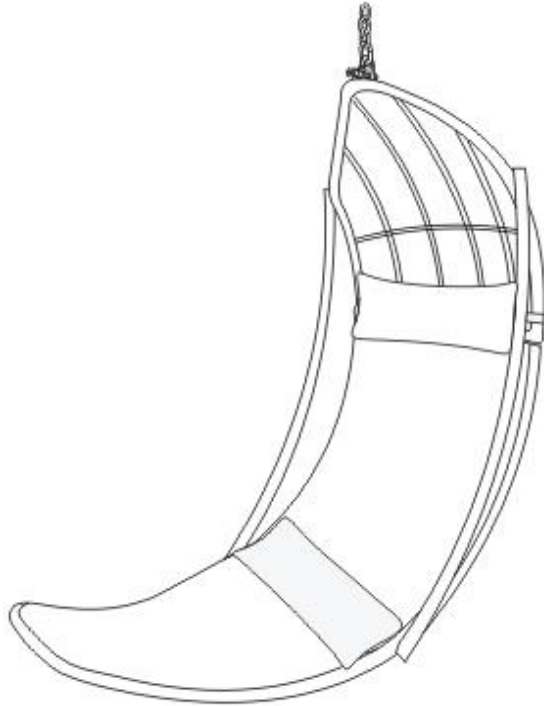



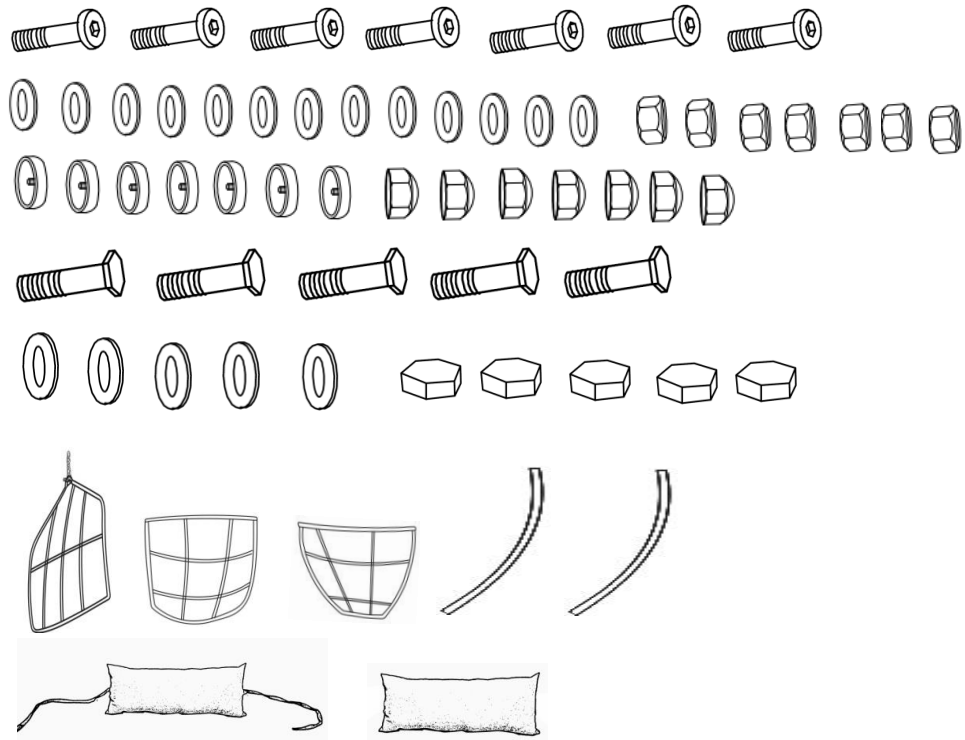

Before Beginning Assembly:



- Read instructions, cover to cover-



- Have 2 adults on hand for assembly-



- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



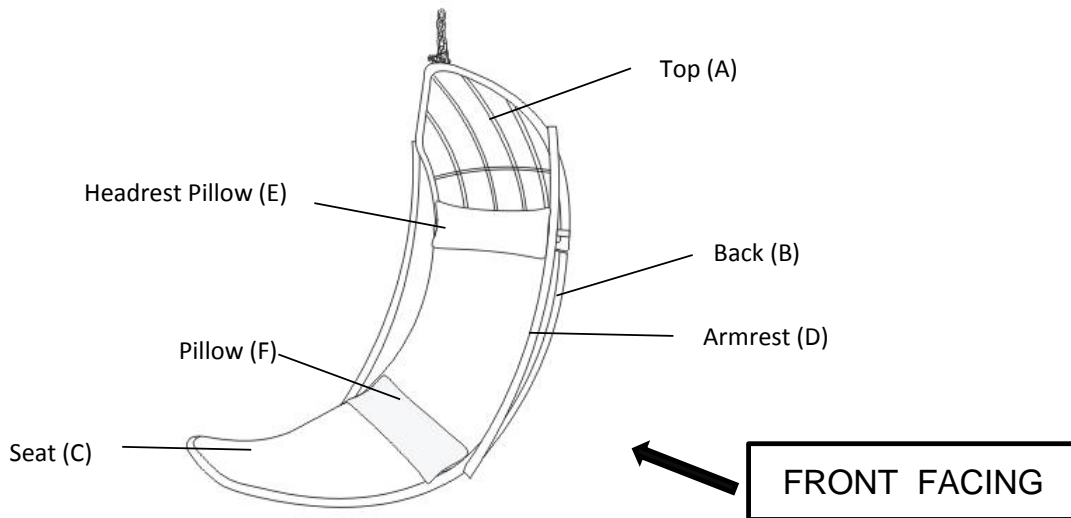
- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



- Save all packaging until finished-

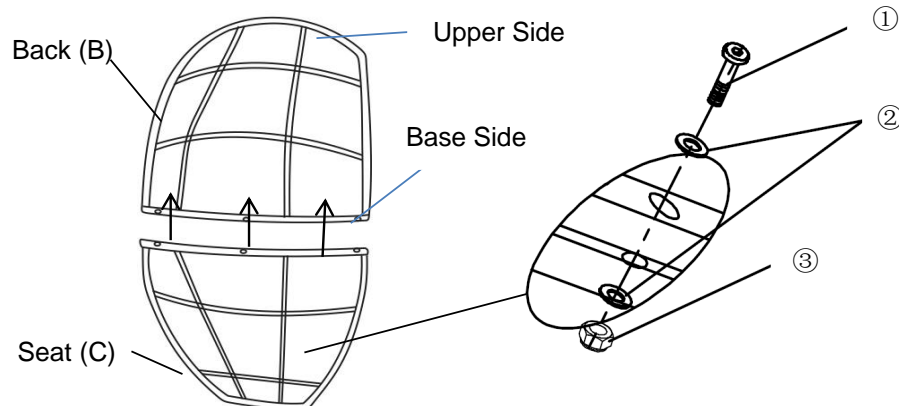
Assembly Steps

Overview



This Basket has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Basket parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



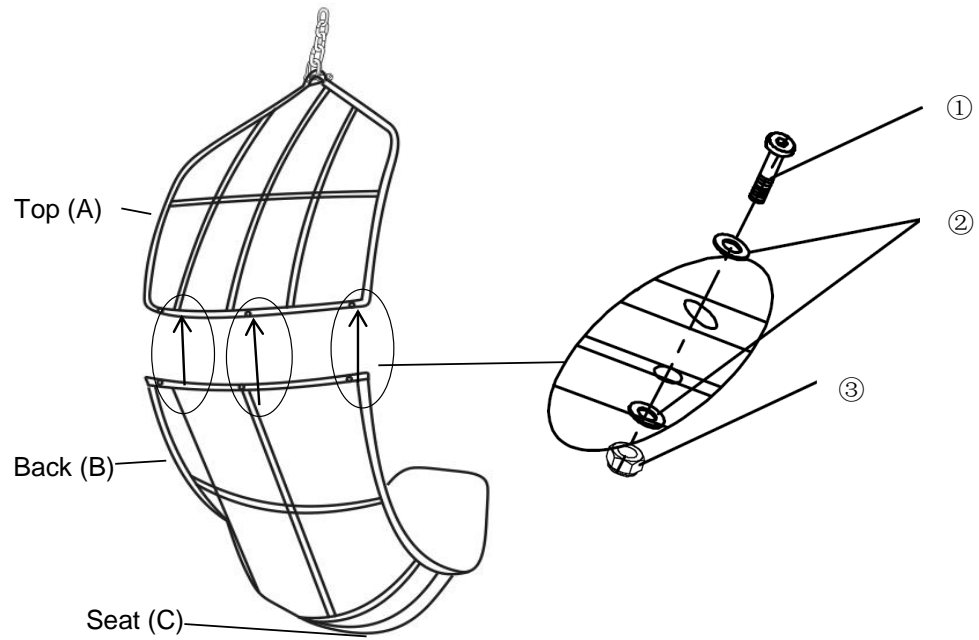
Place the Back(B) and Seat(C) on a clean, non-marring surface.

Note: Find the sticker with the words "upper side" on the Back (B), and keep the upper side upwards.

Attach Back(B) to Seat (C) using Bolts(①), and Washers(②) on upper side and Washers(②) and Nuts(③) on lower side, with Allen Key(⑩) and Spanner(⑨).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

Step 2

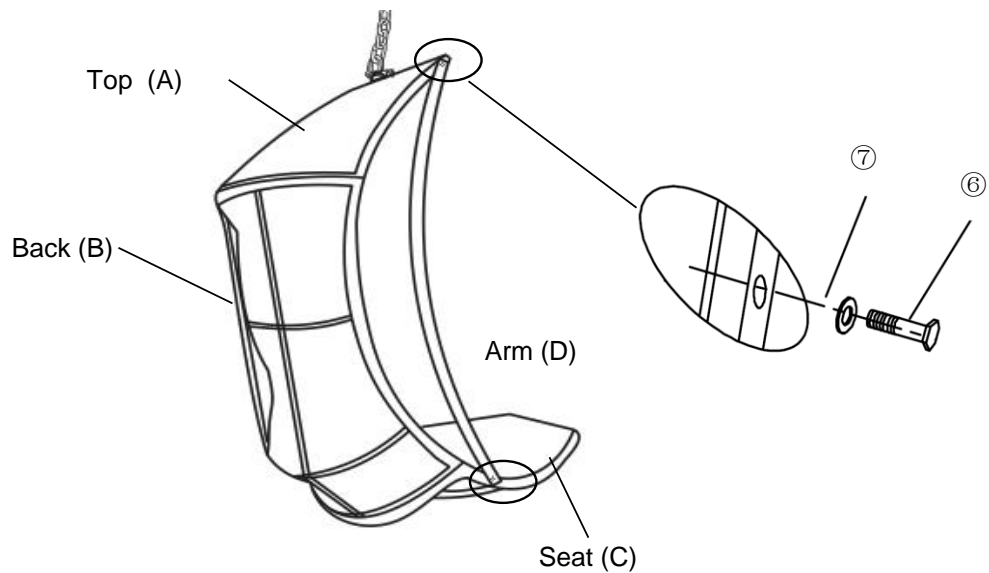


Align Top (A), Back(B) and Seat (C).

Attach Top (A) to Back(B) using Bolts(1), and Washers(2) on the upper side and Washers(2) and Nuts(3) on the lower side, with Allen Key(10) and Spanner(9).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

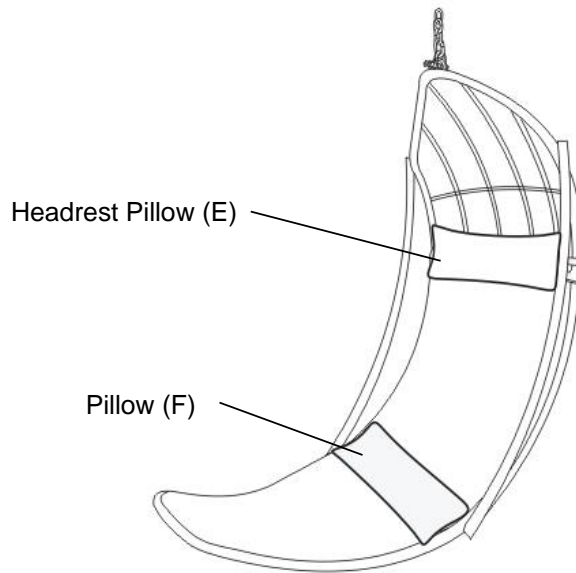
Step 3



Align Top (A), Back(B) and Seat (C). Attach Arms (C) to them, using Bolts(6), and Washers(7) , with Spanner(11).

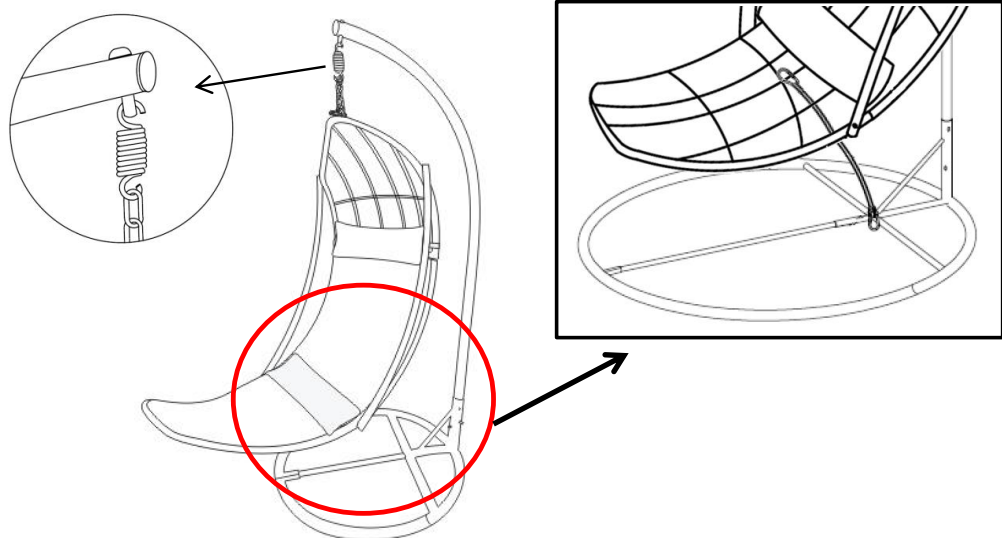
Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

Step 4



Now, tighten all Bolts and Nuts at all joints sequential manner.
Place Bolt Caps(④) on Bolts(①) and Nut Caps(⑤) on Nuts(③). Place Bolt Caps(⑧) on Bolts(⑥).
Tie the Headrest Piollow (E) on the Basket as picture, and place Pillow (F) also.
Your Basket is ready for use.





















Step 5



Lift the Basket and hang the first iron chain on the Spring of the Stand.
Use the fasten Safety Rope to lock on the middle rattan warp at the bottom of the basket as shown above, screwed up the carabiner to keep the warp never come out from it.

Note: This step should be completed with 2 adults.

Care & Maintenance

-   ● Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface
 -   ● Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
 -   ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
 -   ● Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
 -   ● Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
 -   ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
 -   ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only .
 -   ● Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
 -   ● Keep away from sources of ignition.

-   ● Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

• What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

• What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

• What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.

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If
