

Important Safety Instructions

WARNING: To avoid fire, shock and serious personal injury, follow these instructions.

- 1. Read your owner's manual and safety information before installing your new fan. Review the accompanying assembly diagrams.
- 2. Before servicing or cleaning unit, switch power off at service panel and lock service panel disconnecting means to prevent power from being switched on accidentally. When the service disconnecting means cannot be locked, securely fasten a warning device, such as a tag, to the service panel.
- 3. Be careful of the fan and blades when cleaning, painting, or working near the fan. Always turn off the power to the ceiling fan before servicing.
- 4. Do not insert anything into the fan blades while the fan is operation.
- 5. The appliance is not intended for use by young children or infirm persons without supervision. Young children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- 6. The net weight of this fan is: 6.325 kgs.

Additional Safety Instructions

WARNING: To avoid fire, shock and serious personal injury, follow these instructions.

- 1. To avoid possible shock, be sure electricity is turned off at the fuse box before wiring, and do not operate fan without blades.
- All wiring and installation procedures must satisfy National Electrical Codes (ANSI/NFPA 70) and Local Codes. The ceiling fan must be grounded as a precaution against possible electrical shock. Electrical installation should be made or approved by a licensed electrician.
- 3. The fan base must be securely mounted and capable of reliably supporting at least 35 lbs. (fan and accessories not to exceed 35 lbs. or 15.9 kgs.). Consult a qualified electrician if in doubt.
- 4. The fan must be mounted with the fan blades at least 7 feet from the floor to prevent accidental contact with the ceiling fan.
- 5. Follow the recommended instructions for the proper method of wiring your ceiling fan. If you do not have adequate electrical knowledge or experience, have your fan installed by licensed electrician.
- 6. Suitable for use with solid-state speed controls.
- 7. This fan is to be used in indoor dry or damp location only.
- 8. For supply connections, if the conductor of a fan is identified as a grounded conductor, then it should be connected to a grounded conductor power supply. If the conductor of a fan is identified as an ungrounded conductor, then it should be connected to an ungrounded conductor power supply. If the conductor of a fan is identified for equipment grounding, then it should be connected to an equipment-grounding conductor.

CAUTION: Changes or modifications not expressly approved by the party responsible for compliance could void the user's authority to operate the equipment.

WARNING: TO REDUCE THE RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK, THIS FAN MUST BE INSTALLED WITH A GENERAL USE, ISOLATING WALL CONTROL/SWITCH.

WARNING: This product is designed to use only those parts supplied with this product and/or accessories designaed specifically for use with this product. Using parts and/or accessories not designated for use with this product could result in personal injury or property damage.

WARNING: To reduce the risk of personal injury, do not bend the blade bracket (flange or blade holder) when instaing the brackets, balancing the blades, or cleaning the fan. Do not insert foreign objects in between rotating fan blades.

WARNING: To reduce the risk of fire, electrical shock, or personal injury, mount to an outlet box marked "Acceptable for Fan Support of 15.9 kg (35 lb) or less" and use the mounting screws provided with the outlet box. Most outlet boxes commonly used for the support of lighting fixtures are not acceptable for fan support and may need to be replaced. Consult a qualified electrician if in doubt.

WARNING: Do not operate this fan with a variable (Rheostat) wall controller or dimmer switch. Doing so could result in damage to the ceiling fan's remote control unit.

This device complies with Part 15 of the FCC Rules. Operation is subject to the following two conditions: (1) This device may not cause harmful interference, and (2) this device must accept any interference received, including interference that may cause undesired operation. If the intentional radiator can be classified as a Class B digital device or a PC peripheral, then shall include the following or equivalent:

If the fan motor or any other part fails at any time within three years of the original purchase, due to a defect in materials or workmanship, we will repair or replace, at our option, the defective part, free of charge.

Because of varying climate conditions, this warranty does not cover changes on the finish, including rusting, pitting, corroding, tarnishing or peeling. This includes coastal locations where salt air can cause corrosion.

This warranty is void and does not apply to damage from improper installation, neglect, accident, misuse, exposure to extremes of heat or humidity, or as the result of any modification to the original product.

All costs of removal and re-installation of the fan are the sole responsibility of the owner of the fan and not the retailer that sold the fan or Arranmore Lighting Company, LLC.

Arranmore reserves the right to modify or discontinue any product at any time and may substitute any part under this warranty.

Under no circumstances may a fan be returned without prior authorization from Arranmore. The receipt of purchase must accompany authorized returns and must be sent freight prepaid to Arranmore. The fan to be returned must be properly packed to avoid damage in transit; Arranmore will not be responsible for any damage resulting from improper packaging.

It is understood that any repair or replacement is the exclusive remedy available from Arranmore. There is no other expressed or implied warranty. Arranmore hereby disclaims any and all implied warranties, including, but not limited to those of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose to the extent permitted by law. Some states do not allow limitations on implied warranties. Arranmore will not be liable for incidental, consequential, or special damages arising out of or in conjunction with product use or performance, except as may otherwise be accorded by law. This warranty gives you special legal rights and you may also have other rights that vary from state to state.





Preparation

Before beginning assembly of product, make sure all parts are present. Compare parts with package contents list and hardware contents list. If any part is missing or damaged, do not attempt to assemble the product.

Estimated Assembly Time: 120 minutes

Tools Required for Assembly (not included): Electrical Tape, Phillips Screwdriver, Pliers, Safety Glasses, Stepladder and Wire Strippers.

Helpful Tools (not included): AC Tester Light, Tape Measure, Do-It-Yourself Wiring Handbook and Wire Cutters.

DANGER

When using an existing outlet box, make sure the outlet box is securely attached to the building structure and can support the full weight of the fan. Failure to do this can result in serious injury or death. The stability of the outlet box is essential in minimizing wobble and noise in the fan after installation is complete.

A CAUTION

Be sure outlet box is properly grounded and a ground wire (green or bare) is present.

After opening top of carton, remove mounting hardware package from foam inserts. Remove motor from packing and place on carpet or on foam to avoid damage to finish.

A CAUTION


Carefully check all screws, bolts and nuts on fan motor assembly to ensure they are secured.

Initial Installation

1. Turn off circuit breakers and wall switch to the fan supply line leads. (Figure 1)


A DANGER

Failure to disconnect power supply prior to installation may result in serious injury or death.



2. This fan can be mounted as a *flushmount* on a regular (no-slope) ceiling only.

Check to make sure blades (D) will be at least 30 in. from any obstruction and at least 7 ft. above the floor. (Figure 2)




How	to	Assemble	Your	Ceiling	Fan


1. Remember to turn off the power. Follow the steps below to hang your fan properly.

Attach the mounting plate (A) to the outlet box (not included) with two screws and washers provided with the outlet box. Ensure the mounting plate (A) is tight and secured. (Figure 1)

NOTE: It is very important you use the proper hardware when installing the mounting plate (A) as this will support the fan.



2. Install the receiver to the mounting plate (A) by snap in the receiver (H) to receiver holder. (Figure 2)



WARNING

The hook is only to hold the fan while attaching wiring. Failure to hang as instructed may result in the hook breaking causing the fan to fall. The hook must pass from the outside to the inside of the fan motor assembly.


3. Carefully lift the fan motor assembly (B) to the mounting plate (A). There are two safety cables installed inside the ceiling fan. Please use the shorter safety cable to hang the fan onto the hook, this will permit you to make the electrical connections without having to hold the fan up as well. (Figure 3)

Secure the safety cable to the building structure that independent to the outlet box using safety cable screw and flat washer (CC) (included). The safety cable should be in a stress-free state after installation.

How to Wire Your Ceiling Fan

▲ WARNING

To avoid possible electrical shock, be sure electricity is turned off at the main fuse box before wiring.

WARNING

Check to see that all connections are tight, including ground, and that no bare wire is visible at the wire nuts (except for the ground wire).

WARNING

To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, do not use this fan with any solid-state speed control device.

If you feel you do not have enough electrical wiring knowledge or experience, have your fan installed by a licensed electrician.

Follow the steps below to connect the fan to your household wiring. Use the plastic wire nuts (AA) with your fan. Secure the plastic wire nuts (AA) with electrical tape. Make sure there are no loose strands or connections.

1. Make wire connections from the fan to the receiver. (H)

From Fan To Receiver
2-pin connector ----- 2-pin connector
3-pin connector ----- 3-pin connector

2. Make wire connections from the receiver to the outlet box as follows, using the wire nuts (AA).

From Receiver To Outlet box
Black wire ------ Black wire (Hot)
White wire ------ White wire (Neutral)

From Fan and Receiver To Outlet box
Green wires* ------ Green or bare wire
(Ground)


*There are three green grounding leads: one from the mounting plate (A), one from the receiver (H) and one from motor.

3. Turn the wire nut connections upward, spreading them apart so the green (ground) and white wires will be on one side of the outlet box and the black wire will be on the other side. Carefully tuck wires into the outlet box space above the receiver (H) or evenly around the sides of the mounting plate (A).

How to Wire Your Ceiling Fan (continued)


WARNING

The hook is only to hold the fan while attaching wiring. Failure to hang as instructed may result in the hook breaking causing the fan to fall. The hook must pass from the inside to the outside of the fan motor assembly.

4. Remove two of the four mounting plate screws from the mounting plate (A) and loosen the other two screws. (Do not remove.)


Remove the safety cable from the mounting plate hook, and engage the key holes on the fan motor assembly (B) with the two mounting plate screws previously loosened.

Install the two mounting plate screws previously removed, and tighten all four mounting plate screws.



How to Install Your Decorative Motor Cover

1. Raise the decorative motor cover (C) up against the fan motor assembly (B). The four supports inside the decorative motor cover (C) should be placed against the four studs on top of the fan motor assembly (B). Twist the decorative motor cover (C) clockwise until snug.




How to Install Your Fan Blades

WARNING

To reduce the risk of personal injury, do not insert foreign objects between rotating fan blades (D).

1. Align the holes on the blade (D) and the fan motor assembly (B) and secure the blade in place with blade support plate with screws and lock washers (E) provided.

Repeat this process to attach the other blades (D).




How to Install Your Decorative Ring

1. Remove one of the three decorative ring mounting screws from the decorative motor cover mounting plate and loosen the other two screws. (Do not remove)

Place the key holes in the decorative ring (F) over the two screws previously loosened from the decorative motor cover mounting plate, and turn the decorative ring (F) until it locks in place at the narrow section of the key holes.

Securely tighten the two decorative ring mounting screws previously loosened and the one previously removed.




How to Install Your Decorative Cap

A CAUTION

Before starting installation, disconnect the power by turning off the circuit breaker or removing the fuse at the fuse box. Turning power off using the fan switch is not sufficient to prevent electric shock.

1. Position the notches on the inner edge of the decorative cap (G) so they match the tabs on the outside of the rim on the decorative cap mounting plate. Carefully lift the decorative cap (G) inside the decorative cap mounting plate and secure it to the fan by turning the decorative cap (G) clockwise until snug.

NOTE: If the decorative cap (G) could be wobbled by hand, it means the decorative cap (G) is not twisted completely till the right position. Keep twisting the decorative cap (G) till it could not be wobbled by hand.




How to Install Your LED Light Kit (optional)

A CAUTION

Before starting installation, disconnect the power by turning off the circuit breaker or removing the fuse at the fuse box. Turning power off using the fan switch is not sufficient to prevent electric shock.

- 1. While holding the LED light kit (optional) under the fan motor assembly (B), snap together the wire connection plugs:
 - ☐ White to white
 - ☐ Black to blue
 - 2. Position the notches on the inner edge of the LED light kit (optional) so they match the tabs on the outside of the rim on the decorative cap mounting plate. Carefully lift the LED light kit inside the decorative cap mounting plate and secure it to the fan by turning the LED light kit clockwise until snug.

NOTE: If the LED light kit (optional) could be wobbled by hand, it means the LED light kit is not twisted completely till the right position. Keep twisting the LED light kit till it could not be wobbled by hand.



How to Operate Your Ceiling Fan


1. Remove the battery cover by pressing firmly on the arrow and sliding the cover off.

Install two 1.5V AAA batteries (DD) (included). Batteries are to be inserted with the correct polarity.

Slide the battery cover on the remote control till it click in place.

NOTE: The remote control (I) has been pre-paired in the factory for your convenience.

NOTE: Batteries will weaken with age and should be replaced before leaking takes place as this will damage the remote control (I). Dispose used batteries properly and keep them out of the reach of children. Do not dispose batteries in fire. Batteries may explode or leak. Do not mix old and new batteries. Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon - zinc), or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries. Exhausted batteries are to be removed from the product. Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.

How to Operate Your Ceiling Fan (continued)

Learning Process

▲ IMPORTANT

This fan has been pre-paired at the factory and the fan can be used now. If you have two or more fans, please follow steps below to control each fan independently. Also follow steps below to re-pair the remote control (I) and the receiver when needed.

NOTE: The dip switch in the battery compartment has been set on "0" position for your convenience. If you want to re-pair the remote control (I), please set the dip switch on "1" position.

2. To add a remote to your fan's memory, use the steps below:

Ensure AC power to the fan is OFF to begin the learning process.

Slide the dip switch in the battery compartment to the "1" position.


Turn the fan's AC power ON.

Within 1 minute of turning AC power on, press and release the "LEARN" button located in the remote's battery compartment to enter the learning function. The fan blades will start to spin.

The fan will now accept commands from the added remote.

If you would like to set the dip switch back to the "0" position after a learning, please re-pair the remote control (I) by following the learning process again.

NOTE: If installing multiple fans on separate remotes, only the fan being programmed should have AC power turned ON. All other fans, even if they have already been programmed, should have AC power OFF so they do not memorize other remotes during the learning process. Separate the fan power switches by approximately 2 meters.



How to Operate Your Ceiling Fan (continued)

- 3. **0** button: Press and release the power button to turn the fan off. (Figure 3)
- 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 Speed functions:
 - 1 = for fan MINIMUM speed
 - 2 = for fan LOWER speed
 - 3 = for fan LOW speed
 - 4 = for fan MEDIUM speed
 - 5 = for fan HIGH speed
 - 6 = for fan MAXIMUM speed
- button: Controls rotation of the entire fan direction.

2H and 6H Timer:

Pressing the timer button will automatically turn fan off after 2 or 6 hours. To cancel the timer settings, press and release the " **0** " button.

Light ON/OFF and Dimming: (optional)
Press and release the button to turn the light on or

off. Press and hold the button to activate the dimmer function.

Light Color Temperature: (optional)

Press and release the button to cycle through the five color temperature options.

Option 1: 2700K (Warm White).

Option 2: 3000K (Soft White).


Option 3: 3500K (Neutral White).


Option 4: 4000K (Bright White).


Option 5: 5000K (Daylight).

Warm weather - (Counter- clockwise Direction) A downward air flow creates a cooling effect. This allows you to set your air conditioner on a warmer setting without affecting your comfort. (Figure 4)

Cool weather - (Clockwise Direction) An upward air flow moves warm air off the ceiling. This allows you to set your heating unit on a cooler setting without affecting your comfort. (Figure 5)

Troubleshooting

WARNING

Before beginning work, shut off the power supply to avoid electrical shock.

Fan does not move.	1. Reverse switch not engaged. 2. Power is off or fuse is blown. 3. Faulty wire connection. 4. Plugs not connected properly.	 Push switch firmly either left or right. Check that wire nuts from fan and receiver to the outlet box are connected properly according to instructions on page 8.
Noisy operation.	 Blades are loose. Cracked blade. Full range dimmer switch. Fan is new. 	 Tighten all blade screws. Replace blade. Replace with an approved speed control device. Allow fan a "break in" period of a few days, especially when running the fan at Medium and High speeds.
