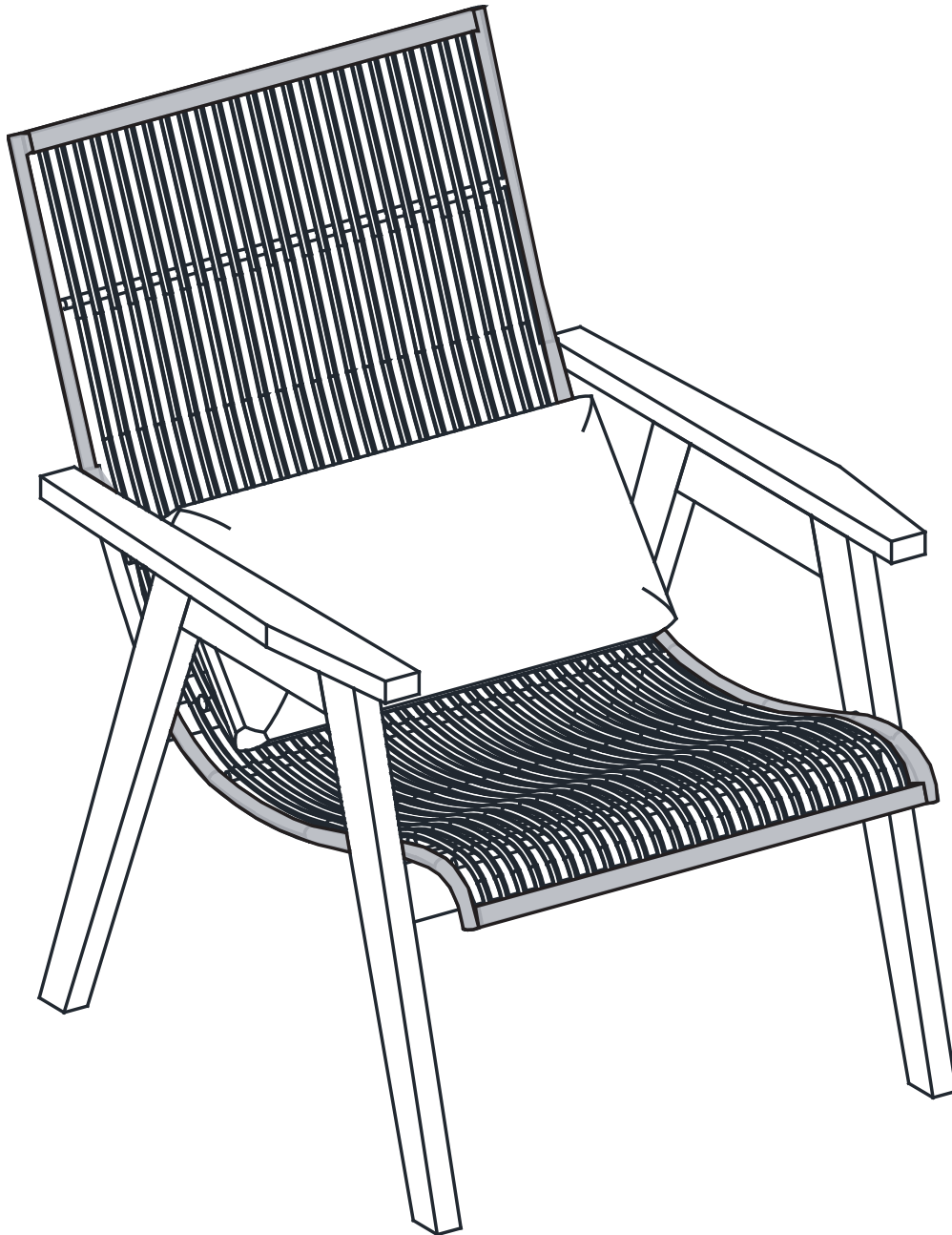

Care & Maintenance

- ⊘  • Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
- ⊘  • Prolonged exposure to rain may cause rusting which can stain floors.
- ⊘  • Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
- ⊘  • Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
- ✓  • To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
- ⊘  • Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
- ⊘  • Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
- ✓  • To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
- ⊘  • Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
- ✓  • Keep away from sources of ignition.
- ✓  • Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

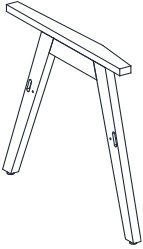
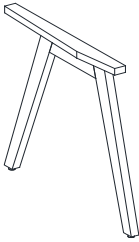
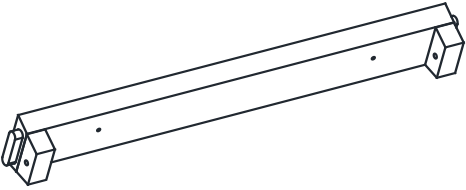
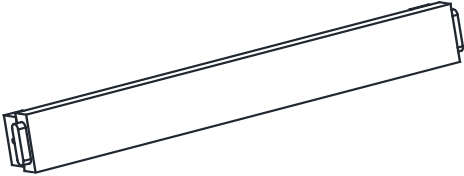
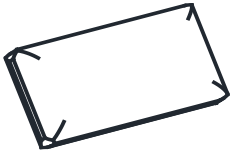
CLUB CHAIR

Keep your child/children at bay during the assembly process.

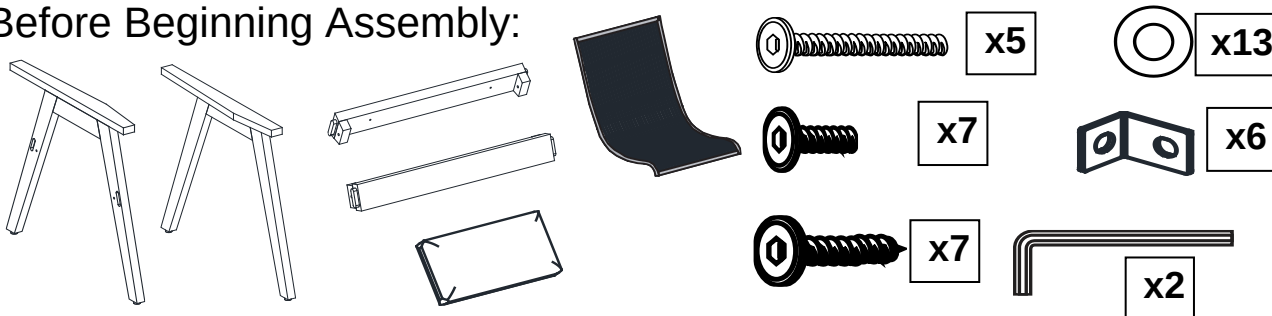
Whenever lifting or moving the Chair and to prevent damage to the Chair, two adults may be needed to execute these actions.

Assembly Preparation

Before Beginning Assembly:



- Read instructions, cover to cover-



- Have 2 adults on hand for assembly-



- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



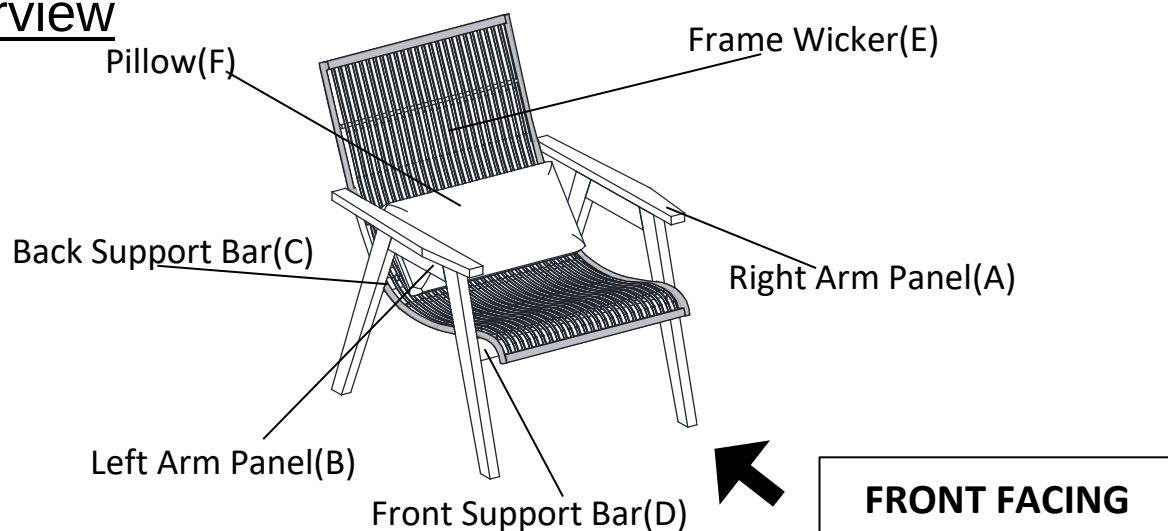
- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



- Save all packaging until finished-

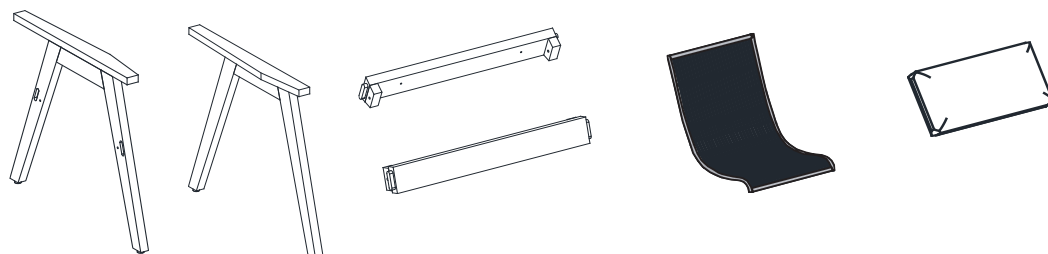
Assembly Steps

Overview



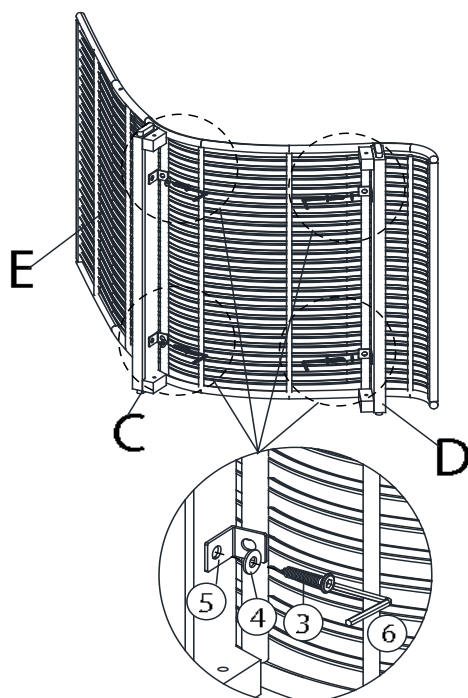
This Chair has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Chair parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



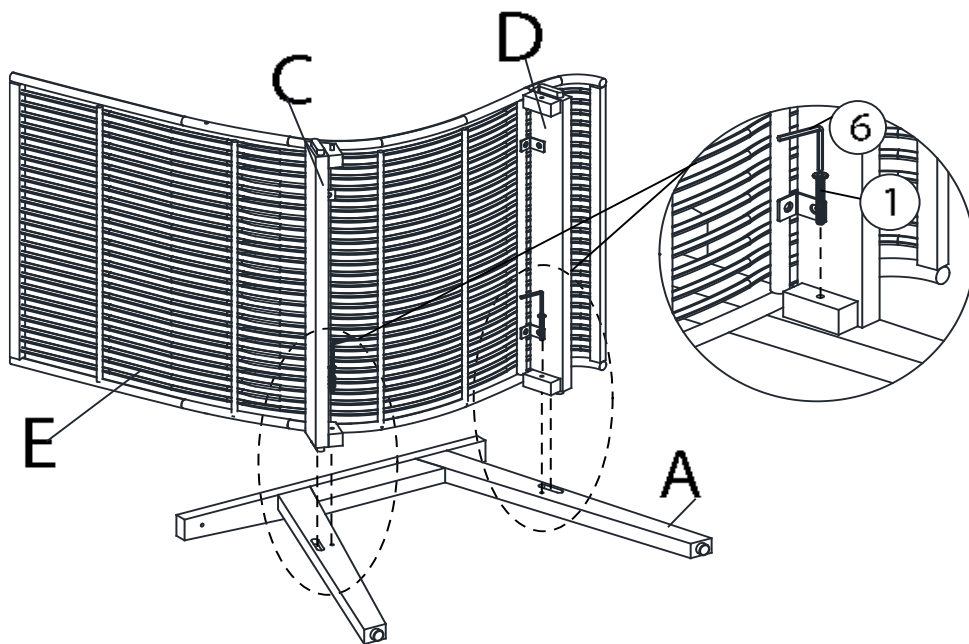
Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

Step 2



Place the Back Support Bar (C) and Front Support Bar (D) in an bottom position of Frame Wicker (E) as shown in the picture above, using the Allen Wrenches ((6)) to turn the Bolts ((3)) into the washer (4) and L-Bracket (5). Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

Step 3



Place Right Arm Panel (A) onto the assembled frame from Step 2

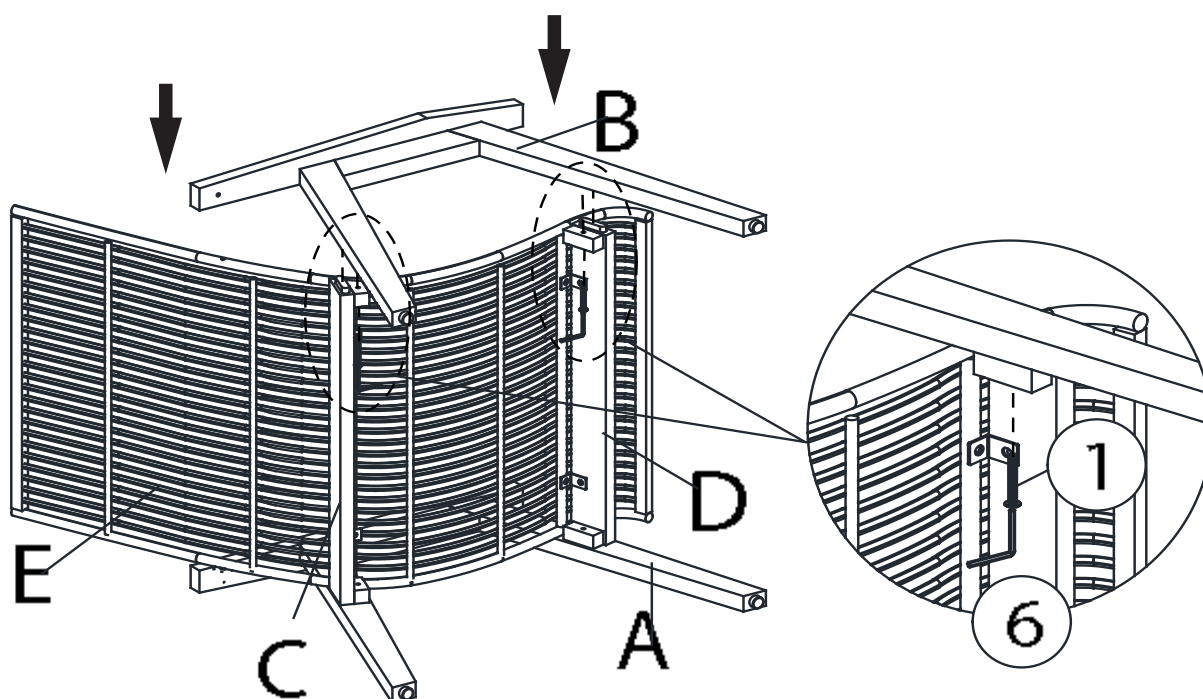
Step 3.1: Align the dowels of Support Bar (C) into the positions in the Right Arm Panel (A).

Then, affix Support Bar (C) with Right Arm Panel (A) by using Bolt ((1)) and Allen ((6)).

Step 3.2: Attach the Right Arm Panel (A) onto Front Support Bar (D) by using Bolts ((1)) and Allen ((6)).

DO NOT FULLY TIGHTEN BOLTS.

Step 4



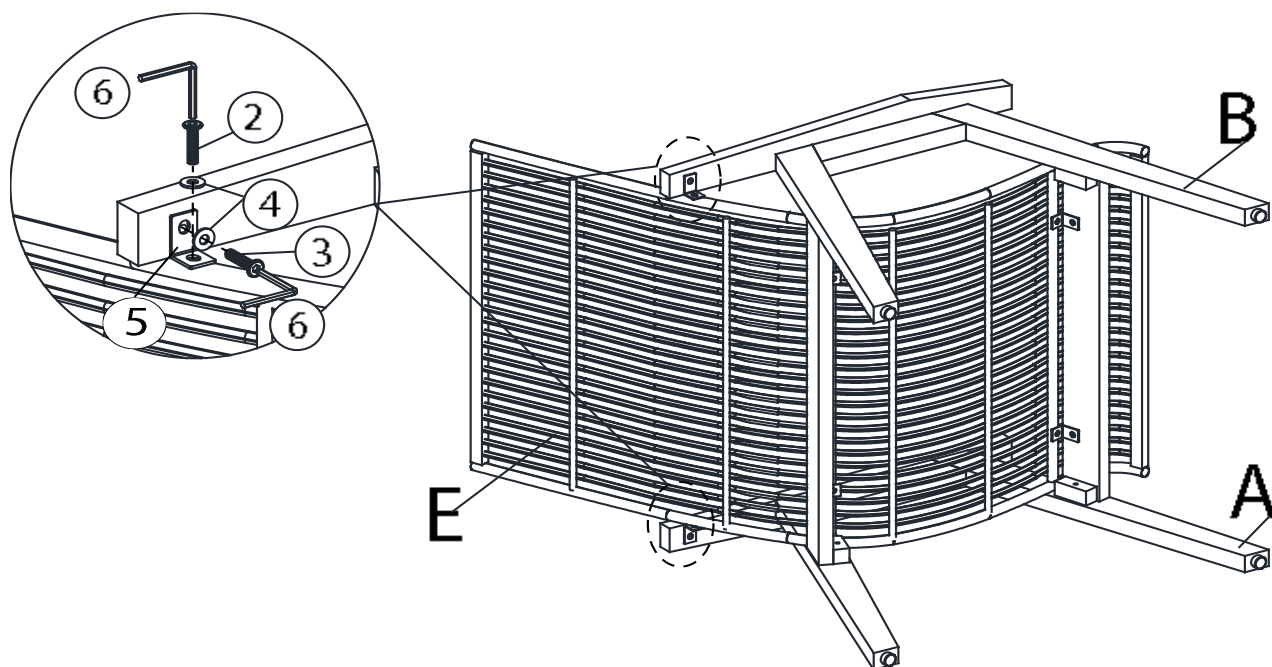
Place Left Arm Panel (B) onto the assembled frame from Step 3

Step 4.1: Align the dowels of Support Bar (C) into the positions in the Left Arm Panel (B).

Then, affix Support Bar (C) with Left Arm Panel (B) by using Bolt (①) and Allen (⑥).

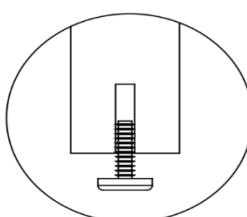
Step 4.2: Attach the Left Arm Panel (B) onto Front Support Bar (D) by using Bolts (①) and Allen (⑥).
DO NOT FULLY TIGHTEN BOLTS.

Step 5

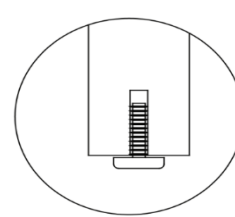


Place Right Arm Panel (A) and Left Arm Panel (B) onto the assembled frame from Step 4,
using the Allen Wrenches ((6)) to turn the Bolts ((3))
into the washer (4) and L-Bracket (5).
Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

Step 6



Adjust height for balance



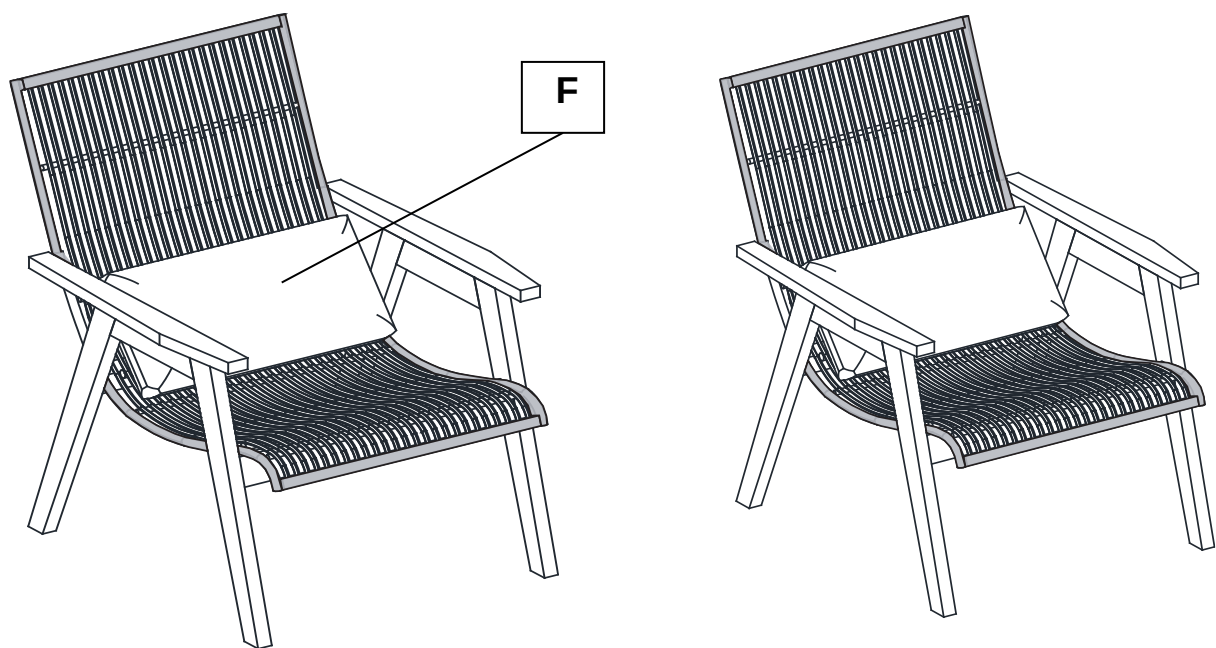
Adjust low for balance

Adjust Pre-installed Levellers
height for balance

Inspect the Chair and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

In a sequential manner, tighten all Screws and Bolts at all joints.

With assistance from your adult partners, adjust the Levelers to desired height to avoid wobbles.



Turn the Chair right side up.

Place Pillow (F) to Frame Wicker E

Inspect the Chair and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

The Chair is ready to be used.

Caution: This Chair can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
