Notes



When installing wall panels, make sure the two connecting panels are at a 90 degree angle vertical to the ground, and 90 degree perpendicular to each other. Tilting in any way might cause damage to the groove.



IMPORTANT ASSEMBLY TIPS


Before launch our new product line, we have conducted hundreds of testing and surveys with end users. Thanks to all the participants and their feedbacks, now we have these valuable tips to pass on to you ...

- ⇒ **Assemble on a hard, flat surface.** Once assembled, you can easily move the house to the location desired.
- ⇒ **Sort the parts in sequence.** We know you are eager to dive in, but spending a moment lay out the parts by ascending numbers will save you time and frustration later on.
- ⇒ **Note the difference of the panel edges.** For all wall, roof and floor panels, one edge has lip, the other edge has groove. During assembly, the grooved edge is always facing downward (except for the floor panels).
- ⇒ **Note the difference of the two sides of panels.** As a general rule, the flat side is facing inside the house, and the washed side is facing outside.




Note: After install Panel ③, make sure the FLAT side of panel ① and ③ are facing inside, and the washed sides are facing out.




Move assembled parts ④ & ⑤ and ③ near to each other. Lift ③ upward as shown, then tilt ④ & ⑤ so ③ is perpendicular to ⑤. Insert ③ into ⑤.








So far you have setup the wall base panels, ②, ③, ⑤ & ⑧; and the 4 column posts. Step back and stand facing the front door open. Do a quick check:


- The FLAT SIDES of the all wall panels are facing inside.
- The floor support bins are located on the lower edge of the flat side of the wall panels.
- The assembly holes on the two front columns ① & ④ are facing forwards; while the assembly holes on the two back columns ⑥ & ⑦ are facing each other.

Once you check all the above, you are ready to move on...





Hold panel (11) at the two corner cutouts. Slightly angle (11) into (10). Release panel (11), then gently push it down.






Note: If your chicken barn comes with 2 roosting bars. Put the roosting bars (42) and (43) into the U-shaped slots on wall panels (3) and (8).






Place door frame (21) into one of the lower corners of the door opening, then push the other end down gently. The side of the frame piece with part # bar code should be facing inside the barn. Same for all door frame pieces.




Insert one end of a pin (G) into the hole in door panel (24), the other end into the hole in door frame (22). Repeat on the other side. Place the assembled unit in the door opening as shown.





Attach door frame (25) to panel (26) in the same fashion as Step 16.




Hold door frame (25) and wall panel (26) together, insert wall panel (26) into place.






Parts ③① and ③② should be installed with the flange attaching to the inside of the wall panels.








Tilt **36** as shown. Align the top of **36** with the notch in **29**. Push to lower part of **36** sideways until vertical.





Insert nesting box floor **40**.
Note the notches at the front and back are different. Check alignment to make sure the floor is inserted correctly.

Locking Nesting Box (optional):



To lock the nesting box, insert the 15/16" Thumb Screw into a hole on the side of the cover of the nesting box. Screw all the way in. Remove the Thumb Screw when to open and retrieve eggs.

Cleaning Instruction

It is very important to keep the barn clean for healthy chickens. The Easy to Assemble design will be appreciated when it is time to clean.

Remove one or more roof panels by reversing step 28 and 27 of the assembly instruction. You now have access to the entire inside of the house.

We recommend using a detergent with strong grease cutting capabilities and safe to use around you, your kids and the chickens. After washing, rinse and then wipe down the panels. Don't forget to clean the inside of the roof panels. Allow the interior to air dry thoroughly and reassemble.

Once the house is clean and dry, re-assemble the roof panels.
