### CEILING FAN WITH LED LIGHT/ REMOTE CONTOL



# SAFETY TIPS

#### **OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING: READ AND SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS**

WARNING: TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE, ELECTRIC SHOCK, OR PERSONAL INJURY, MOUNT TO CEILING SHOULD USE THE SCREWS PROVIDED. MOST ORIGINAL SCREWS USED FOR THE SUPPORT OF LIGHTING FIXTURES ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE FOR FAN SUPPORT AND MAY NEED TO BE REPLACED. CONSULT A QUALIFIED ELECTRICIAN IF IN DOUBT.

- 1. Installation work and electrical wiring must be done by qualified person(s) in accordance with all applicable codes and standards, including fire-rated construction.
- 2. Use this unit only in the manner intended by the manufacturer. This fan is applied to 220-240V 50Hz only. If you have any questions contact the manufacturer.
- 3. After making the wire connections, gently push connections into outlet box with wire nuts pointing up. The wires should be spread apart with the grounded wire.
- 4. Before you begin installing the fan, Switch power off at Service panel and lock service disconnecting means to prevent power from being switched on accidentally. When the service disconnecting means cannot be locked, securely fasten a prominent warning device, such as a tag, to the service panel.
- 5. Be cautious! Read all instructions and safety information before installing your new fan. Review the accompanying assembly diagrams.
- 6. When cutting or drilling into wall or ceiling, do not damage electrical wiring and other hidden utilities.
- 7. Make sure the installation site you choose allows the fan blades to rotate without any obstructions. Allow a minimum clearance of 7 feet from the floor to the trailing edge of the blade.
- 8. To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, or personal injury, this fan must be mounted to an safety ceiling support. And use mounting screws provided. (Mounting must support at least 35 lbs.)
- 9. Do not bend blade holders during installation to motor, balancing or during cleaning. Do not insert foreign object between rotating blades.
- 10. Attach the mounting bracket using only the hardware supplied. Fan is only to be mounted to an safety ceiling support.
- 11. To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, do not use this fan with any solid state fan speed control device, or variable speed control, dimmer switch which is not included in the box.
- 12. If this unit is to be installed over a tub or shower, it must be marked as appropriate for the application.
- 13. NEVER place a switch where it can be reached from a tub or shower.
- 14. The combustion airflow needed for safe operation of fuel-burning equipment may be affected by this unit's operation. Follow the local heating equipment manufacturer's guideline safety standards.
- 15. Before servicing or cleaning unit, Switch power off at Service panel and lock service disconnecting means to prevent power from being switched on accidentally. When the service disconnecting means cannot be locked, securely fasten a prominent warning device, such as a tag, to the service panel.
- 16. Do not operate on/off of fan and light frequently, it will shorten the lifespan. Do not operate continuously more than 12 hours.
- 17. Do not repair yourself. Only repair by skilled technicians, LED panel cannot be replaced.
- 18. Do not use and operate if any damage and problem is found.



### Parts and Accessories



### **BEFORE INSTALL**

Unpack and inspect fan carefully to be certain all contents are included. Turn off power at fuse box to avoid possible electrical shock.



Drill two mounting holes in the ceiling joist and securely screw the mounting bracket to the ceiling using the washers and wood screws provided. The mounting position located should be able to hold a weight of at least 15.9kgs (35 lbs).

NOTE - Proper care must be taken when mounting to concrete ceilings. For safe mounting, these ceilings may require expansion screw and plastic plugs or anchors than supplied with the product. Please mark the hole positions first and then drill holes to avoid incorrect hole positions.



## INSTALLATION

#### Step 1

Insert downrod into Coupling coupling cover and Canopy.



#### Step2

Feed all Motor wire and LED drive power from coupling throuth the downrod assembly. Insert downrod into downrod coupling. Make sure to align hole in downrod with the hole in downrod coupling. Install cross pin through coupling and downrod, Insert Clamp pin into cross pin until it snaps into place. Tighten set screws in coupling. Slide coupling cover over the downrod coupling.

#### IMPORTANT

All wires should not be stress while feed through the downrod.

The power wires Live& Neutral must be connected to wall swich(Double pole), seperate at least 3mm apart in all poles.



Step3 Tighen housing screws to remove housing from Motor coupling.





Check the motor for plastic shipping stabilizer tabs, and remove them if they are present. Attach blade assembly to motor using the motor screws provided. Tighten screws securely. NOTE: Some models do not utilize motor gaskets, washers, or stabilizer tabs.



#### Step4

Re install the houing on the coupling, tighten all the screws securely, then loosen one set screw from the lighting switch.



The light plate has two mating slots. Position both slots on light plate directly under and in line with two screws in the lighting switch. Lift the light plate, allowing the two screws to slide into the mating slots. Rotate the light plate anticlockwise until both screws from the lighting switch drop into the slot recesses. Tighten all the screws securely.



#### Step6

Find the light wire plugs from the motor and guide it throuth the LED panel, Connect the plug to LED panel and magnetic on the light plate. Place PC shade and twist it tighten into the light plate.



Connect the LED drive power wire using the pin molex plug. And fix the LED drive power in the side of the mounting bracket.

After hanging fan onto the mounting bracket, make sure wire from the ceiling fan and remote receiver connect with terminal block correctly(1). Slide the remote receiver into the space above the downrod ball as shown.



Follow diagram above to make wiring connections to the terminal block on the mounting bracket.



Carefully lift fan assembly onto mounting bracket. Rotate fan until notch on downrod ball(1) engages the ridge (2) on the mounting bracket. This will allow for hands free wiring.



#### Step 9

For downrod fans, slide the canopy up to the mounting bracket. The canopy has two mating slots (1) and two mating holes (2). Position both slots on canopy directly under and in line with two screws in the mounting bracket (3). Lift the canopy, allowing the two screws to slide into the mating slots. Rotate the canopy until both screws from the mounting bracket drop into the slot recesses. Tighten screws securely.



Install two AAA batteries by removing battery cover on back of transmitter, installing batteries, and replacing battery cover. If desired, install the transmitter holder onto the wall with included screws.



Note: In case the remote is not workable, Sync code matching: After powering on, within 5 seconds, press and hold the code matching fan to turn off, and the code matching is successful

### OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

#### Operation

Turn on the power and check operation of fan. The remote controls the fan speeds as follows: 1 to 6 speed. Speed settings for warm or cool weather depend on factors such as room size, ceiling height, number of fans and so on. The upper housing slide switch controls direction, forward or reverse. Warm weather/down position - (Forward) Fan turns counterclockwise direction. A downward air flow creates a cooling effect as shown in illustration A. This allows you to set your air conditioner on a higher temperature setting without affecting your comfort. Cool weather/up position - (Reverse) Fan turns clockwise direction. An upward airflow moves warm air off the ceiling area as shown in illustration B.

This allows you to set your heating unit on a lower setting without affecting your comfort.

NOTE: Turn off and wait for fan to stop before changing the setting of the forward/reverse slide switch.

#### Maintenance

- 1. Because of the fan's natural movement, some connections may become loose. Check the support connections, brackets, and blade attachments twice a year. Make sure they are secure.
- 2. Clean your fan periodically to help maintain its new appearance over the years. Do not use water when cleaning. This could damage the motor, or the wood, or possibly cause electrical shock.
- 3. Use only a soft brush or lint-free cloth to avoid scratching the finish. The plating is sealed with a lacquer coating to minimize discoloration or tarnishing.
- 4. There is no need to oil your fan. The motor has permanently lubricated bearings.

### TROUBLESHOOTING GUIDE

Installation errors may be mistaken for defects. If you experience any faults, please check this Trouble Shooting Chart. If a problem cannot be remedied, please consult with your authorized electrician and do not attempt any electrical repairs yourself.

TROUBLE 1. If fan does not start:	<ul> <li>SUGGESTED REMEDY</li> <li>1. Check main and branch circuit fuses or circuit breakers.</li> <li>2. Check wire connections as performed installation. Caution: Make sure main power is turned off.</li> <li>3. Make sure forward/ reverse switch is firmly in side position. Fan will not operate when switch is in the middle.</li> <li>4. if the fan still will not start, contact a qualified electrician. Do not attempt to troubleshoot internal electrical connections yourself.</li> </ul>
2. If fan sounds noisy:	<ol> <li>Check to make sure all screws in motor housing are snug (not over tightened).</li> <li>Check to make sure the screws which attach the fan blade holder to the motor are tight.</li> <li>If using an optional Ceiling Fan Light Kit, check to be sure the screws securing the glassware are finger tight. Check to be sure light bulb is tight in socket and not touching glass shade. If vibration persists from glass, remove glass and install a 6mm wide rubber band on glass neck to act as an insulator. Replace glass and tighten screws against rubber band.</li> <li>Some fan motors are sensitive to signals from Solid State variable speed controls. DO NOT USE a Solid-State variable speed control.</li> <li>Allow "break-in" period of 24 hours. Most noises associated with a new fan will disappear after this period.</li> </ol>
3. If fan wobbles:	<ul> <li>All blades are weighed and grouped by weight. Natural woods vary in density which could cause the fan to wobble even though all blades are weight-matched. The following procedures should eliminate most of the wobble. Check for wobble after each step.</li> <li>1. Check that all blades are screwed firmly into blade holders.</li> <li>2. Check that all blade holders are tightened securely to motor.</li> <li>3. Make sure that canopy and mounting bracket are tightened securely to ceiling joist.</li> <li>4. Most fan wobble problems are caused when blade levels are unequal. Check this level by selecting a point on the ceiling above the tip of one of the blades. Measure this distance as shown in Figure 1. Keeping measure within 3mm, rotate the fan until the next blade is positioned for measurement. Repeat for each blade. If all blade levels are not equal, you can adjust blade levels by the following procedure. To adjust a blade tip down, insert a washer (not supplied) between the blade and blade holder at the screw closest to the motor. To adjust a blade tip up, insert washer (not supplied) between the blade and blade holder at the two screws farthest from the motor.</li> <li>5. If blade wobble is still noticeable, interchanging two adjacent (side by side) blades can redistribute the weight</li> </ul>
4. If light does not work:	<ol> <li>and possibly result in smoother operation.</li> <li>Check to see that the wire connections are connected.</li> <li>Check for faulty light plate.</li> <li>If light kit will still not operate, contact a qualified electrician for assistance.</li> </ol>
