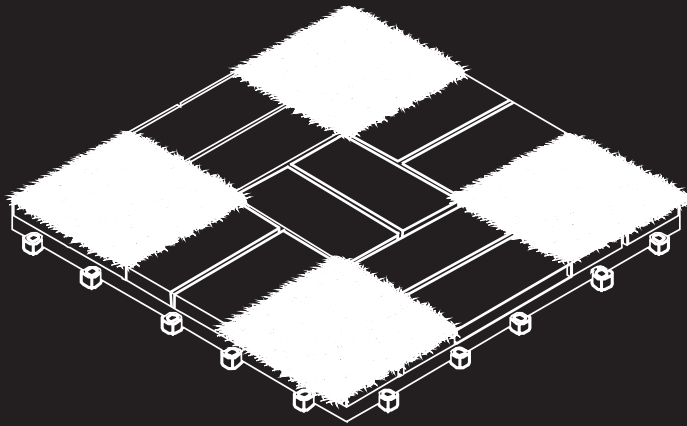
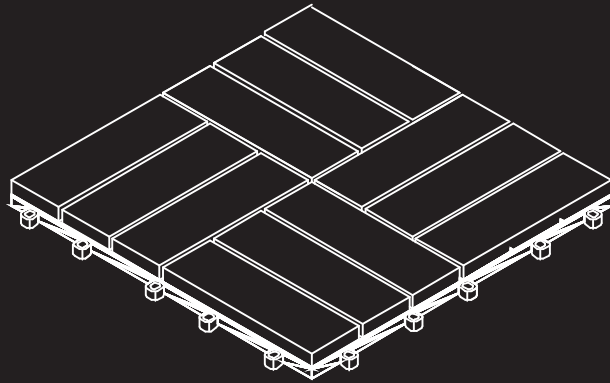
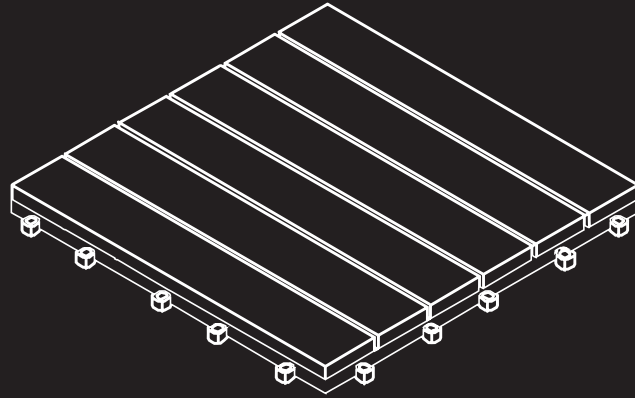


Deck Tiles



Acacia natural wood
1pcs = 11.81"x11.81"x0.94"
1pack=10pcs

Each set of 10 tiles covers 10 square feet

INSTALLATION GUIDE

1. Calculate the area of your project and double-check the order amount:
 - a.Length x Width = Area (in)
 - b.Area(in²) /136.59375 (in²) = Number of Tiles

Note: Individual tiles are 12.6"x12.6" squares but the Exposed surface of each tile is ~ 11.81" x 11.81"

2. Be sure to leave a gap near any walls or edges (Approximately 1 inch gap (total) for every 16 linear feet) to account for expansion and contraction.
Tip: use Garden Trim or Baseboard trim along the perimeter to hide the gaps.
3. Tiles should be installed onto dense, hard, solid surfaces. (ie concrete, brick, wood, vinyl, etc)
4. Product is not designed to work with roofing membranes/ weatherproof/ slip-resistant materials.

ROUTINE MAINTENANCE AND CARE OF WOOD TILES

Our products are made of Acacia wood. We recommend a basic cleaning with a deck cleaner and the maintenance oil for wood, and a soft bristle brush at the time of installation, and a semiannually (typically spring and fall) maintenance process every 2-3 months. This will help to maintain the quality and beauty of the such type of tiles.

Natural Wood Aging: Our wood tiles will develop a silvery-gray patina if left to weather naturally and, depending on climatic conditions. We recommend that a coat of wood stabilizer be applied after installation. The amount of direct and indirect sunlight, temperature, humidity, moisture, and other local conditions will factor into the time and shading of the deck.

In order To maintain and clean the flooring, you are suggested to follow the below steps:

1. Wet the flooring with cleaner or water.
2. Use the brush to remove the water stain and dirty.
3. Use the sponge to rinse with clean water. Let it dry for a while.
4. Apply the maintenance oil with a brush or cloth.
5. The oil application should be repeated several times until there is no further absorption. Use the cloth to remove any excess oil (if any).
6. Let the flooring dry before using it.

Dirt and Debris

Clean tiles to remove dirt and debris by using a stiff bristle brush.

Chalk Markings

Clean tiles with water and a sponge or cloth.

Keep dry then apply maintenance oil after cleaning.

Pigment Staining

Use sanding paper to sand the area with pigment stains. Clean with wet cloths then keep dry and apply maintenance oil after cleaning.

Snow Removal

Sweeping:

The use of mechanical snow scoopers and blowers is NOT recommended on our tiles and or Pedestal products. A stiff-bristled broom is the recommended method for removing snow from a wood deck, as it causes the least damage to your decking material.

Shoveling:

A metal shovel should NEVER be used, as this can gouge, scrape or otherwise cause damage to the wood decking tiles. Use a plastic shovel, and shovel along the length of the deck boards, instead of across, to minimize damage to the wood grain. Avoid chipping away at the ice with a shovel or pick, as this can also damage the decking tiles. Small or narrow plastic shovels can also be used to help get into tighter areas such as stairs and still move with the grain of the wood decking tiles.

Ice Removal

De-icers and/or salts should NEVER be used on natural wood deck tiles because of the corrosive nature of the salts. These chemicals can erode any waterproof stain or finish and leave water marks on the wood itself. De-icers absorb most of the moisture in natural materials, which makes the wood more brittle and will cause additional cracking and checking. De-icers can come in a range of compositions, including Sodium Chloride (NaCl), Magnesium Chloride (MgCl₂), Calcium Chloride (CaCl₂), and Potassium Chloride (KCl) as well as many other compositions. Rinse off when first practical. Keep dry then apply maintenance oil after rinse.

As an alternative, carefully pour hot water over the iciest areas of the deck and use an outdoor broom to remove the ice and excess water. Sand or kitty litter can also be spread over the deck to help prevent more ice from building up although this may be tracked indoors and should be swept up and cleaned periodically.

Rust Stains, Ground-In Dirt, and Grime

Use the iron brush to clean the surface of the stains. Clean with wet cloths then keep dry and apply maintenance oil after cleaning.

Oil and Grease Stains

Scrub in a household-degreasing agent as soon as the stain occurs. Rinse with hot water. Keep dry then apply maintenance oil after rinse.

Berries and Wine Stains

Mix bleach into hot water according to the bleach-packaging label. Scrub the stain lightly and rinse thoroughly. Keep dry then apply maintenance oil after rinse. The stain may not disappear entirely.

Ink Stains

Inks may be permanent on the surface and hard to remove. However, the stain may be lightened by scrubbing with hot soapy water. Rinse thoroughly. Keep dry then apply maintenance oil after rinse.

Mold

Simply clean tiles with water and a sponge or cloth. Keep dry then apply maintenance oil after cleaning.

Commercial Buffing Machines

Commercial floor buffing or floor scrubber machines are not recommended due to their potential to damage tiles and pedestals with their movement mechanisms.

Pressure Washer

It's not advisable to use a pressure washer for our products.

Sanding

It's acceptable to sand our products by sanding paper.

However, the sanding will be slight, not hard-press.

Hardly pressure sanding will change the appearance of the surface of the material.

Attention

1. To avoid mold or warping, install in areas with adequate sunlight and stable moderate temperatures.
2. Please try to keep this material away from heavy impact.
3. Please take care of it during transportation, installation and storage, and avoid falling from a high place.
4. Do not slide planks against each other when moving them. When removing them from the unit, lift the planks and set them down.
5. Do not slide tools or drag equipment across the top of the planks during construction.
6. Keep the surface of the planks free of construction waste to prevent damage to the tiles.
