


COUNTER TABLE






CAUTION: This COUNTER TABLE is NOT a TOY.

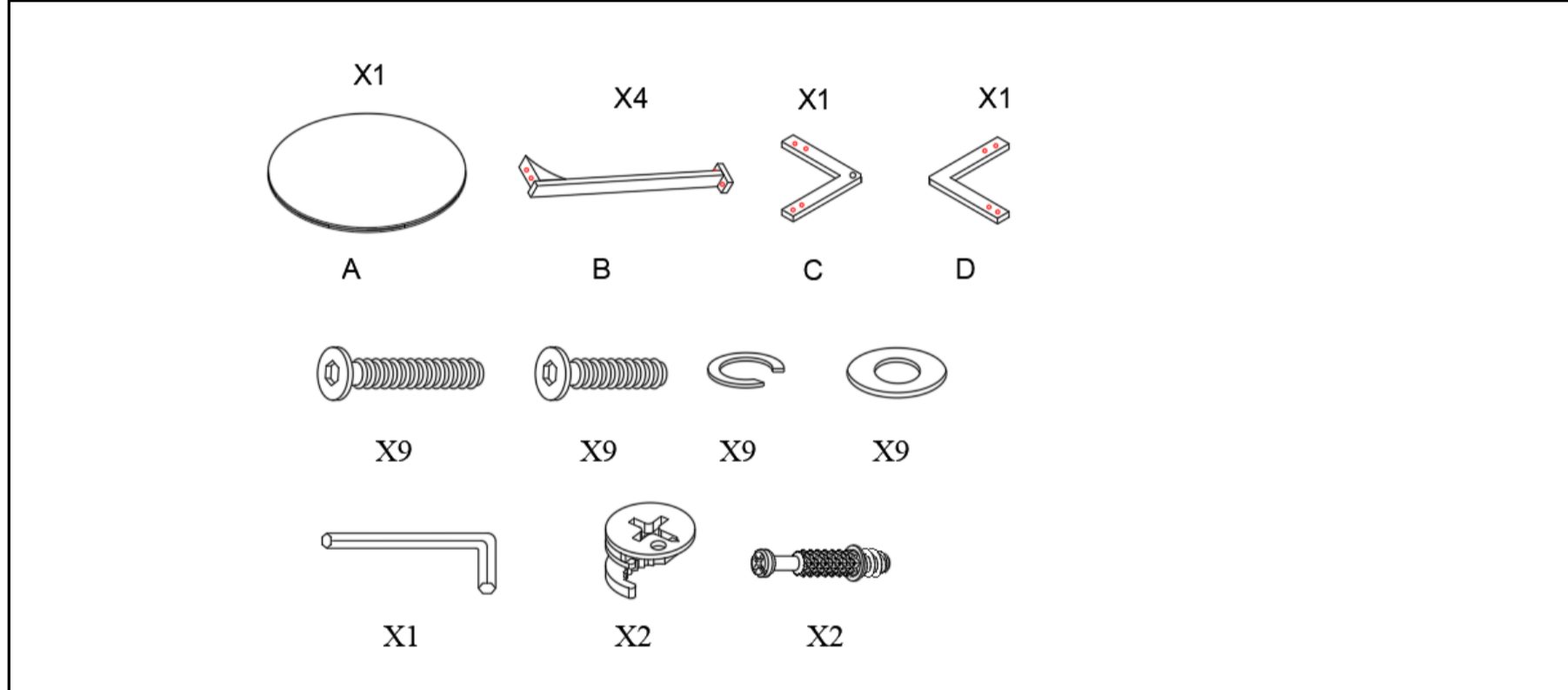



ASSEMBLY PREPARATION

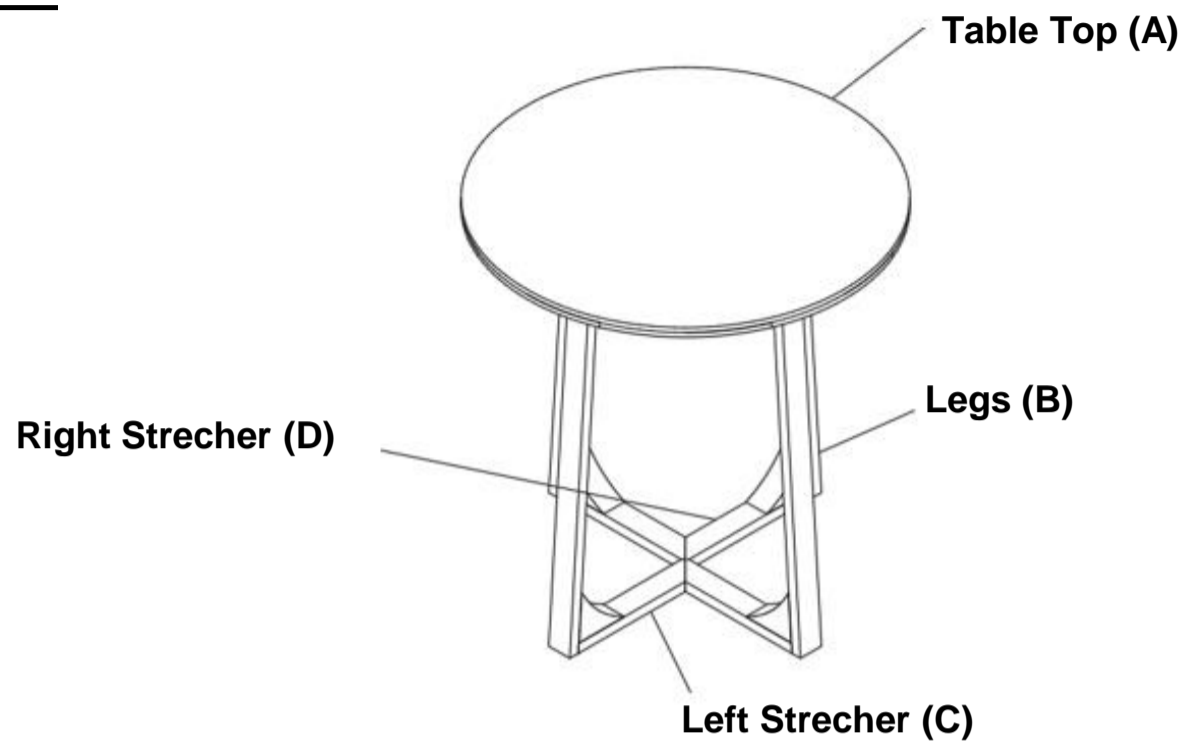
Before Beginning Assembly:



-  • **Read instructions, cover to cover-**
-  • **Have 2 adults on hand for assembly-**
-  • **Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-**
-  • **Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-**
-  • **Save all packaging until finished-**

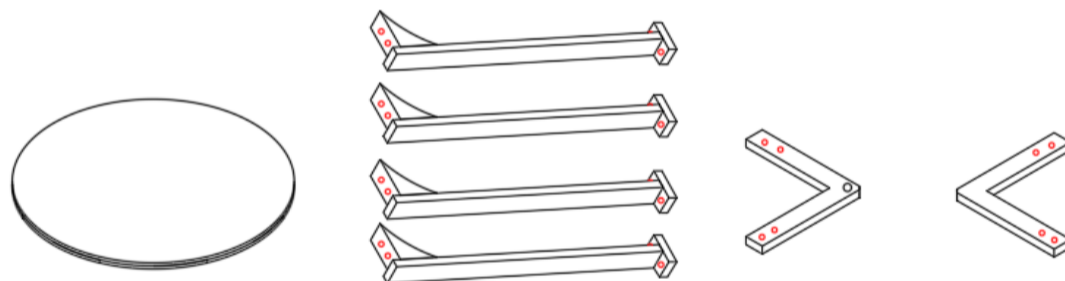
ASSEMBLY STEPS

Overview



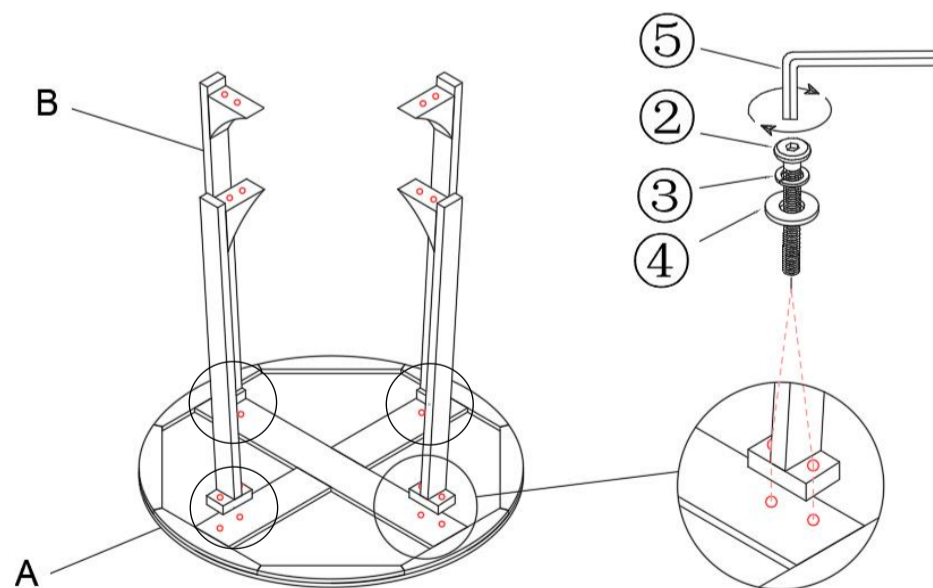
This COUNTER TABLE has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the COUNTER TABLE parts, the above picture is provided to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

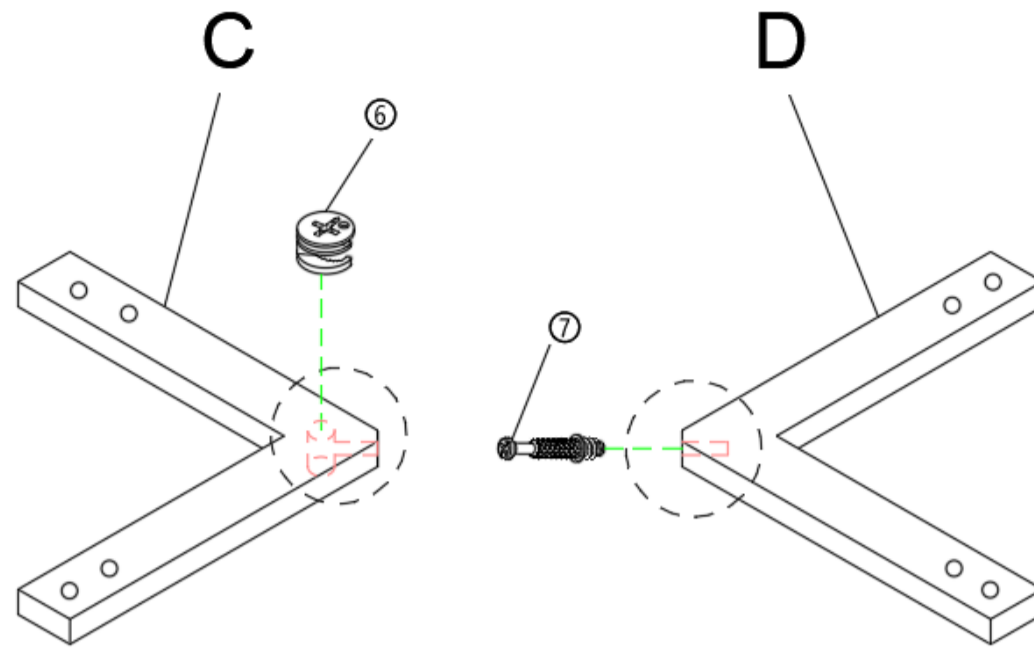
Step 2



1. Place the Table Top (A) on a clean, non-marring surface to avoid any scratches or damages to the product.
2. Attach the Legs (B) to the Table Top (A) by using bolts (②), Spring washer (③), Flat Washer (④) and Allen Wrench (⑤) as shown above

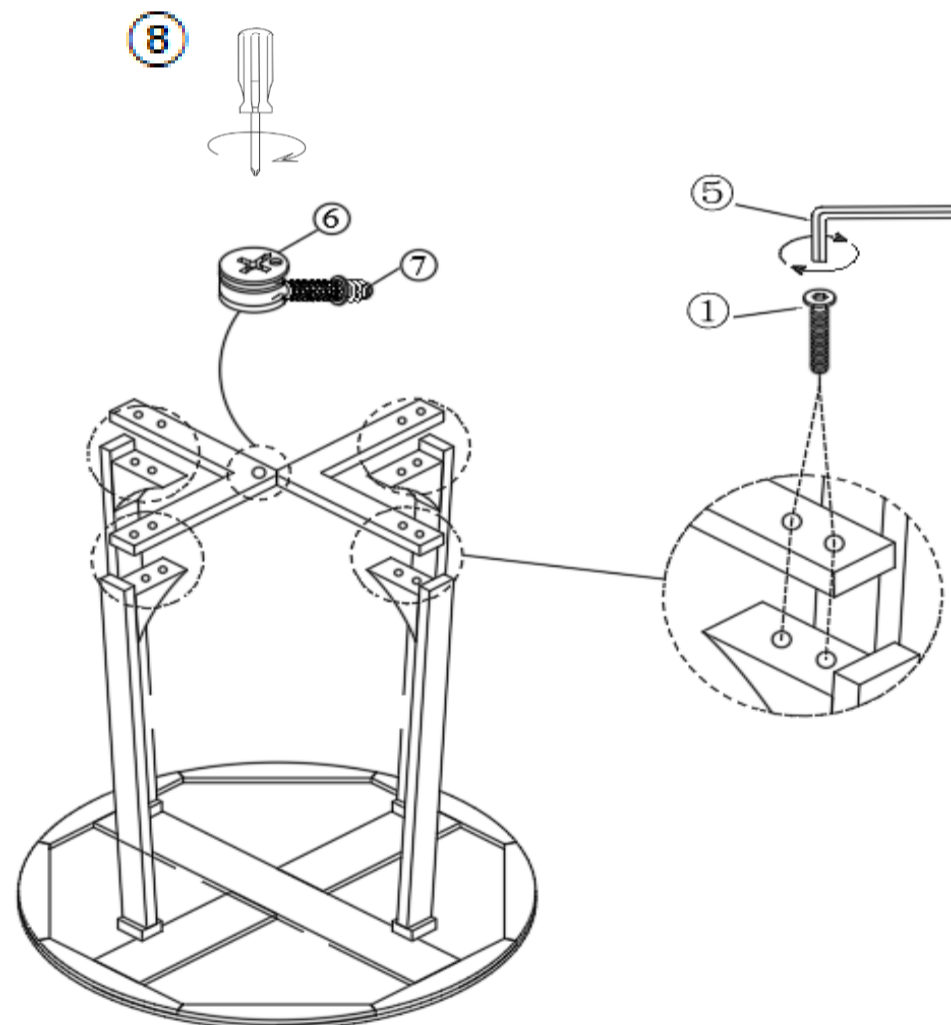
DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

Step 3



Put Left Strecher (C) has a Cam Lock (6) attached and Right Legs (D) has Cam Bolt (7) attached as instrusted above picture

Step 4



With the help from your partner, turn the COUNTER TABLE is now facing skywards.

1. Fully tighten the Cam Lock (6) by using Screw driver (8) and Cam Bolt (7) by Allen Wrench (5) at this time.

2. Attach the assembled parts has just finished above to the assembled parts in Step 2 by using 4pcs of Bolts (1) and the Allen Wrench (5) as shown picture.

Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

Step 5



Turn the COUNTER TABLE right side up

Place the COUNTER TABLE on a flat, level surface to make sure it is balance.

Inspect the COUNTER TABLE and make sure all parts are adequately connected. Then EXERT pressure, floorwards onto the COUNTER TABLE with both hands. This pressure will help align all parts at all joints. Check for wobbles on a LEVEL surface.

If no wobbles are found proceed to tighten the Screws in a sequential manner, until evenly secured.

CAUTION 1: When tightening these screws, tighten sequentially.

DO NOT tighten any screw fully and then towards the next one. This would cause the frame to warp.

WARNING ! IF THE COUNTER TABLE IS NOT STABLE , IT COULD LEAD TO DAMAGING THE PRODUCT.

Your COUNTER TABLE is ready to be used.

CAUTION 2: This COUNTER TABLE can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
