


 Read instructions, cover to cover- Have 2 adults on hand for assembly- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)- Save all packaging until finished- 			






Turn the Table Top (A) upside down on to a soft surface that does not scratch the table top.

Attach four Table Legs (C) to the contact points on the Table Top (A) with Bolts (1), Spring Washers (3) and Washers (2) with Spanner (5).

Repeat the same process for other contact points of the Table Legs and Table Top.

Do not over tighten.

Caution: You may need 2 adults to turn the table top A upside down.



NOTE : To hold the legs together in positon, the Leg Support Panels will overlap at all 04 (four) corners.

Proceed to affix the Legs Support Panels (D) to the Table Legs (C) with Washers (2) and Spring Washers (3) and Nuts (4) using Spanner(5).


Do not over tighten.

Repeat the same process for all 04 (four) contact points of the Table Legs and the Legs Support Panels.

Once all the panels are in place, proceed to tighten the Bolts of the legs, in a rotational sequential manner.

By this, it allows the table legs to be locked into position, evenly, thus reducing wobbles.

Thereafter, lock all the Leg Support Panels tightly into position.




Turn the Table rightside up.


Caution: You may need 2 adults to turn the table rightside up.

Adjust the pre-installed Leveller until the Table is level with the ground. Then, proceed to tighten all Bolts and Nuts.

Your table is ready for use.


Caution: This Table can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

• What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

• What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

• What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
