provided for the back panel and spread them out equally.
- Back panel must be used to make sure your unit is sturdy.
- Do NOT use harsh chemicals or abrasive cleaners on this item.
- Never push, pull, or drag your furniture.




Have the following tools: Flat Head Screwdriver, #2 Phillips Head Screwdriver and Hammer

This Cam Lock Fastening System will be used throughout the assembly process.








Tips for Proper Care and Maintenance of Particle Board Furniture

Understanding Particle Board Particle Board Composition:

Particle board is composed of wood particles, such as sawdust and wood chips, bonded together with adhesive under high pressure. The surface of particle board is typically covered with a laminate or veneer to enhance its appearance.

Sensitivity to Moisture:

One of the primary vulnerabilities of particle board is its sensitivity to moisture. Excessive exposure to water or high humidity can cause swelling, warping, or delamination.

Cleaning and Maintenance Guidelines

1. Dust Regularly:

Regular dusting is crucial to prevent the accumulation of dirt and grime on particle board surfaces. Use a soft, dry cloth or a duster to gently remove dust.

2. Avoid Excess Water:

Particle board should not be cleaned with excessive water or harsh cleaning agents. Use a slightly damp (not wet) cloth with a mild cleaner specifically designed for wood surfaces.

3. Protect from Direct Sunlight:

Prolonged exposure to direct sunlight can cause discoloration or fading of the particle board surface. Position furniture away from direct sunlight or use window coverings to reduce exposure.

4. Use Coasters and Mats:

Protect particle board surfaces from hot items, spills, and scratches by using coasters, placemats, or felt pads under objects. This precaution prevents damage and preserves the furniture's appearance.

5. Repair Minor Damage Promptly:

Address minor damage such as scratches or small chips promptly. You can use touch-up markers or putty to fill in and conceal minor imperfections. Ensure that the repair materials match the furniture's colour and finish.
