

Keep your child / children at bay in the process of assembly.




## **Assembly Preparation**

### Before Beginning Assembly:




- Read instructions, cover to cover-
- **\***2x**†**
- Have 2 adults on hand for assembly-
- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-

- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-
- Save all packaging until finished-

### Assembly Steps



This Bar Table has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Bed parts, the above picture is to help you put the various Bed parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions herebelow to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.




Unpack all parts.

To avoid any scratch or damage to the products, place onto a clean and flat, soft surface.

To the underside of the table top, there are 4 (four) assembly points.

Insert Studs(1) into these 4 (four) positions with Screwdriver(6).

Fully tighten the studs.




Affix 'X' Plate (D) to the top of Upper Pedestal (B).

Align the holes on the 'X' Plate(D) with the holes on the top of Pedestal (B).

Then, insert the Bolt(G) from the 'X' Plate to the Pedestal.

Then, fix the bolt with Spring Washer & Washer & Nut (2) using Spanner(5).

Fully tighten all the nuts.




Attach the 'X' Plate, from Step 2, to the Table Top(E).


Insert the holes on the 'X' plate to the pre-attached Bolts on the Table Top(E).

Using the Spanner(5), turn in and tighten: Flat Washers, Spring Washers and Nuts(F).

Fully, tighten all Nuts.



Attach the Pedestal - Lower (A) to the Pedestal(B) by turning the Pedestal (A) clockwise.




#### WARNING: DO NOT LIFT UP the Table base to assemble as shown in picture 1

Have your partner hold the Table Top on its side as shown in picture 2.

Insert the screw on the Pedestal - Lower (A) to the hole on the table base(C).

Using the Spanner(5), turn in and tighten: Flat Washers, Spring Washers and Nuts(3).

Fully tighten the Nut.




#### Ensure all Bolts and Screws are FULLY TIGHTEN UP.

Turn the table right side up.

Adjust the pre-attached leg leveller at the end of table base until the table is level with the ground.

Your Bar Table is ready for use.

Caution: This Bar Table can only be used on a flat, level surface.



#### What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 is a California law that requires warning labels on products that may contain one of more than 800-plus chemicals or ingredients that the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) has deemed to cause cancer or other reproductive toxicity. Additionally, this warning label is very common and can be found on almost every piece of furniture sold in the state of California.
