02 Safety Information

1. To reduce the risk of electric shock, ensure the electricity has been turned off at the circuit breaker or fuse box before you begin.
2. All wiring must be in accordance with the National Electrical Code ANSI/NFPA 70-1999 and local electrical codes. Electrical installation should be performed by a qualified licensed electrician.
3. The outlet box and support structure must be securely mounted and capable of reliably supporting 35 lbs. (15.9 kg). Use only UL Listed outlet boxes marked "Acceptable for Fan Support of 35 lbs. (15.9 kg) or less".
4. The fan must be mounted with a minimum of 7 ft. (2.1 m) clearance from the trailing edge of the blades to the floor.
5. Do not place objects in the path of the blades.
6. To avoid personal injury or damage to the fan and other items, use caution when working around or cleaning the fan.
7. Electrical diagrams are for reference only. Light kits that are not packed with the fan must be UL-listed and marked suitable for use with the model fan you are installing. Switches must be UL General Use Switches. Refer to the instructions packaged with the light kits and switches for proper assembly.
8. After making electrical connections, spliced conductors should be turned upward and pushed carefully up into the outlet box. The wires should be spread apart with the grounded conductor and the equipment-grounding conductor on one side of the outlet box.
9. All setscrews must be checked and re-tightened where necessary before installation.



WARNING: To reduce the risk of personal injury, do not bend the blade brackets (also referred to as flanges) during assembly or after installation. Do not insert objects in the path of the blades.



WARNING: To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, this fan is NOT suitable for use with solid-state speed controls.



WARNING: To avoid possible electrical shock, make sure that the electricity is turned off at the main power box before starting work. If you feel you do not have enough electrical wiring knowledge or experience, contact a licensed electrician.



WARNING: Electrical diagrams are for reference only. Optional use of any light kit shall be UL-listed and marked suitable for use with this fan



WARNING: To reduce the risk of fire, electrical shock or personal injury, ensure that the fan mounting bracket is supported directly from the building structure or the outlet box marked "Acceptable for Fan Support of 35 lbs. (15.9 kg) or less". Use only the screws provided with the outlet box.



Warning: Do not test the fan before affixing the blades. The DC motor needs a load to rotate properly. Affixing blades and then testing the fans.

03 Warranty

The supplier warrants the fan motor to be free from defects in workmanship and material present at time of shipment from the factory for a lifetime after the date of purchase by the original purchaser. The supplier also warrants that all other fan parts, excluding any glass or acrylic blades, to be free from defects in workmanship and material at the time.

of shipment from the factory for a period of two years after the date of purchase by the original purchaser. We agree to correct such defects without charge or at our option replace with a comparable or superior model if the product is returned.

To obtain warranty service, you must present a copy of the receipt as proof of purchase. All costs of removing and re-installing the product are your responsibility. Damage to any part such as by accident, misuse, improper installation, or by affixing any accessories, is not covered by this warranty.

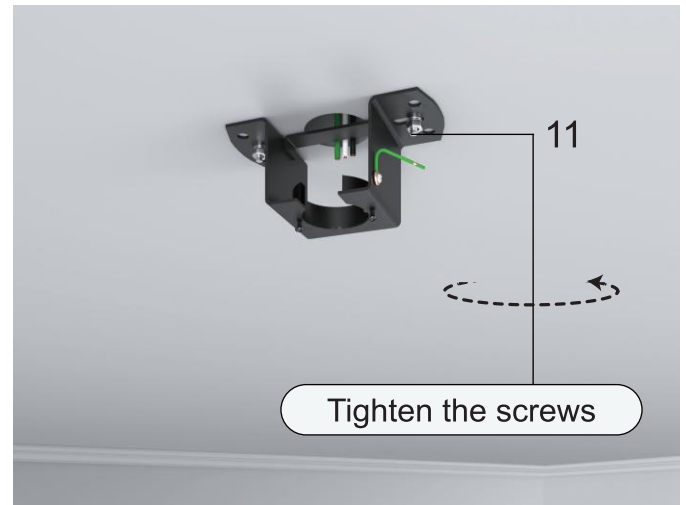
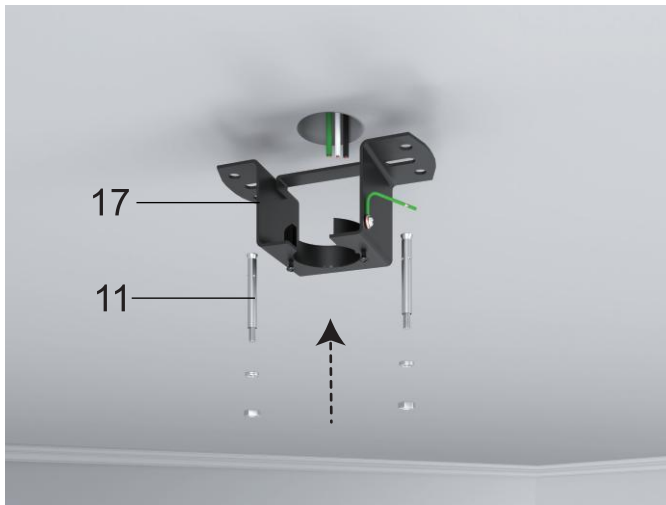

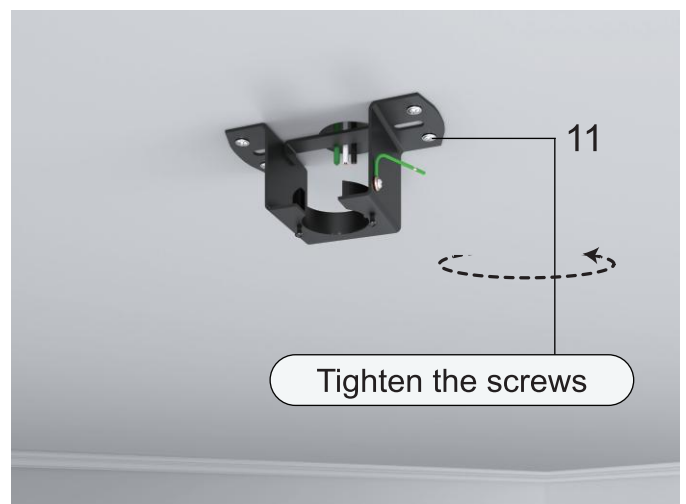
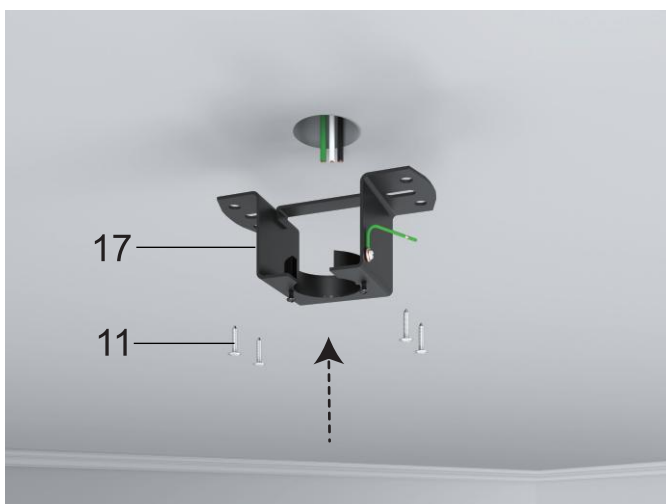
Concrete Ceiling Mounting Bracket



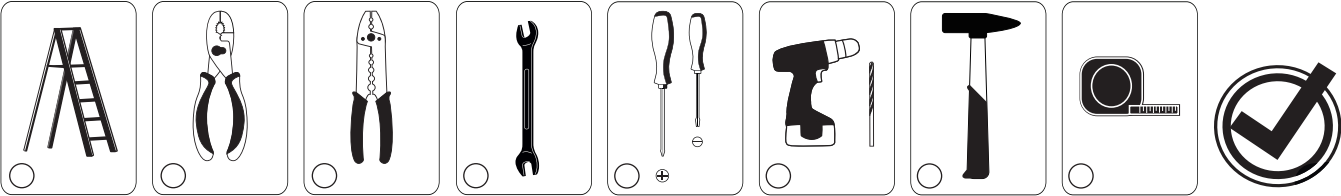
Hanger for Junction Box Mounting Bracket



Wooden ceiling Mounting Bracket

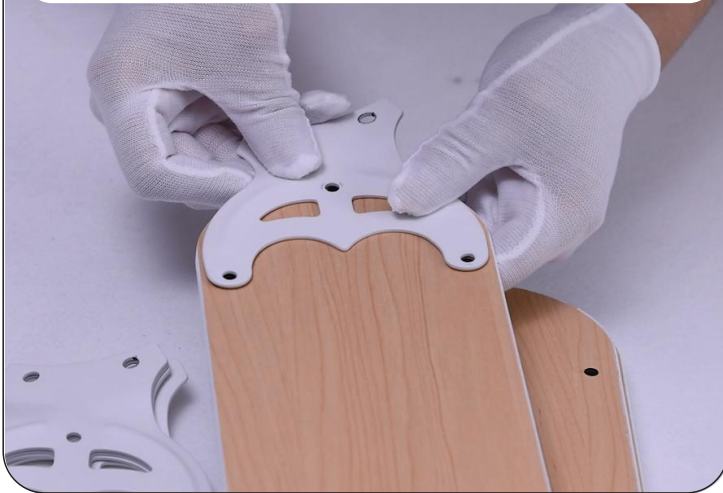

06 Installation procedure

1. Put the blade arm onto one blade and align the holes



2. Put the blade washer on the back of the blade and align the holes



3. Insert the blade screws into the holes and tighten each blade screw; Repeat these steps for the remaining blades



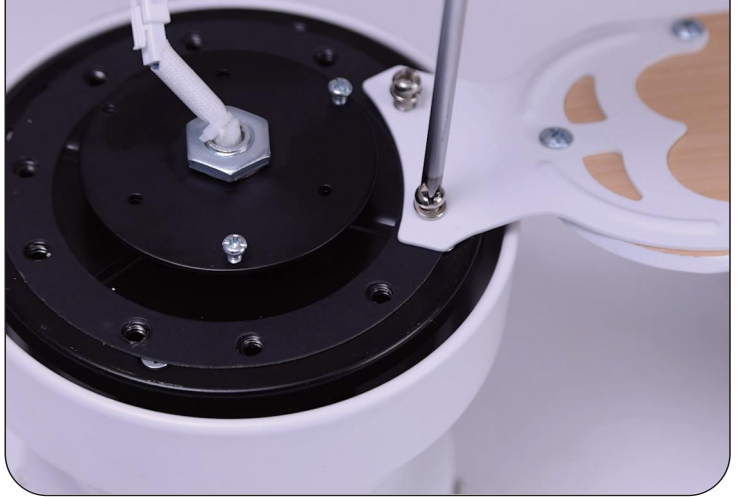
4. Remove the ten blade screws on the motor



5. Remove the first light kit screw and loosen the two light kit screws pre-locked on the motor(They will be needed later.)



6. Attach the blades using the ten blade screws and tighten the blade screws

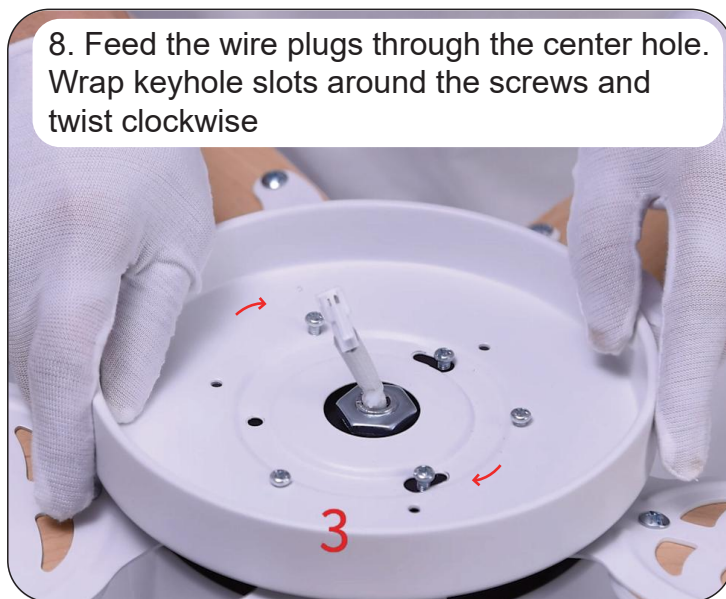

7. Install all the blades



8. Feed the wire plugs through the center hole. Wrap keyhole slots around the screws and twist clockwise



9. Insert the third light kit screw, and then tighten all three light kit screws



10. Remove the three light kit screws on light plate



11. Connect the light source with the wires from the motor



12. Insert three light kit screws, and then tighten them

01.Downrod installation method

If you want a ceiling fan with downrod, please follow this step.
If you want a low profile ceiling fan, please skip to page 14.

13. Remove the lock pin and the bolt of the base of the downrod



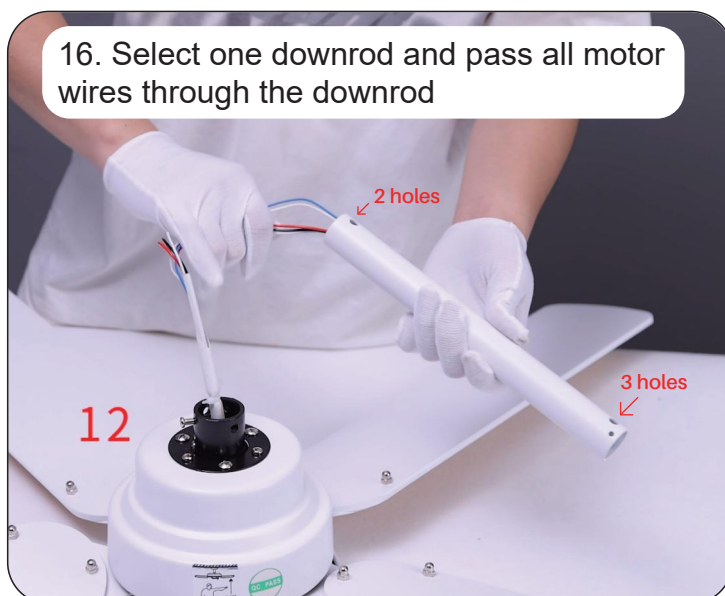
14. Remove two screws and ground wire on the hanger ball. Remove the hanger ball and bolt



15. Loosen the screws.

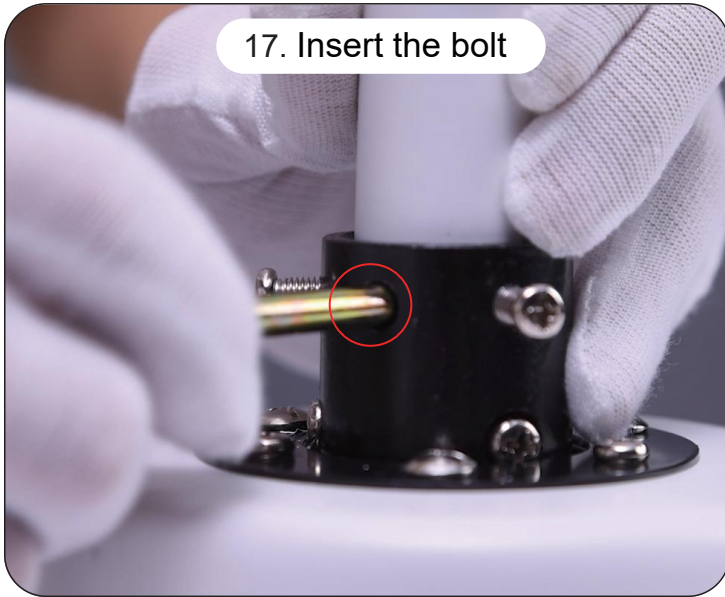


16. Select one downrod and pass all motor wires through the downrod

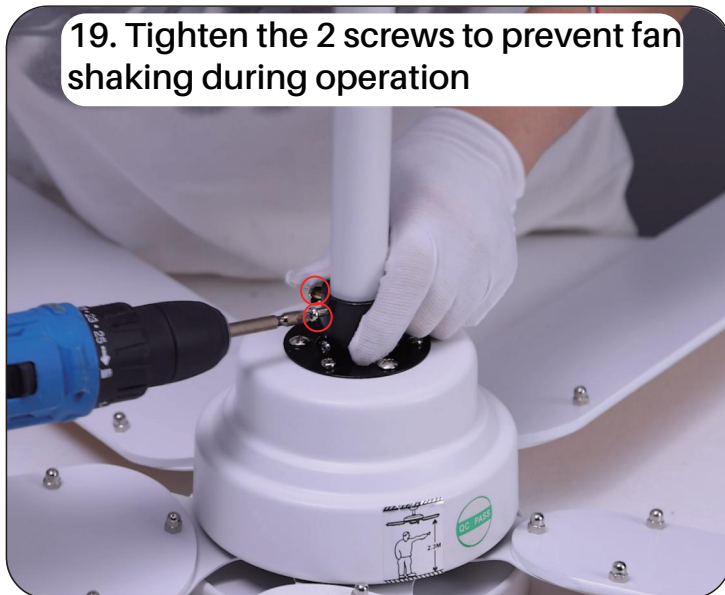
17. Insert the bolt



18. Fix the bolt with the lock pin



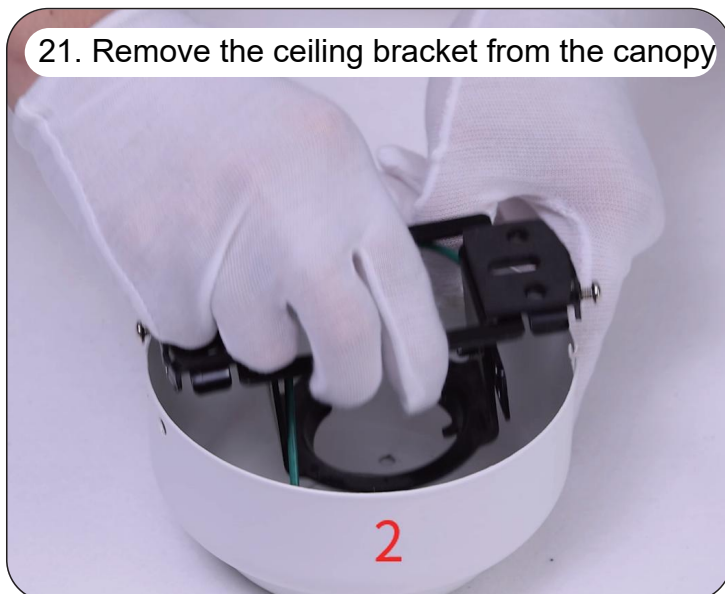
19. Tighten the 2 screws to prevent fan shaking during operation

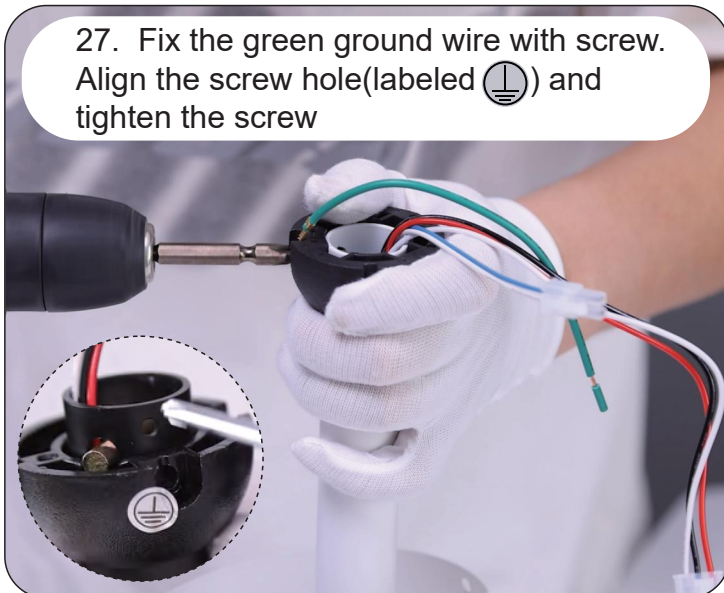

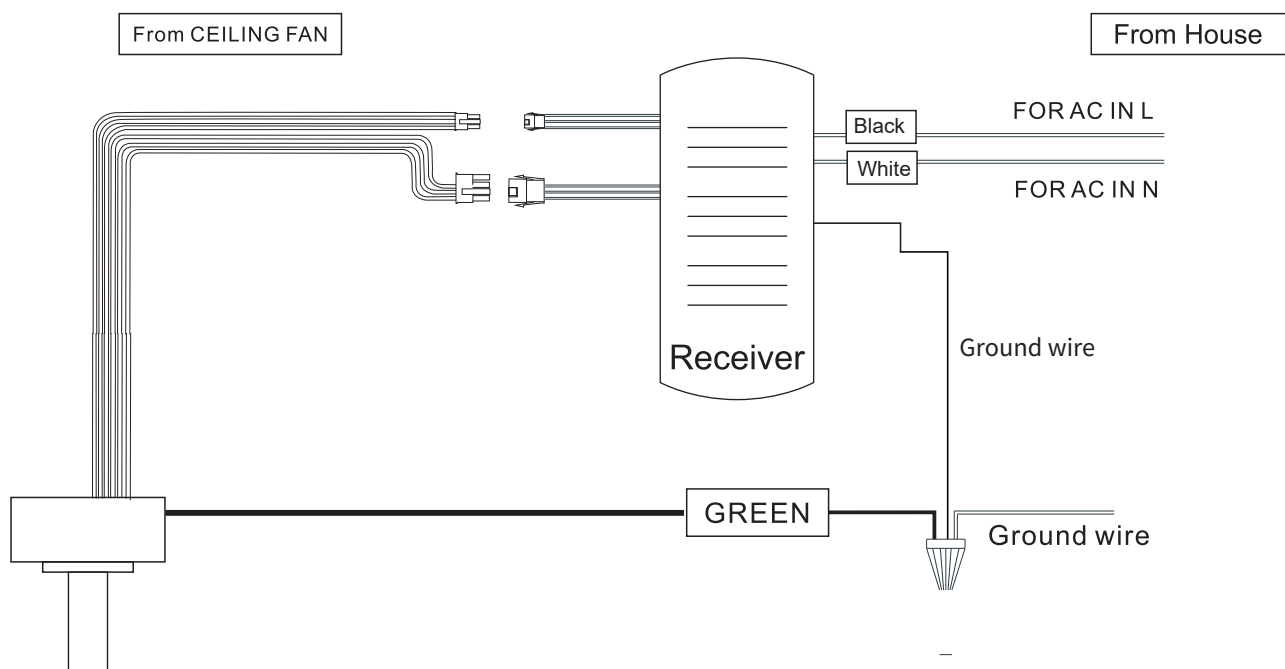
28. Install the ceiling bracket with four self tapping screws. (Is your ceiling different? Check out the guide at the page of 4.)



29. Place the downrod ball into the ceiling bracket. Be sure the fixation slot is locked by the bracket. If not, rotate the ball until the fixation slot is locked

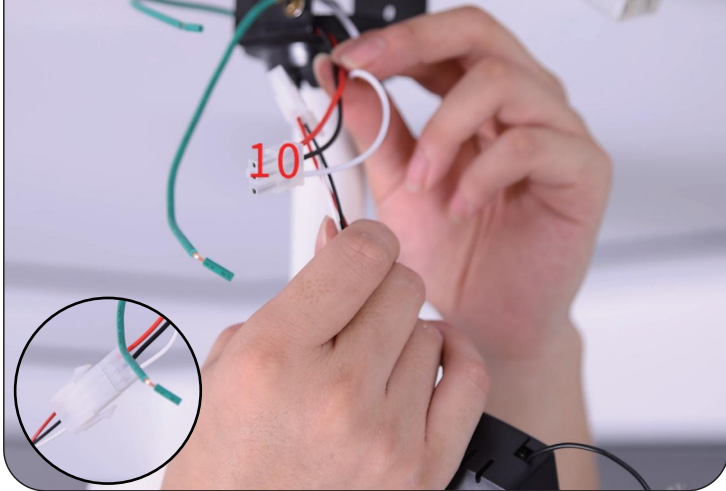


1. Connect the wire which from ceiling fan into the receiver.
2. Connect the wire from receiver with the wire from house.

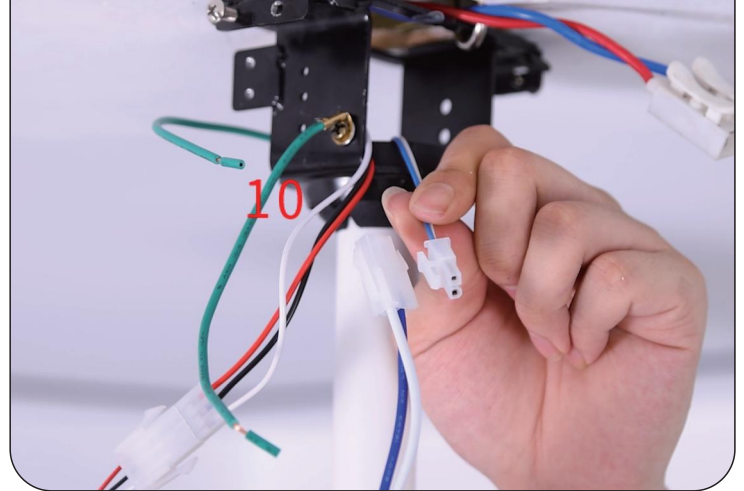

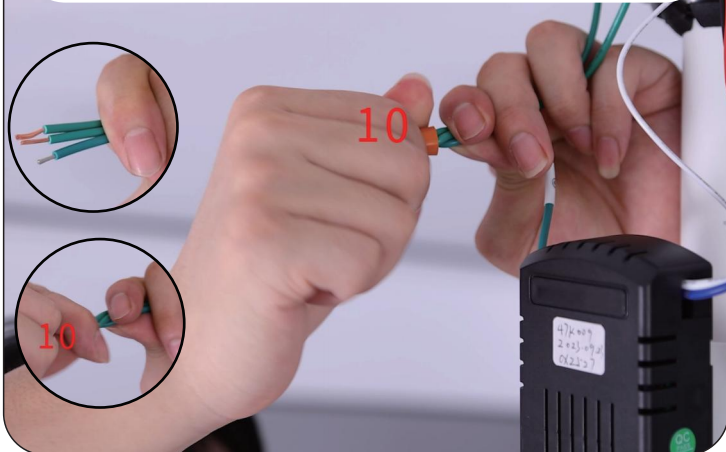

31. Connect the wire from the ceiling fan to the receiver(White and Blue wires)



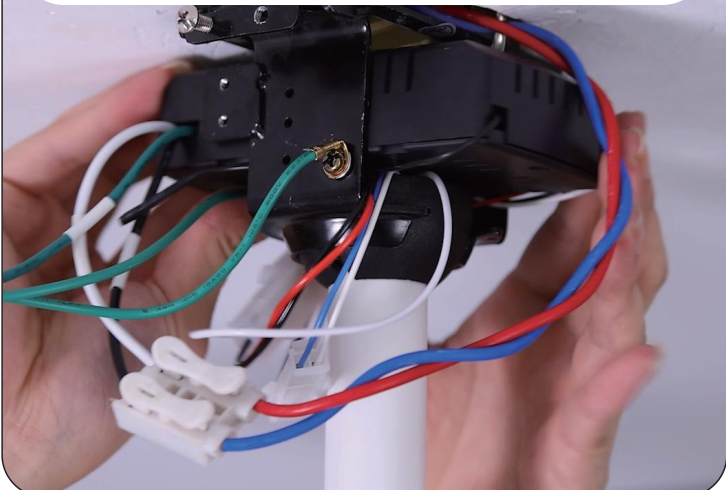
32. Use wire connecting nuts to connect the three ground wires(green) coming from the downrod, receiver and ceiling bracket

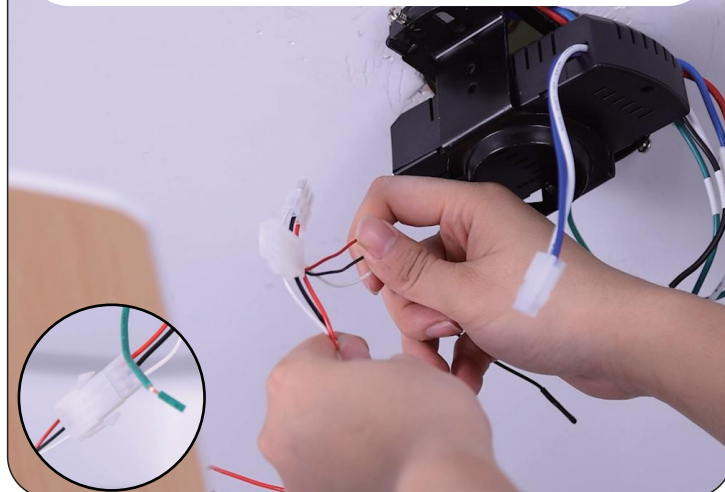

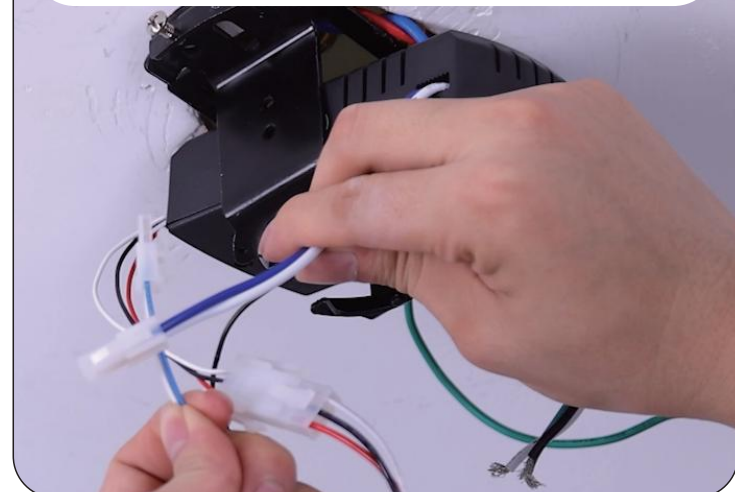

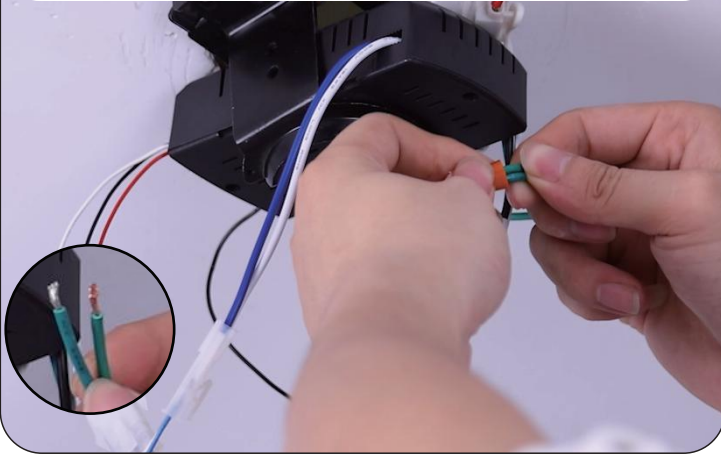

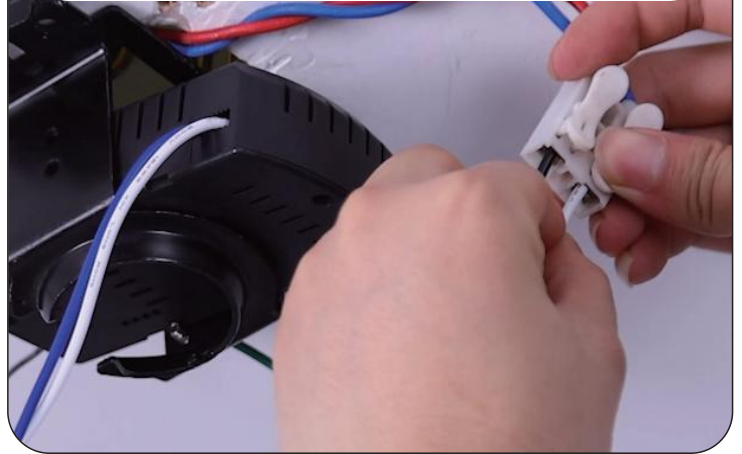

USER MANUAL FOR REMOTE CONTROL TRANSMITTER



(1) Turn OFF the Fan and Light

Turn OFF the Fan and Light together.

(2) Fan speed

Press the key 1-6 to start the fan.

(3) Timing control of the Fan & Light

- Press the key to set up the timer at 1 hour, 4 hours or 8 hours to set up fan and lamp timer. At the end of the timing, the fan and lamp will be automatically turned off.
- When the timing function is in effect, you can operate all the functions of the ceiling fan, and then press any timing button to recalculate the timing time.
- Timer setting cancellation : When timing function is working, press key(1) to cancel the timing function.

(4) Anti-theft mode

Press the key to turn on or turn off Anti-theft mode:

Every three hours, the light will automatically turn on and go out after 30 minutes. Press the key again to cancel.

(5) Color temperature Switch of the light

Press the key to change LED light color : white-yellow-warm (circulate).

(6) Light dimming

When the light is on, press and hold the key, the light gradually brightened - gradually dimmed(circulate).

(7) Direction of the fan

Press the key to change direction of the fan.

(8) Natural wind

Press the key, the fan speed automatic change between 1 to 6 speed.

(9) Fan OFF / Remote control pairing

- Turn OFF the fan.
- **Remote control pairing** : when AC power on, press and hold the key for 3-5 seconds, then finish the remote control pairing.

Notice:

The remote controller only needs to be paired once. After the paired product, the controller will have memory. The products have been paired before leaving the factory. When the remote control is damaged or lost, it is necessary to implement remote control pairing before using a new remote control.

(10) Turn ON/OFF the Light

(11) Fan speed and Timing time indicator

The indicator light will light up when press any key of the remote control

(12) AAA battery * 2

- Please install 2 pieces of AAA batteries before use.
- Please remove the battery when it is not used for a long time.

Note: the remote control must match the same code r

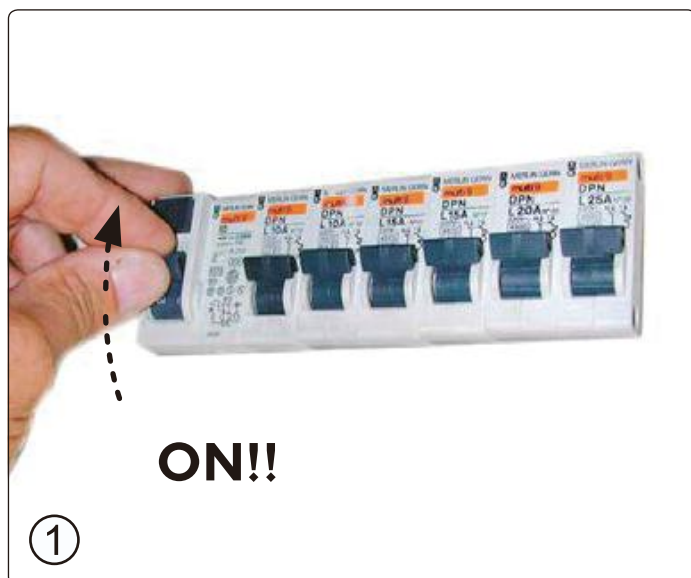


When the reversible button is pressed, the fan slowly slows down to a stop and then begins to reverse.

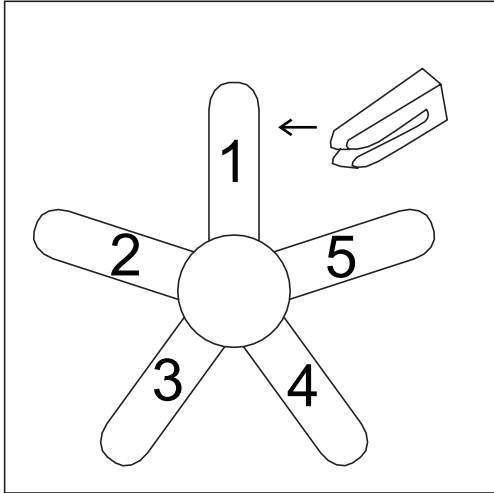

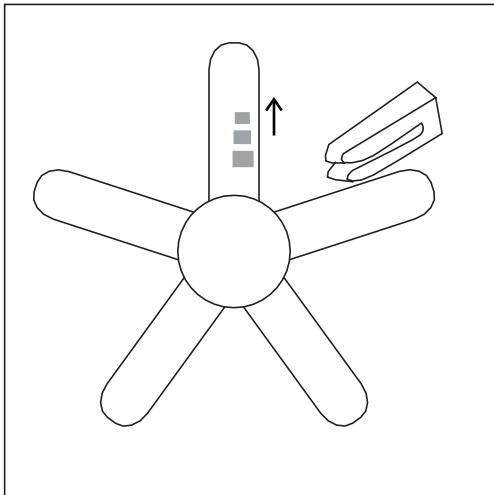

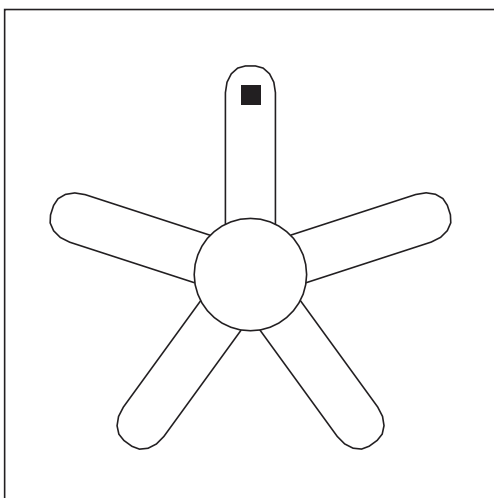
09 Fans Balance



Put the clip in the center of a blade. turn on the fan and if the shake persists, put the clip in another blade until the shake is reduced. Then this blade will need the counterweight.



Place the clip on the blade that needs t counterweight and try the best place t place it, from the center to the tip of th blade, until the wobble disappears.



Paste the counterweight on the surface of the blade which near the clip, remove the clip and test the fan. If it keep staggering put another counterweight. if it gets worse, try another better area to place it. please try it patiently till the fan is balanc

10 Care and Cleaning



WARNING: Make sure the power is off before cleaning your fan.

- Because of the fan's natural movement, some connections may become loose. Check the support connections, brackets, and blade attachments twice a year. Make sure they are secure. It is not necessary to remove the fan from the ceiling.
- Clean your fan periodically to help maintain its new appearance over the years. Do not use water when cleaning, as this could damage the motor, or the wood, or possibly cause an electrical shock. Use only a soft brush or lint-free cloth to avoid scratching the finish. The plating is sealed with a lacquer to minimize discoloration or tarnishing.
- You can apply a light coat of furniture polish to the wood for additional protection and enhanced beauty. Cover small scratches with a light application of shoe polish.
- You do not need to oil your fan. The motor has permanently-lubricated sealed ball bearings.

11 Trouble shooting

Problem	Solution
The fan will not start.	□ Check the main and branch circuit fuses or breakers. □ Check the line wire connections to the fan and switch wire connections in the switch housing.
The fan is noisy.	□ Ensure all motor housing screws are snug. □ Ensure the screws that attach the fan blade bracket to the motor hub are tight. □ Ensure the wire nut connetions are not ratting against each other or the interior wall of the switch housing. □ Allow a 24-hour "breaking in" period. Most noises associated with a new fan disappear during this time. □ If you are using the Ceiling Fan light kit,ensure the screws securing the glassware are tight.Check that the light bulbs are also secure. □ Ensure the canopy is a short distance from the ceiling.It should not touch the ceiling. □ Ensure your outlet box is secure and rubber isolator pads wereused between the mounting plate and outlet box.
