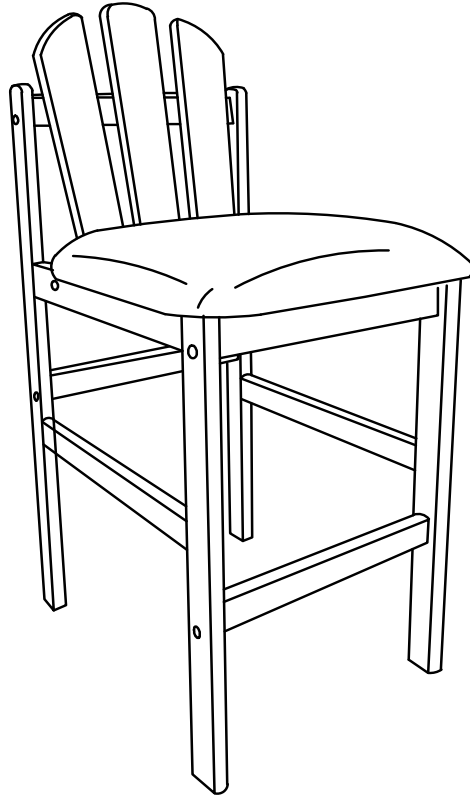

Care & Maintenance

-  ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
-  ● Furniture may scratch floors. We recommend using furniture pads to protect your floors.
-  ● Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
-  ● Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
-  ● Do not place furniture under direct sunlight.
-  ● Do not place furniture near heating or cooling vents.
-  ● Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
-  ● Do not place furniture outside . For indoor use only.
-  ● Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
-  ● Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
-  ● Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

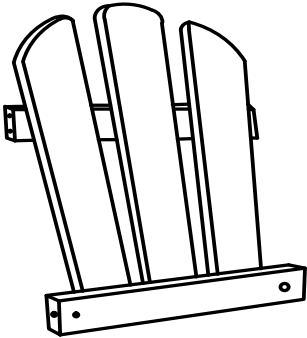
Please look in carton for hardware packs and legs.

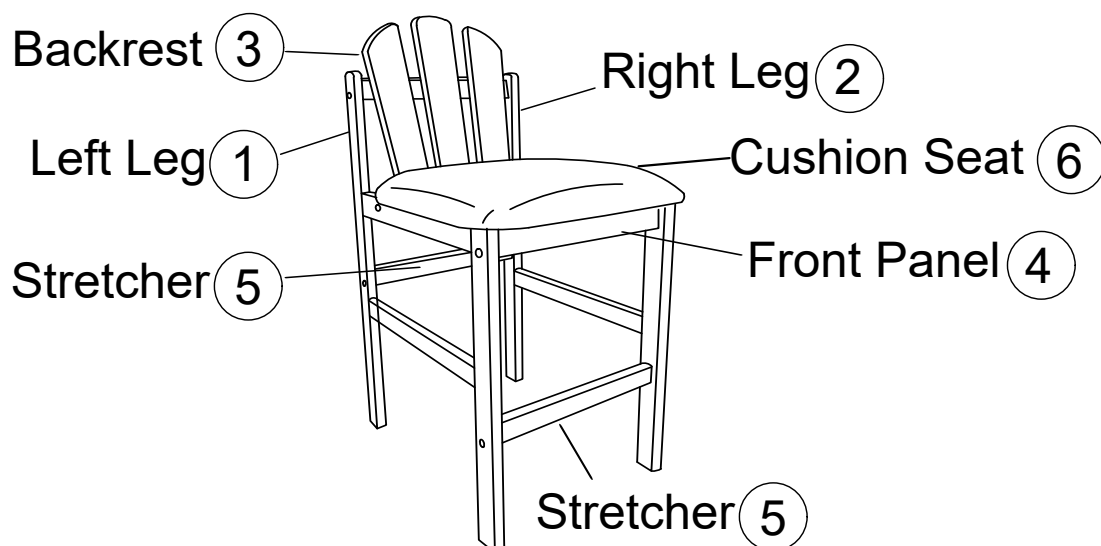
Assembly Preparation

Before Beginning Assembly:



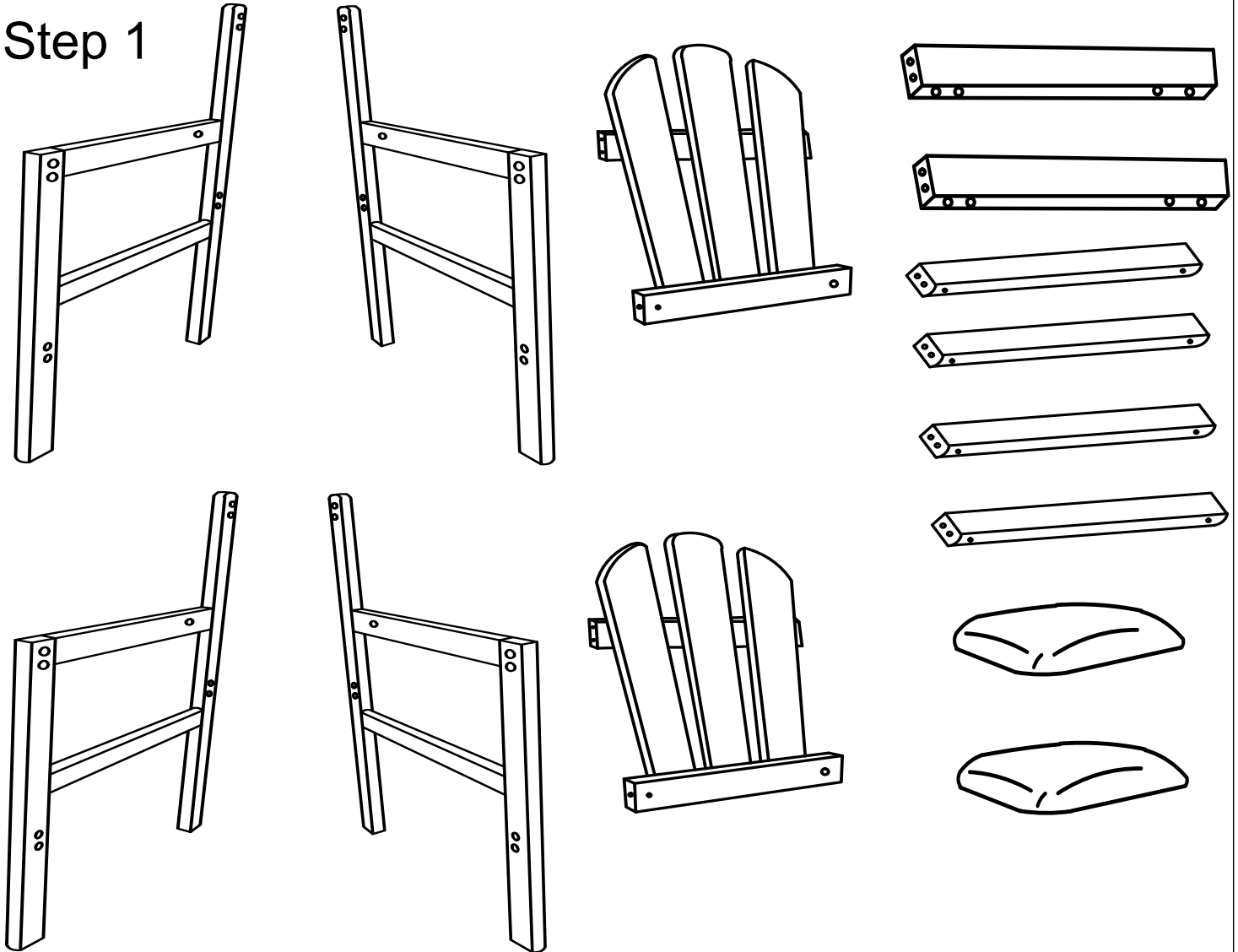
- Read instructions, cover to cover-
- Assembly by one adult-
- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-
- Assembly on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-
- Save all packaging until finished-

Assembly Steps



This Counter stool has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Counter stool parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarize yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



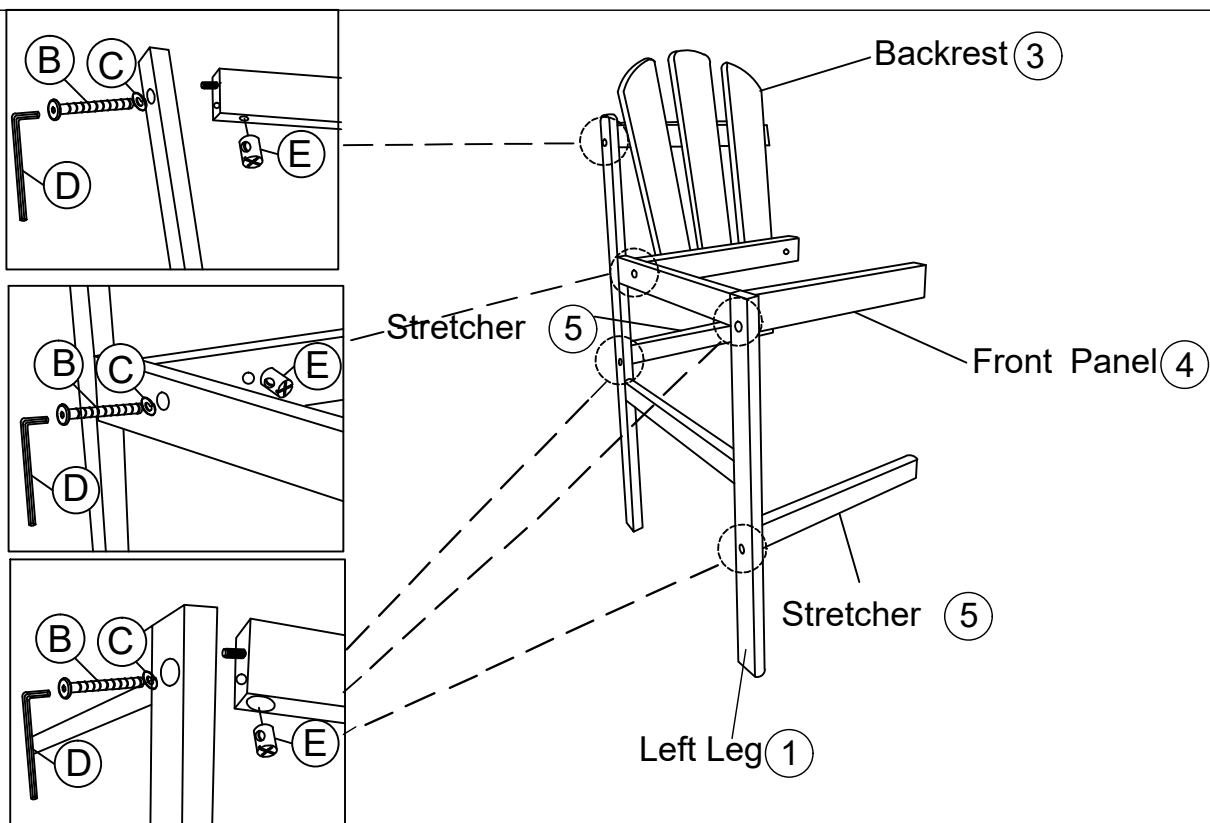
Unpack and place all parts on a clean and soft surface.

Step 2



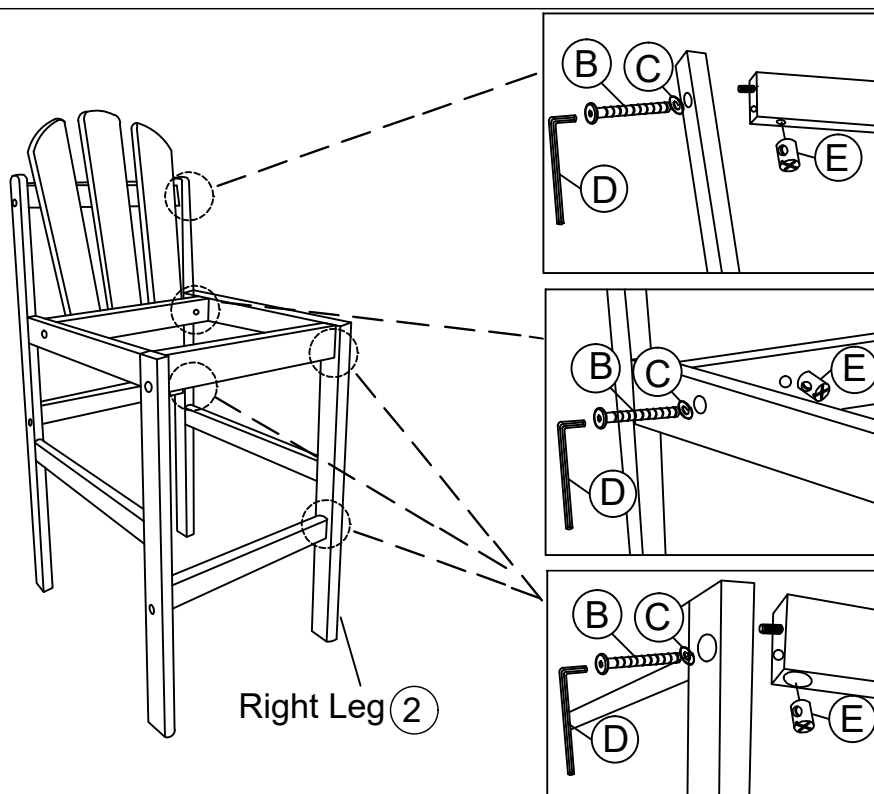
Assemble the product on a soft surface to prevent scratches or damage. Insert the wooden dowels (F) into the holes of the Front Panel (4) and Stretcher (5).

Step 3



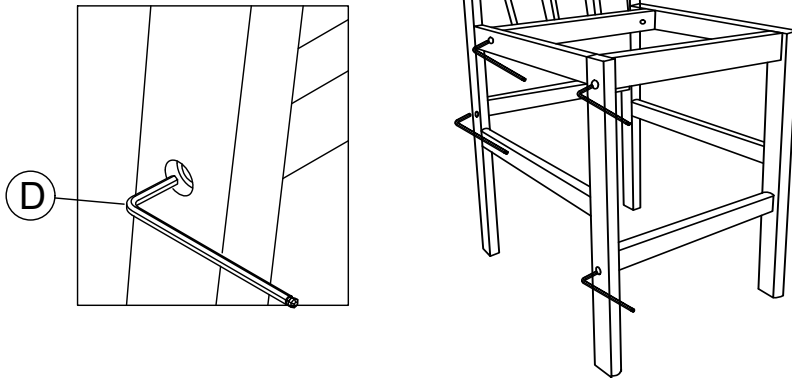
Attach the Backrest (3) and Front Panel (4) and Stretcher (5) to the Left Leg (1) using JCBC Bolts M6 x 50 (B) and Spring Washers (C) and Barrel Nut (E) . Tighten the bolts with the Allen Wrench (D). Do not fully tighten at this stage.

Step 4



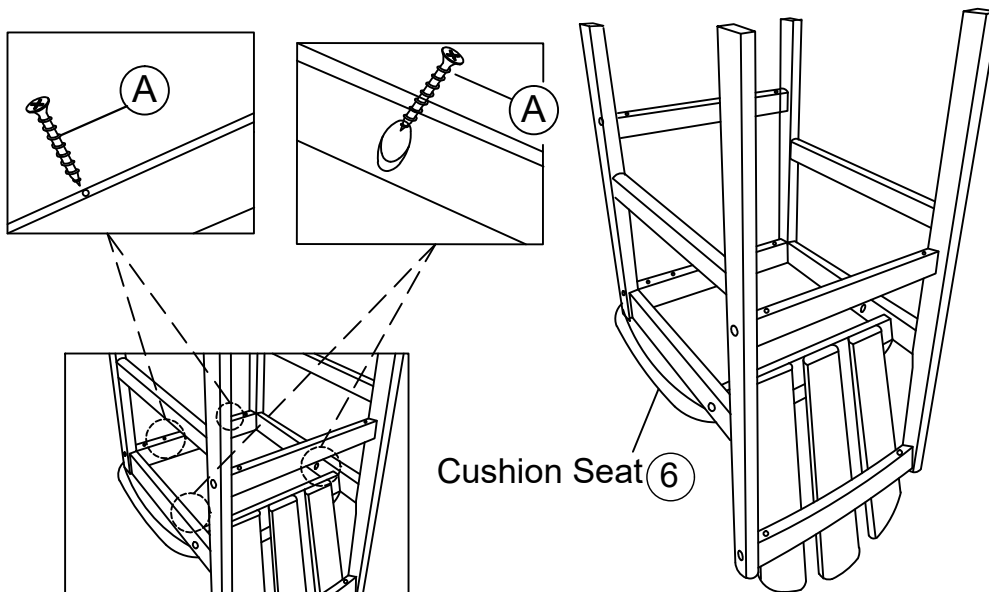
Turn the chair frame onto its side and place the Left Leg (1) flat on a soft surface. Align the mortises on the Right Leg (2) with the tenons of the Backrest (3) and Front Panel (4) and Stretcher (5), then fit them together securely. Fasten the Backrest (3) and Front Panel (4) and Stretcher (5) using JCBC Bolts M6 x 50 (B) and Spring Washers (C) and Barrel Nut (E) . Tighten the bolts with the Allen Wrench (D). Do not fully tighten at this stage.

Step 5



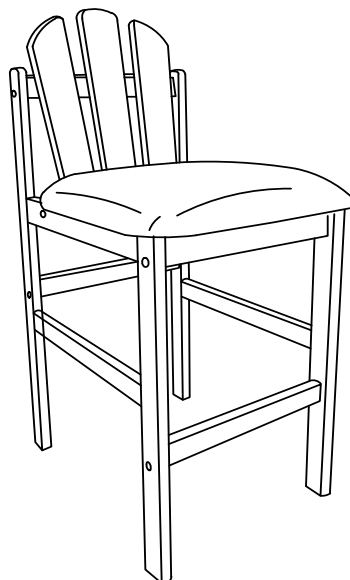
Make sure all four legs rest evenly on the floor, then use the Allen Wrench (D) to fully tighten all previously loosened bolts.
If the chair remains uneven, adjust the legs or slightly loosen and retighten the bolts until stable.

Step 6



Turn the Counter stool so that the backrest faces down, and place it on a Table. Attach the Cushion Seat (6) Insert Wood Screw M4 x 32 (A).

Step 7



Final Assembly & Safety Check

Place the Counter stool on a flat, level surface.

Inspect the Counter stool to ensure all parts are properly connected.

If any bolts are found to be loose, tighten them securely with the Allen Wrench (D).

WARNING:

If the Counter stool is not stable, it may cause injury or product damage.

Always make sure all bolts are securely tightened before use.

The Counter stool is now ready for use.

CAUTION:

This Counter stool must be used only on a flat, level surface

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

• What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

• What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

• What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
