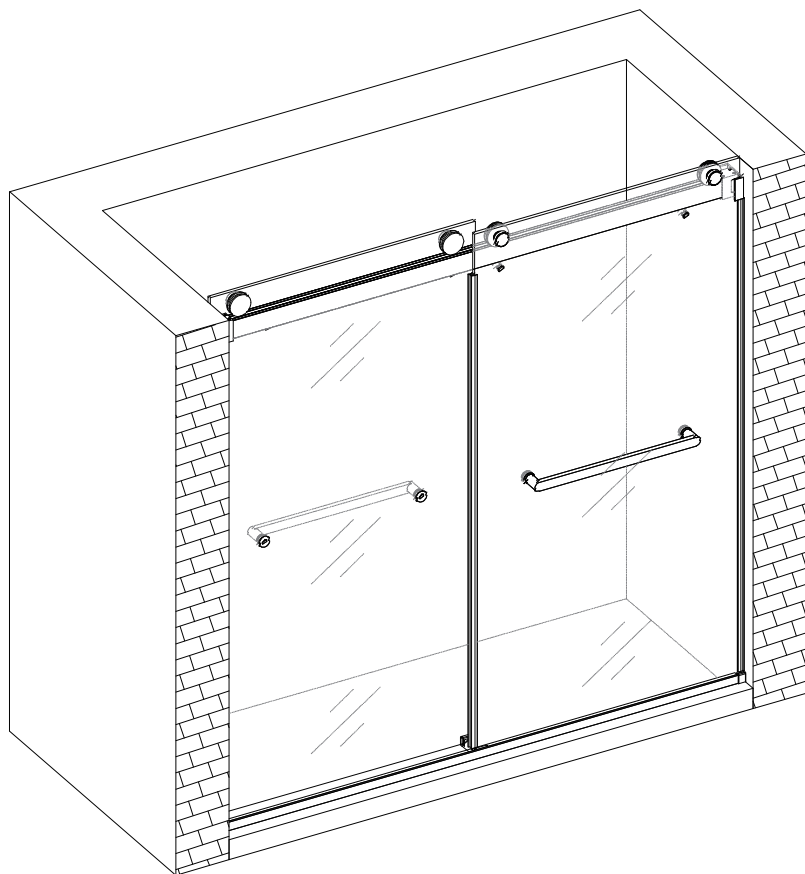

Safety — Read Before Unpacking



A minimum of two people are required to lift and install this product. Professional installation is recommended.



Read all instructions carefully before unpacking and installing the product.

- We reserve the right to change, update, modify, or redesign this manual, product, or related specifications without prior notice.
- It is your responsibility to visit our website or contact customer service to obtain the latest version of the installation instructions.



Never lift or carry the glass panels by the handle or towel bar. Always hold the glass by the edges. The handle is not designed as a lifting point and may cause the glass to break.



Never place glass panels directly on tile, concrete, or any hard surface. Always lay glass flat on a soft protective blanket at least 1/4" thick. Never place glass panels upright on their corners or edges.



Inspect all glass panels and components before installation. Do not install any glass with chips, cracks, or scratches. Stop installation and contact customer service if any damage is found.



The wall and supporting structure must be capable of supporting the full weight of the shower door assembly.



Use professional-grade glass suction cups when handling glass panels. Do not modify the product in any way. For residential use only.

Tempered Glass Spontaneous Breakage Safety Notice



Risk of Tempered Glass Spontaneous Breakage

Tempered glass may rarely experience spontaneous breakage due to factors such as internal stress, sudden temperature changes, edge damage, or uneven installation stress. This is an inherent characteristic of tempered glass and does not necessarily indicate a product defect.

Installation Safety

To reduce the risk of glass breakage during installation:

- Carefully inspect the glass panels before installation. Do not install any glass panel with visible cracks, chips, or edge damage.
- Do not force the glass panel into position during installation. Do not apply excessive pressure from the wall brackets, fixed glass clips, glass connectors, center guide, or other hardware. Maintain proper clearance between the glass and hardware components to prevent stress concentration that may cause glass breakage.
- Tighten screws, clips, and fasteners with moderate force. Do not overtighten or apply excessive pressure to the glass edges.
- Avoid direct rigid contact between the glass and hard materials such as metal, tile, or stone. Ensure protective pads, seals, or gaskets are properly installed where required.

Use and Maintenance Safety

To reduce the risk of glass damage during use:

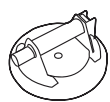
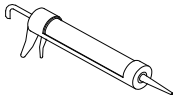
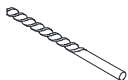
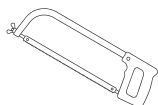
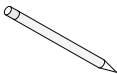
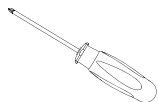
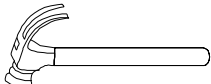
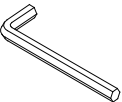
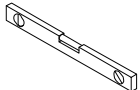
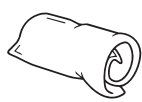
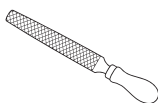
- Avoid exposing the glass to extreme temperature changes, such as spraying cold water directly onto glass that has been heated by prolonged sunlight.
- Do not hit, strike, or lean heavily against the glass door or panels.
- Regularly inspect seals, protective pads, or buffers, if applicable. Replace any damaged or worn components to prevent direct contact between the glass and metal parts.
- Stop using the shower door immediately if you notice cracks, unusual sounds, or visible fracture patterns on the glass. Do not attempt to repair or handle damaged glass yourself. Contact a qualified professional for inspection or replacement.

If Glass Breakage Occurs

- Stay calm and keep away from the broken glass area.
- Do not walk on broken glass or pick up glass fragments with bare hands. Although tempered glass breaks into small pieces, the fragments may still cause injury.
- Wear protective gloves and use appropriate tools when cleaning up broken glass, or contact a professional for assistance.
- Take photos of the affected area and contact DeerValley Customer Service for assistance. Please provide details of the situation and retain your original proof of purchase for warranty evaluation.

Before You Drill — Verify Your Opening

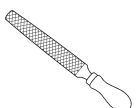
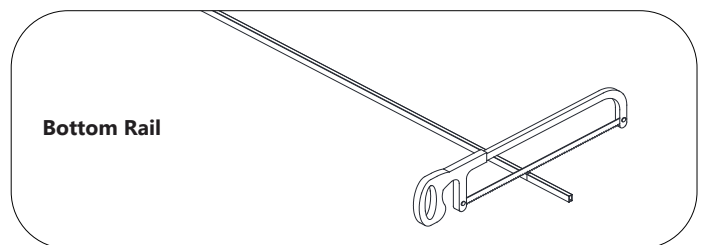
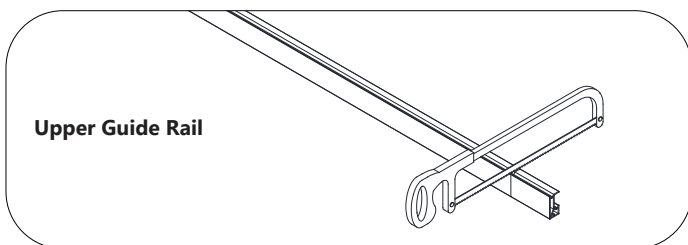
Opening Width

Use a 20"–40" (500–1000 mm) level to check that both walls are plumb and the shower base/curb is level. Correct any excessive deviation before installation.



Cut the Guide Rail Components and Threshold (If Required)

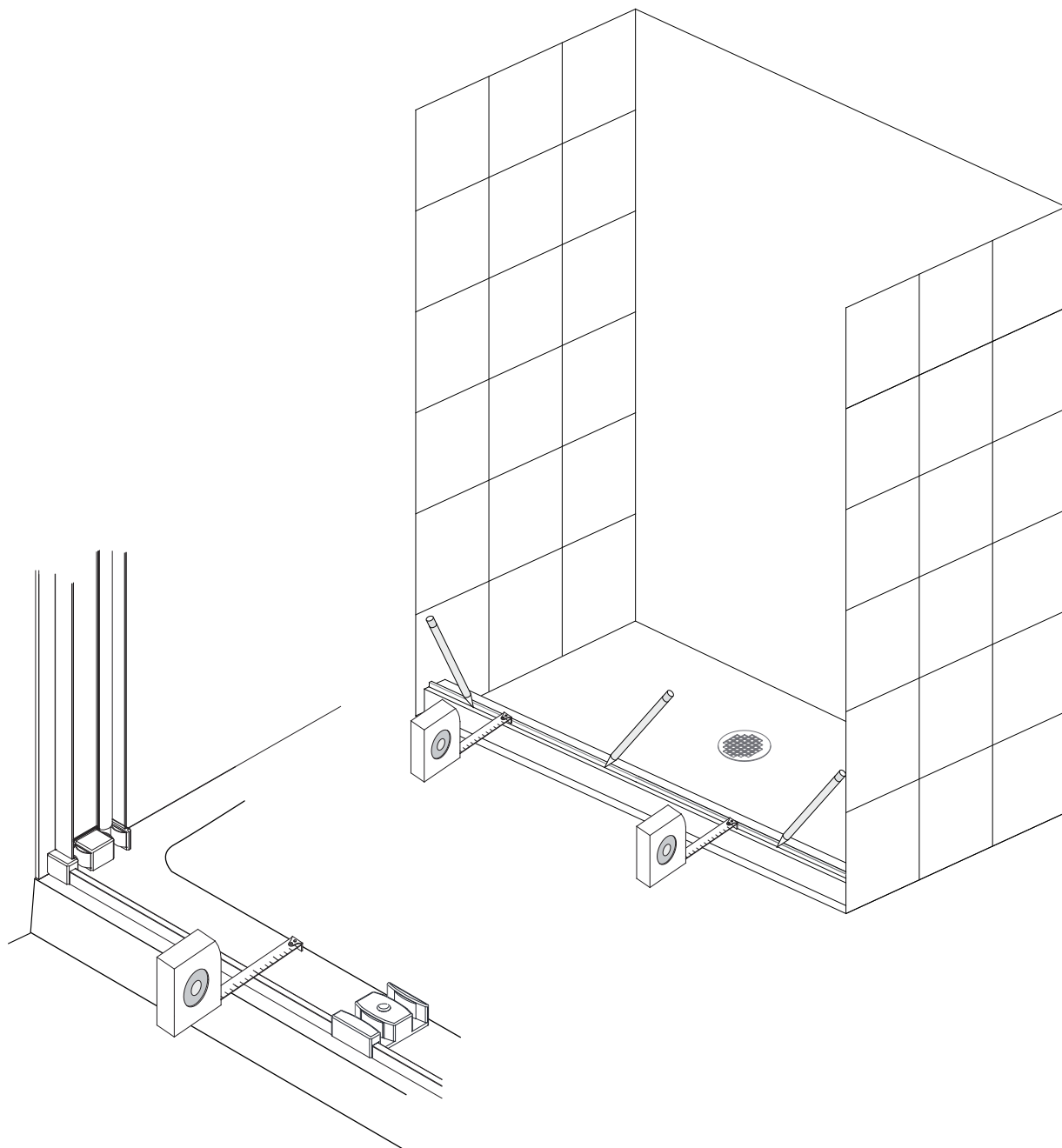
If necessary, cut the inner guide rail, guide rail sleeve, and threshold to fit the finished opening dimensions.



Tip: Use a metal file to remove any sharp edges or burrs from the cut ends of the inner guide rail, guide rail sleeve, and threshold.

Confirm Required Installation Space

Before installation, confirm that the installation surface provides sufficient flat and level space for the threshold and center guide.



Note: The combined installation width of the threshold and center guide is 3 3/16" (80.8 mm). For installation on a shower curb, a minimum flat installation width of 3 3/8" (85 mm) is recommended to allow space for sealant and adjustment. The installation surface must be flat and level. Installation is not recommended if the available width is less than 3 1/8" (80 mm).

Checklist — Do Not Proceed Until All Items Are Confirmed

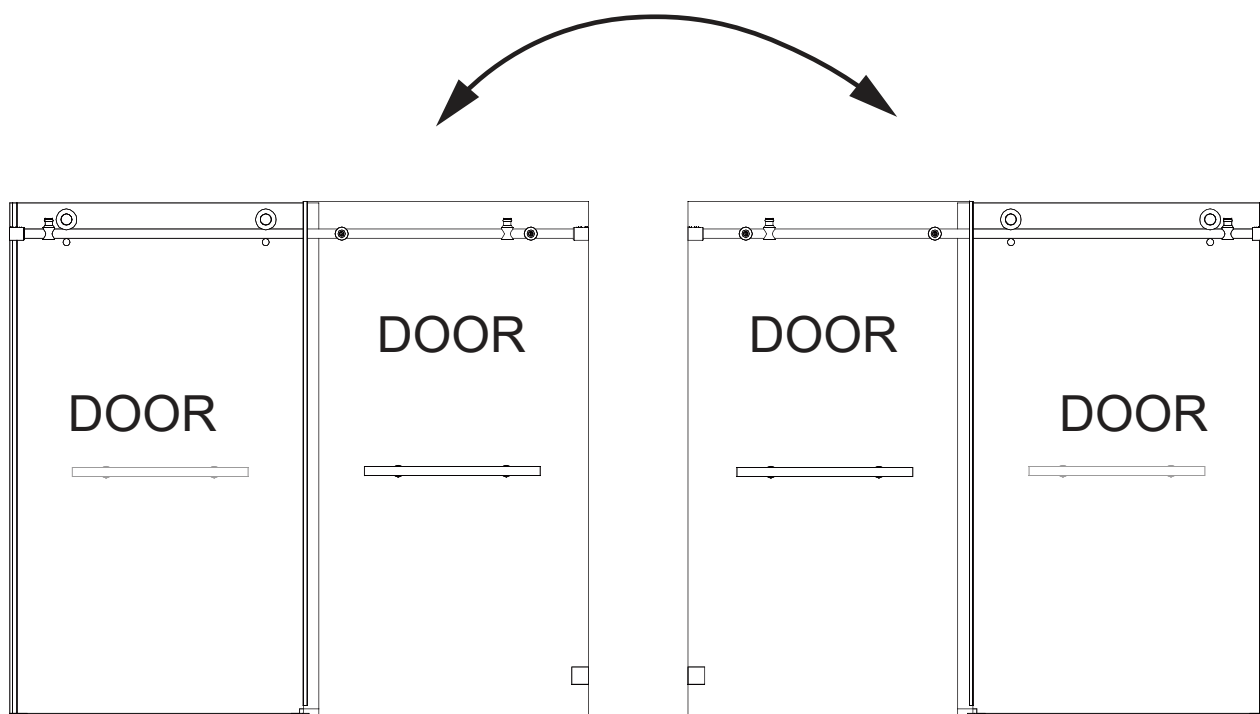
- ☐ Opening width W is within the specified range for your model.
- ☐ Both walls are plumb, with a maximum deviation of 1/16" (1.75 mm) over the full door height.
- ☐ Both anchor locations have solid masonry support behind the wall.
- ☐ All glass panels have been inspected and are free of chips, cracks, or scratches.

Reversible Installation



Note: This shower door is reversible and can be installed to suit different bathroom layouts. Follow the installation steps according to your installation requirements.

Installation Steps

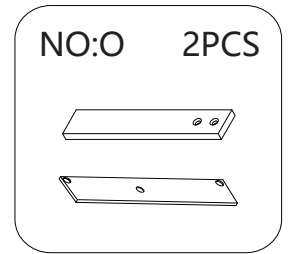
Step 1: Mark Holes Using the Templates (O)

· Installation Height (All Models):

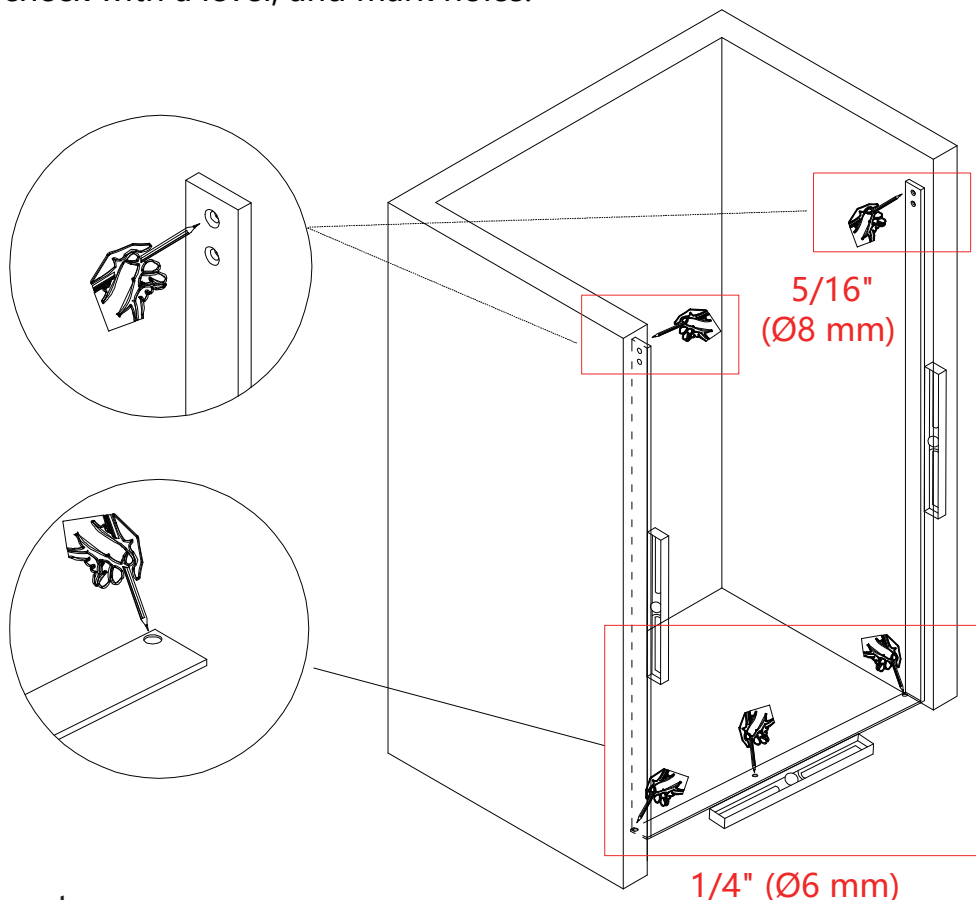
Install wall sleeves (A1/A2) with centers 72-3/16" / 73-1/16" (1833 mm / 1856 mm) above the bathroom floor or shower base/bathtub rim. The wall marking template (O) is pre-drilled for this height.

· Mark Holes:

1. Use the long template for wall holes and the short template for floor/shower base holes.
2. Drill sizes: 5/16" (Ø8 mm) for wall sleeve (A1) holes; 1/4" (Ø6 mm) for center guide (J) and threshold fixing bracket (H) holes.
3. Place the wall template vertically against each wall, align with the corner, check with a level, and mark holes. Repeat for the opposite wall.
4. Place the floor template centered between the walls along the front edge of the shower base/floor, check with a level, and mark holes.

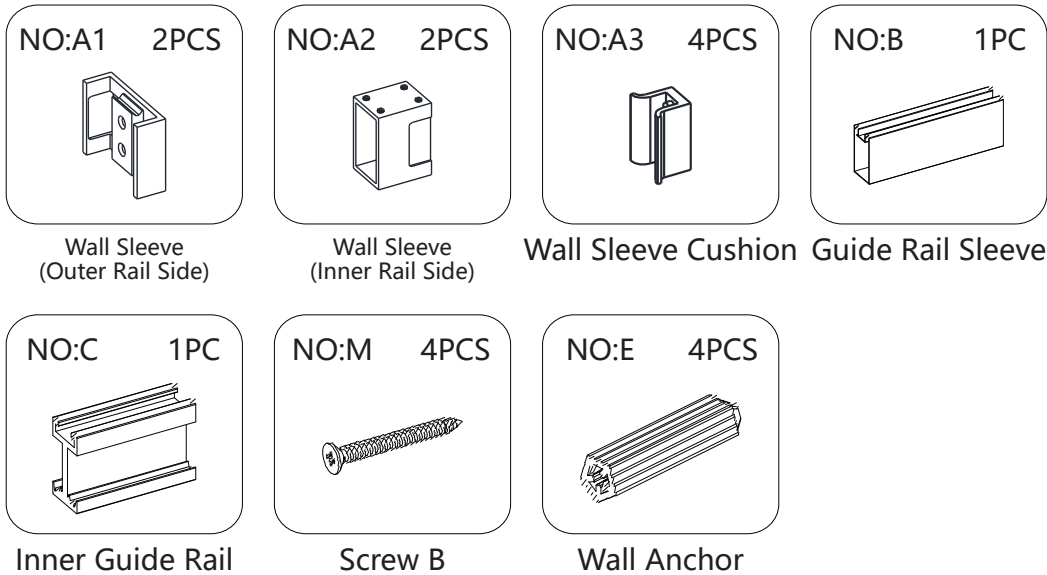


· Check Alignment:

Ensure wall holes are level and vertically aligned with floor holes before drilling.

Step 2: Mount the Upper Guide Rail

Note:

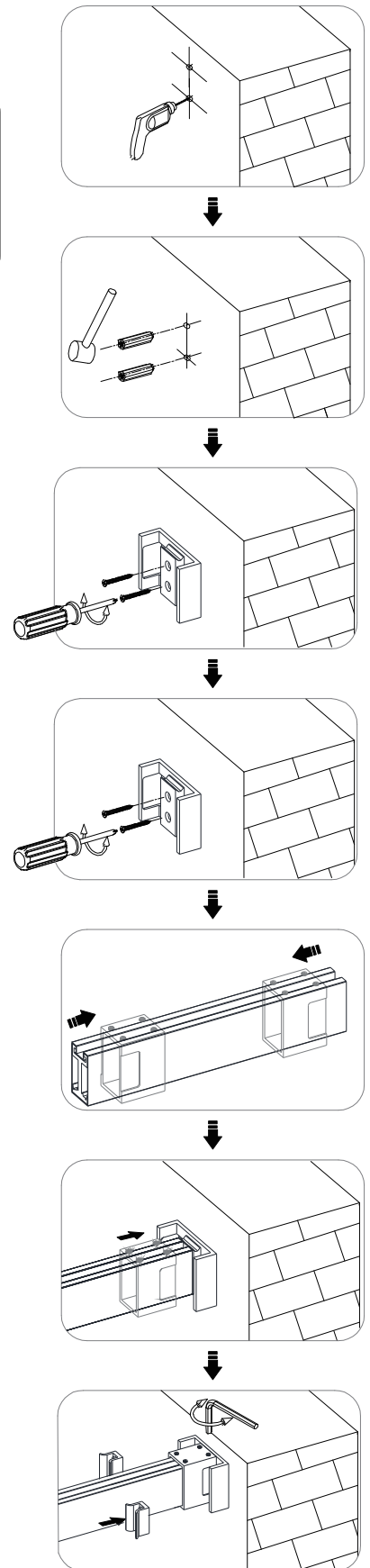
- A1 = Wall Sleeve, Outer Rail Side (2 pcs)
- A2 = Wall Sleeve, Inner Rail Side (2 pcs)
- A3 = Wall Sleeve Cushion (4 pcs)

· Install Wall Sleeves (A1):

1. Drill wall holes from Step 1 using a 5/16" drill bit.
2. Insert wall anchors (E) flush with the wall surface.
3. Secure one wall sleeve (A1) to the wall with screw-B (M), then repeat on the opposite wall.
4. Check both wall sleeves are level and at the same height, then tighten screws.

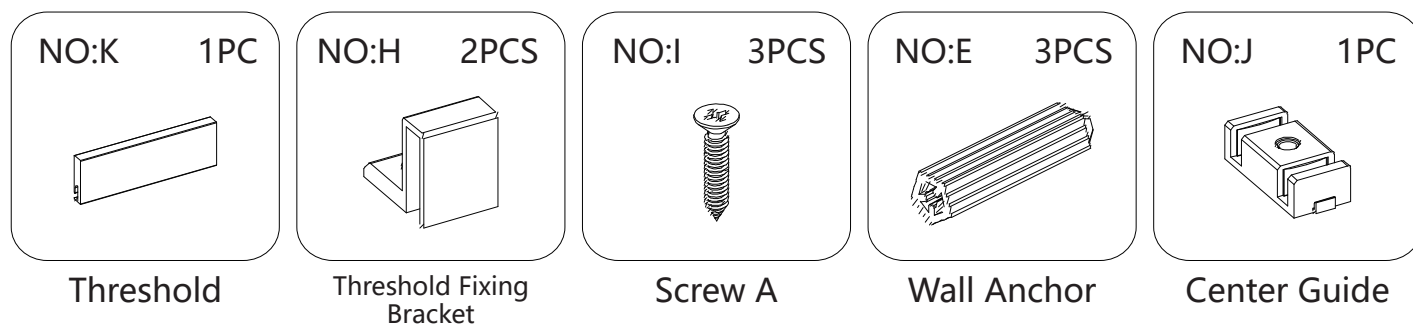
· Install Upper Guide Rail Assembly:

1. Slide the inner guide rail (C) into the guide rail sleeve (B), then install wall sleeves (A2) on both ends. Do not tighten yet.
2. With assistance, lift the rail assembly and insert both ends into wall sleeves (A1).
3. Check that the guide rail is level, slide wall sleeves (A2) against the walls, align mounting positions, and secure with screws.
4. Install wall sleeve cushions (A3) at both ends (two per side), then tighten set screws with the hex key.
5. Re-check the guide rail level and fully tighten all screws.

Step 3: Install the Threshold and Center Guide



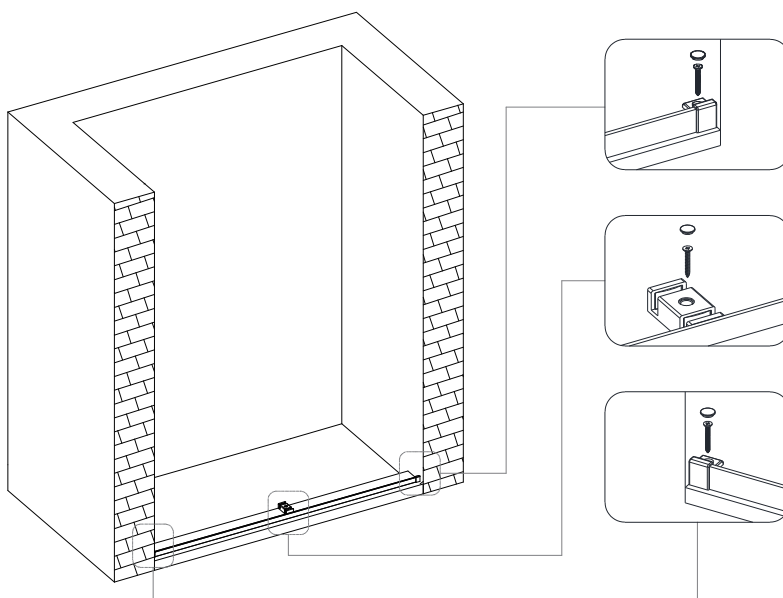
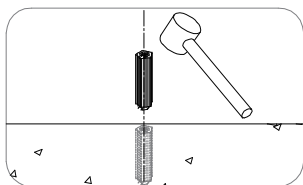
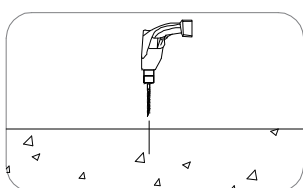
Note: Install the threshold along the full shower opening length.

· Drill Floor Holes:

1. Align the threshold mounting position with the guide rail assembly on the same vertical plane.
2. Drill holes with a 1/4" drill bit and insert wall anchors (E) flush with the surface.

· Secure the Threshold:

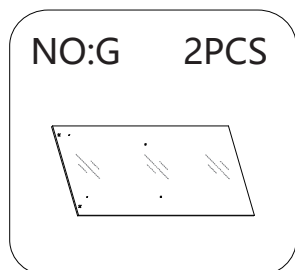
1. Place the threshold (K).
2. Install threshold fixing brackets (H) and center guide (J), secure with three screw A (I), and install decorative caps.



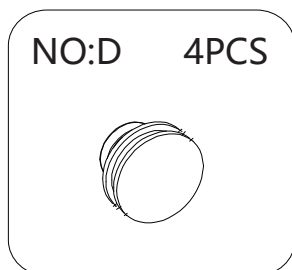
Note: Avoid damaging the waterproof membrane when drilling.

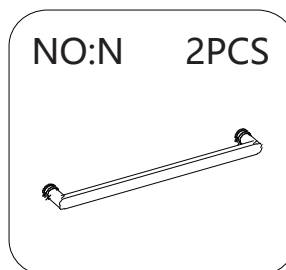

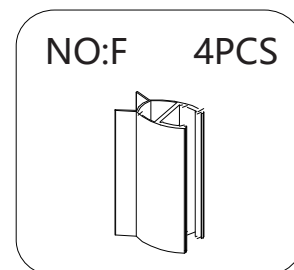

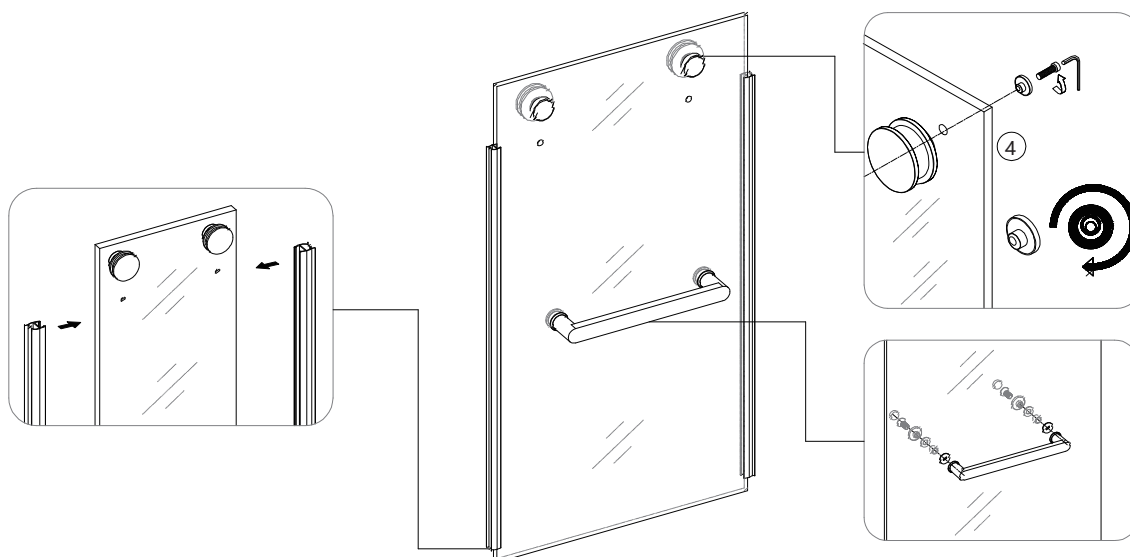
Step 4: Pre-Assemble Door Glass Components

· Confirm Door Glass Orientation:

1. Lay both door panels flat. Ensure roller holes face up, handle holes face opposite directions, and the printed glass side faces outward.
2. Install one panel on the inner rail (shower side) and the other on the outer rail. Confirm orientation before installing accessories.

· Install Door Glass Components:

1. Install two rollers (D) on the top holes of each panel. Insert bolts with gaskets on both sides of the glass, then tighten caps with the hex key.
2. Install anti-collision seal strips (F) on both sides of both door panels.
3. Install one handle (N) on each panel with gaskets on both sides. Ensure handles face opposite directions.



· Orientation Check:

Place both panels in hanging positions. Rollers should be on top, the outer door handle should face you, and the inner door handle should face away. If handles face the same direction, reassemble one panel.

Step 5: Install Door Panels

· Confirm Roller Orientation:

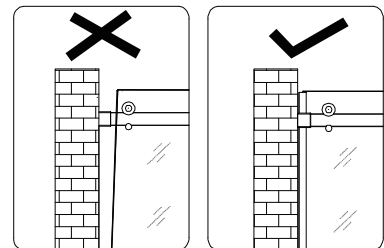
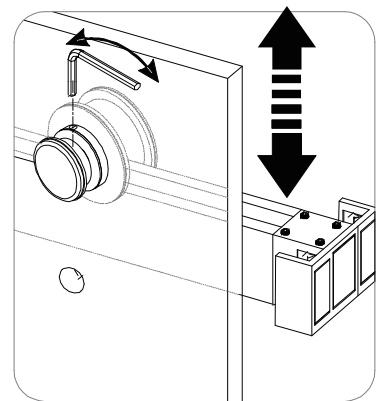
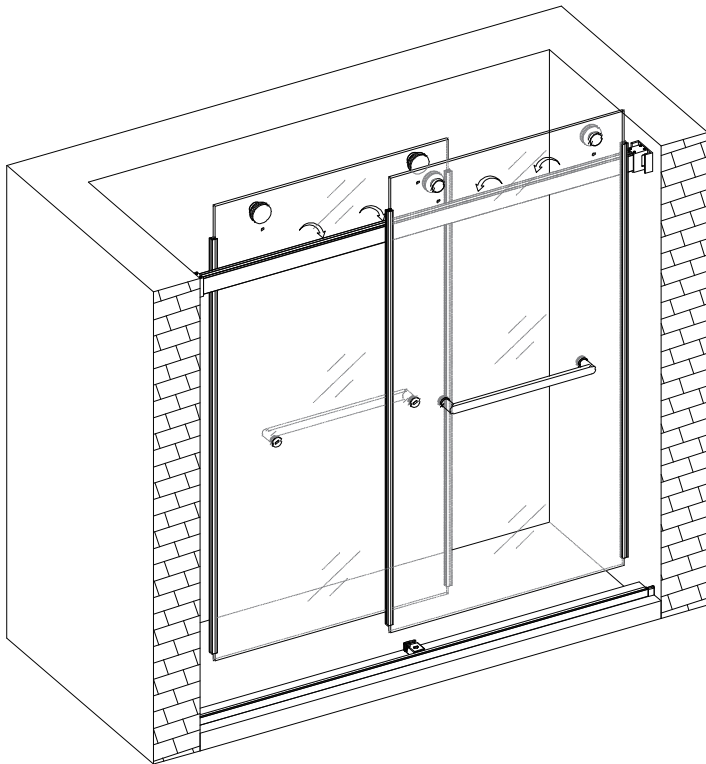
1. Each roller has different diameter wheels. The larger wheel must engage with the inner guide rail, and the smaller wheel must face the exposed side of the door panel.
2. Confirm roller direction before installation to prevent tilting, derailment, or rubbing.

· Hang Door Panels:

1. With two people, lift door panels by the glass edges only. Install the inner door panel on the inner rail first, then the outer door panel on the outer rail.
2. Align the bottom of each panel with the center guide and insert into the guide groove. Ensure both top and bottom are engaged before releasing. Do not force the glass; adjust the top position if needed.
3. Slide both panels to confirm smooth movement without contact.

· Adjust Door Panel Level:

1. Use the hex key to adjust the eccentric discs on the rollers to raise or lower each corner.
2. Adjust until the door panels are vertical, parallel with the wall, and stable without rocking.

Step 6: Install Roller Anti-Jump Brackets

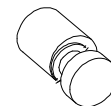
· Install Brackets:

Slide each door panel to access the lower holes. Install two roller anti-jump brackets (L) on each panel with gaskets on both sides of the glass, then tighten the caps.

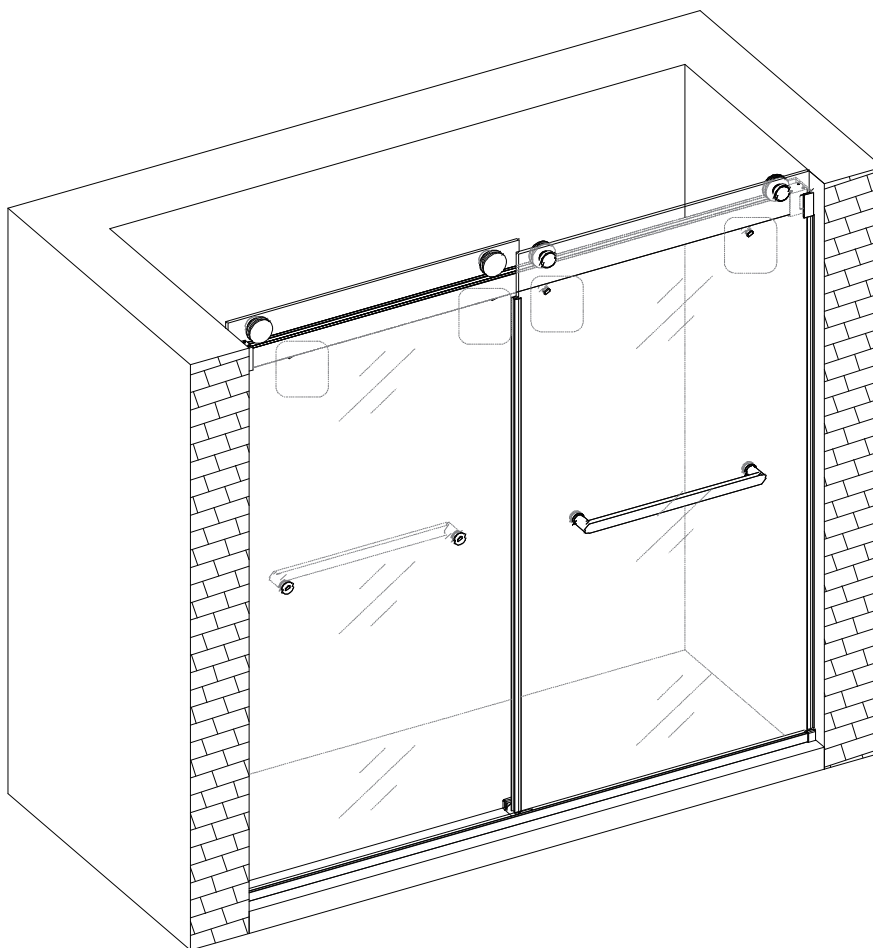
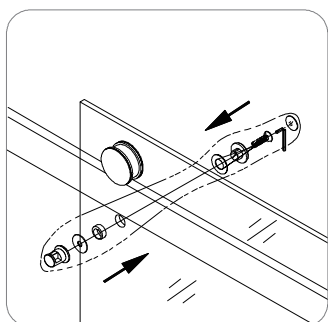
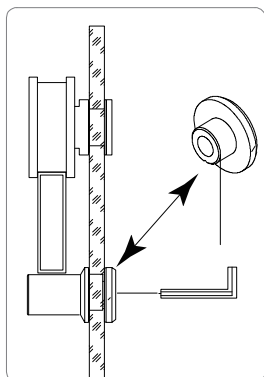
· Check Clearance:

1. Ensure brackets are $\frac{1}{32}$ "– $\frac{1}{16}$ " (1–2 mm) below the guide rail to prevent lifting while allowing smooth sliding.
2. Slide both panels through the full range to confirm smooth operation without contact or abnormal noise.

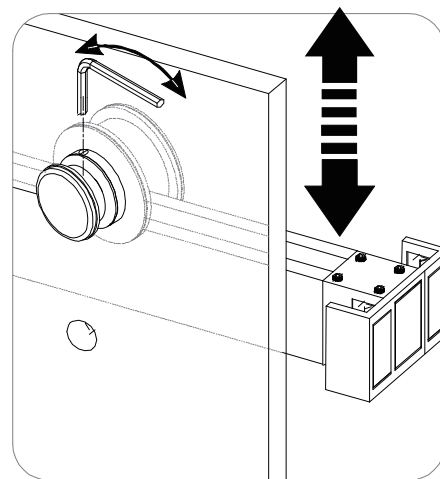
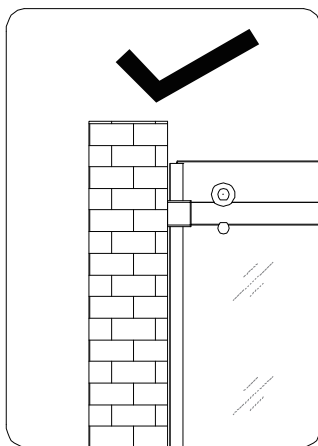
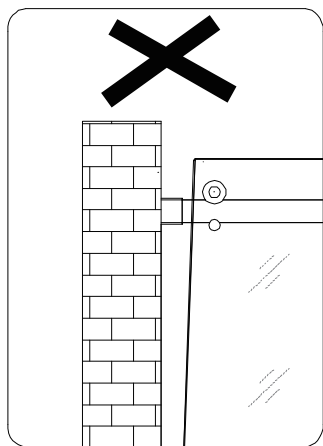
Roller Anti-Jump Bracket

Installation Steps

Step 7: Final Inspection



· Check the door operation and alignment:

- ☐ Ensure door panels are level and plumb with an even gap from top to bottom.
- ☐ Slide both panels to confirm smooth operation without derailment, contact, or abnormal noise.
- ☐ Check that seal strips align and fully engage when doors are closed.
- ☐ Confirm all screws are tightened and decorative caps are installed.
- ☐ Ensure door bottoms are properly seated in the center guide without binding or lifting.

Installation Steps

Step 8: Apply Silicone Sealant

· Inside of Enclosure:

Apply a continuous bead of silicone sealant to:

1. Both guide rail ends where wall sleeves meet the walls.
2. Both threshold ends where they meet the walls.
3. The joint between the threshold and shower base/floor.

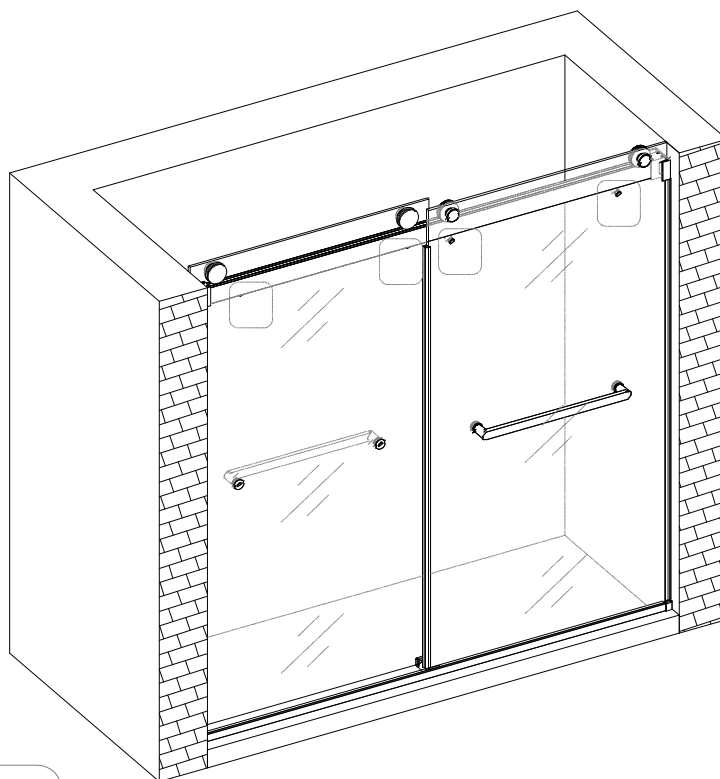
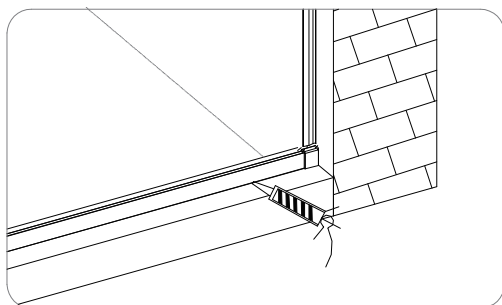
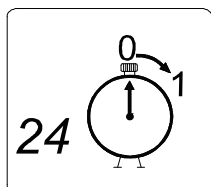
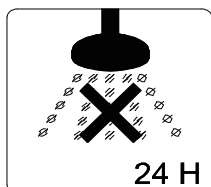
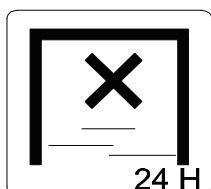
· Outside of Enclosure:

Apply silicone to joints where wall sleeves and threshold meet the wall or shower base/floor.

· Do Not Apply Silicone:

Do not apply silicone inside guide rail or center guide grooves, or on moving parts.

· Wait 24 hours before use.

Troubleshooting

Alignment Issues	
Problem	Recommended Action
The top or bottom of the sliding door glass panel tilts away from the wall.	Adjust the rollers to align the door panel until the sliding door glass panel is plumb from top to bottom.

Water Leak Issues	
Problem	Recommended Action
Water leaks between the sliding door glass panels.	Ensure the water seal strip is properly installed and the door panels are correctly aligned.
Water leaks between the sliding door glass panel and wall area.	Check that the seal strip is properly installed and contacting the glass panel. Adjust the door position if necessary.
Water leaks under the threshold.	Check the silicone sealant around the threshold. Apply additional silicone sealant if needed.
Water leaks around the wall sleeve area.	Check the silicone sealant application along the wall sleeves and wall joints. Apply additional silicone sealant if needed.

Operation Issues (Opening / Closing)	
Problem	Recommended Action
The sliding door glass panel is difficult to move.	1. Check that the rollers are properly installed and adjusted. 2. Ensure the door is properly seated in the center guide. 3. Clean any debris from the top rail.
The door makes rubbing or unusual noises during movement.	1. Check that the sliding door glass panel is properly aligned. 2. Ensure the rollers are securely tightened. 3. Check that no components are rubbing against the glass or top rail.

Before troubleshooting, check the following:

1. Ensure the guide rail is level.
2. Check that the rollers are properly adjusted.
3. Confirm that each door panel is properly aligned and fully engaged with the guide rail and center guide.
4. Always support the door panel during adjustment. Do not adjust the door panel while it is supported by only one roller.

LIMITED WARRANTY COVERAGE

FIVE YEARS LIMITED WARRANTY

DeerValley products are made with quality materials and excellent craftsmanship to provide customers with a long-lasting product. If any defects in materials or craftsmanship are found under normal use within the first five year of delivery, DeerValley will provide replacement parts at no charge or, at its option, replace any product or part of the product deemed defective under normal installation, use, service, and maintenance. This warranty applies only to the original purchaser. Proof of purchase will be required to process any claims. SCRATCHES ARE NOT COVERED UNDER WARRANTY.

The manufacturer warrants that this product will be free from manufacturing defects for the duration of the above-mentioned warranty period. Please retain a copy of the original invoice as proof of purchase.

DeerValley will, at its option, (1) repair or replace the defective part(s) or product(s) at no charge; (2) issue a refund for the original purchase price of the product(s) (valid within 30 days from the date of delivery); or (3) issue a credit to be applied toward the purchase of a new DeerValley product. Shipping/delivery charges may apply and are at DeerValley's sole discretion.

DeerValley recommends that installations be performed by a licensed, professional plumber. DeerValley will not be held responsible for any damage or product failure resulting from improper installation, misuse, or failure to hire a licensed professional. Additionally, DeerValley is not responsible for any removal or installation costs.
