- 4. The mounting surface should be clean, dry, flat, strong enough and 1/4" larger than the canopy on all side. Any gaps between the mounting surface and canopy exceeding 3/16" should be corrected as required.
- 5. Make sure that the ceiling or wall can stand the weight of the lamp before the fixture.
- 6. Make sure the voltage you are using is **120V**. The maximum wattage is **60W** per bulb.
- 7. Keep the lamp away from acidic and basic objects in case of damaging the surface of the lamp.
- 8. When replacing the bulb, you should turn off or unplug the lamp and you must wait until it is cool as bulbs get hot quickly.
- 9. The safety instructions appearing in this manual are not meant to cover all possible conditions that may occur. It must be understood that common sense, caution, and care must be used with any electrical products.






Image for the finished product:





Installation Procedures:

- 1. Open the package and take out all the parts or accessories, then place them on a clean flat place.
- 2. Turn off power at the circuit box to avoid possible electric shock.
- 3. Assemble the light fixture as below procedure:
- 4. Fix two straight tubes 2 to part 1 on the bar.
- 5. Fix tube 2 to the hole 10 on the wood frame 3.
- 6. Connect tube 4 to tube 2 through hole 10, choose to install ring 5 to straight tube 4 if your house has a sloped ceiling.
- 7. Fix canopy 6 to the straight tube 4 or ring 5.
- 8. Fix mounting plate 7 to the Outlet Box of ceiling by screw 8.
- 9. Connect wires from lamp to the Outlet Box wire by wire connectors 9, more details as below:

- 10. Push canopy 6 upward to the outlet box and secure it with the screw nuts 11 until snug.
- 11. Fix the glass shade 13 to the lamp base by using the cover ring 12. Then install bulb 14 (not included).
- 12. Check everything installed correctly, then you can turn on the light.
