Caution: You must read this before you proceed



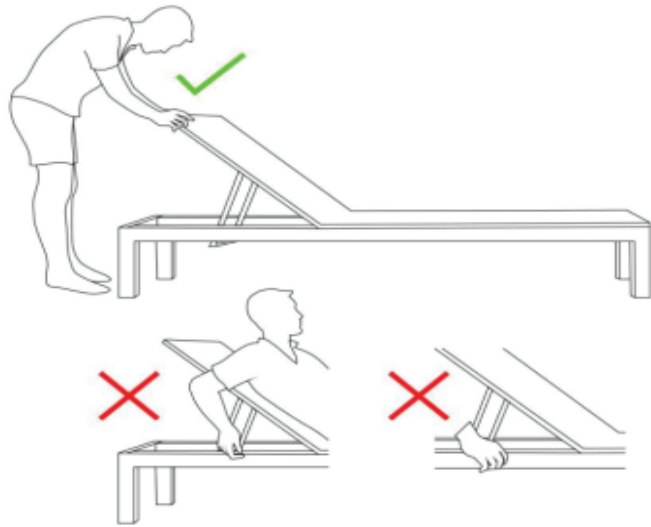
SAFETY WARNING

Never adjust chaise lounge or recliner backrest while seated.

Always make sure the backrest is flat before moving the chaise lounge.

Keep all limbs clear from under the backrest when it is in a raised position.

Serious finger, hand, or other bodily injuries may result from adjusting the chaise lounge backrest position while seated.

Care & Maintenance

-  ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
-  ● Prolonged exposure to rain may cause rusting which can stain floors.
-  ● Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
-  ● Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
-  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
-  ● Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
-  ● Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
-  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
-  ● Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
-  ● Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

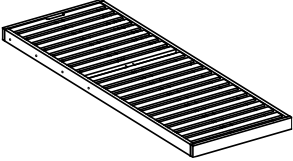
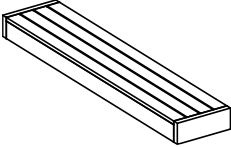
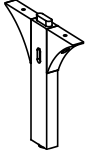
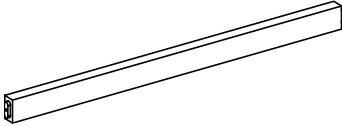
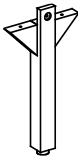


CAUTION: This Chaise Lounge is NOT a TOY.

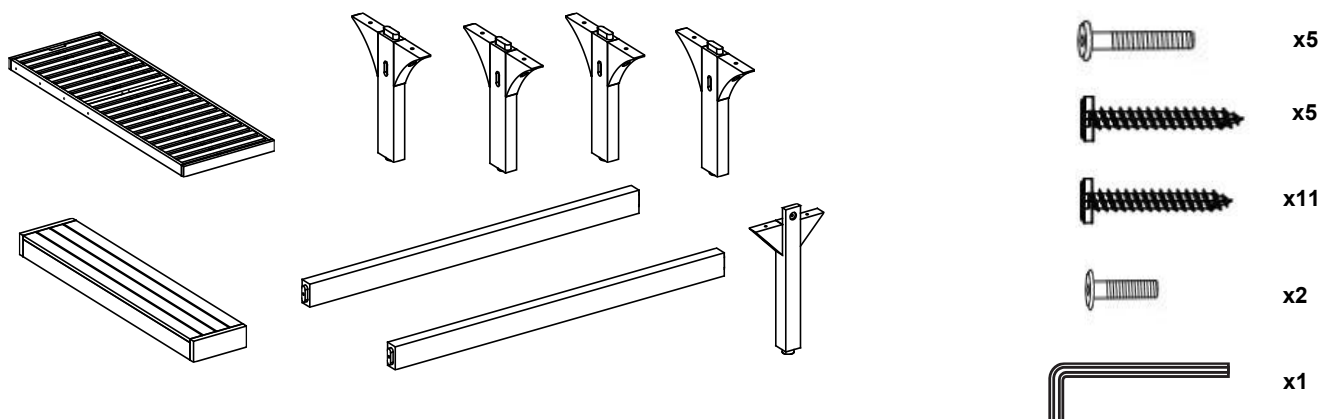

Assembly Preparation

Before Beginning Assembly:



- Read instructions, cover to cover-



- Have 2 adults on hand for assembly-



- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



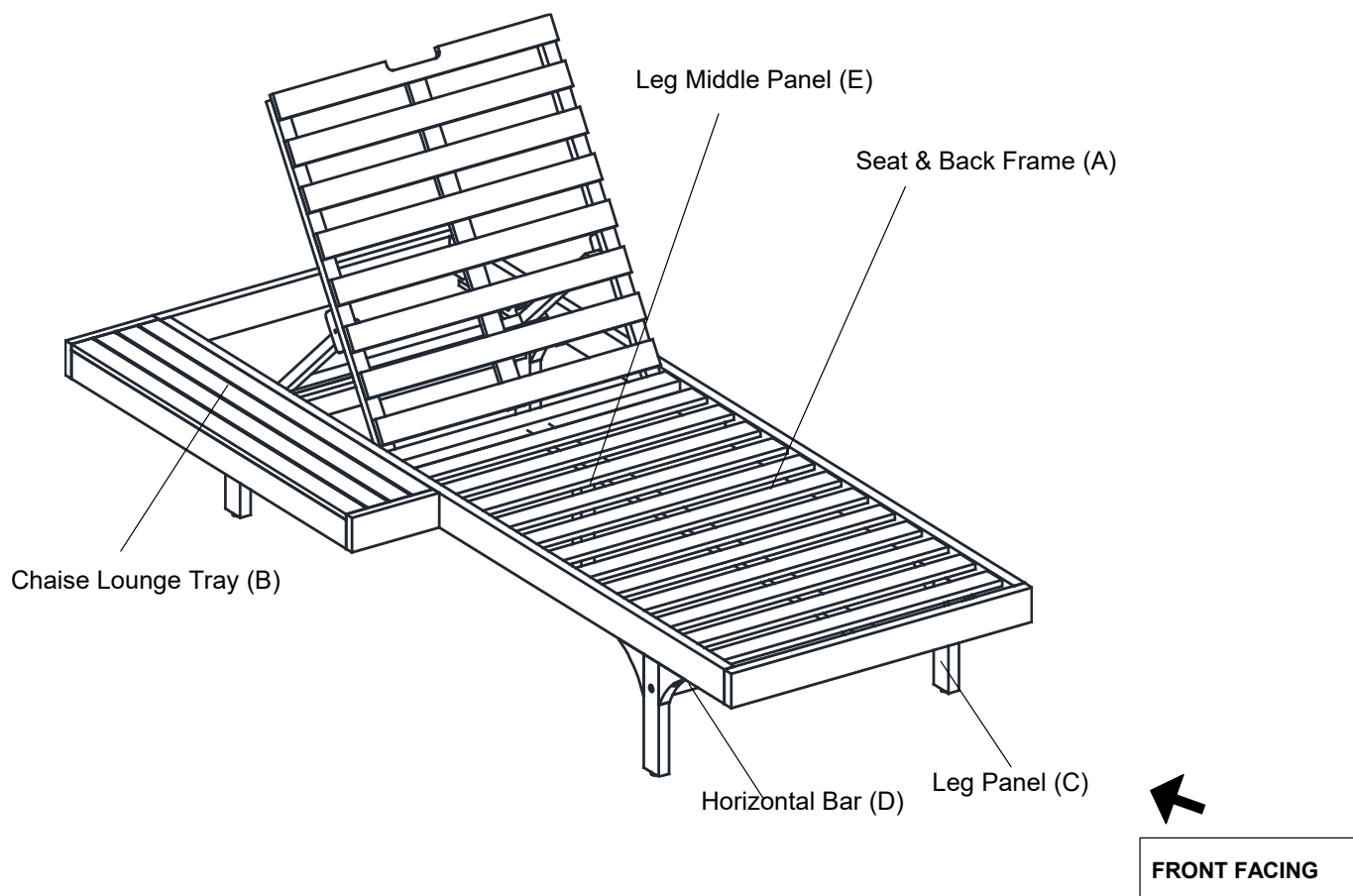
- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



- Save all packaging until finished-

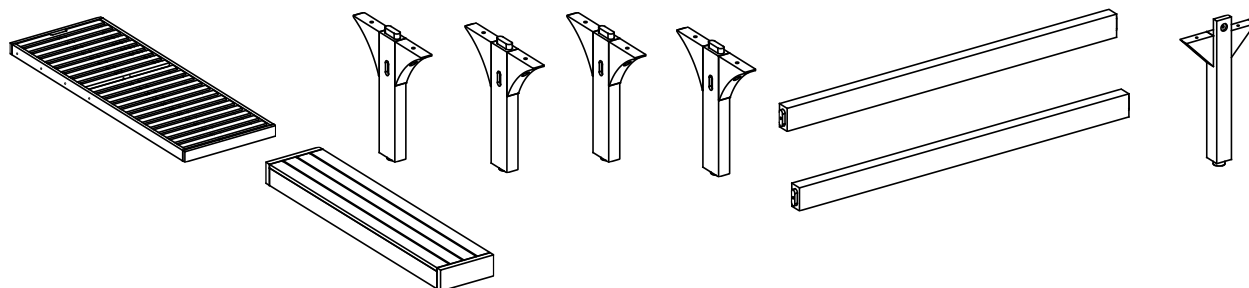
Assembly Steps

OVERVIEW



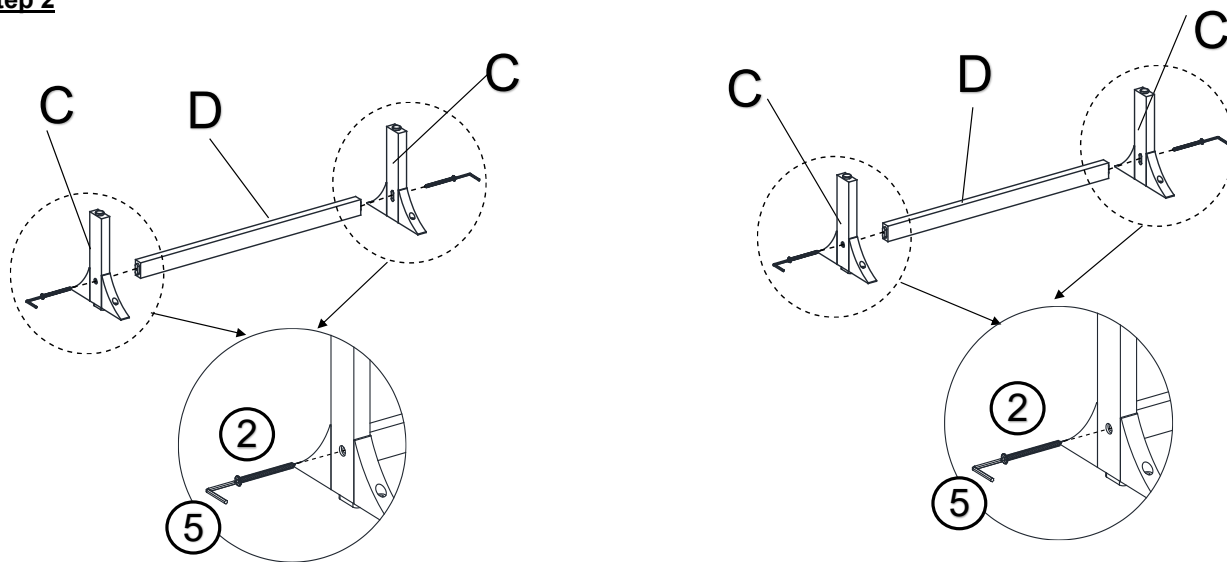
This Chaise Lounge has multiple parts and may require up to some 45 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Chaise Lounge parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



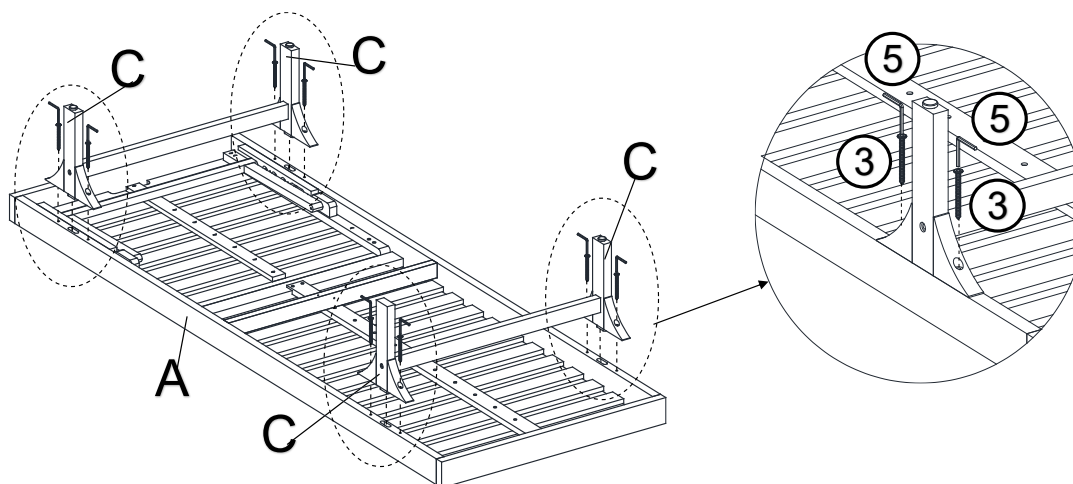
Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

Step 2



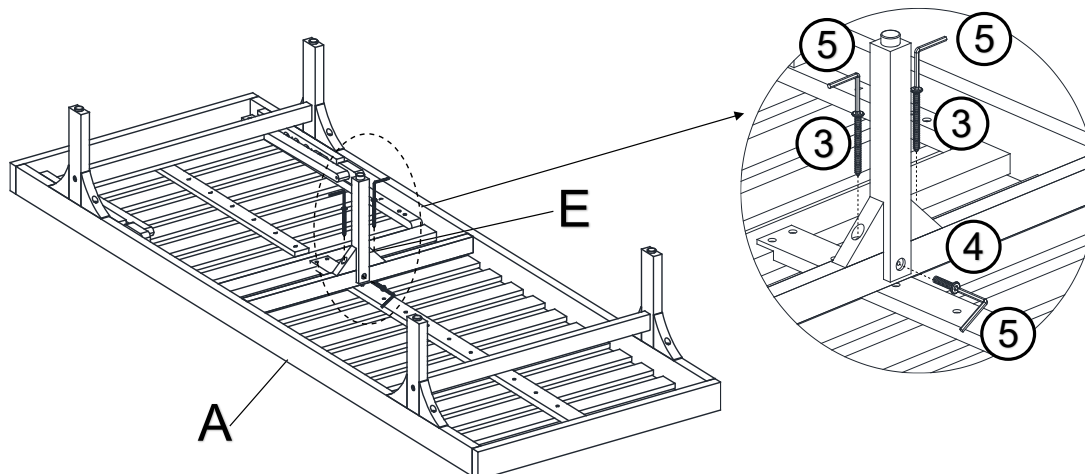
Position the tenon of the Horizontal Bar (D) to the housing of Leg Panel (C) as shown above
Attach the Leg Panel (C) to the Horizontal Bar (D) by using Screw (2) and Allen Wrench (5) as shown above.
Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time

Step 3



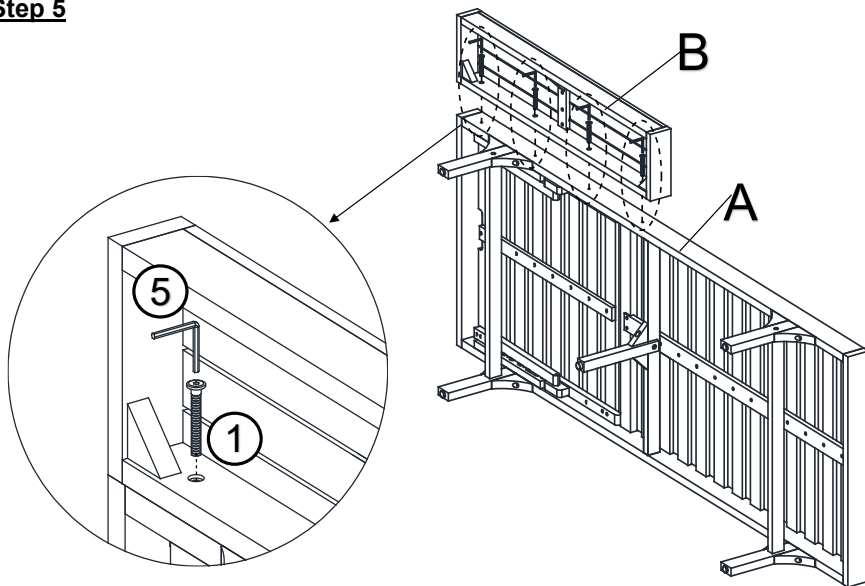
Place the assembled parts in step 2 and the Seat & Back Frame (A) on a clean, non- marring surface
Attach the assembled parts in step 2 to the Seat & Back Frame (A) by using Screw (3) and Allen Wrench (5) as shown above
Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time

Step 4



Position the assembled parts in step 3 and the Leg Middle Panel (E) as shown above. Then attach the Leg Middle Panel (E) to the assembled parts in step 3 by using Screw (3), Bolt (4) and Allen Wrench (5) as shown above
Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time

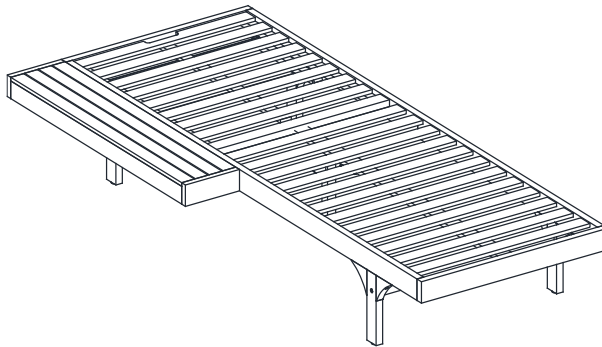
Step 5



With the help of your adult partner, place the assembled parts in step 4 and the Chaise Lounge Tray (B) in an inclined position as shown above. Then attach the Chaise Lounge Tray (B) to the assembled parts in step 4 by using Bolt (①) and Allen Wrench (⑤) as shown above

Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time

Step 6



Turn the chaise lounge right side up

Inspect the chaise lounge and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

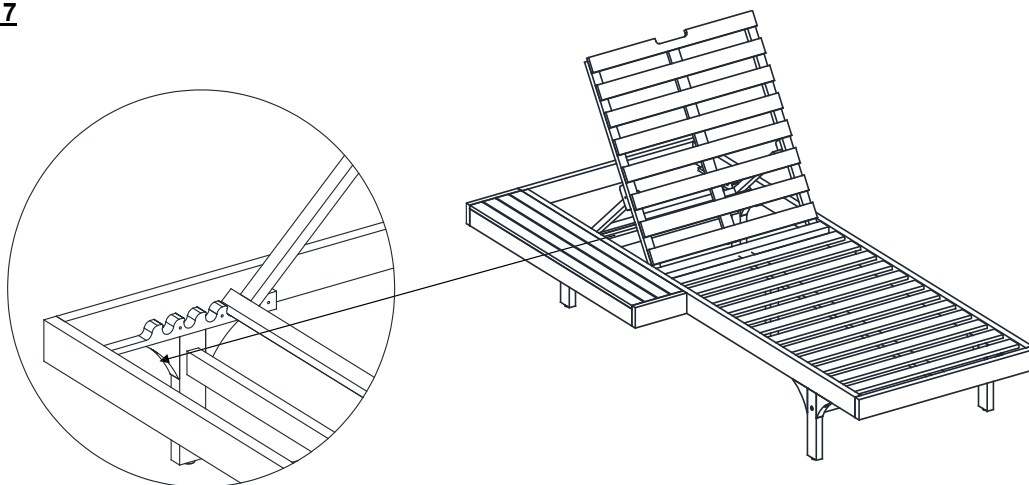
In a sequential manner, tighten all Screws and bolts at all joints.

CAUTION: When tightening these screws and bolts, tighten sequentially.

DO NOT tighten any screw or bolt fully and then move towards the next one. This could cause the frame to warp.

WARNING!! IF THE CHAISE LOUNGE IS NOT STABLE , IT COULD LEAD TO DAMAGING THE PRODUCT.

Step 7



Adjust the chaise Lounge adjustment notches to set the desired backrest angle.

The Chaise Lounge is ready to be used.

This Chaise Lounge can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
