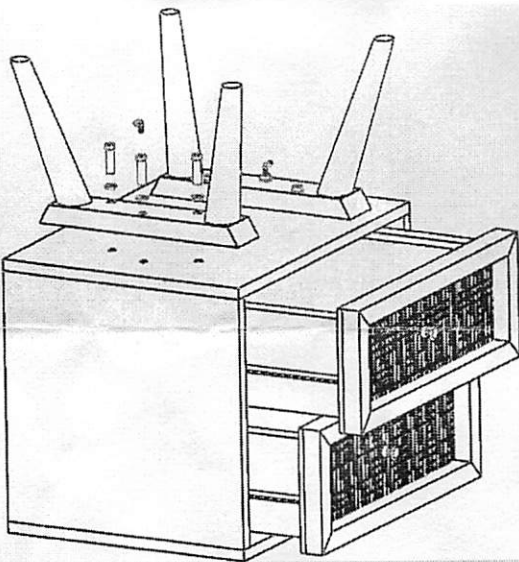


# ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

Please read instructions carefully. Remove all wrapping material, staples and packing straps from the carton. See Hardware and Furniture Parts List for guidance. Be sure you have all parts before you start assembling. Place all wooden furniture parts on a clean and flat soft surface, such as carpet or rug to prevent from being scratched.

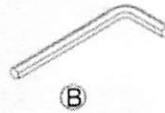


## PARTS INCLUDED

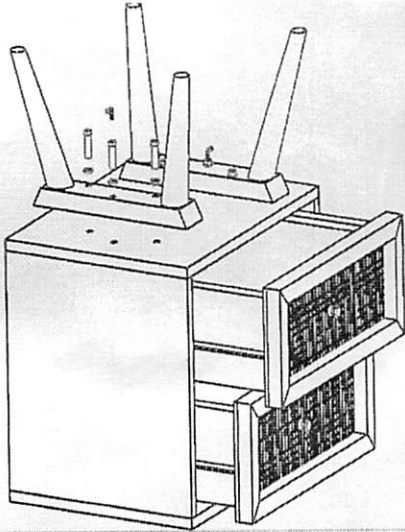
A. BOLT	:	6 Pcs

C. WASHER	:	6 Pcs



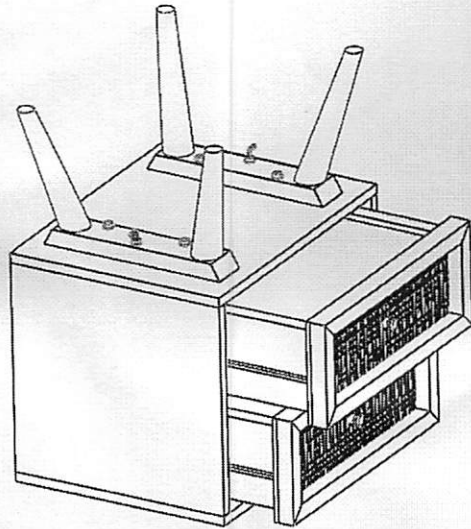
## **FOR ASSEMBLY**

- First, check the content to make sure that nothing is missing.
- Sort out the parts and fittings as shown, assemble product step by step.
- It is preferable to rest the product on a soft surface to avoid damage during assembly.
- Do not overtighten screws and fittings.
- Re-tighten all screws and fittings periodically.

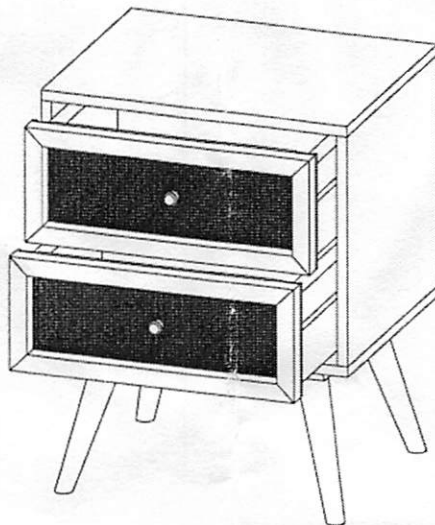

## Wood Characteristics

Wood is a natural product and will have small knots, burrs and inconsistent grains. These occur when the tree grows in the forest, and may still be visible in even the most meticulously selected wood - This should not be seen as a blemish but the proof of the highly individual nature of this fine material.

Wood will continue to expand and contract throughout the year and will adjust to its surroundings; slight movement between panels and hairline cracks within the grain will occur. This is totally natural and is expected from a natural material such as wood e.g. hairline cracks in the grooves or slight movement in panels or tenon joints are a commonplace.

All wood surfaces will change color and mellow over time. New furniture will initially vary in shade from items that have been previously purchased with the same finish. Color variance between solids and veneers may be visible; every effort is made to reduce this variance in the manufacturing process.

Some furniture may use filler to reduce visibility of joint lines. This is all part of the manufacturing process to assure the highest visual finish to your furniture.

Furniture finishes can vary; some ranges of furniture may require an antiqued look. The surface of this Wood will be purposely dented, scratched and left rough; this completes the look of the furniture and adds another completely unique element to your furniture.

Each piece of furniture is unique and will not be identical to the rest of the pieces in the range. Not one piece of wood is the same; it's your own personal piece.

## Caring for your furniture

Please do not use abrasive cleaners or silicone-based products on your product as this may damage the surface.

A soft cloth should be used for cleaning. We do not recommend the yellow duster type as these can leave fibers on the surface.

Always use mats and coasters with cork/felt backing when placing hot items onto the surface of your product. Avoid mats and coasters with plastic/rubber backs/feet they can leave un-reversible marks on your furniture surface over time.

Never use sharp items on the surface of the product; knives and utensils may damage the wood. It is advisable to place a mat under paper when writing.

Never overload an item such as a shelf that may be beyond what the shelf is reasonably expected to hold.

Any liquid spilled onto the item should be cleaned up immediately using an absorbent cloth. Please ensure the surface is completely dry.

Please do not sit or place an amount of weight onto the edge of a tabletop as this may cause the table to tip.

Never attempt to lift heavy furniture on your own. Always seek assistance and where ever possible please dismantle any heavy items before moving them to a new location.

Please periodically tighten bolts and screws on all self-assembly items, as these may work loose over time.

Your furniture will endure most temperatures in your home, but it is recommended that placing it next to a heat source such as a fire or a radiator is avoided. This is particularly recommended with solid woods as the heat may cause the wood to warp, crack or split.
