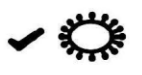


Assembly Instructions

Caution : You must read this before you proceed

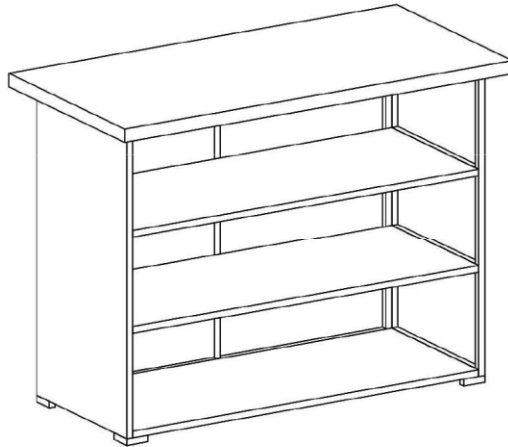
Care & Maintenance

-  ● Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface
-  ● Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
-  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
-  ● Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
-  ● Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
-  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and/or place under patio or awnings.
-  ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
-  ● Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
-  ● Keep away from sources of ignition.
-  ● Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

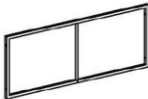

- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



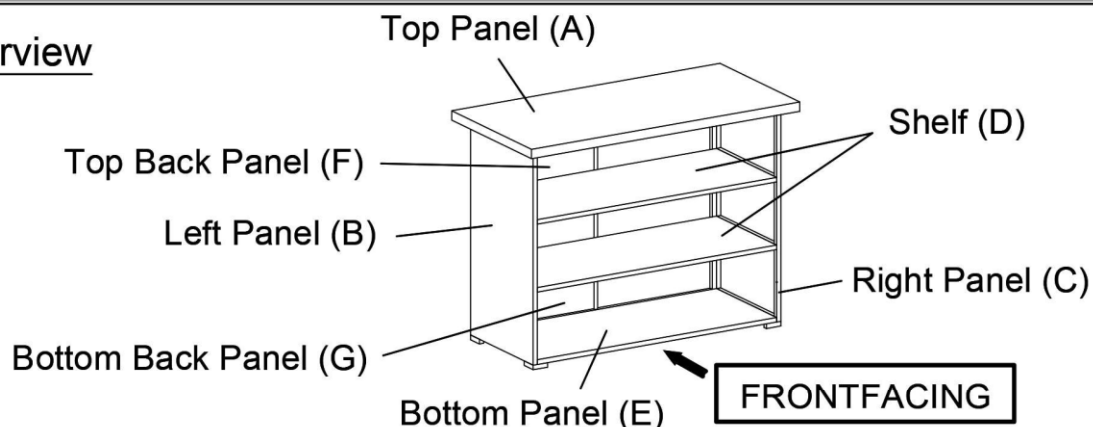
- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



- Save all packaging until finished-

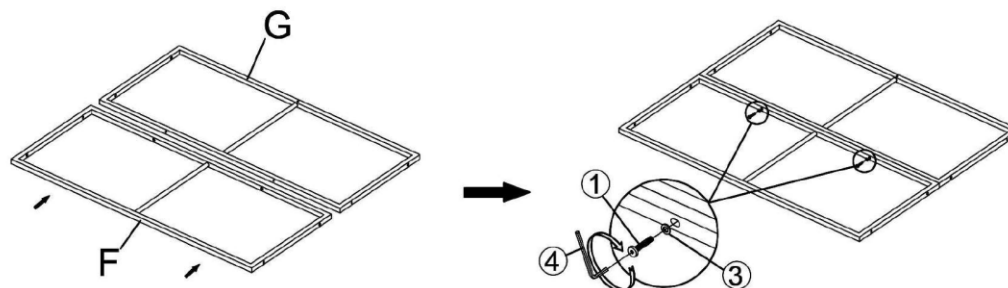
Assembly Steps

Overview



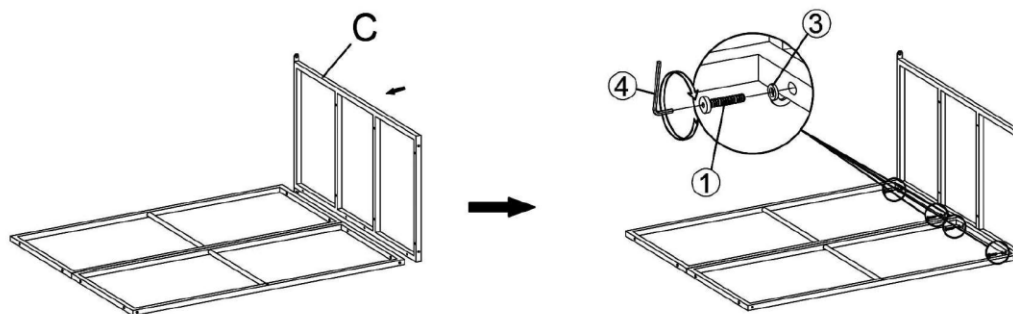
This Table has multiple parts and may require up to some 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Table parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions here below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



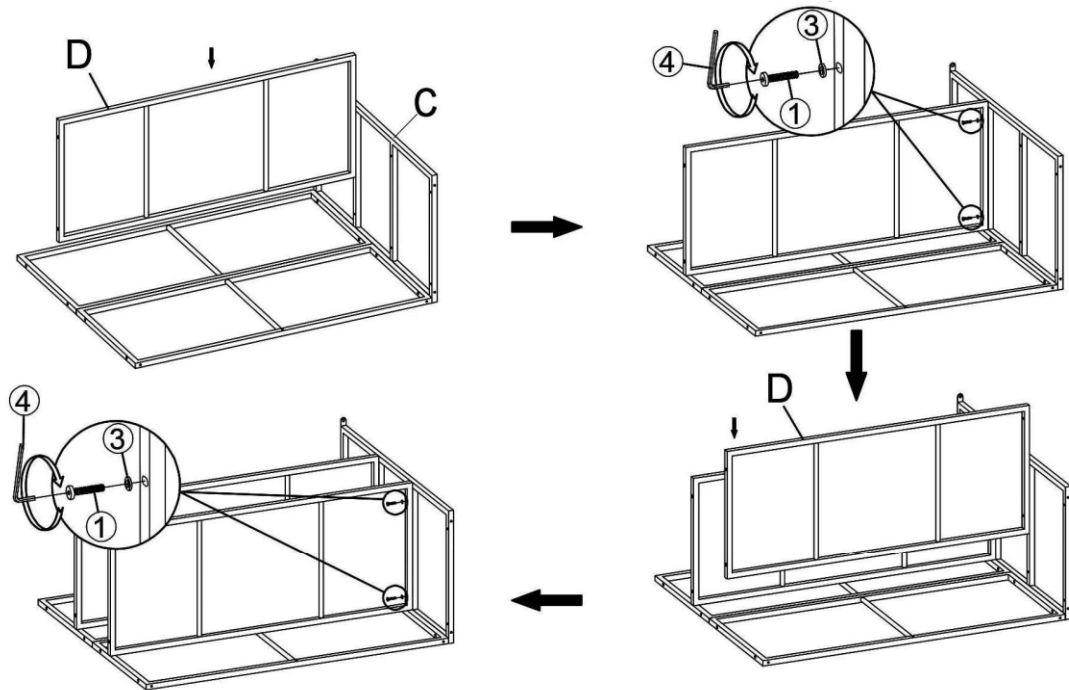
Open the carton and place all the parts onto a clean and soft surface.
Unpack all packages of hardware.
Attach Top Back Panel(F) to Bottom Back Panel(G) using Bolt(1) and Washer(3) with Allen Wrench(4).
Do not fully tighten the bolts.

Step 2



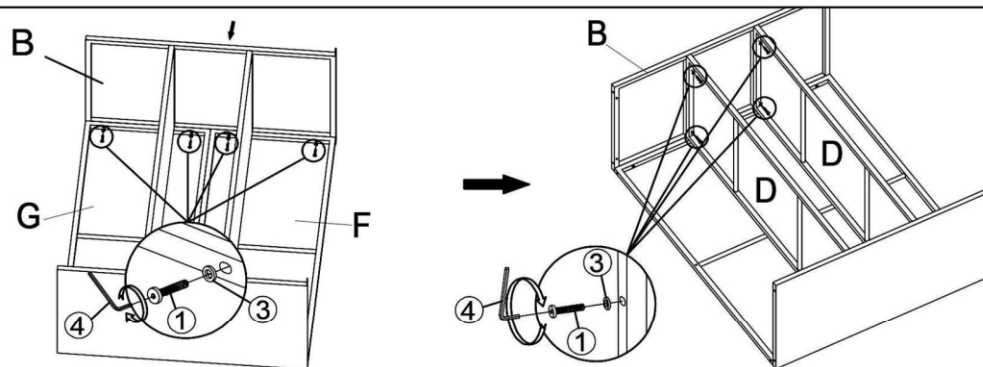
Attach assembled Back Panel(F&G) to Right Panel(C) using Bolt(1) and Washer(3) with Allen Wrench(4).
Do not fully tighten the bolts.

Step 3



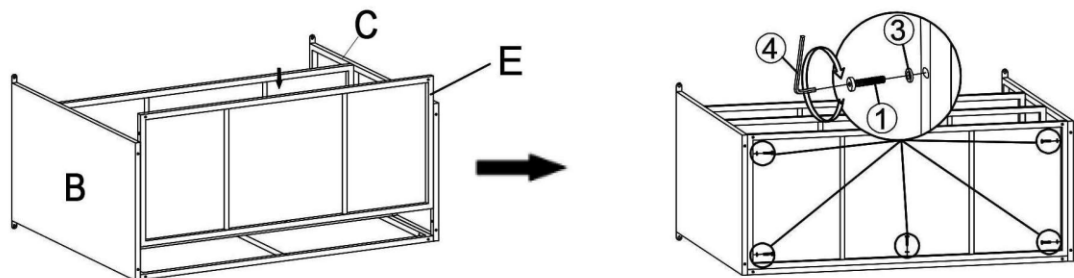
Attach Shelf(D) to Right Panel(C) using Bolt(①) and Washer(③) with Allen Wrench(④).
Repeat same step to assemble the other Shelf(D) to Right Panel(C) using Bolt(①) and Washer(③) with Allen Wrench(④).
Do not fully tighten the bolts.

Step 4



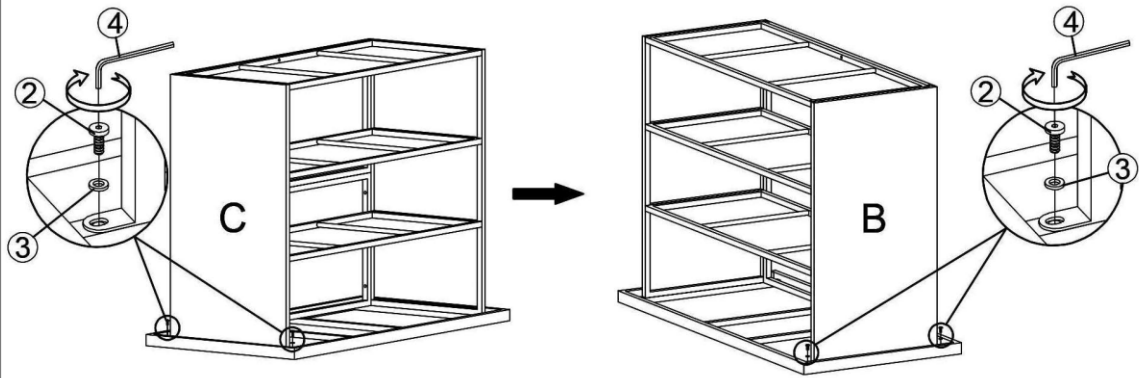
Attach Left Panel(B) to Top Back Panel(F) and Bottom Back Panel(G) using Bolt(①) and Washer(③) with Allen Wrench(④)
Attach Shelf(D) to Left Panel(B) using Bolt(①) and Washer(③) with Allen Wrench(④)
Repeat same step to assemble the other Shelf(D) to Left Panel(B) using Bolt(①) and Washer(③) with Allen Wrench(④)
Do not fully tighten the bolts.

Step 5



Attach Bottom Panel(E) to Left Panel(B) using Bolt(①) and Washer(③) with Allen Wrench(④).
Repeat same step to attach Bottom Panel(E) to Right Panel(C) using Bolt(①) and Washer(③) with Allen Wrench(④).
Do not fully tighten the bolts.

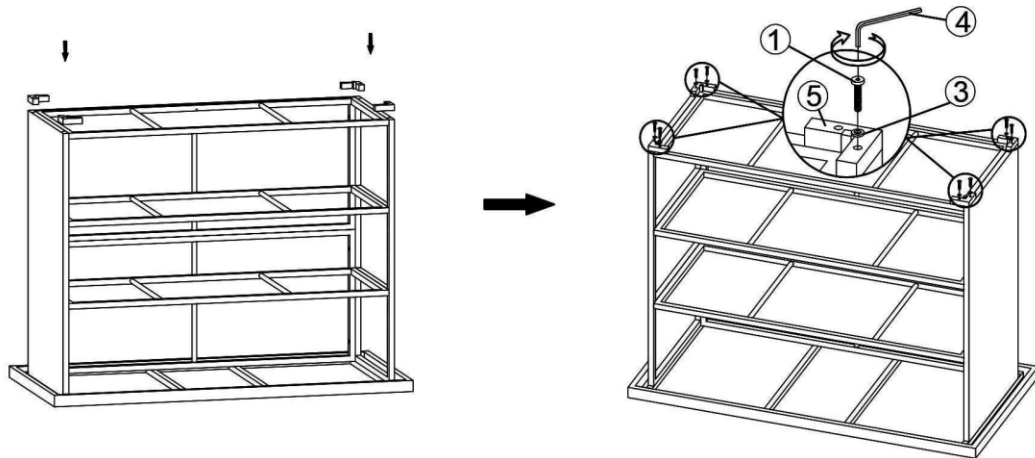
Step 6



With the assistance of your adult partners, align the assembled Panel(B&C) with the mounting position on Top Panel(A).

Attach assembled Panel(B&C) to Top Panel(A) using Bolt(②) and Washer(③) with Allen Wrench(④).
Do not fully tighten the bolts.

Step 7



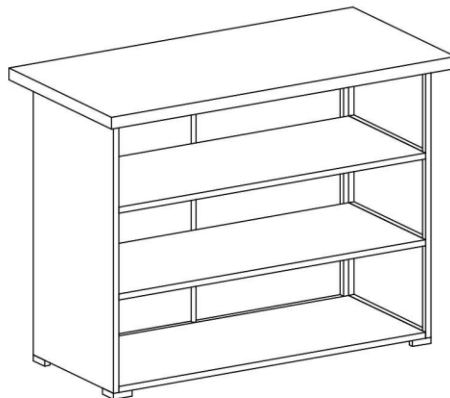
Attach Foot(⑤) to assembled bottom frame(B&C&G) using Bolt(①) and Washer(③) with Allen Wrench(④).

Tighten all the remaining bolts.

Do Not fully tighten a bolt in one go and then move on to the next.

Rather, in a gradual and sequential manner, proceed to fully and securely tighten all Bolts at all joints. This methodology will ensure maximum evenness once all bolts are fully tightened.

Step 8



With the assistance of your adult partners, turn the table right side up.

The Table is ready for use.

The Table can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be by products of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
