Product Care and Maintenance

Stone Tables

Under reasonably foreseeable conditions of use this product presents either no risk, or only minimal risk to the user during the life of the product when taking into consideration each of the following points:

- Each piece of furniture is structurally stable.
- The design and construction is robust and safe to the user
- Safe for children provided they are supervised
- Effect on other products none.

WARNING:

- Please take care when lifting.
- When assembling keep children and small animals away as small parts and packaging could choke if swallowed.
- When assembling the table, ensure the tabletop's face is protected from scratching or chipping
- Dispose of all packaging carefully and responsibly
- Do not use power tools when assembling this product
- If using a parasol please ensure it is lowered when not in use taking care in windy conditions
- Should tiles break for due to accidents then please be aware there may be sharp edges

CARE AND MAINTENANCE:

- Your table has been sealed during manufacture, this allows protection against spills. It
 is advised that a new coat of stone sealer be applied annually to retain the best
 protection.
- Avoid abrasive cleaners
- Clean with warm soapy water and rinse with plain water
- Periodically check fittings (if applicable) assuring they are tight.
- Although designed for outdoor and indoor use these tables must be dried and then stored out of the weather in winter
- It is recommended to store the chairs away during winter
- We do not guarantee the tables and chairs as being frost-proof.
- Should either the metal chair or table frames become chipped they should be touched up with matching enamel paint immediately to avoid rusting.
- Natural Stone is porous and will absorb liquids, any spillages should be removed without delay
- The grout between the tiles on our tables can also stain, and care should be taken to remove spills as soon as possible.

- Some liquids (lemon juice, tonic water, cola, red wine to name but a few,) will leave stains or blemishes which can be difficult to remove
- Some natural stone does have pits and blemishes, and sometimes fissures which look like cracks, these are part and parcel of natural stone and do not constitute a fault.
- Do not stand or sit on the table, very heavy items should not be placed on the table
- Please do not drag items across the tabletop, as this may scratch the surface,
- Very hot items should not be placed directly on the tabletop.
