Care & Maintenance



- Not for commercial use. For residential use only.



- Furniture may scratch floors. We recommend using furniture pads to protect your floors.



- Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.



- Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.



- Do not place furniture under direct sunlight.



- Do not place furniture near heating or cooling vents.



- Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.



- Do not place furniture outside . For indoor use only.



- Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.



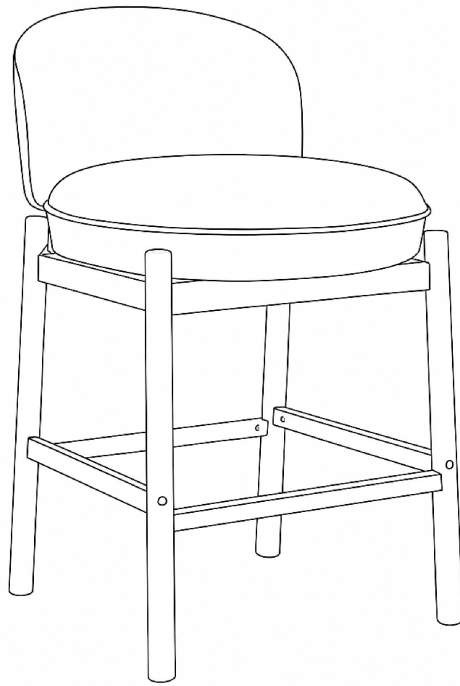
- Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.



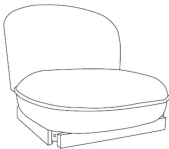
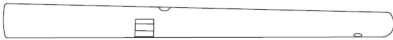
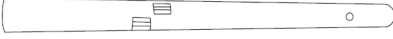
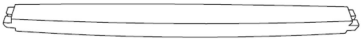
- Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

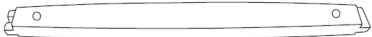
Please look in boxes for hardware packs and legs.

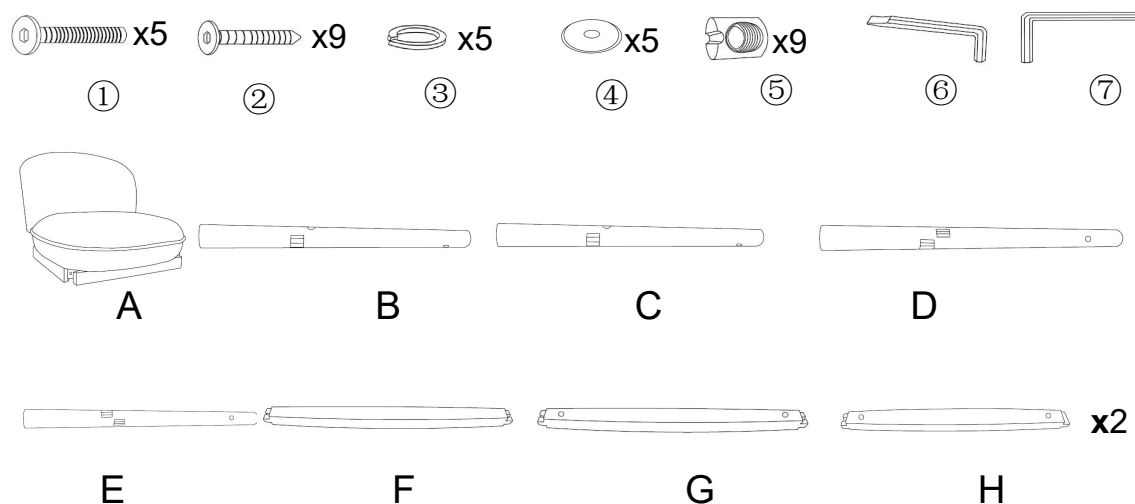

- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



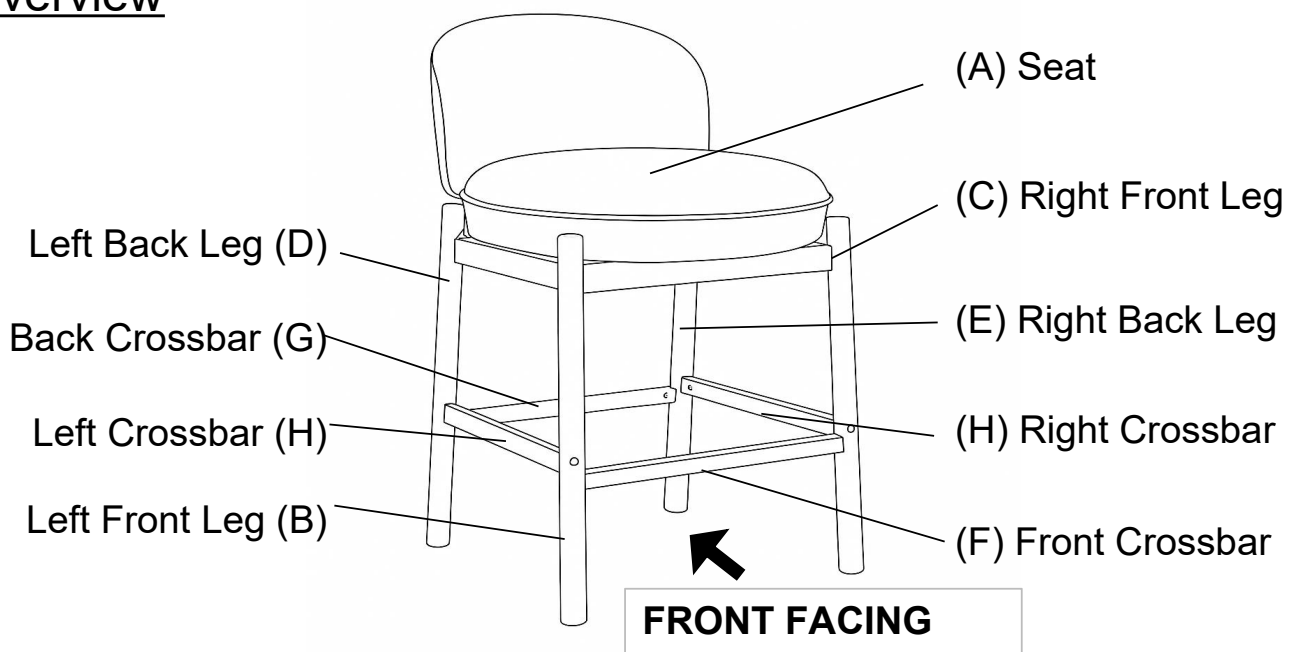
- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-

Assembly Steps

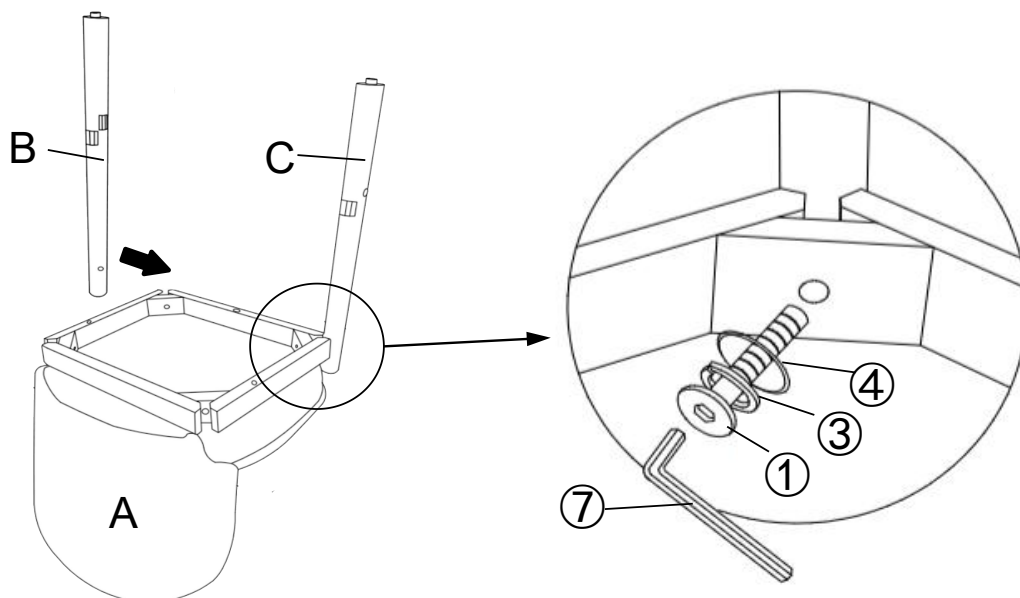
Overview



This Counter Stool has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the stool parts, the above picture is provided to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Friendly reminder: Tighten all the screws after all holes are installed.

Step 1

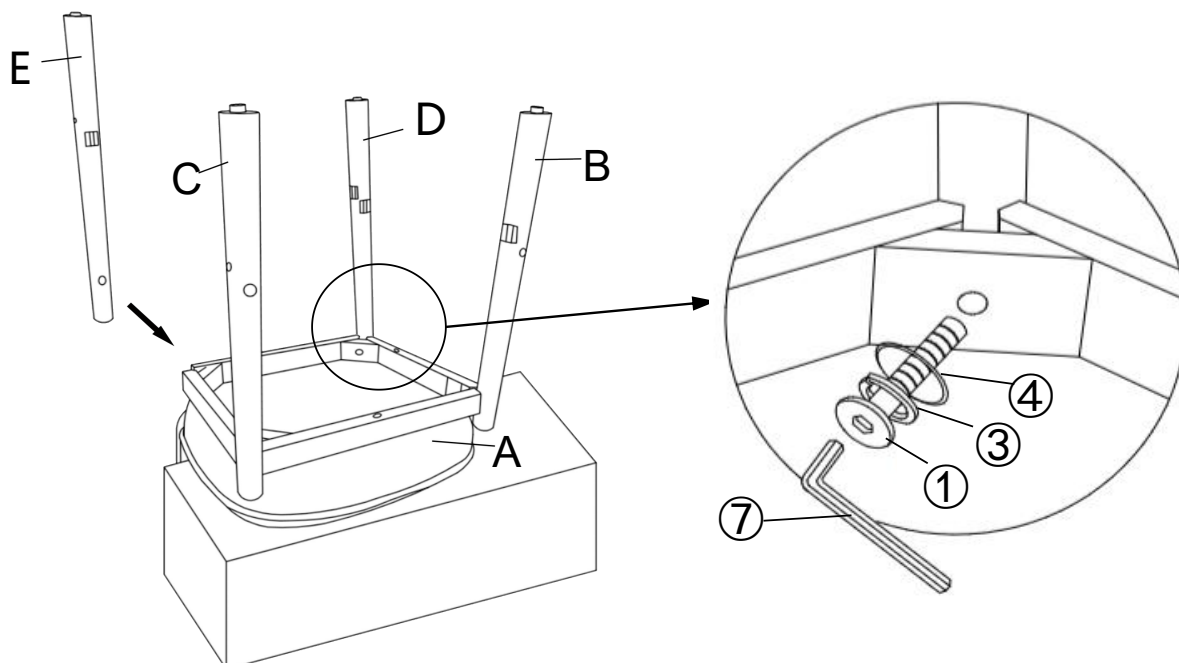


Open the carton, and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

Attach the Left Front Leg (B) and Right Front Leg (C) to the Seat (A), using the Bolts (①), Spring Washers (③) and Flat Washers (④) with Allen Wrench (⑦).

Do Not Fully Tighten the Bolts.

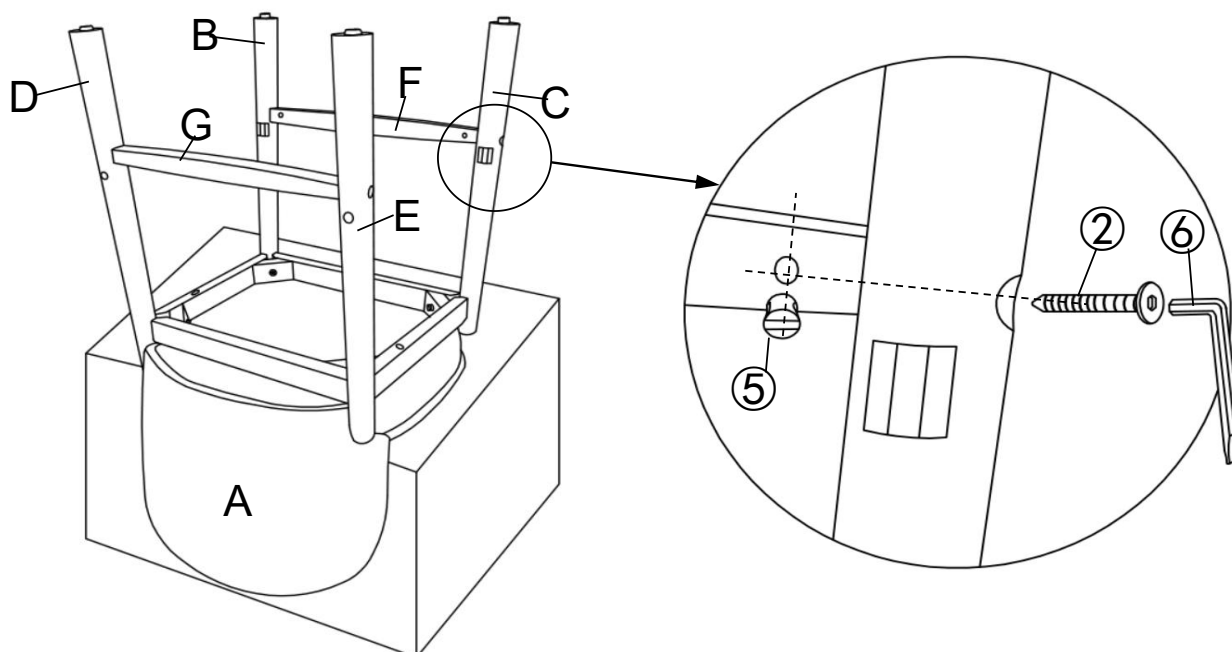
Step 2



Attach the Left Back Leg (D) and Right Back Leg (E) to the Seat (A) as shown above, using the Bolts (①), Spring Washers (③) and Flat Washers (④) with Allen Wrench (⑦).

Do Not Fully Tighten the Bolts.

Step 3

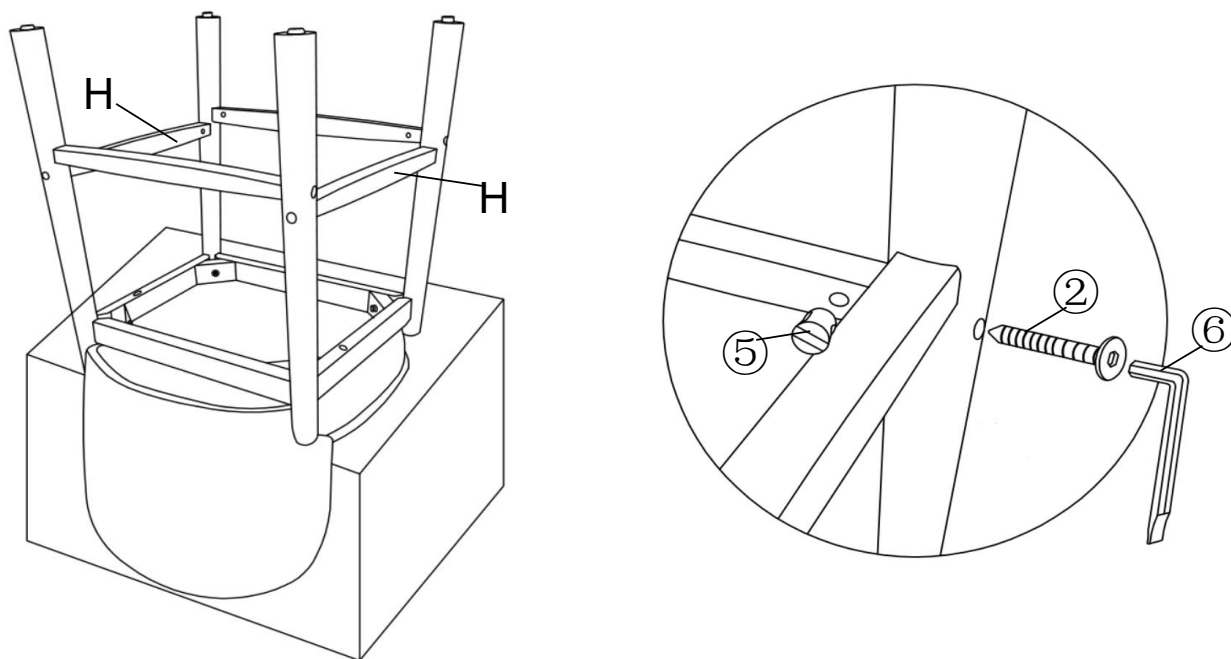


Attach the Front Crossbar (F) to Front Legs (B & C), and the Back Crossbar (G) to Back Legs (D & E).

Install Cam Locks (⑤) into the holes in a straight line, then secure with Bolts (②) using the Allen Wrench (⑥) as shown above.

Do Not Fully Tighten the Bolts.

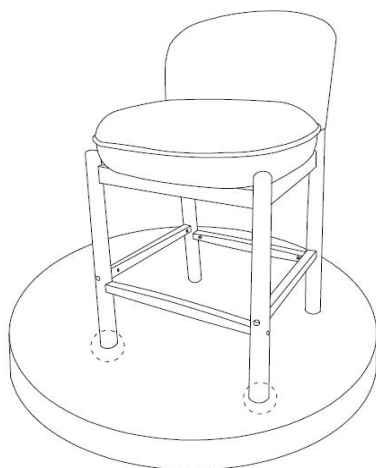
Step 4



Attach the Left/ Right Crossbar (H) to Legs as shown above.
Install Cam Locks (⑤) into the holes in a straight line, then secure with Bolts (②) using the Allen Wrench (⑥) as shown above.

Do Not Fully Tighten the Bolts.

Step 5



Turn the counter stool right side up and place it on a level surface.
Inspect the counter stool to ensure all parts are properly connected.
Sit gently on the counter stool to help align all joints and connections.

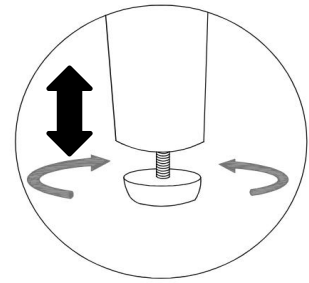
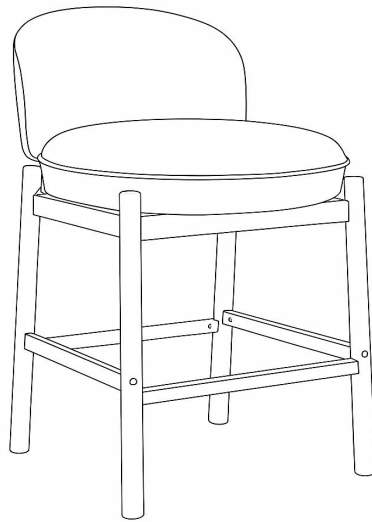
Step off the counter stool and, in a sequential manner, proceed to tighten all bolts.

You may need to turn the Counter stool to access certain bolt points, always turn it carefully and in a synchronized manner with assistance if needed.

Tighten all bolts gradually and sequentially.

Do not fully tighten one bolt before moving to the next, as this may cause the frame to warp.
If the Counter stool still wobbles, loosen the screws slightly and repeat the tightening process.

Step 6



Adjust the levelers on the legs to ensure chair stability.

Your Counter Stool is ready for use.

This Counter Stool can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

• What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

• What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may

• What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
