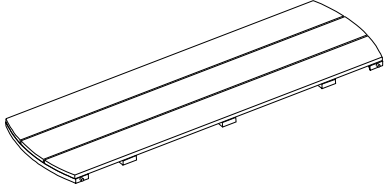
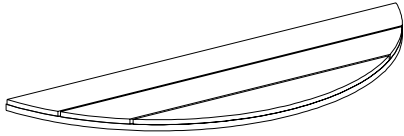
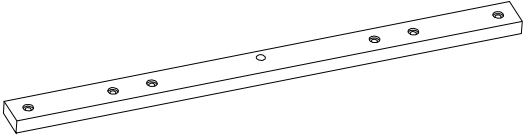
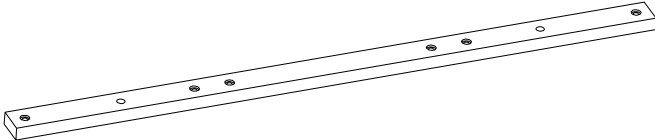
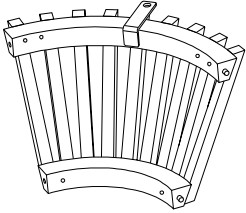
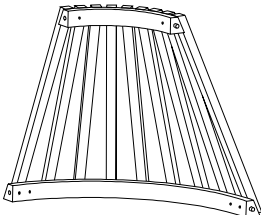
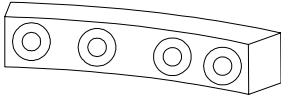
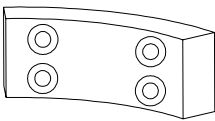
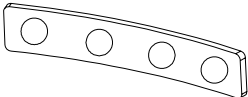
Care & Maintenance

-   ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only
-   ● Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface
-   ● Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
-   ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
-   ● Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
-   ● Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
-   ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
-   ● Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
-   ● Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth .

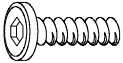

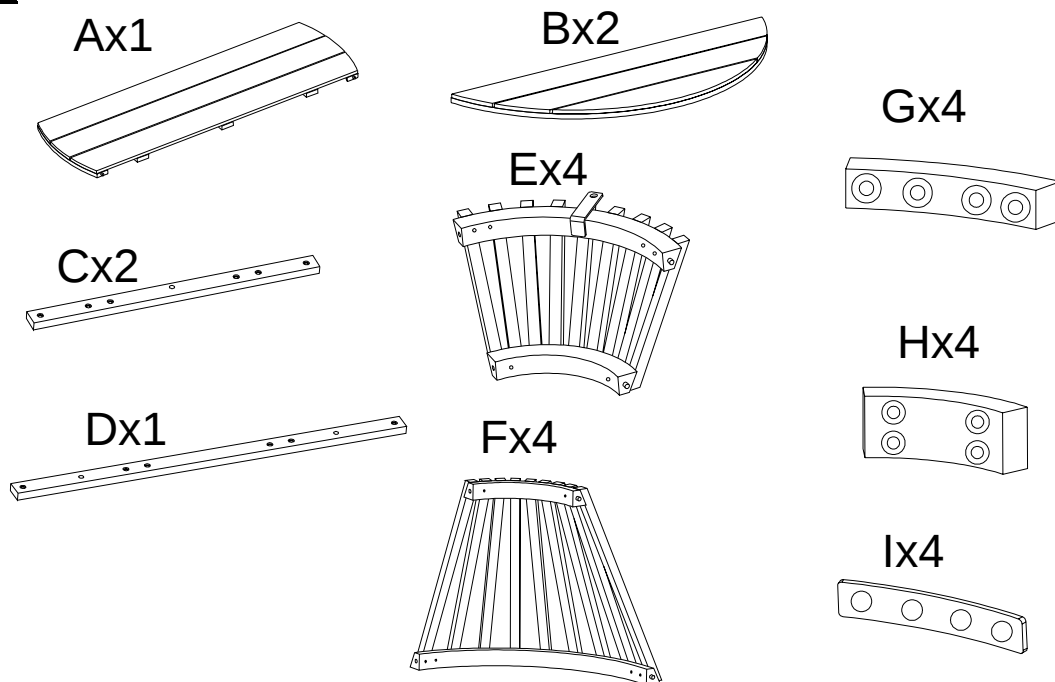
Assembly Steps

OVERVIEW



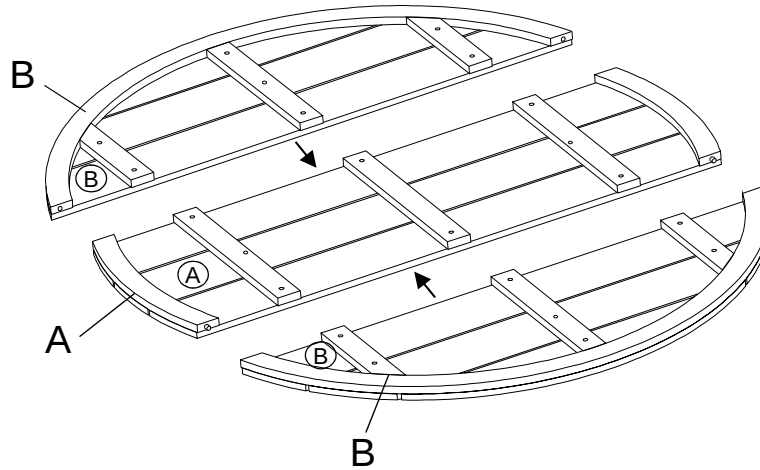
This Dining Table has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Table parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

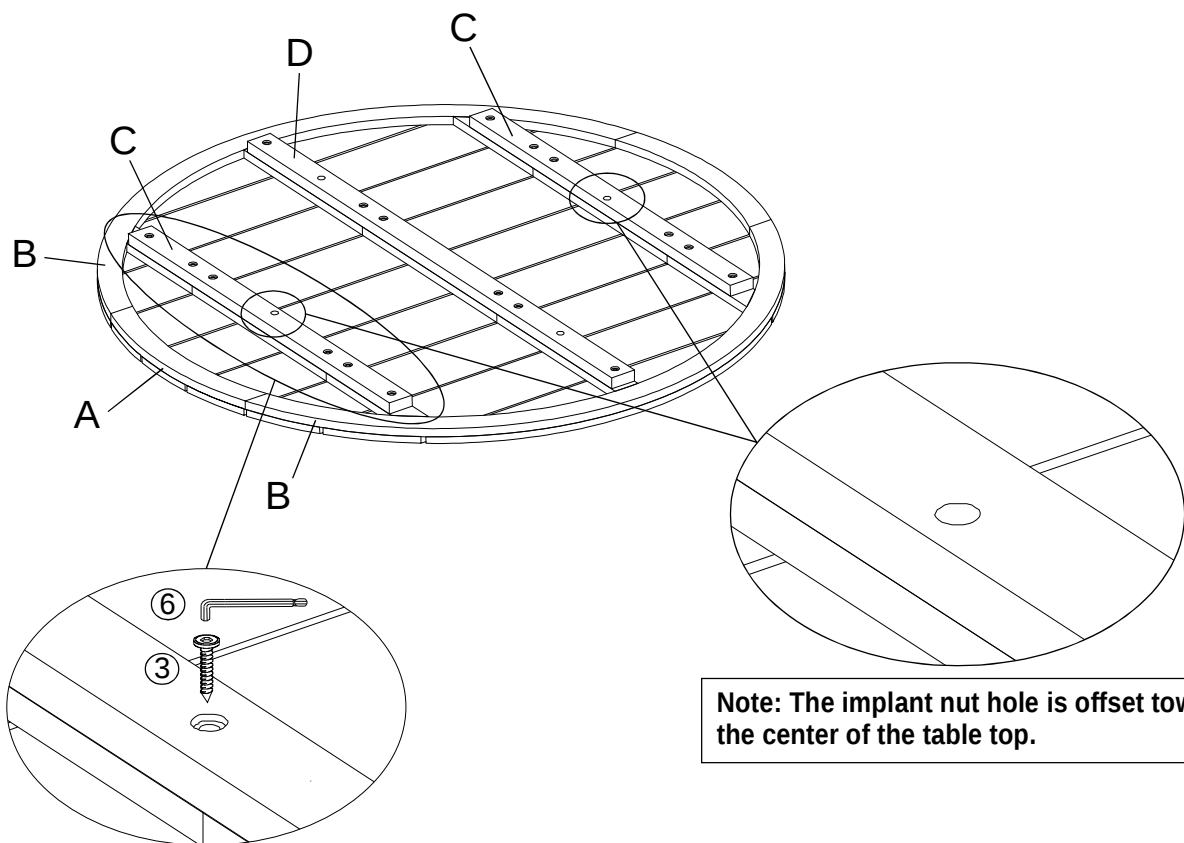
Step 2



With the help of your adult partner, place the Side Table Top Panels (B) and Middle Table Top Panel (A) with its underside skywards onto a clean surface as shown above.

Attention: Labels (A), (B) stuck on these parts are supposed to be on the same side once assembly as pictures shown above.

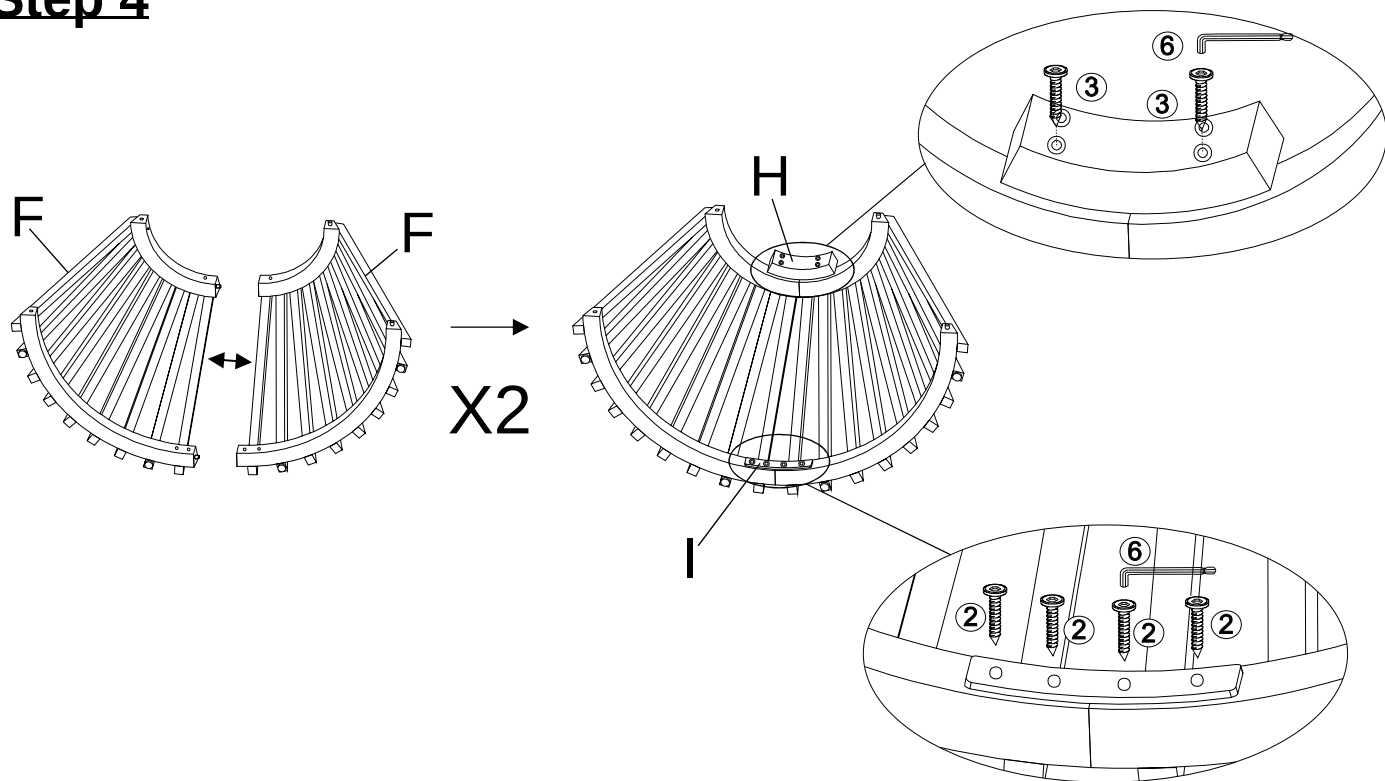
Step 3



Note: The implant nut hole is offset towards the center of the table top.

Attach the Side Support Top (C) and Middle Support Top (D) to the Side Table Top Panel (B) and Middle Table Top Panel (A) by using Screws (③) with Allen Wrench (⑥) as shown in the picture above. **DO NOT fully tighten the Screws at this time.**

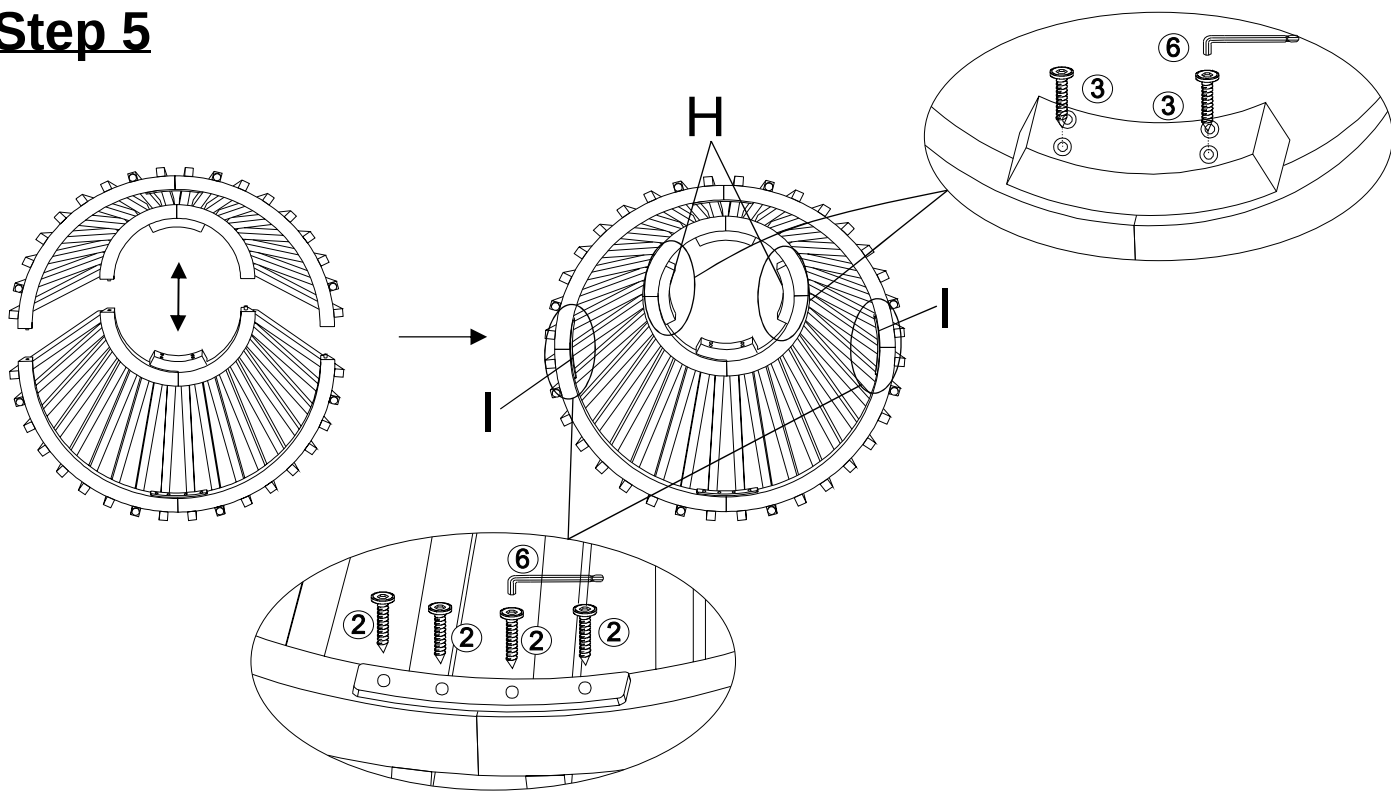
Step 4



With the help of your adult partner, attach the Middle Connector Part (H) and Bottom Connector Part (I) to the Lower Leg Panel (F) by using Screws (2) and Screws (3) with the Allen Wrench (6), as shown in the picture above.

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time.

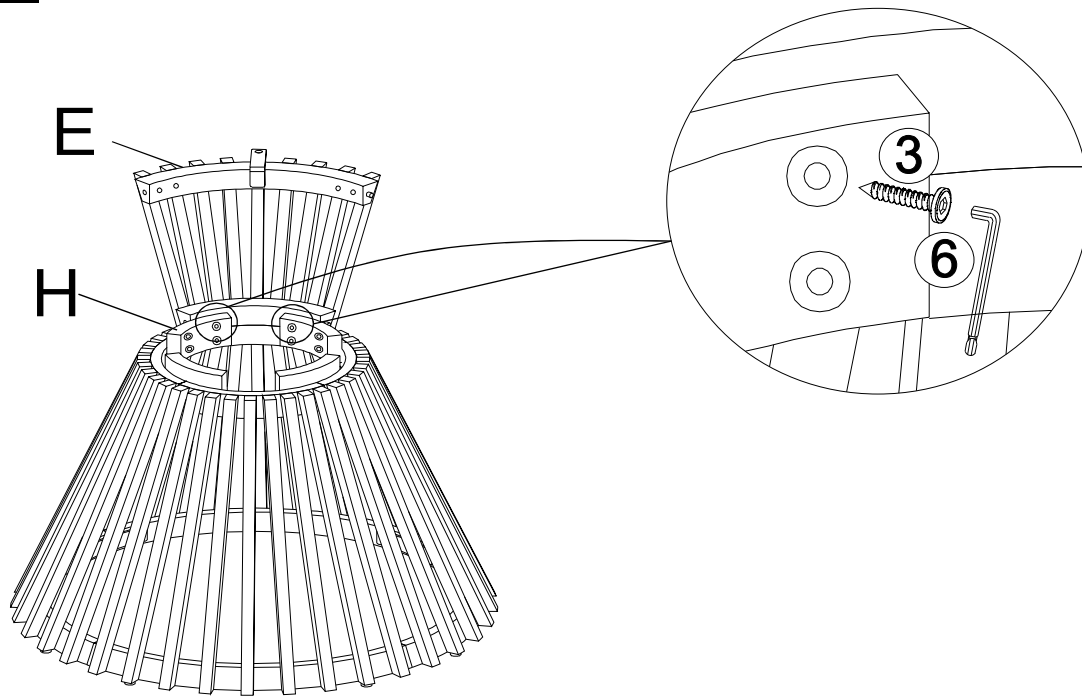
Step 5



With the help of your adult partner, attach the Middle Connector Part (H) and Bottom Connector Part (I) to the Lower Leg Panel (F) by using Screws (2) and Screws (3) with the Allen Wrench (6), as shown in the picture above.

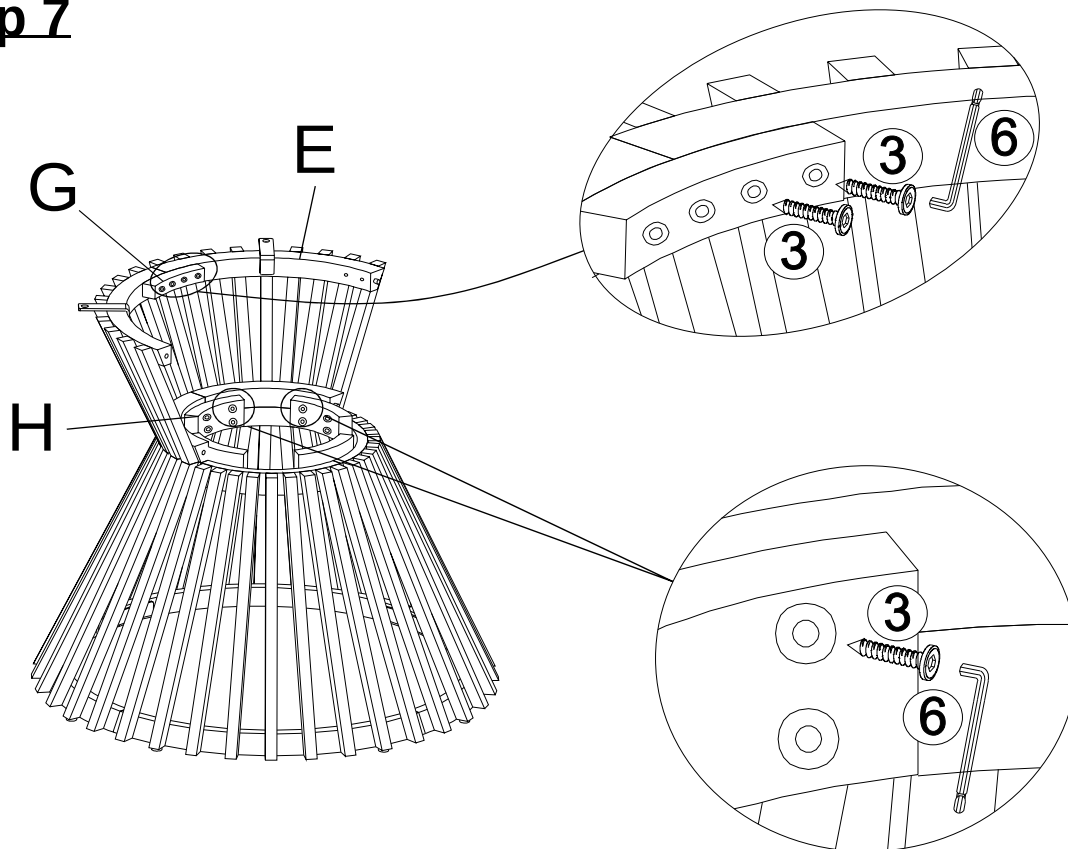
Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time.

Step 6



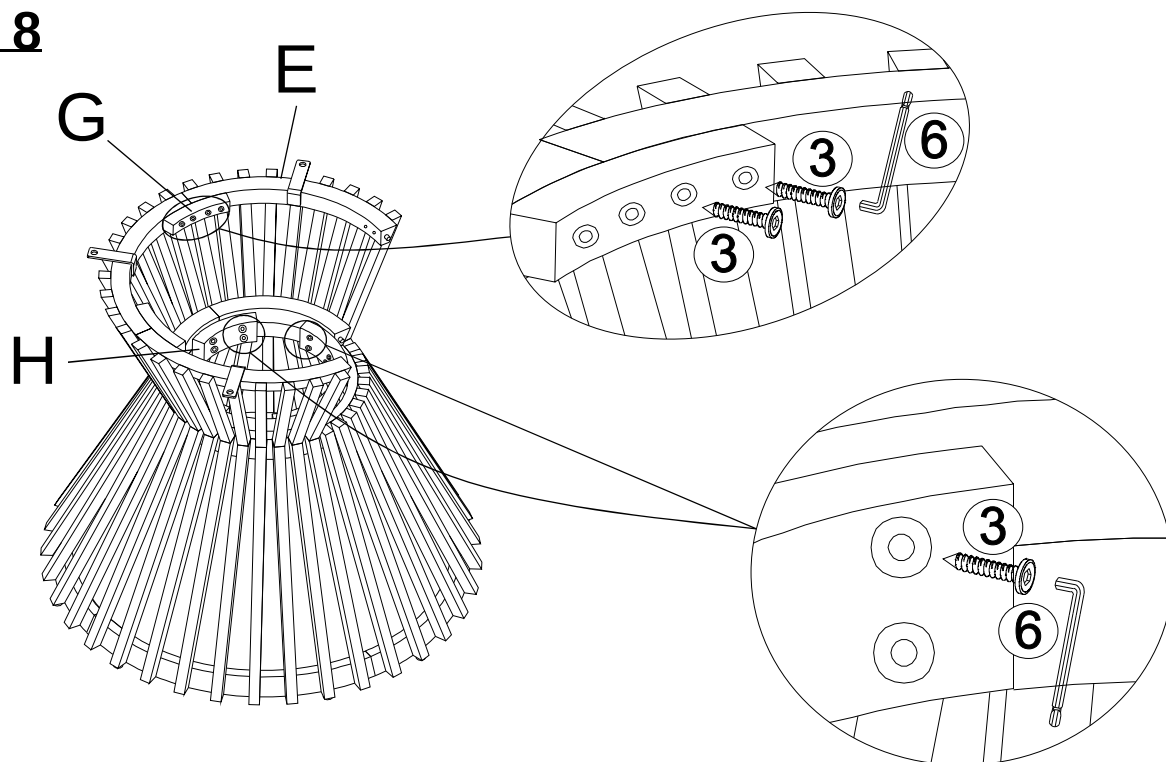
With the help of your adult partner, attach the Upper Leg Panel (E) to the Middle Connector Part (H) by using Screws (3) with the Allen Wrench (6), as shown in the picture above.
Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time.

Step 7



With the help of your adult partner, attach the Upper Leg Panel (E) to the Middle Connector Part (H) by using Screws (3) with the Allen Wrench (6) and attach the Top Connector Part (G) to the Upper Leg Panel (E) by using Screws (3) with the Allen Wrench (6) as shown in the picture above.
Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time.

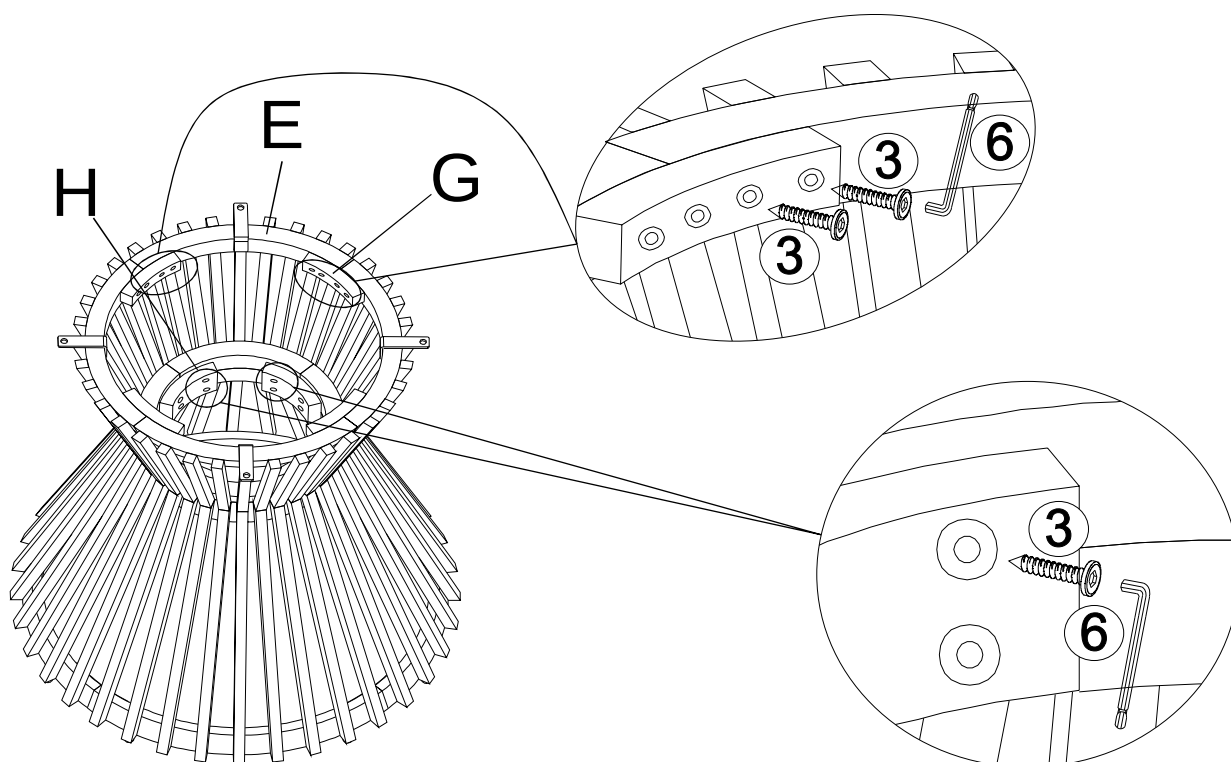
Step 8



Repeat the same processs in step 7 with the remaining Upper Leg Panel (E), Middle Connector Part (H) and Top Connector Part (G).

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time.

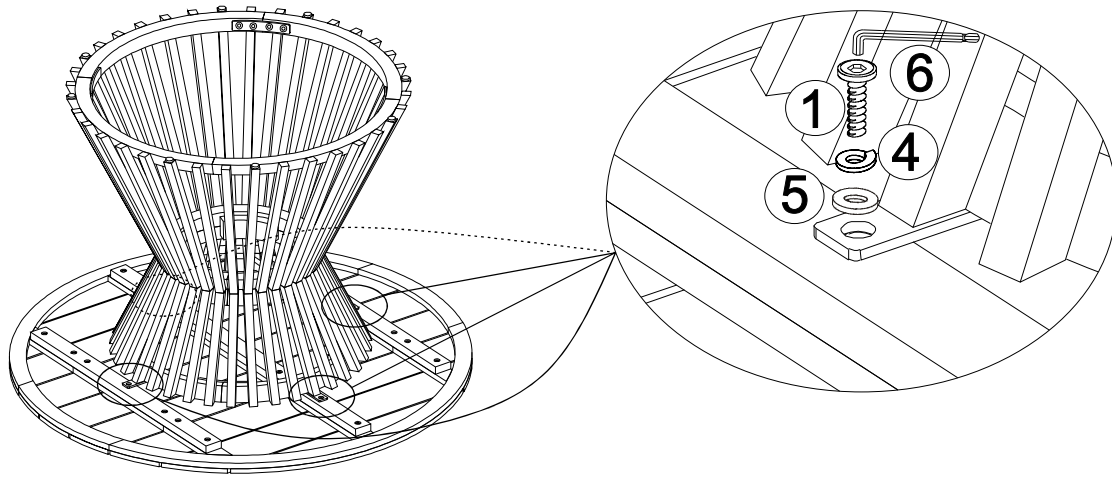
Step 9



Repeat the same processs in step 8 with the remaining Upper Leg Panel (E), Middle Connector Part (H) and Top Connector Part (G).

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time.

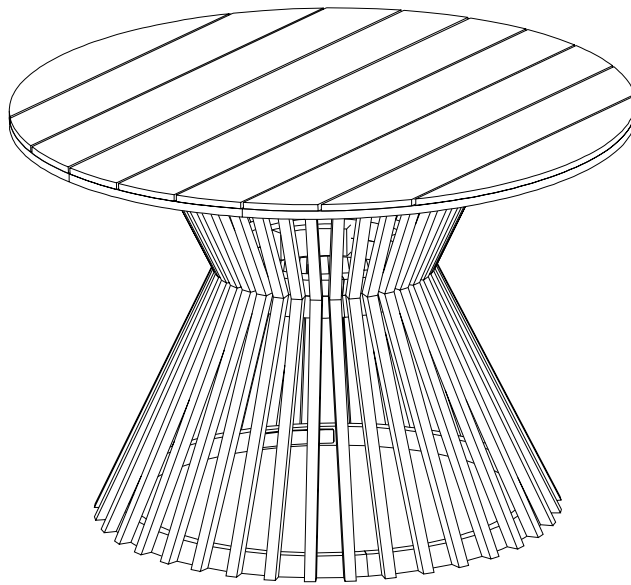
Step 10



With the help of your adult partner, flip the assembled part in step 3, then attach the assembled part in step 9 to assembled part in step 3 by using Bolt (①) , Spring Washer (④) and Flat Washer (⑤) with the Allen Wrench (⑥), as shown in the picture above.

Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

Step 11



You are now at the FINAL step of this assembly.

Inspect it and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

With the help of your adult partner, stand the Table up.

Exert pressure floorwards, onto the Table with both your hands.

This pressure will help the Legs and Table Top reach full alignment status.

Check for wobbles on a LEVEL surface.

If no wobbles are found proceed to tighten the Bolts and Screws in a sequential manner, until evenly secured.

When tightening the Bolts and Screws tighten sequentially.

Do not tighten any Bolt and Screws fully and then move on towards the next one.

If there are still wobbles, loosen the Bolts, Screws and excute the same above process.

WARNING!! IF TABLE IS NOT STABLE , IT COULD LEAD TO DAMAGING THE PRODUCT.

Your Dining Table is ready for use.

This Dining Table can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
