

Assembly Instructions

Caution: You must read this before you proceed



- Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.



- Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.



- To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.



- Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.



- Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.



- To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.



- Not for commercial use. For residential use only.



- Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.












- Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.



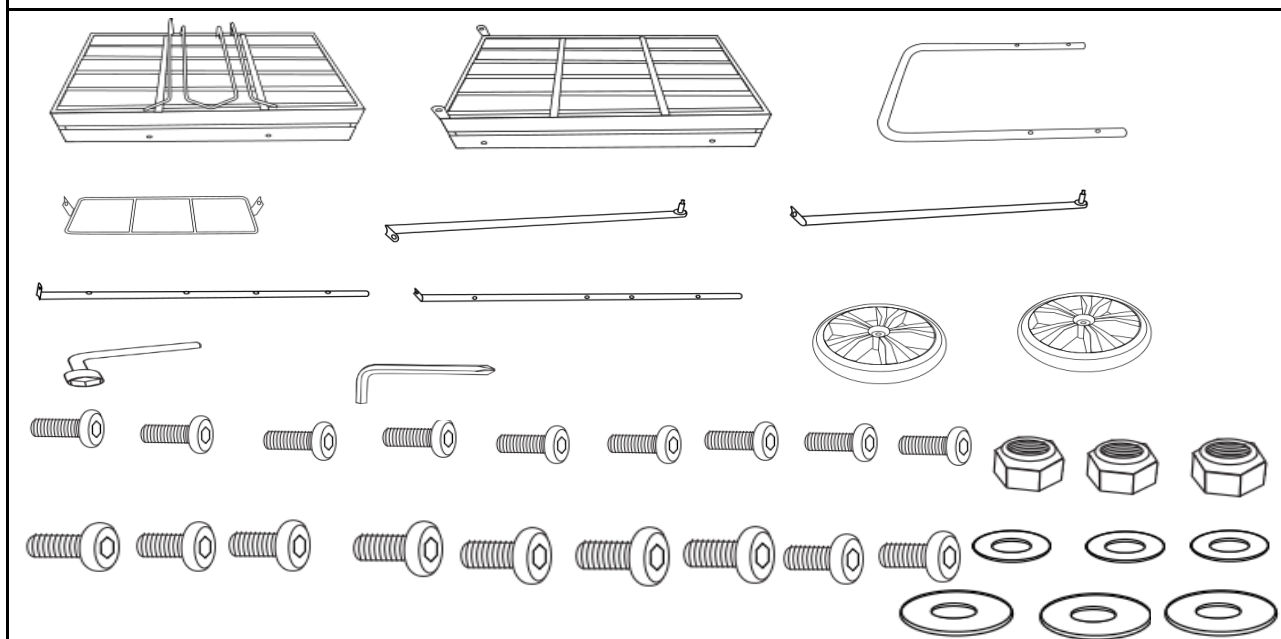

Before Beginning Assembly:

- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



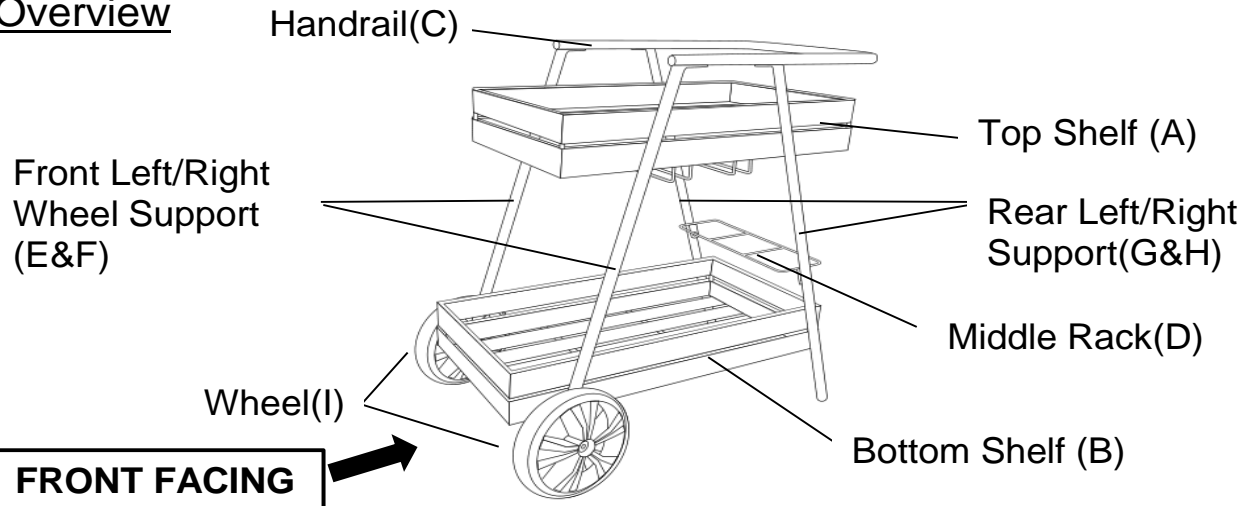
- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



- Save all packaging until finished-

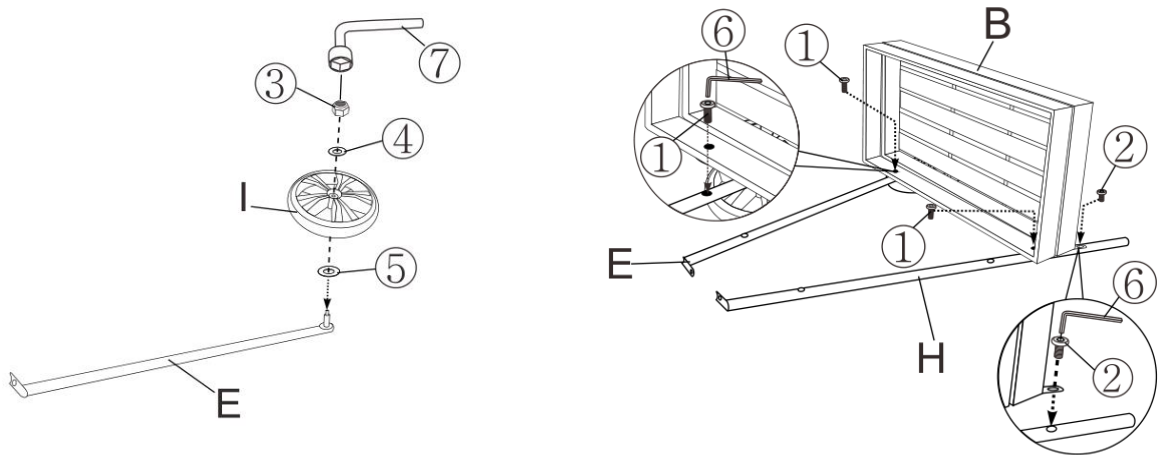
Assembly Steps

Overview



This Bar Cart has multiple parts and may require up to some 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Bar Cart parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions herebelow to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



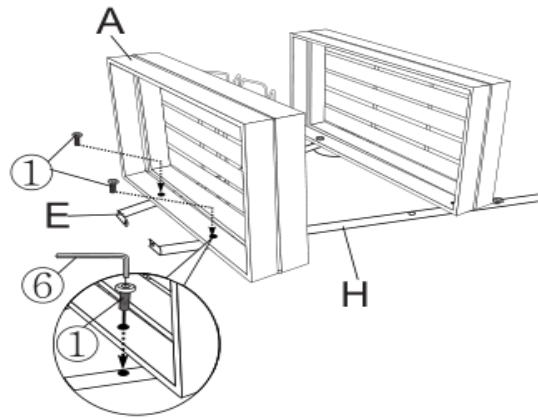
Place the Front Right Wheel Support(E) onto a clean, non-marring surface. Attach the Wheel(I) to the Support(E) using a Washer (④)(⑤) and Nut(③) with the Allen Wrench(⑦), tighten the Nut.

Then, Take out the Rear Right Support(H), Align the Bottom Shelf(B) to the Support(H) and attach it using a Bolt(②) with the Allen Wrench(⑥).

Attach the Bottom Shelf(B) to the Support(E) using a Bolt(①) and the Allen Wrench(⑥).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

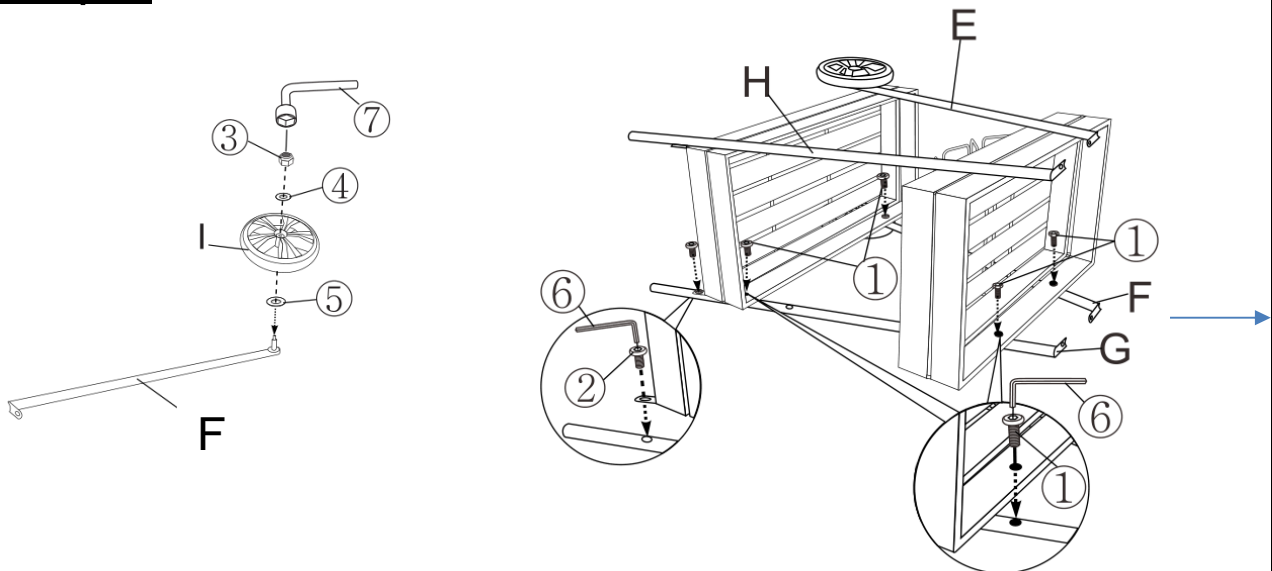
Step 2



Repeat Step 2 to assemble the Top Shelf (A) using Bolts(①) and the Allen Wrench(⑥).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

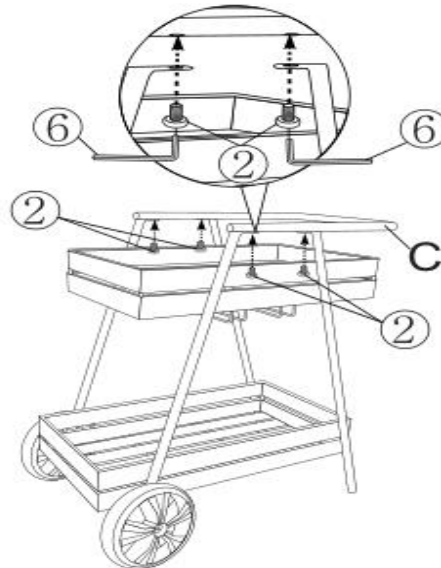
Step 3



Repeat Step 1 to assemble the Wheel(I) to the Front Left Wheel Support(F). Then, align the Support(F)(G) to the Top and Bottom Shelf(A)(B) as shown above, using Bolts(①)(②) and the Allen Wrench(⑥).

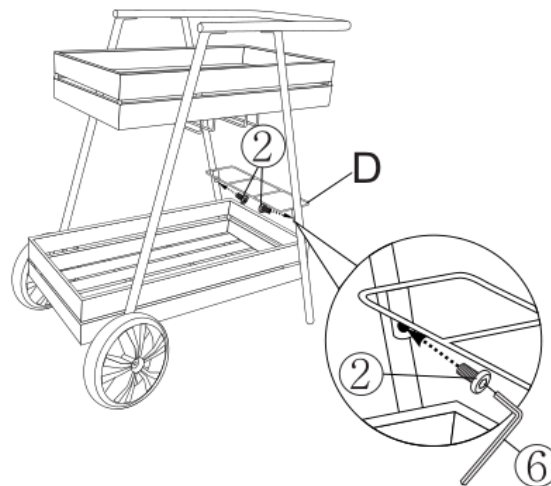
Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

Step 4



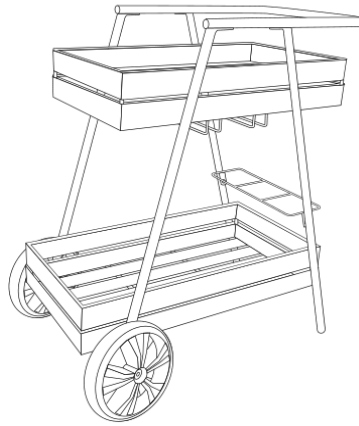
Position the Handrail(C) to the Supports as shown above.
Attach the Handrail(C) to the Supports using Bolts(②) and the Allen Wrench(⑥).
Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

Step 5



Take out the Middle Rack(D), and attach it using Bolts(②) and the Allen Wrench(⑥).
Fully and securely tighten all Bolts.

Step 6



Your Bar Cart is ready for use.

This Bar Cart can only be used on a flat and level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

• What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm.

These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

• What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

• What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
