

Assembly Instructions






Place the Seat&Back (A), Left Back Leg(E) onto a soft surface to avoid any scratches or damages to the product.

Step 1.1) Attach the Left Back Leg (E) to the Bar Chair Seat&Back (A) and secure with 2 Bolt^①, 2 Spring Washer^② and 2 Flat Washer^③ per each leg with Allen Wrench^④.

Step 1.2) Repeat the step of step 1.1, assembly the other Left Front Leg(B), Right Front Leg(C), Right Back Leg(D) as the picture shown.

Do not fully tighten Bolts^① on this step.




Step 2.1)Insert the Back Rail (H) into round housing of the Right Back Leg (D) &Left Back Leg (E) as shown above.

Caution: You may need to apply a little pressure to the Back leg pushing outwards, so as to enable the Back Rail(H) to be slotted into position. If the distance is not enough, need to go back loose the screw on step 1, makes the foot pole has enough space to insert the rail.

Step 2.2)Secure with 2 Screw⁽⁵⁾ per each side rail (F,G,&I).

Tighten Screw[®] only using Screwdriver[®].

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of natural y occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
