

Warnings and Safety Instructions

General Usage and Safety Guidelines

- Keep children away from the area where the furniture parts are being unpacked. The packaging may contain small parts (e.g., screws, fittings) that could be accidentally swallowed.
- Heavy and bulky furniture should always be moved by two or more people to prevent damage or injury.
- Carefully follow the assembly instructions to ensure that all components are correctly assembled. The manufacturer is not responsible for personal or property damage resulting from improper assembly or use.
- The product should only be used as intended once assembly is fully completed.
- Regularly check all connections, screws, hinges, and other fasteners. Tighten them if necessary to ensure the stability of the furniture.
- Immediately replace any missing or damaged parts with original components provided by the manufacturer.
- Due to the variety of floor types, use appropriate pads to prevent scratches or damage to surfaces.
- Do not use furniture with visible damage, as it may affect its safety and functionality.

Extendable Tables

- Heavy tables should be carried by gripping the lower structure, not the tabletop, to prevent damage.
- When extending a table with pull-out or additional extending segments, ensure that the mechanisms can move freely and that no objects are blocking their movement.
- Check that the extension mechanism operates smoothly and that it is securely locked in place after being extended.
- Exercise caution when extending or folding the table to avoid pinching fingers or other body parts.
- When inserting or removing additional inserts, handle them gently—do not drop them to avoid damaging the table or inserts.
- After extending, make sure the table is stable and safe to use in its expanded form.
- Check the stability of additional tops and extensions. Avoid overloading them to prevent damage to the furniture.
- Ensure that pets cannot damage the table or cause it to tip over.

Chairs

- Use the chair only for its intended purpose (sitting), not for climbing or as a step ladder.
- Avoid leaning or rocking on the chair.
- Ensure the chair is placed on a flat and stable surface.
- Do not exceed the maximum weight limit for the chair.
- Use appropriate floor protectors to avoid damaging the floor.
- Ensure the swivel function operates smoothly and the chair does not tip over.
- Make sure that fingers or other body parts are not pinched.
- Do not use chairs with visible damage.
- Regularly check the stability of the chair and the fastening of its structural components.
- Do not leave children unsupervised while playing on the chair.
- Ensure that pets will not chew on the chairs or knock them over.

Coffee Tables

- Do not place heavy items on the table that could cause it to tip over or become damaged.
- Use the table only for placing items, not as a seat, climbing surface, or step ladder.
- Avoid placing the table on an uneven surface to prevent it from tipping over.
- Ensure the table is stable on the ground. If necessary, adjust the table legs to prevent wobbling.
- Do not use the table if it has visible damage that could affect its stability.
- Ensure that children do not play on or near the table.
- Do not allow children to climb on the table or use it as a play area.
- Avoid hitting or tipping over the table to prevent damage.
- Do not carry the table by the tabletop, but by the lower structure to prevent damage to the surface.
- Clean the table surface according to the manufacturer's instructions, avoiding the use of harsh chemicals that may damage the material.
- Regularly check the stability of the table legs and the fastening of its structural components.

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Dining Tables

- Heavy tables should be carried by gripping the lower structure, not the tabletop, to avoid damaging the furniture.
- The table is intended solely for placing items. Do not use it as a seat, climbing surface, or step ladder.
- Place the table on a stable and even surface to ensure proper use. Make sure the table does not wobble before using it.
- Do not use a table with visible damage, as this may affect its stability and safety.
- Do not leave children unsupervised while they play on or near the table.
- Ensure that pets cannot damage the table or cause it to tip over.

Case Furniture (wardrobes, dressers, shelves, sideboards, wall units, nightstands, consoles, etc.)

- Ensure the furniture is placed on a flat and stable surface to prevent wobbling and enhance safety during use.
- Case furniture is intended solely for storing items.
- Distribute weight evenly in cabinets and shelves. Store heavier items on the lower shelves and lighter ones on the upper shelves to prevent imbalance.
- Adhere to the maximum allowable weight limits for shelves and drawers, avoiding overloading them.
- Do not climb on the furniture or sit on surfaces not designed for this purpose.
- Do not use extended drawers as a ladder, as this could cause the furniture to tip over.
- Tall and narrow furniture, such as drawer cabinets, should be anchored to the wall to prevent tipping.
- Use the included or recommended wall-mounting hardware and ensure it is installed securely and stably. Anchoring furniture to the wall is a crucial part of its proper use.
- Supervise children to ensure they do not pull on drawers or doors or play near unstable furniture.
- Ensure pets do not damage the furniture or cause it to tip over during play.

Upholstered Furniture (sectionals, sofas, armchairs, ottomans, etc.)

- Use upholstered furniture only for its intended purpose. Do not use it for climbing or as a step ladder.
- Sit only on designated seating areas. Avoid sitting or leaning on armrests, backrests, or other structural elements to prevent damage and minimize the risk of injury.
- Do not jump or stand on the furniture, as this can damage the structure and pose a safety risk.
- Do not exceed the maximum weight limit specified by the manufacturer.
- The product is not a toy. Prevent children from playing with furniture components, especially reclining or extendable parts.
- Do not leave children unsupervised while using the furniture.
- Avoid contact between the upholstery and sharp objects, chemicals, or fire, which could cause damage.
- Keep furniture away from open flames, such as candles, fireplaces, or cigarettes.
- Use the furniture in well-ventilated spaces to avoid the buildup of chemical fumes from materials.
- Regularly check the stability of the furniture and the condition of its structural elements.
- Ensure pets cannot damage upholstered furniture or tip it over during play or use.

Beds

- Do not jump on the bed to prevent damage to the frame and mattress.
- Adhere to the maximum weight limit specified for a single user.
- The product is intended for indoor use only.
- Beds are not suitable for children's play. Ensure children do not play with folding mechanisms or climb on bed components.
- Avoid placing fingers in gaps between structural elements.
- For beds with storage compartments, ensure that lifting mechanisms operate correctly.
- Do not leave the lifting mechanism in a raised position unattended, as this poses a risk of injury.
- Avoid using the bed near sources of heat or fire.
- Upholstery materials can be flammable, so exercise caution.
- Clean the surface according to the manufacturer's recommendations. Using improper cleaning products may damage the upholstery.

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Dog Kennel Furniture

- Use the kennel furniture only as an indoor resting space for a dog. Do not use it as a transport crate, car crate, outdoor kennel, toy, or punishment device.
- Choose the correct size so the dog can stand, turn around, enter, exit, and lie down comfortably.
- Place the product on a flat, stable, dry surface. Do not use it outdoors, in damp areas, near heat sources, open flames, or in direct sunlight for long periods.
- Do not leave the dog locked inside for long periods or without supervision.
- Do not use the product for anxious, aggressive, or very strong dogs that may chew, force, bend, or damage the bars, door, hinges, latch, or frame.
- Before use, check that the door, hinges, latch, bars, screws, and fittings are secure and working correctly.
- Do not use the product if it has visible damage, loose parts, sharp edges, cracks, splinters, bent bars, or a faulty latch.
- Keep paws, tail, fur, ears, and nose clear when closing the door to avoid pinching or injury.
- Ensure proper ventilation. Do not cover the bars, door, or openings in a way that restricts airflow.
- Remove the dog's lead before placing the dog inside. Make sure collars, tags, or harnesses cannot get caught on the bars, door, hinges, or latch.
- Do not attach leads, chains, ropes, straps, or additional locks to the kennel.
- Do not allow children to climb on, sit on, enter, lock, unlock, or play with the kennel furniture.
- Do not sit, stand, climb, or place heavy, hot, sharp, fragile, unstable, or liquid-filled objects on the tabletop.
- Do not exceed the maximum dog weight or tabletop load specified by the manufacturer.
- Keep the kennel clean and dry. Clean only according to the manufacturer's instructions and avoid harsh chemicals or excessive water.
- Regularly check the product for chewing, scratching, loosening, cracking, corrosion, instability, or other damage. Stop using it if safety may be affected.
- Replace missing or damaged parts only with original components supplied or recommended by the manufacturer.
