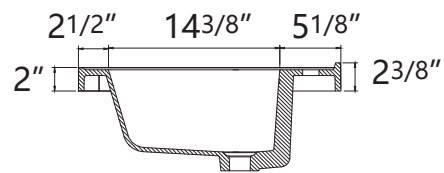


COUNTERTOP SIZE

Top View

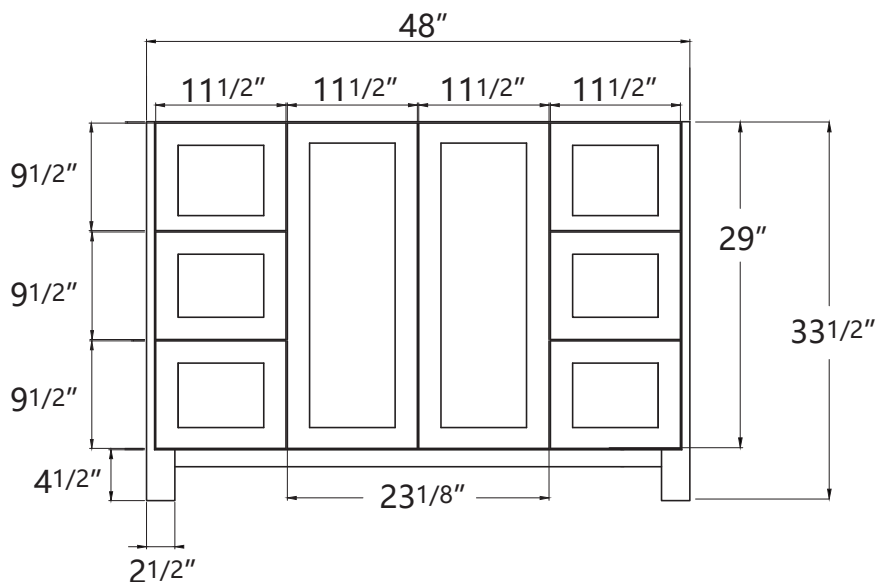


Front View

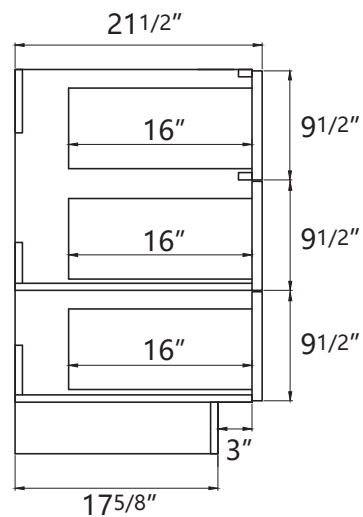

PRE-ASSEMBLY

- 4. Remove the old vanity:** If there is an existing vanity, you will need to disconnect the plumbing, remove the sink, and take out the old vanity.

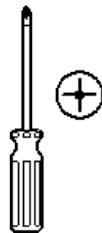

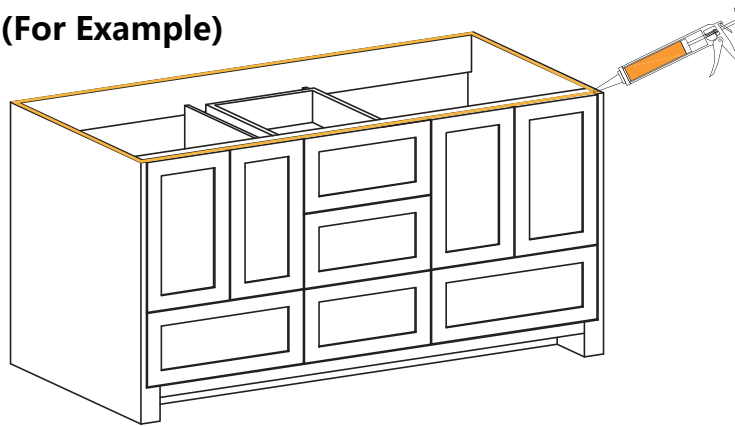

INSTALLATION STEPS

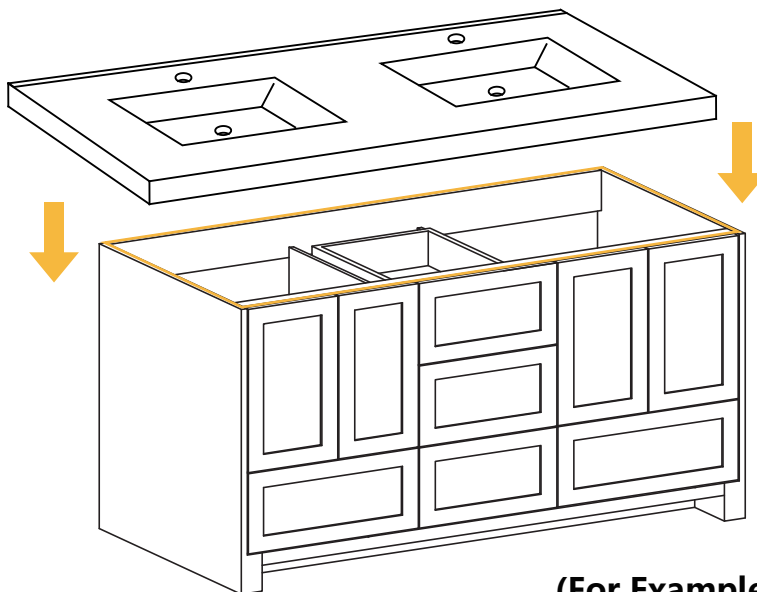
1. Prepare the Vanity: Make sure the vanity is in place and securely attached to the wall.

2. Seal the Edges: To prevent water damage and ensure a clean finish, apply a bead of silicone caulk along the edges where the countertop meets the vanity.

3. Attach the Countertop: Secure the solid surface countertop on the vanity.

4.Position the Countertop: Carefully place the countertop on top of the vanity, ensuring it is centered and aligned correctly.

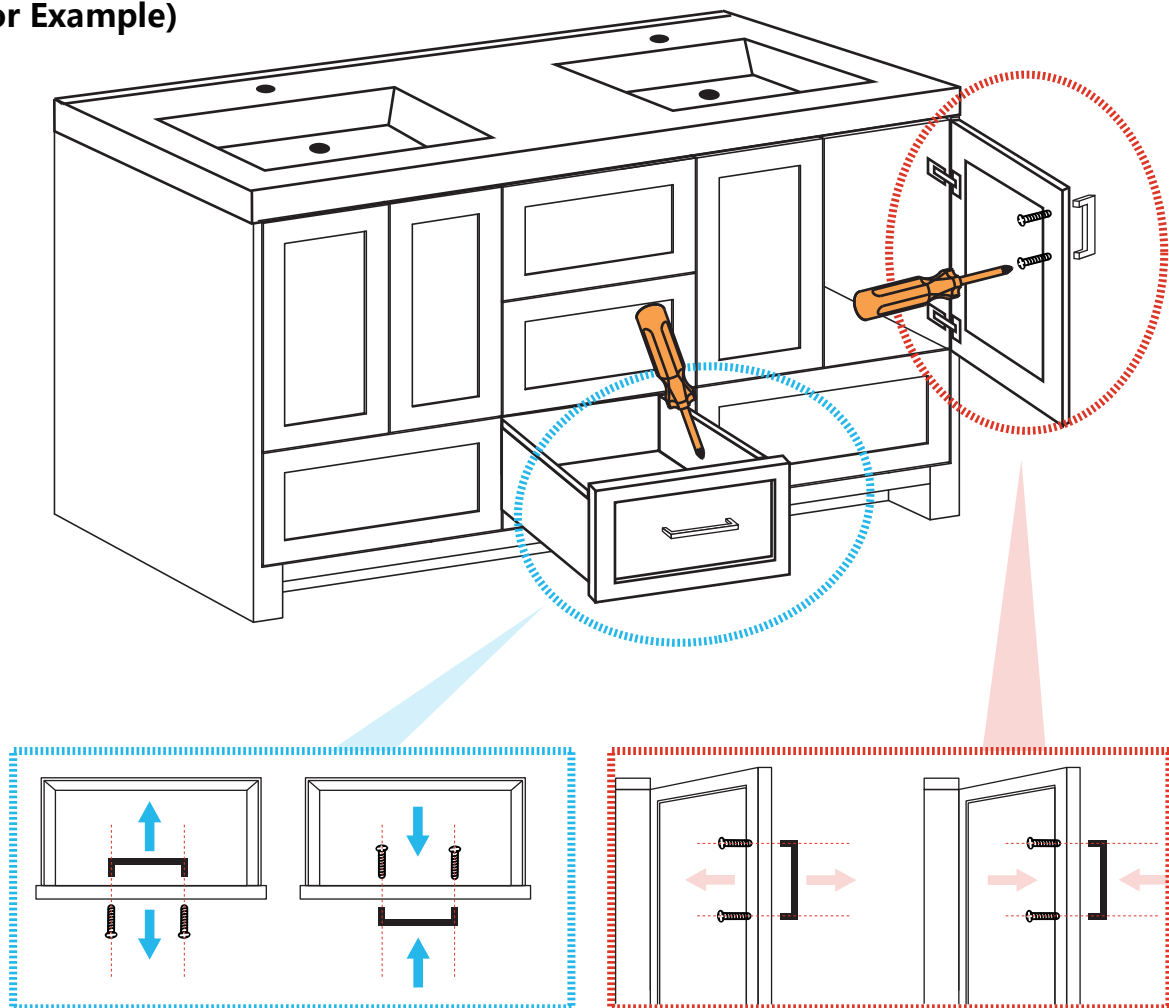

7.Finish Up: Clean any excess caulk and ensure that the countertop is clean and ready for use.

8.Install the handle: loosen the screw of the handle which pre-installed inside the vanity, and take it out, according to the same location to install the handle on the opposite side of the cabinet surface.

CARE & MAINTAINCE
