



Large Vinyl Decal Installation

What you receive

1. White Backing
2. Vinyl Decal
3. Transfer Tape

Tools that you will need:

Scissors, Painters Tape, Level, Tape Measure



Installation

Wall decals may be applied to hard, clean, smooth and dry surfaces. Our decals are designed to work with most common wall and paint types. In rare cases, walls painted with stain resistant paints or walls with heavy/very rough texture may require additional adhesive during application. Any craft spray adhesive such as Elmer's spray adhesive works well for this purpose and can be found in any local store for under \$3. In the rare event that additional adhesive is needed, apply a small amount of the spray adhesive to the entire decal after removing the backing sheet, it is ok to get adhesive onto the transfer tape also. Applying additional adhesive is the best solution in cases when the decal is not sticking well. Vinyl wall decals are removable but not reusable! Please use caution when removing wall decals. It is recommended to wait at least 2 weeks before applying decals to newly painted walls.

1. If your decal comes in sections be sure to separate the sections before positioning them on walls. This will make application of large decals easier. You can do this easily with a pair of scissors.
2. Decide where you want to place your decal, using a level or a tape measure may be helpful. Position the decal on the wall and secure it in place with painter's tape - a few small pieces is all you need. Make sure you are happy with the placement because this will be the final position of the decal.
3. Go over the decal with a squeegee or a credit card to make sure the transfer tape is fully adhered to the vinyl
4. Take a long piece of tape and place it horizontally or vertically over the decal to divide it in half.
5. Choose one half of the decal to work with and fold it over the other half (that's taped to the wall.) Carefully separate the paper backing from the decal and transfer tape. Make sure all pieces of the decal are sticking to the transfer tape and release from the backing, otherwise the decal could stretch and tear. Now the adhesive from the decal and transfer tape will be exposed, make sure they don't fold over and stick together.
6. Once the paper backing is removed from the first half of the decal you can trim the backing away with scissors. Be sure not to cut the transfer tape of the decal. Apply additional adhesive if needed.
7. Hold the half of the decal perpendicular to the wall and smooth the decal down on to the wall starting from the tape hinge and working your way towards the edge. Go over the section with a squeegee or credit card to make sure the decal is adhered to the wall.
8. Remove the tape hinge and any other tape, repeat the steps 5-7 for the second half of the decal.
9. Carefully peel the transfer tape from the wall. The best way to do this is to start at one corner and roll it back over onto itself. Be sure the decal sticks to the wall and does not come off with the transfer tape. If the decal comes up, firmly press transfer paper back to the wall and smooth again with squeegee. **The following can be very helpful with smaller letters/text decals.** If the vinyl is not sticking well to the wall/paint, waiting for a few hours before doing this step can help as it allows more time for the adhesive to bond to the wall. In some cases, waiting 24 hours produces the best result as it allows the vinyl to fully bond to the surface and makes transfer tape removal easier.
10. For decals that come in section repeat the steps for each section.
