

HEART STICK CURTAIN TIEBACK

Installation Guide

What's Included

In Your Package:

- 1 or 2 × Heart stick tiebacks (depending on selected quantity)
- Heart-shaped frame (5.7" × 8" with 4.4" × 6" opening)
- Stick pin for threading through curtain and heart
- Decorative stem detail at top of heart

Tools Needed:

- None required - no drilling or hardware installation needed!
- Clean, dry cloth (for initial cleaning if desired)

⚠ Important Fit Requirements

- Your gathered curtain must fit within the 4.4" × 6" heart opening
- This tieback works best with lightweight to medium-weight fabrics
- Not suitable for heavy drapes or very thick curtain bundles
- Test fit before final installation

Step-by-Step Installation

1 Prepare Your Curtains

Ensure your curtains are clean and properly hung. The heart tieback works beautifully with lightweight to medium-weight fabrics and complements romantic, charming decor themes.

Tip: If curtains are new, let them hang for 24 hours to settle before installing tiebacks.

2 Determine Tieback Position

Choose where you want the tieback positioned on your curtain:

- **High position:** 1/3 from the top - elegant, romantic drape
- **Middle position:** Center of curtain - balanced, classic look
- **Low position:** 2/3 down - casual, relaxed style

3 Gather and Test Fit

Pull your curtain to one side and gather the fabric at your chosen position. Test that the gathered bundle fits easily within the 4.4" × 6" heart opening.

Fit Test: The curtain should pass through the heart opening without forcing. If it's too tight, gather less fabric or choose a different curtain.

4 Position the Heart Frame

Hold the heart-shaped frame against your gathered curtain where you want it positioned. The decorative stem should point upward, and the heart opening should align with your curtain bundle.

5 Thread the Stick Pin

Take the stick pin and carefully thread it through the gathered curtain fabric and through the heart frame opening. The pin should pass completely through both the curtain and the heart frame.

Caution: Handle the stick pin carefully to avoid damaging delicate fabrics. Thread gently and smoothly.

6 Secure and Adjust

Ensure the stick pin is fully inserted and secure. The heart frame should sit snugly against the curtain, held in place by the pin threading through both elements.

Adjust the curtain draping around the heart for the most attractive appearance.

7 Final Positioning

Adjust the curtain draping and the heart position until you achieve the perfect romantic look. The heart should sit attractively against the curtain while the stick pin holds everything securely.

Ensure the decorative stem detail is positioned for maximum visual appeal.

Pro Installation Tips

- Always test fit the curtain through the heart opening before final installation
- With a set of 2, install tiebacks at the same height for perfect symmetry
- For wide windows with multiple panels, use one tieback per panel
- Position the heart so the decorative stem creates an attractive accent
- Consider the heart as part of your room's romantic design elements
- The stick pin should thread smoothly - never force it through thick fabric

Daily Use Instructions

Opening Curtains

Simply pull the curtain toward the heart tieback.

The stick pin will hold the gathered fabric securely in place with romantic charm.

Closing Curtains

Gently remove the stick pin from the heart frame and curtain. Allow the curtain to fall naturally back into position.

Maintenance & Care

Regular Care:

- **Cleaning:** Wipe heart frame with a soft, damp cloth as needed
- **Pin Care:** Keep stick pin clean and free from fabric snags
- **Storage:** When not in use, keep pin and heart frame together
- **Fabric Protection:** Check insertion points periodically for any fabric wear
- **Inspection:** Check heart frame and pin for any damage or sharp edges

Troubleshooting

Problem: Curtain won't fit through heart opening

Solution: Gather less fabric or choose a lighter-weight curtain. The heart opening is 4.4" × 6" maximum.

Problem: Stick pin won't go through fabric

Solution: Fabric may be too thick or tightly woven. Try gathering less fabric or use with lighter materials.

Problem: Heart frame slides down curtain

Solution: Ensure stick pin is fully inserted through both curtain and heart frame. Pin should be secure and tight.

Problem: Pin damages delicate fabric

Solution: This tieback works best with sturdy fabrics. For delicate materials, consider a different tieback style.
