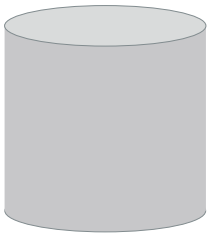


Tabletop Fire Pit

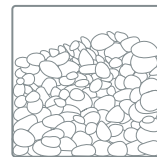
Fire Pit Base
(B)



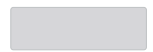
Fuel Cup

READ BEFORE USING

IMPORTANT SAFETY MEASURES

- Use in a well ventilated area greater than 80 sq. feet.
- Remove all packing materials, cardboard, foam, plastic film etc. before use.
- Place on a heat resistant surface.
- Keep all flammable materials such as curtains and other decor at least 4 feet away from the fire pit.
- As with all open flames, keep a fire extinguisher nearby.
- Liquid Bio-Ethanol Fuel is highly recommended for use with this fire pit. 91% Isopropyl Alcohol (rubbing alcohol) is acceptable, however, this may cause odors/fumes, residue, and/or soot.
- If you spill any of the fuel, be sure to clean immediately.
- Do not smoke while filling the fuel cup.
- Never add fuel while the fire pit is lit or still hot. Wait at least 15 minutes before adding fuel to the fuel cup.
- Allow the fuel cup to fully burn out. If you need to extinguish the flame, use the snuffer. Do not attempt to blow it out or use water.
- Do not touch or move any part of the fire pit while lit or still hot.
- The flame will burn low at first and may be blue and difficult to see. Allow 15 minutes for flame to achieve full size.
- If the flame fully extinguishes before 15 minutes has passed, use the snuffer to ensure it has been fully extinguished, wait until the cup has cooled, refill with fuel, and then re-ignite the cup.
- Never leave the fire pit unattended.
- Keep out of reach of children and pets.
- Store fuel containers far away from any heat source and out of reach from children or pets.
- Do not make modifications to the fire pit.
- Not intended as a heat source.
- Leave snuffer over fuel cup when not in use. This helps preserve any remaining fuel from evaporating.

MAINTENANCE & CARE

- Clean the fire pit regularly. Use a wet cloth to clean the surface of the fire pit.
- Do not attempt to clean the fiberglass wick. Only clean the glass hurricane, fire pit base, and fuel cup.
- Do not put in a dishwasher.
- Never use any chemicals or cleaning solutions to clean the fire pit. Use only water.
- Never use steel wool or scrubbing sponges to clean the fire pit. Use only soft lint free cloths.

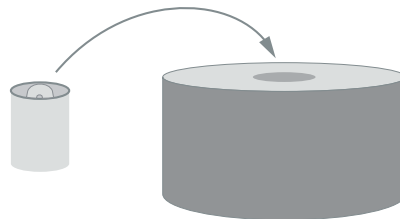
Step 1

Remove Fiberglass Wick (F) from Fuel Cup (C), fold Fiberglass Wick in half, and re-insert into Fuel Cup with fold on top.



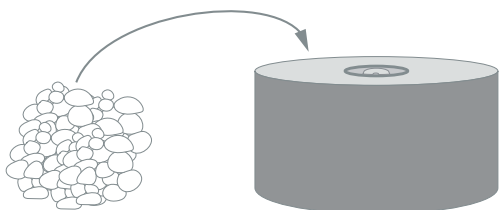
Step 2

Insert Fuel Cup (C) in center hole of Fire Pit Base (B). **HOLLOW SIDE FACE DOWN.** The hole is **ON TOP** of the base.



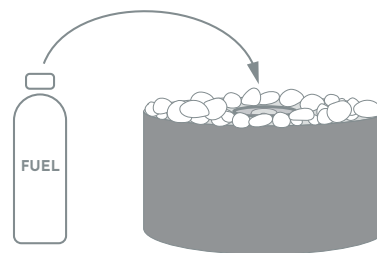
Step 3

Arrange Decorative Rocks (E) around the perimeter on top of the Fire Pit Base (B).



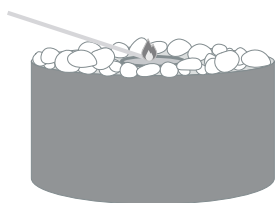
Step 4

Fill Fuel Cup (C) with Fuel (not included). **DO NOT EXCEED** the Max Fill Line.



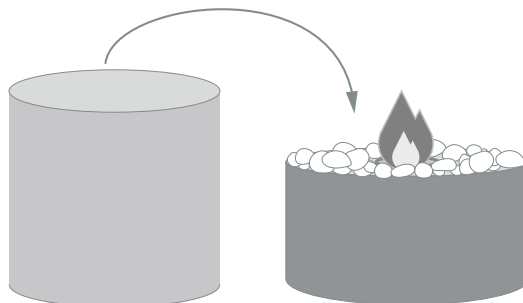
Step 5

Use extended reach lighter or long match (not included) to ignite the fuel cup.



Step 6

Place Glass Hurricane (A) on top of Fire Pit Base (B) inside the perimeter's edge.



Step 7

To extinguish the flame, place the Snuffer (D) over the cup to cover the Fuel Cup and Fiberglass until the flame has ceased.
