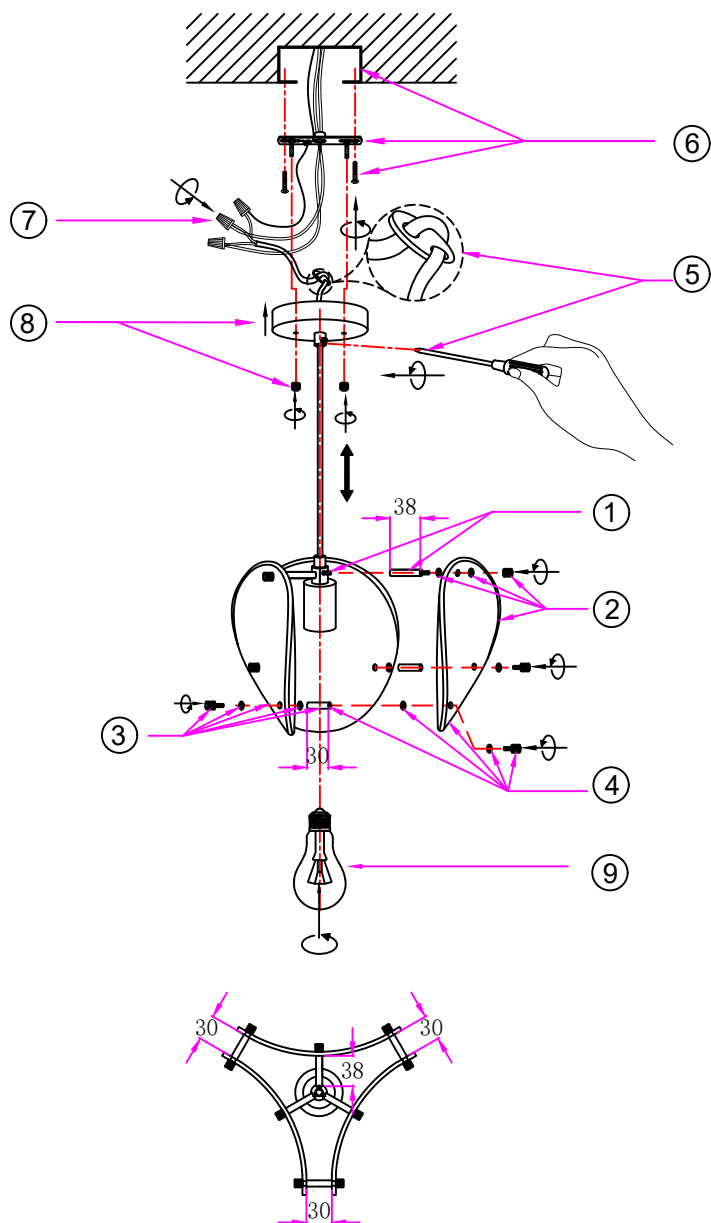


ASSEMBLY AND INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

WARNING: TO AVOID RISK OF ELECTRICAL SHOCK, BE SURE TO SHUT OFF POWER BEFORE INSTALLING OR SERVICING THIS FIXTURE.



Before You Begin:

- Ensure power is turned off at the circuit breaker before installation.
- Read all instructions carefully.
- Installation should be performed by a qualified electrician if you are unfamiliar with wiring.

Step-by-Step Installation:

1. Screw the three D8*38 metal tubes into the top threaded component of the fixture body.
 2. Install the Glass Panels
 - Slide a rubber washer onto the threaded stud of D8*38 metal tube.
 - Place the glass panel (the curved side faces left/right) onto the tube.
 - Add another rubber washer outside the glass, and then secure with a lock nut.
 3. Slide a rubber washer onto the threaded stud of lock nut. Insert the stud through the bottom hole of the glass panel, and attach the D8*30 metal tube onto it.
 4. Secure the adjacent glass panels
 - Slide a rubber washer onto another threaded stud of lock nut.
 - Insert the stud through the bottom hole of another glass panel.
 - Screw the stud into the D8*30 metal tube.
 5. Loosen the set screw inside the metal component. Slide the figure-8 adjuster to adjust the wire length to your desired height. And tighten the screw to secure the wire.
 6. Secure the mounting plate to the U.S.-standard junction box using the provided screws.
 7. Wire Connections
 - Use wire connectors to connect the black (hot) wire to the black wire, the white (neutral) wire to the white wire, and the ground wire to the grounding terminal.
 - Ensure no exposed conductors remain outside wire connectors or outside the junction box.
 8. Secure the canopy to the mounting plate using the decorative nuts.
 9. Screw the bulb into the light holder. (Bulb Not Included)
 10. Restore power, and check if the bulb works properly.
- Installation Complete.

Safety Instructions:

To avoid fire, shock, and serious personal injury, follow all instructions carefully.

1. Do not install or use the light fixture if any part is missing or damaged.
2. To avoid possible electrical shock be sure electricity is turned off at the main fuse or circuit breaker box before wiring.
3. Make certain no bare wires are exposed outside the wire connectors.
4. All wiring must conform to national and local electrical codes.
5. Follow the recommended instructions for the proper method of wiring your new light fixture. If you feel you do not have enough electrical wiring knowledge or experience, have your light fixture installed by a licensed electrician. Any electrical work not described in this manual should be performed by a licensed electrician.
