Care of Wood Furniture:

Our wood stain and painted finishes are protected by several coatings of lacquer, which will last indefinitely under controlled conditions. Lacquer coatings are not invulnerable to direct sunlight and heat, scratches, dents, or spills of alcoholic beverages. Avoid using silicone waxes, oil-based polishes, or lemon oils. Keep your furniture shielded from daily exposure to direct sunlight, as the sun may cause deterioration of the original finish. Clean your furniture with routine dusting using a damp cloth and then dry the surface immediately using a dry, soft cloth. Always wipe in the direction of the wood grain.

Marble / Stone / Granite Disclaimer:

Marble, Stone, and Granite are products of nature and no two pieces are alike. There will be unique variations in color, and each piece has its own distinctive beauty. Clean hones stone surfaces with a soft cloth, using a mild liquid dishwashing detergent and lukewarm water. Avoid using a cleaning product containing vinegar, lemon, or other acids. Do not use scouring powders or creams, as they contain abrasives that may scratch the surface. Clean Non-honed stone using a lightly damp cloth and then dry the surface immediately with a dry, soft cloth.

Leather Care:

For regular care and cleaning, dust periodically with a dry cloth to remove residual dust and prevent dirt from building up. No harsh cleaners or solvents should ever be used on the leather, as they could abrade the finish or topcoat off the article. For stubborn stains and spills, a lightly damp cloth with warm water should be blotted on the stain to lift and remove it. If this does not work, a mild soap and water solution (Palmolive or Dawn) should be mixed and then blotted to release the stain and then blot again with dry cloth. This should never be done heavily or in a scrubbing motion. Specially formulated leather cleaner and conditioner can be used to rejuvenate fine leather surfaces;

however, some leathers are inherently sensitive so these products should be spot tested before overall use.

Woodbridge Repel Stainguard Linen Fabric:

Woodbridge Repel Stainguard Linen is an "S" fabric which means spot clean only with a water-free dry-cleaning solvent. Pretest a small, inconspicuous area before proceeding. Do not saturate.

DO NOT USE WATER. Pile fabrics may require brushing with a nonmetallic, soft bristle brush to restore appearance. Cushion covers should not be removed and dry-cleaned.

To prevent overall soiling, frequent vacuuming or light brushing with a non-metallic, soft bristle brush to remove dust and grime is recommended. When cleaning a spill, blot immediately to remove spilled material. Evenly clean the entire panel in a seam to seam fashion. Do not clean just the spots or stains.

Woodbridge Outdoor Sunbrella Fabric:

All Sunbrella® fabrics are engineered to combine the highest level of design and performance. For easy day-to-day maintenance of your Sunbrella fabric:

Brush off loose dirt.

Spray on a cleaning solution of water and mild soap.

Use a soft bristle brush to clean.

Allow cleaning solution to soak into the fabric.

Rinse thoroughly until all soap residue is removed.

If the cushion is removable, machine wash cold gentle cycle with tide is acceptable. Air dry.

Care of Teak wood Furniture:

For first use, it is recommended to clean your teak furniture with water hose and spray them to move the dust or dirt. Dry them under direct sunlight and repeat the process for multiple times. This process will help to minimize the potential oil stain from wood sticking to the cushion. However, stain from wood is not covered under factory warranty because teak has natural oil content that allow them to be put outside for outdoor use.

The unique feature of our Weathered Teak finish is the silver-grey patina look to appear faster than normal untreated teak. The process may vary depending on weather conditions, on average it starts to form a handsome silver-grey patina from 6 months to 1 year. After first rainfall, DO NOT ATTEMPT to clean your furniture with soap water. You may clean the furniture but not with soap water. Only use water, hose and spray the dirt away from the wood surface is all that is required.

Further cleaning/conditioning instructions

- Wash by hand at 40°C/100°F or lower.
- Safety soap when needed
- Spray with Teak Cleaner and soft brush and wipe with soft cloth.
