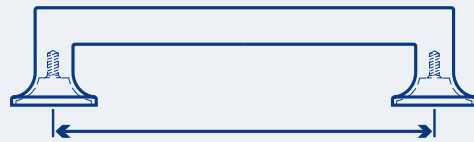


Use this page as a template to determine the size of your current cabinet hardware.

FIND YOUR SIZE

Use this measurement guide to determine the pull size you need.




The center-to-center (C/C) measurement is the distance between screw holes on a handle. It is very important to know the C/C of your existing handles to avoid re-drilling holes or creating cabinet defects.



C/C: Screw Distance, Center to Center

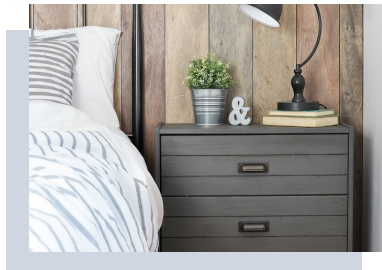

SQUARED VS. CURVED HARDWARE

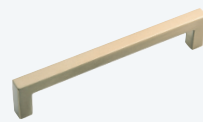
What kind of details are on your cabinets, kitchen appliances, and decor? Are there squared clean lines or very detailed curved lines throughout?

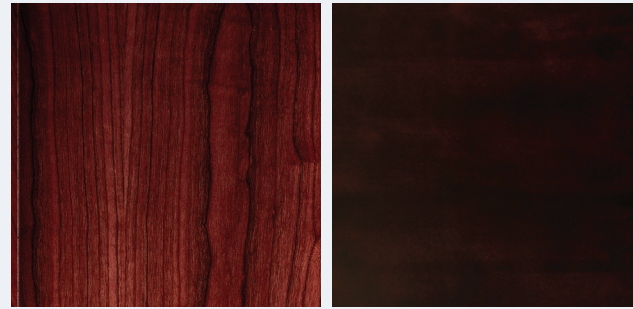
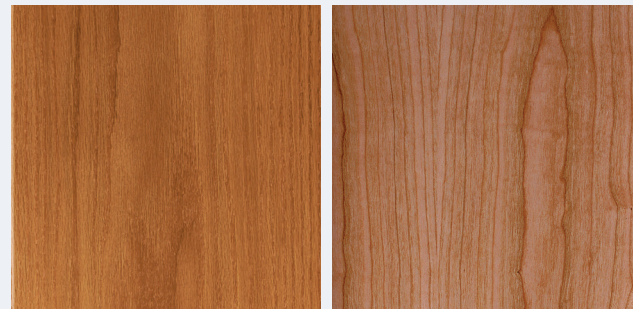
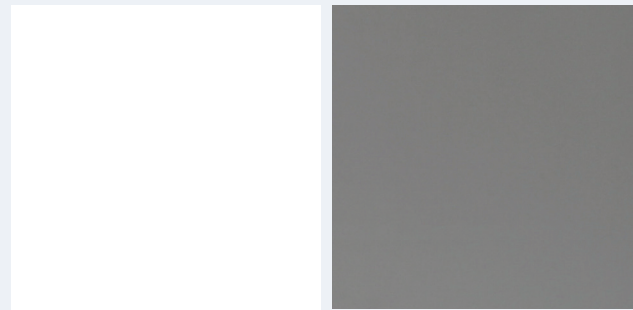

3 CABINET COLOR

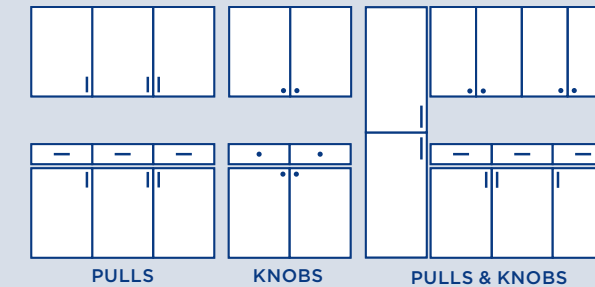
Hold up hardware to cabinet tones above to find the best fit for your cabinets at home.

KNOBS OR PULLS?

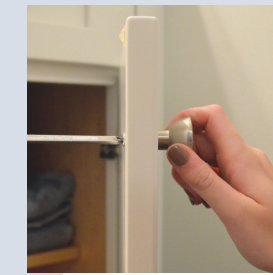
Visually, there is no wrong way to place your hardware! It's all about personal preference.



SWITCHING FROM KNOBS TO PULLS

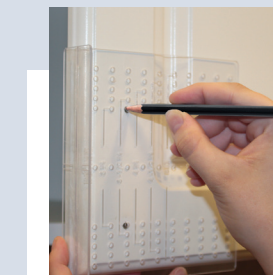
1. Remove Your Knobs

If your cabinets have knobs, and you'd like to change the look from a knob to a pull, it's a simple task! First remove the knob with a screwdriver.



2. Choose Your Pull

Next, choose a pull length you love, and measure the center-to-center. Use a drill template to drill an additional hole on your cabinet that aligns to the existing hole used for the knob.

5 OKAY, LET'S DO THIS!

1. CHOOSE KNOBS & PULLS

Knobs install with one screw and pulls install with two screws.

2. COUNT

Count how many knobs and/or pulls you will need.

Here's a Tip:

Drawers under 24" wide need a single knob or pull and drawers over 24" wide should have either 2 knobs, 2 small pulls or 1 large pull.

3. MEASURE

Use the guide on the reverse side to find the center-to-center of your current cabinet hardware at home.

4. CHECK CLEARANCE

When choosing hardware, be sure to check that a knob's projection will not interfere with the function of other cabinets or drawers.
