Stone Sink Care and Maintenance

To clean your stone sink use a soft cloth, sponge or soapy nylon brush. Be sure to rinse the sink well after cleaning and dry. Cleaning on a regular basis will help prevent the development of hard water deposits. If persistent stains develop try a non-abrasive cleaner such as dishwasher soap or a professional stone cleaner solution available from a local hardware or tile store.

Due to the porous nature of natural stone certain substances can stain stone. Stone sinks can also absorb moisture if they are not properly protected. Polished surfaces are much less porous while unpolished surfaces are generally more porous, making them susceptible to staining and moisture absorption. The longer the stain remains on the sink the more apparent the stain will appear. We recommend all spills be wiped up immediately. Do not allow surface deposits of water bi-products such as calcium, salt, lime or detergents build up on the stone sink as it will be difficult to clean. Novatto's stone sinks should be cleaned regularly by using a soft cloth or a sponge with a solution of a non-abrasive light neutral soap with warm water.

For a nice glossy shine hand polish your stone sink periodically. Stone polishing pads and products are available from a local hardware store. To be sure your stone sink maintains its natural beauty, use a stone sealer at least once a year and follow the instructions provided. Novatto recommends using a professional plumber to install your stone sink.

Caution: Do NOT use any acidic tub or tile cleaners, toilet bowl cleaners, ammonia, abrasive or soft paste cleaners. Also vinegar, window cleaners, lemon juice, steel wool or metal brushes should be avoided as this may damages the finish.
