INSTALLATION GUIDE

Installing a bathroom vanity can vary depending on the specific type and design of the vanity, as well as your bathroom setup. Here are some general steps to guide you through the process:



NOTE: A drain pipe and trap are not included with this vanity.

- 1. Prepare the area:** Clear out the space where the vanity will be installed. Ensure the plumbing lines are in place and ready for connection.
- 2. Measure the space:** Measure the dimensions of the vanity and the available space in your bathroom to ensure it will fit properly.
- 3. Turn off the water supply:** Before starting any work, be sure to turn off the water supply to the bathroom.
- 4. Remove the old vanity:** If there is an existing vanity, you will need to disconnect the plumbing, remove the sink, and take out the old vanity.

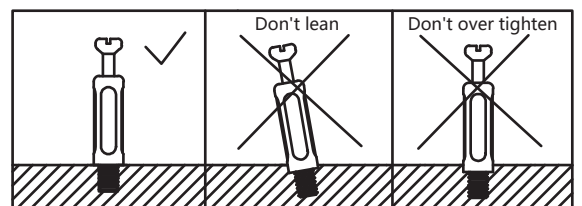
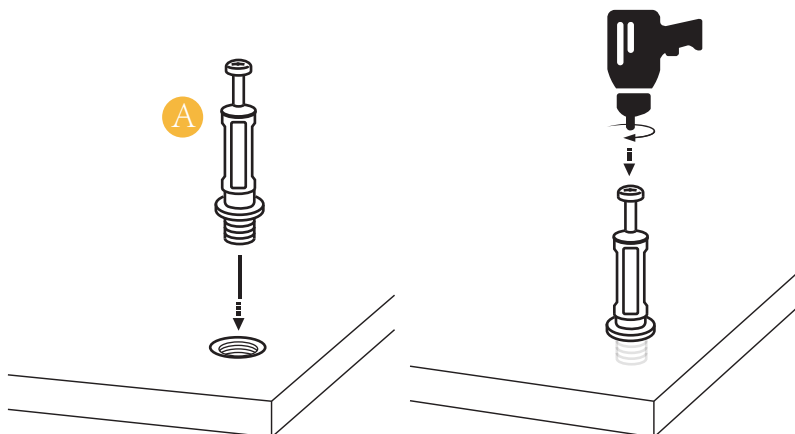
Drive in the screws (A) into the panel (8) tightly.



Attention: Stop tightening the screws until they meet the rubber particles, and do not over-tighten to prevent the screws from deforming.

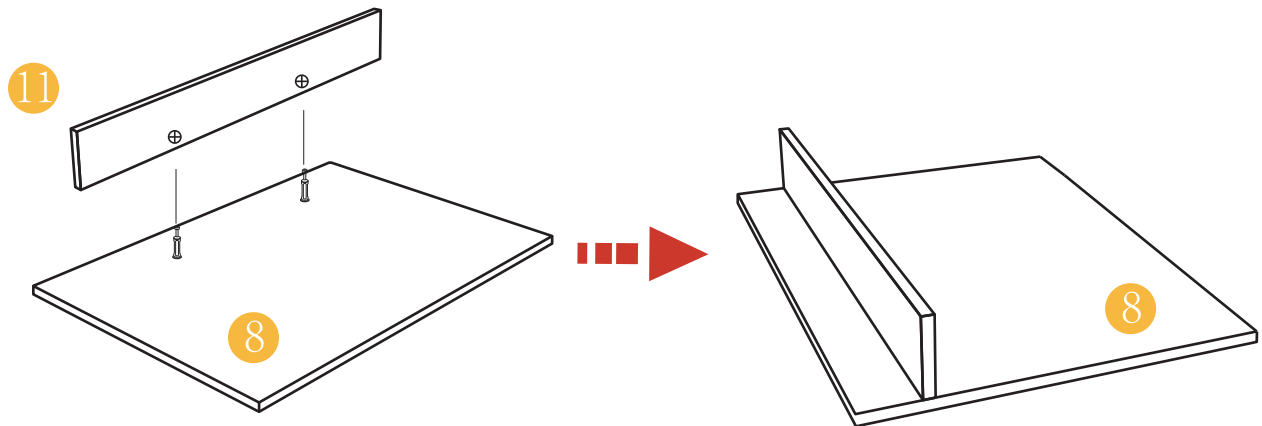


Ⓐ All rubber particles are fit for screws (A) to tighten



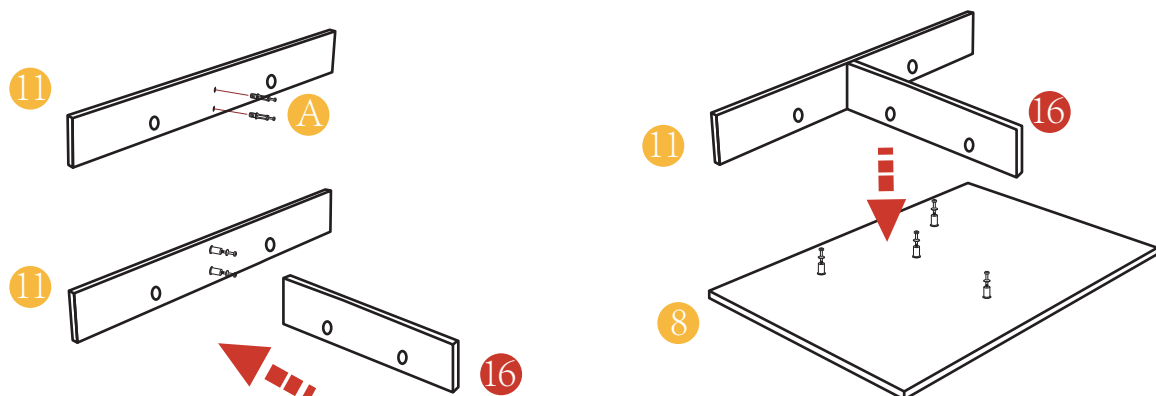

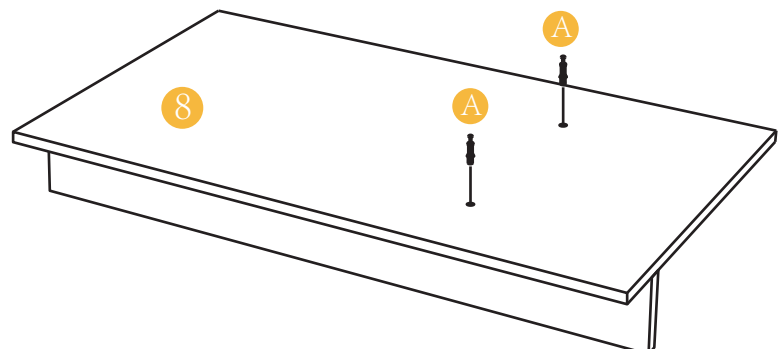
STEP 3

After the panels are spliced, you can rotate clockwise buckle (B) to lock the panels, and contrarotate to unlock and remove the panels.

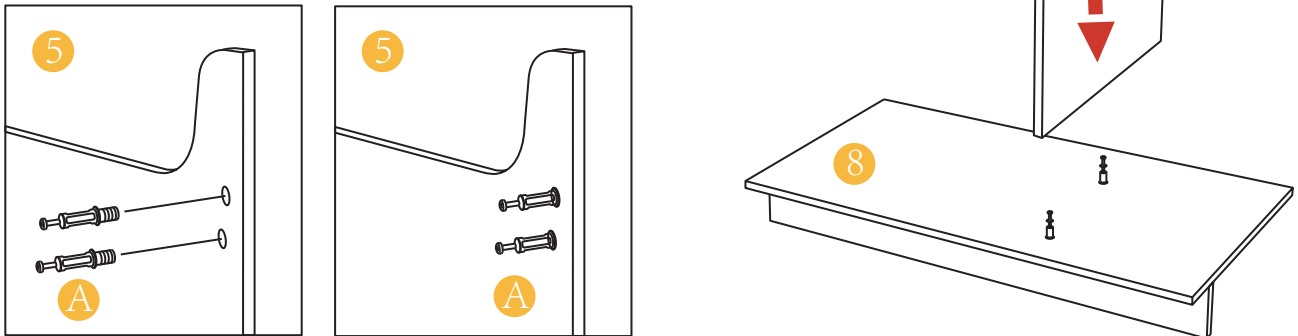

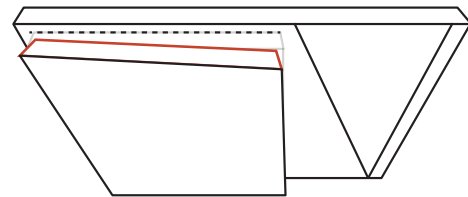
Stick-on anti-collision pads (H)

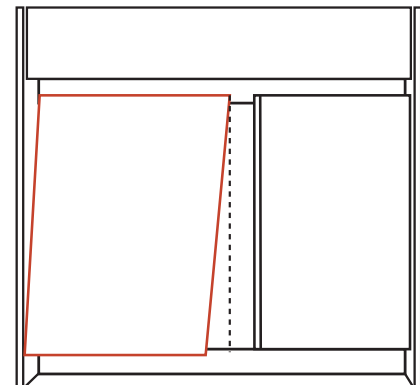
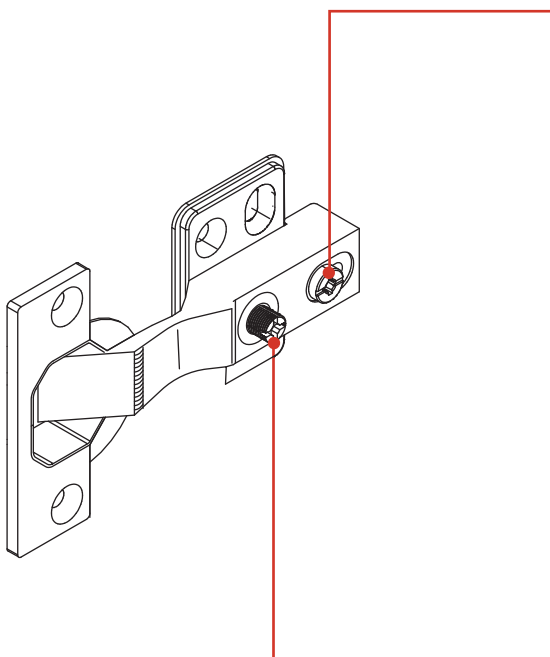
Drive in the screws (K) to fix the panel (2) tightly.

**STEP 15**

Use a screwdriver to adjust the door panel.



Loosen this screw and pull the hinge back and forth to adjust the door panel's front and rear tilt, ultimately achieving snug-fitting baffle effect.

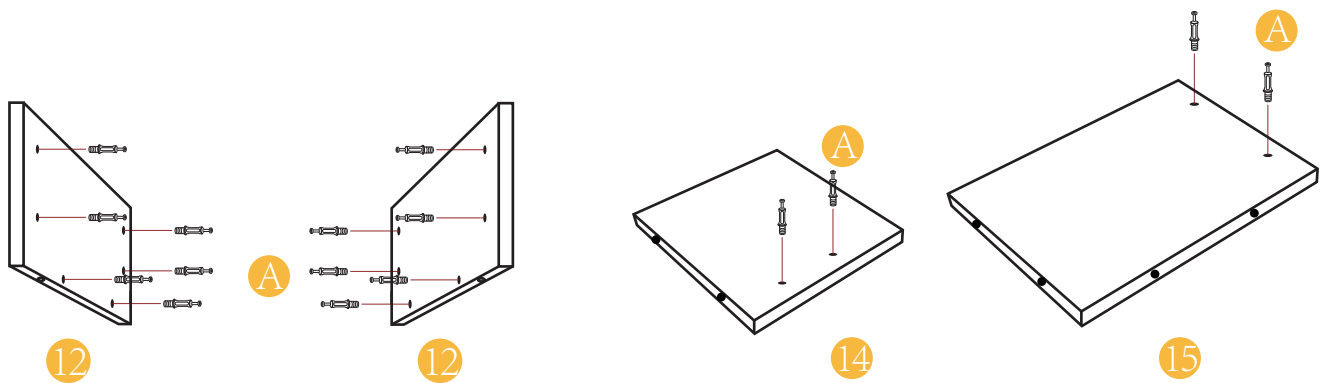


Turning this screw, the door panel can be adjusted to tilt left and right, eventually achieving vertical effect.

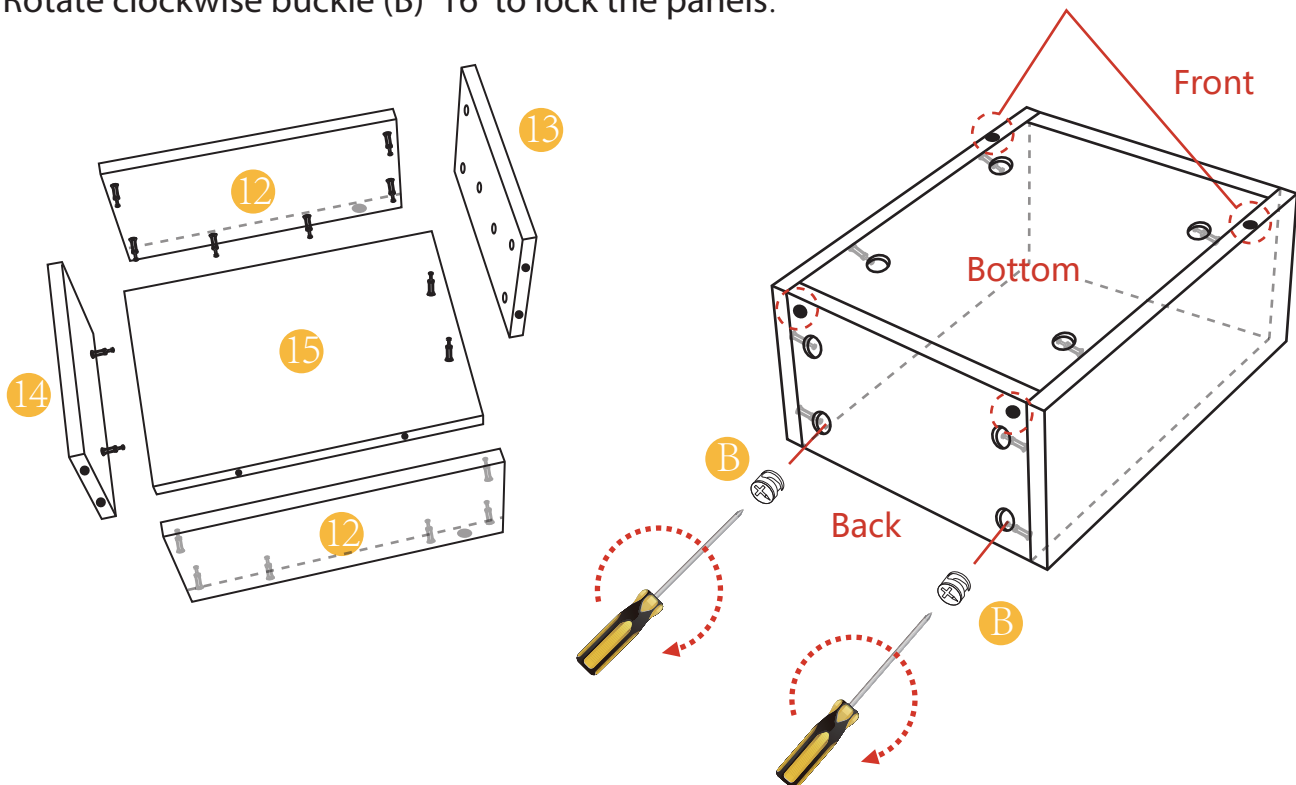

Rotate clockwise buckle (B)*16 to lock the panels.



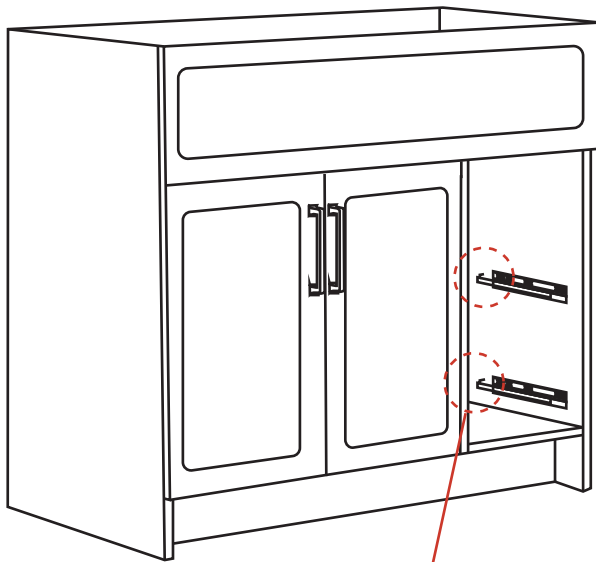

1 YEARS LIMITED WARRANTY

CARE & MAINTENANCE

Additional Tips:

- **Keep the vanity away from direct sunlight, which can fade the finish.**
- **Avoid placing extremely hot or cold objects directly on the surface.**

Regular Cleaning

- **Daily Wipe-Down:** Use a soft, damp cloth to wipe the surface. Avoid abrasive materials that can scratch the wood.
- **Mild Cleaners:** Use a gentle soap mixed with water or a wood-specific cleaner. Avoid ammonia-based or bleach cleaners, as they can damage the finish.
- **Dry Thoroughly:** After cleaning, dry the surface with a soft, dry cloth to prevent water spots and moisture buildup.

Protecting the Wood

- **Sealant & Finish:** Ensure your vanity has a proper water-resistant sealant or finish. Reseal as recommended by the manufacturer, typically annually.
