


Oscillating Ceramic Heater

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SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When using electrical appliances, basic safety precautions should always be observed, including the following:

- Read all instructions.
- Check that the your mains voltage corresponds with the rating on the appliance.
- The appliance must not be left unattended while it is connected to the mains supply.
- This appliance must be positioned upright on the floor away from curtains, furniture or wall coverings and other flammable items.
- Do not touch hot surfaces. Use the handle at the back of the heater.
- To protect against electrical shock do not immerse cord, plug, or appliance in water or other liquid. Do not operate with wet hands.
- Do not let the cord hangover the edge of a worktop, table etc. or touch hot surfaces.
- Do not operate any appliance with a damaged cord or plug, or after the appliance malfunctions or is dropped or damaged in any manner. The supply cord cannot be replaced. If the cord is damaged the appliance should be scrapped.
- The use of accessory attachments not recommended by the appliance manufacturer may cause fire, electric shock or injury.
- To disconnect remove the plug from the mains outlet. Do not pull the plug out by the cord.
- Never remove parts from the appliance, such as the feet, screws.
- This appliance must never be immersed in water. Never use the appliance near a bath, shower or a swimming pool.
- Never use the appliance on or near hot surface.
- Never place flammable objects or clothing on top of the appliance.
- Allow at least 15cm safe area around the appliance on the top, at the front and sides to provide good air circulation.
- Prevent overheating of the appliance by keeping the air inlets and outlets clean and free of anything that may cause blockage. Check all inlets and outlets from time to time for accumulated dust. DO NOT COVER.
- This heater draws 12.5 amps during operation. To prevent overloading a circuit, do not plug the heater into a circuit that already has other high consumption appliances working.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- Never move the heater when it is operating. Turn the heater off before move it. Never move the appliance by pulling the cord.
- Never use the appliance in a room with explosive gas such as petrol, or while using any kinds of flammable glues, sprays or solvents.
- The appliance must not be used with an extension lead.
- Do not place any part of your body near the air inlet, outlet or on the fins
 ,to avoid personal injury, electric shock or fire.
- If overheating should occur, the built-in overheating safety device will shut the appliance off.
- Caution: Some parts of this product can become very hot and cause burns. Particular attention must be given when children vulnerable people are present.
- Do not insert any foreign objects into the ventilation or exhaust opening as this may cause an electric shock or fire or damage the heater.
- Keep all grills clear of any draped fabric or curtains.
- The appliance must not be located immediately below a mains socket. Do
 not use the appliance with a programmer, timer or any other device that
 switches the appliance on automatically. A fire risk exists if the appliance
 is covered or positioned incorrectly.
- Do not operate this appliance for any thing other than its intended use.
- This appliance is not intended for commercial use
- This product is intended for household use only. Do not use outdoors.
- This product is only intended for heating.
- Warning: It is hazardous for anyone other than a competent person to carry out any service or repair operation which involves the removal of a cover which gives protection against exposure to electrical parts.
- Warning: Children should not use this appliance. Close supervision is necessary when any appliances are used near children.
- This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- Children of less than 3 years should be kept away unless continuously supervised.
- Children aged from 3 years and less than 8 years shall only switch on/off the appliance provided that it has been placed or installed in its intended normal operating position and they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children aged from 3 years and less than 8 years shall not plug in, regulate and clean the appliance or perform user maintenance.
- Warning: This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety. Children should be supervised to make sure that they do not play with the appliance.

Electrical Safety

- Before switching on, make sure that the voltage of your electricity supply is the same as that indicated on the rating plate. This product is designed to operate on 220 – 240V AC; 50/60Hz. Connection to any other power source may damage the unit.
- This product may be fitted with a non re-wireable plug. If it is necessary to change the fuse in the plug, the fuse cover must be refitted. If the fuse cover becomes lost or damaged, the plug must not be used until a suitable replacement is obtained.
- If the plug has to be changed because it is not suitable for your socket, or becomes damaged in any way, it should be cut off and an appropriate plug fitted. This should be carried out by a qualified electrician. The plug removed must be disposed of safely, as insertion into a socket is likely to cause an electrical hazard.

BATTERY REPLACEMENT INFORMATION


This appliance comes with 2 AAA (1.5V) batteries which are to be fitted into the remote.



CAUTION: Batteries are a chemical burn and choking hazard. Keep batteries away from children.


- Ensure that the battery compartment is always completely secure.
 If the battery compartment does not close securely, stop using the remote, remove the batteries, and keep it away from children.
- If you think batteries might have been swallowed or placed inside any part of the body, seek immediate medical attention. Dispose of cells properly and keep away from children. Even used cells may cause injury.
- Please dispose of or recycle the remote control batteries according to municipal or provincial laws.

To place the batteries into the remote/replace the batteries please follow the instructions below:



- 1. Remove the cover from the back of the remote.
- 2. Insert 2 AAA (1.5V) batteries as shown above.
- 3. Replace the cover onto the back of the remote.





WARNING: In order to avoid overheating, do not cover the heater.

CONTROL PANEL & REMOTE





- A. Auto ON/OFF timer button
- B. Power ON/OFF button
- C. Oscillation button
- D. Temperature/timer increase button
- E. Mode/heat level button
- F. Temperature/timer decrease button
- G. Mode/heat level display light
- H. Digit display light
- I. Temperature display light
- J. Timer display light
- K. Power indicator display light
- L. Oscillation display light
- M. Mute/unmute button

Before connecting your appliance to the mains socket, position the appliance upright on the floor, at least 90cm away from the wall, curtains, furniture or wall coverings.

Insert the mains plug into a suitable wall mains socket. The unit will then enter standby mode, as shown with a beep and the power indicator lit up in red. Your heater is now ready for use.



Power On/Off Button

- Press the "Power On/Off" button on the appliance/remote control once to turn the heater on with default settings: High mode and a temperature setting of $35C^{\circ}$.
- Press the "Power On/Off" button again to turn off the heater. If the display has turned off, press the button twice to turn the heater off. If the heater has been operating it will take 15 seconds for the heater to shut off, with the countdown time shown on the display.



Mode/Heat Level + Child Lock (3 second press) Button

- When the unit is on, repeatedly press the "Mode/Heat Level" button on the appliance/remote control to cycle through the modes: High (HI) ->Low(LO)-> ECO (ECO) -> MAX (MAX) -> Fan Only (♣).
- When "ECO" mode is turned on, the heater will adjust between the "High" and "Low" modes automatically based on the ambient temperature.
- The temperature can be set and adjusted on "High", "Low", and "ECO" mode, but not on "MAX" mode.
- When the set temperature is reached, the display will flash and the heater will stop working. When the ambient temperature is lower than the set temperature, the heater will start working again.

Hold the "Mode/Heat Level" button for 3 seconds to turn the Child Lock function on/off. The appliance will beep twice to confirm that the Child Lock function is enabled or disabled.

Adjustment Buttons



- When the unit is on, press the "+" or "-" buttons on the appliance/remote control to adjust the temperature from 5 to 36° C in 1° C increments. If you rapidly press or hold down the "+" or "-" buttons, the temperature will change rapidly.
- The adjustment buttons can also be used to adjust the timer, as described below.



Auto ON/OFF Timer Button

- To set the timer for the appliance to automatically turn off, follow the below: When the unit powered on, first press the "Auto ON/OFF Timer" button, and then use the "+" or "-" buttons on the appliance/remote control to adjust the hours on the timer. The timer will cycle through 00, 01, 02... up to 24 hours. If you rapidly press or hold down the "+" or "-" buttons, the temperature will change rapidly.
- Once the time has been selected, it will confirm this automatically.
- When the time is up, the appliance will automatically stop running.
- The timer can also be set to turn the appliance on by following the instructions below: plug the appliance in and while it is in stand-by mode, follow the same instructions as above on how to set the timer.

- When the time is up, the appliance will automatically turn on.
- To cancel the timer setting, press the "Auto ON/OFF
 Timer" button on the heater and the timer indicator
 light will flash. If the display has turned off, press the
 button twice.
- Then press the "Auto ON/OFF Timer" button again and the timer setting will adjust to "00" hours.
- When the heater has been working for 24 hours continuously without any operations being changed/adjusted, it will automatically shut off.
- To turn off the auto shut off function, touch the "Auto ON/OFF Timer" button for 3 seconds; the appliance will beep twice and the auto off function is now off.
- To turn the auto off function back on, touch the "Auto ON/OFF Timer" button for 3 seconds; the appliance will beep twice and the auto off function is now on.
- **NOTE:** Once the heater is turned off at the mains/unplugged, this will reset and the auto shut off function will again be turned on.



Oscillation Button

- When the appliance is turned on press the "Oscillation" button on the appliance/remote control once to start the oscillating.
- If you would like to turn off the LED display, touch the "Oscillation" button on the appliance for 3 seconds.
 The appliance will beep twice and the display will be turned off.
- To turn the display back on, touch the "Oscillation" button on the appliance again for 3 seconds. Two beeps will sound and the display will be turned on.

Remote Control Buttons

The buttons on the remote control work the same as the ones on the appliance, except for the child-lock function, 24 hour auto shut off cancellation, display turn off function.

The remote also features a mute button.



Mute Button

- When the appliance is turned on press the "Mute" button on the remote control once to turn off the buzzer.
- Press the "Mute" button again to turn back on the buzzer.

PLEASE NOTE: Once the appliance has been in use, if there is no operation within 30 seconds, then the display will automatically turn off with only the power indicator light on display. To wake the appliance up press any button.

Other Functions

Memory Function - If the heater is turned off then on again, it will resume operation in the mode it was in before it was turned off. If the heater is unplugged then plugged back in again, it will default to the original settings.

Tip-Over Protection - When the heater is tipped over, the heater will automatically shut off and show the error code "**P4**" on the LED display. Place the heater on a flat, level, and stable surface and turn the heater on again.

Overheat Protection - When the ambient temperature is above 50° C, the appliance will stop heating, 2 beeps will sound and the error code "**FF**" will show on the LED display.

CLEANING AND CARE

WARNING: Electrical Shock Hazard.

Before you clean the appliance, disconnect the mains plug from the wall socket.

- Allow the appliance to cool down completely before cleaning.
- Do not immerse cord, plug or appliance in any liquid or allow moisture to come into contact with electrical parts.
- Clean the outer surface using a moist cloth and wipe over with a dry, soft cloth.
- Do not use harsh detergents, abrasives or spray on cleaners.
- Don't allow water to seep into the openings or come into contact with electrical connections.
- Allow sufficient drying time before operating again.
- Clean the air inlets and outlets regularly with a vacuum cleaner using the brush attachment (with a regular use, at least twice a year).
- When the appliance is not in use. We recommend that the heater is re-packed in its original packaging and stored in a cool, dry place.

PROBLEM SOLVING



WARNING: To reduce the risk of personal injury, always unplug the appliance before performing maintenance or trouble shooting checks.

The following troubleshooting guide addresses the most common problems. If the problems persist, please contact Customer Services.

CONNECTION TO THE MAINS SUPPLY


This appliance is designed to operate from a mains supply of 220-240V AC 50/60Hz.

Check that the voltage marked on the product corresponds with your supply voltage.

How to change the fuse

- 1. Slot the end of a screwdriver into the recess in the fuse holder of the plug.
- 2. Pull the fuse holder upwards until free of the plug and slide the fuse out.
- 3. Replace the fuse and replace fuse holder, pushing down until locked into place.

Important: Only ever use a 13 amp fuse.


