

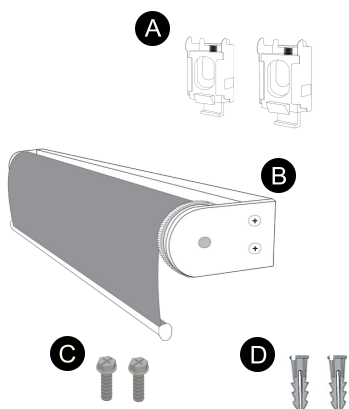
How to Install Standard Roller Shade

Tools Needed

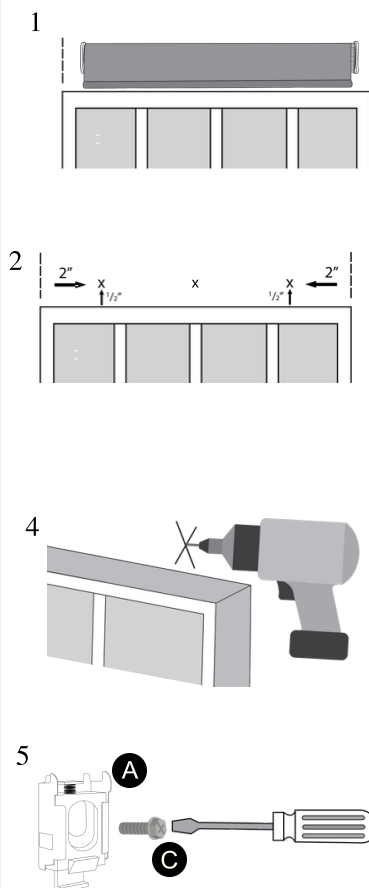
- Pencil or Marker
- Measuring Tape
- Screwdriver
- Level
- Power Drill
- 1/16" Drill Bit

Mounting Surface	Fastener
Drywall, Plaster	Wall Anchors (D), Expansion Bolts (Not Provided)
Metal	Sheet Metal Screws (Not Provided)
Wood	No. 6 Hex Head Screws (C)

For Outside Mount

Mounting the Brackets

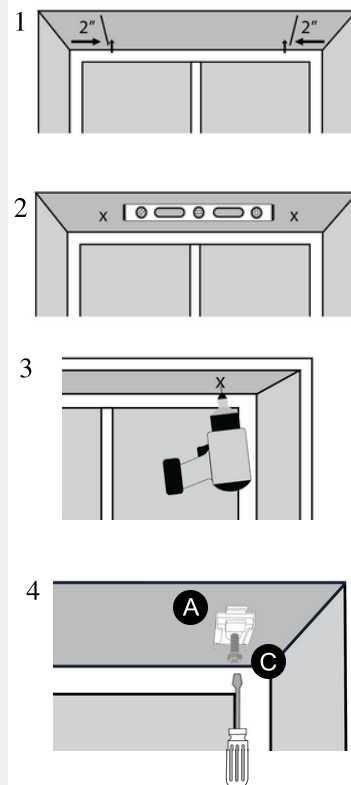
1. Hold and center the shade (B) above the window and mark the edges.
2. Measure and mark 2" from the edges and 1/2" above the window frame. If using a 3rd bracket (A), measure and mark the exact center of outside marks.
3. Brackets (A) must be mounted level, so use a level to ensure markings are perfectly aligned.
4. Use a 1/16" drill bit to drill a hole for each screw (C) location.
5. Screw the brackets (A) into place. To ensure a secure mount, wall anchors (D) may be needed.
6. Continue to "Installing the Shade"



For Inside Mount

Mounting the Brackets

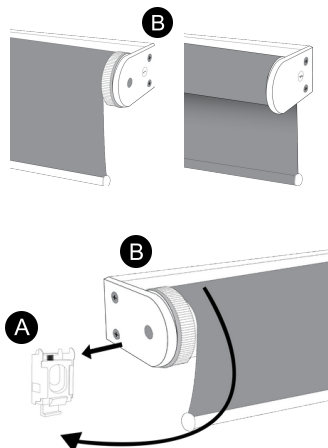
1. Begin by measuring 2" from the inside edge of the window frame and far enough forward for the shade to clear any obstructions.
2. Mark this location and use a level to ensure the markings are aligned across the width of the window.
3. Use a 1/16" drill bit to drill pilot holes for each screw location.
4. Screw the brackets (A) into place using the provided hex screws (C). Make sure the release tab faces forward, away from the window.
5. Continue to "Installing the Shade"



For Outside Mount (cont.)

Installing the Shade

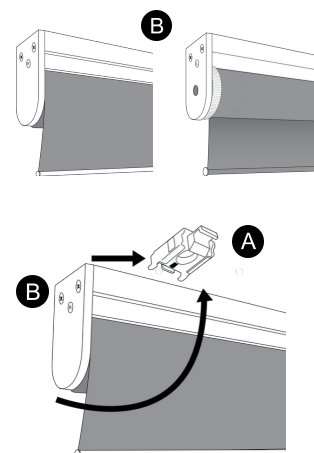
1. The shade (B) ends are stamped L and R, but may be installed either way.
2. Hook the inside groove of the headrail (B) onto the top of the bracket (A).
3. Rotate down until you hear an audible "click" and the shade (B) locks into place.



For Inside Mount (cont.)

Installing the Shade

1. The shade ends are stamped L and R, but may be installed either way.
2. Hook the inside groove of the headrail (B) to the back of the bracket (A).
3. Rotate the headrail (B) forward and up until you hear an audible "click."



How to Operate the Shade

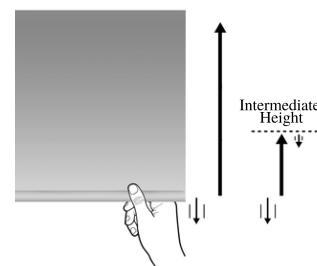
To Lower

Lower the shade by grasping the bottom bar and pulling straight down to your desired height. If required, give a small tug downward to lock into place.



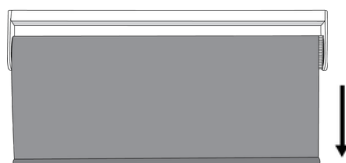
To Raise

Grasp the bottom bar, tug down, and release. The shade will automatically stop at upper limit. To raise the shade to an intermediate height, lift to the desired height and lock into place.

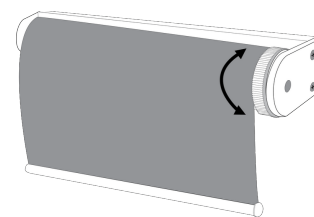


How to Adjust the Lift Tension

The lift speed has been preset, however you may make adjustments according to your preference. Lower the shade to any length and lock into place.



Once the shade is lowered, rotate the wheel clockwise to increase lift speed and counter-clockwise to reduce speed. Continue to adjust until the speed is to your liking.



Cleaning and Maintenance

The vinyl headrail and bottom rail can be wiped clean with a damp sponge. To clean the shade fabric, use a feather duster or vacuum lightly using the soft brush attachment.
