Furniture Tipping Risk

Serious risk of severe or fatal crush injuries can occur from furniture tipping over if not secured.

Children like to climb on furniture and Unsecured furniture can pose a Serious danger.

Please follow all instructions and install the tip-over restraints provided.


In addition to installing the restraints to help prevent tip-over:

1. Place heaviest items in the lowest drawers.
2. Unless Specifically designed to accommodate them, do not set TV's or other heavy objects on top of this product.
3. Never allow children to climb or hang on drawers, doors, or shelves.
4. Do not leave drawers open.
5. Never open more than one drawer at a time.
6. Do not step on the base.




Keep your child / children at bay during the assembly process.

Whenever lifting or moving the Shelf and to prevent damage to the Shelf, two adults may be needed to execute these actions.




Before Beginning Assembly:

- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-




- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



- Save all packaging until finished-



Assembly Steps

Overview




This Shelf has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Shelf parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

Step 2




Insert the Top Frame(A) into the Left Leg Panel(B) and Right Leg Panel(C) as pictured above.

Attach Top Frame(A) to Left Leg Panel(B) and Right Leg Panel(C) using Bolts(②) with Allen Key(④).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

Step 3




Place the Top Shelf(D) and Bottom Shelf(E) onto the Left Leg Panel(B) and Right Leg Panel(C).

3.1) Attach Top Shelf(D) to the brackets on Left Leg Panel(B) and Right Leg Panel(C) using Bolts(①), and Washers(③) with Allen Key(④).

3.2) Attach Bottom Shelf(E) to the brackets on Left Leg Panel(B) and Right Leg Panel(C) using Bolts(①), and Washers(③) with Allen Key(④).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

Step 4



Exert pressure floorwards, onto the Shelf with both your hands. This pressure will help the Legs and Shelf reach full alignment status.

Check for wobbles on a LEVEL surface.

If no wobbles are found proceed to tighten the Bolts in a sequential manner, until evenly secured.

When tightening the Bolts tighten sequentially.

Do not tighten any Bolt fully and then move on towards the next one.

If there are still wobbles, loosen the Bolts and execute the same above process.

Your Shelf is ready for use.

This Shelf can only be used on a flat, level surface.


Shelf Restraint Device Installation Instructions:

WARNING

Serious or fatal crushing injuries can occur from tipping furniture.

To help prevent tip-over: **ALWAYS** secure this furniture to the wall using Shelf Restraint Device.



Usage For Cabinet Restraint Device:

To Secure Shelf against wall, attach Metal Brackets(⑤) to wall, and use Shelf Restraint Straps(⑦) to connect the Metal Brackets(⑤) and the Shelf.

Instructions:



Find the location of the screw holes on the wall.

You can mark these points in two ways as below:


1) Move the Shelf back to the wall. Mark two points the same height as the Shelf on the wall.

Note: The Metal Brackets need to be secured to solid, load bearing surface. Please use a Stud Finder(not supplied) if needed to locate the Wall Frame.

2) Measure the height of the Metal Brackets(⑤) with ruler/measuring tape and mark on wall to keep them accurate and same height.

(Caution: The Shelf Restraint Strap(⑦) between the product and Metal Brackets(⑤) on the wall should be within 3.5”)

Then attach L-shaped Metal Brackets(⑤) to wall using Self Tapping Screws(⑥) with Screwdriver(⑧).



Move the Shelf back against wall. Pull the Restraint Straps(⑦) through the Metal Brackets(⑤) on the wall and around the Top Frame(A), and pull the Restraint Straps(⑦) tight.

The Shelf Restraint Device is installed and your Shelf is ready for use.

Care & Maintenance

-  ● Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
-  ● Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
-  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
-  ● Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
-  ● Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
-  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
-  ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
-  ● Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
-  ● Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

Q What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase in their homes or workplaces or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

Q What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction or they may be by-products of chemical processes such as motor vehicle exhaust.

Q What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace or a business or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
