

ROPE CURTAIN TIEBACK

Installation Guide

What's Included

In Your Package:

- 1 or 2 × Rope curtain tiebacks (depending on selected quantity)
- 14" length each, 0.12" thickness
- 90% cotton, 10% metal construction
- Available in your selected color: White, Beige, or Jute

Your Color Selection:

Your rope tieback(s) come in the color you selected. Each color offers the same high-quality cotton-metal blend construction and durability.

- **White:** Clean, classic appearance - perfect for modern and traditional decor
- **Beige:** Warm, neutral tone - complements most color schemes
- **Jute:** Natural, rustic look - ideal for farmhouse and coastal styles

Tools Needed:

- None required - no drilling or hardware installation needed!
- Your hands for tying knots
- Clean, dry cloth (for initial cleaning if desired)

Step-by-Step Installation

1 Prepare Your Curtains

Ensure your curtains are clean and properly hung. The rope tieback works with any curtain weight and fabric type.

Tip: If curtains are new, let them hang for 24 hours to settle before installing tiebacks.

2 Choose Your Tieback Position

Decide where you want the tieback positioned on your curtain:

- **High position:** 1/3 from the top - elegant, formal drape
- **Middle position:** Center of curtain - balanced, classic look
- **Low position:** 2/3 down - relaxed, casual appearance

3 Gather the Curtain Fabric

Pull your curtain to one side and gather the fabric at your chosen position. The rope is flexible and adjusts to any curtain thickness.

Advantage: Unlike fixed-length tiebacks, this rope design accommodates thin sheers to thick drapes with the same ease.

4 Position the Rope

Place the rope around the gathered curtain fabric. The rope should sit comfortably around the curtain bundle.

Find the center point of the rope so both ends are equal length for tying.

5 Create Your Knot

Tie the rope ends together using your preferred knot style. See the knot options below for different looks.

Simple Bow

Classic and easy to untie

Square Knot

Secure and nautical style

Slip Knot

Adjustable and quick release

6 Adjust and Perfect

Adjust the curtain draping and the knot position until you achieve the desired look. The rope should hold securely while allowing natural curtain movement.

If needed, retie the knot tighter or looser to achieve the perfect fit.

Knot Tying Instructions

Simple Bow Knot

1. Cross the rope ends
2. Tie a simple overhand knot
3. Create two loops (bunny ears)
4. Cross loops and pull one through
5. Pull tight to secure

Best for: Easy daily use, decorative appearance

Square Knot

1. Cross right rope over left
2. Bring right rope under and through
3. Cross left rope over right
4. Bring left rope under and through
5. Pull both ends tight

Best for: Secure hold, nautical/rustic style

💡 Pro Installation Tips

- For heavier curtains, tie the knot slightly tighter for better support
- With a set of 2, install tiebacks at the same height for perfect symmetry
- For wide windows with multiple panels, use one tieback per panel
- The knot can be positioned in front, side, or back depending on your preference
- Practice your preferred knot style before final installation
- The rope length allows for multiple wraps around very thick curtains

Daily Use Instructions

Opening Curtains

Simply pull the curtain toward the tieback. The rope knot holds the gathered fabric securely in place.

Closing Curtains

Untie the rope knot and allow the curtain to fall naturally back into position. Retie when ready to open again.

Maintenance & Care

Regular Care:

- **Cleaning:** Hand wash in cold water with mild detergent as needed
- **Drying:** Air dry flat to maintain rope shape and prevent shrinkage
- **Storage:** Store loosely coiled to prevent permanent creases
- **Inspection:** Check rope for fraying or wear; replace if damaged
- **Color Care:** Keep out of direct sunlight when not in use to prevent fading
