Assembly Preparation

Before Beginning Assembly:



- Read instructions, cover to cover-



- Have 2 adults on hand for assembly-



- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



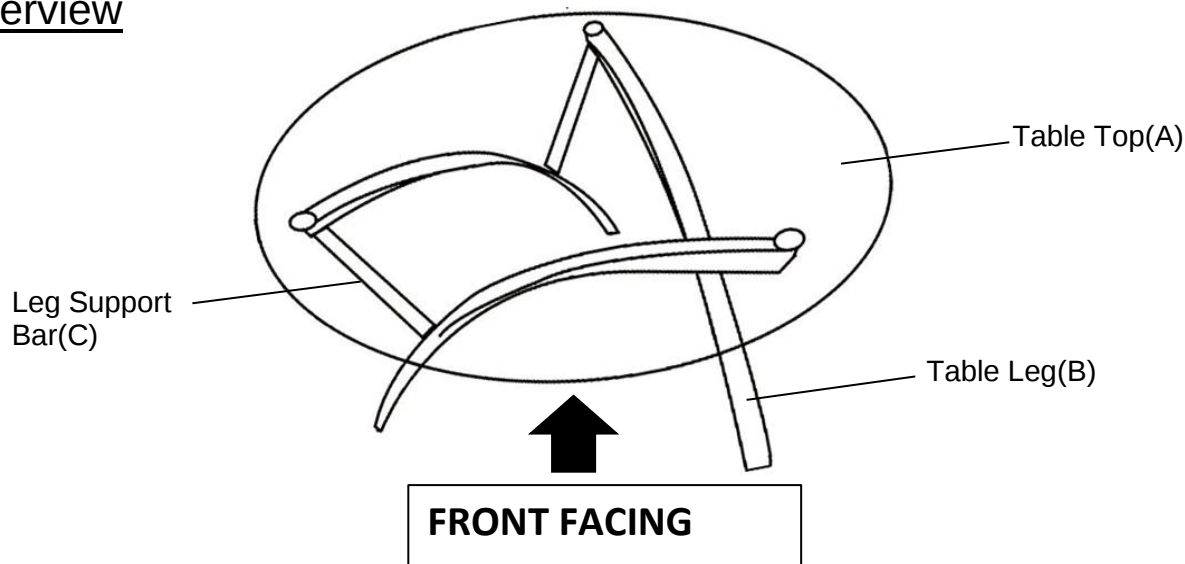
- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



- Save all packaging until finished-

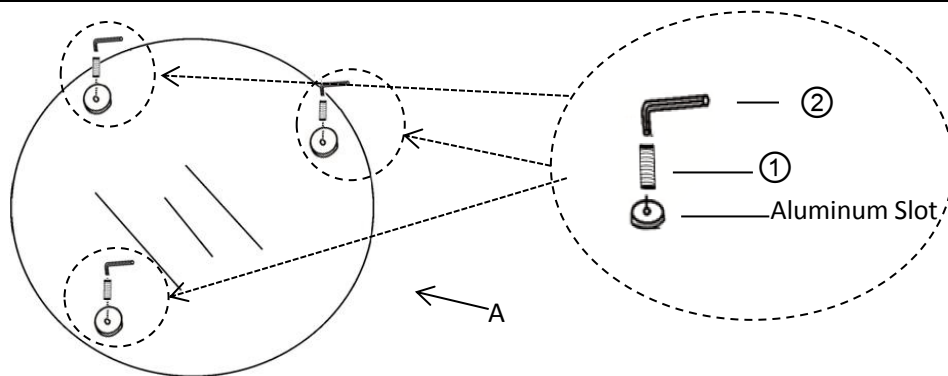
Assembly Steps

Overview



This GLASS COFFEE TABLE has multiple parts and may require up to some 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Table parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions herebelow to familiarise the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



Carefully lay the Table Top(A) facedown on a clean, non-marring surface.

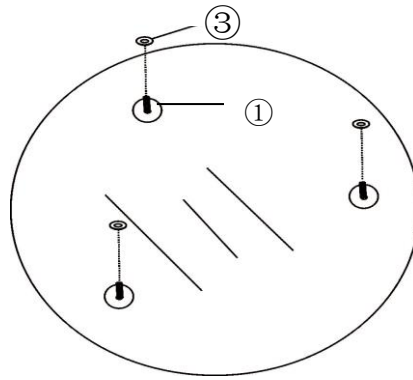
Note: The Aluminum Slots should be facing upward.

Screw the Stud(①) into the Mounting Position of the Aluminum Slot with Allen Key(②), tightening completely in a sequential manner.

Note: Both ends of the Stud(①) are different, be sure that the recessed Allen head is facing outwards.

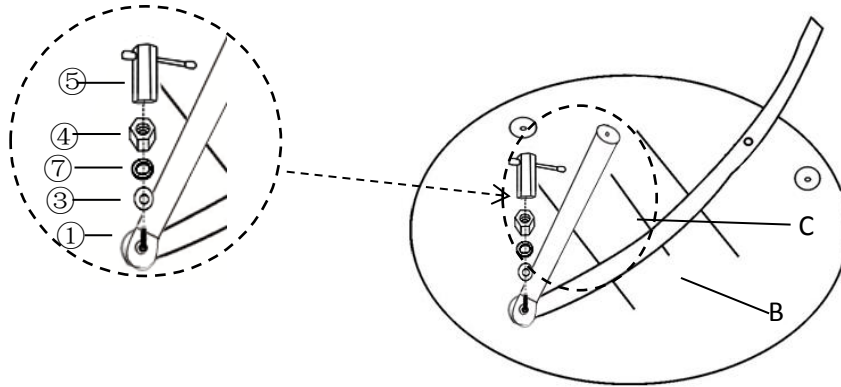
Caution: The Table Top is heavy, two Adults are required whenever lifting or moving it.

Step 2



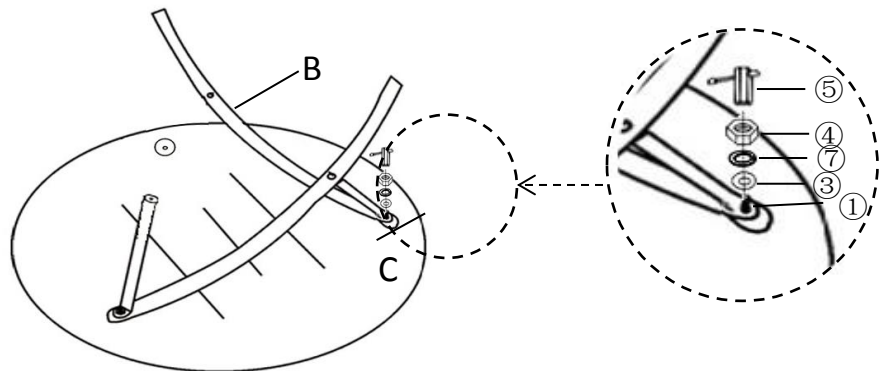
Place the Flat Washer(③) through the Stud(①).

Step 3



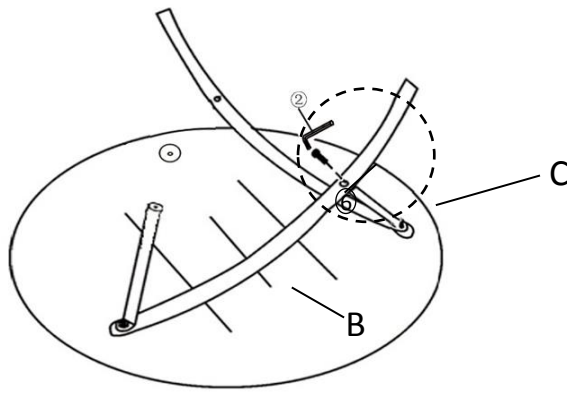
Place the first Table Leg(B) and Leg Support Bar(C) through the Stud(①), and Attach them using Flat Washer(③), Spring Washer(⑦) and Nut(④) with Socket Wrench(⑤). DO NOT fully tighten.

Step 4



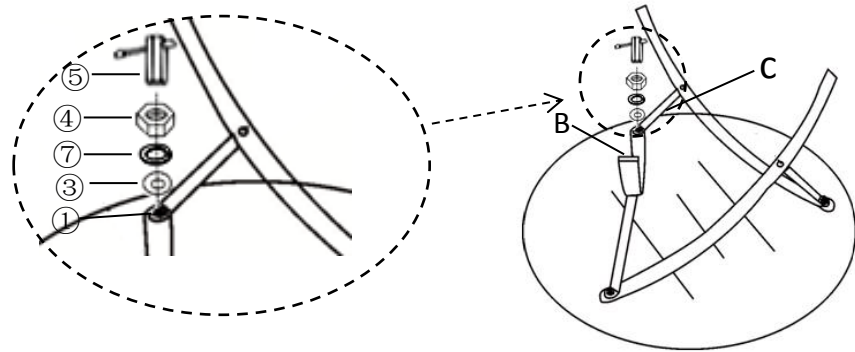
Place the second Table Leg(B) and Leg Support Bar(C) through the Stud(①), and Attach them using Flat Washer(③), Spring Washer(⑦) and Nut(④) with Socket Wrench(⑤). DO NOT fully tighten.

Step 5



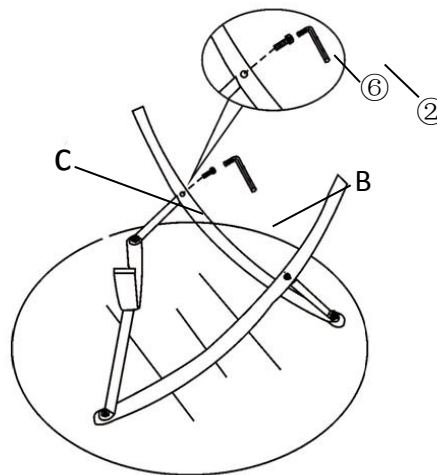
Insert Socket Head Screw(⑥) into the Mounting Position between the first Table Leg(B) and second Leg Support Bar(C) with Allen Key(②).
DO NOT fully tighten.

Step 6



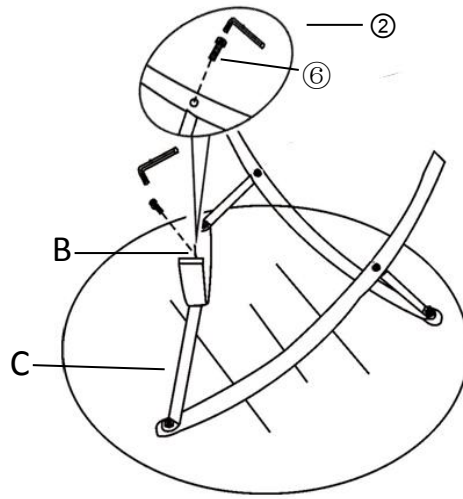
Place the third Table Leg(B) and Leg Support Bar(C) through the Stud(①), and Attach them using Flat Washer(③), Spring Washer(⑦) and Nut(④) with Socket Wrench(⑤).
DO NOT fully tighten.

Step 7



Insert Socket Head Screw(⑥) into the Mounting Position between the second Table Leg(B) and third Leg Support Bar(C) with Allen Key(②).
DO NOT fully tighten.

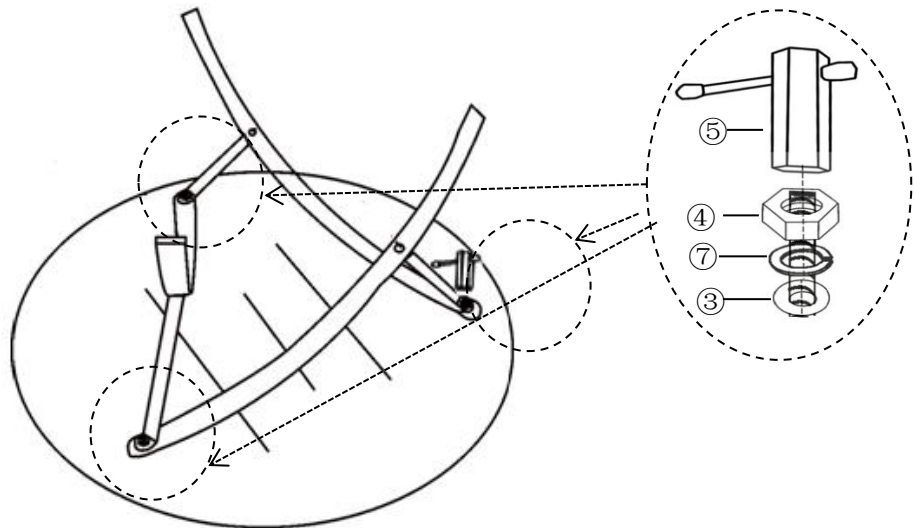
Step 8



Insert Socket Head Screw(⑥) into the Mounting Position between the third Table Leg(B) and first Leg Support Bar(C) with Allen Key(②).

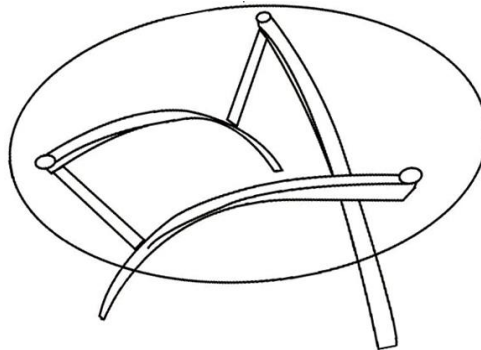
Tighten all Socket Head Screws(⑥) in a sequential manner with Allen Key(②).

Step 9



Tighten all Nuts(④) with Socket Wrench(⑤) in a sequential manner.

Step 10



Turn over the Glass Coffee Table.
Your Glass Coffee Table is ready for use.

Caution: This Glass Coffee Table can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Care & Maintenance

-   ● Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface
 -   ● Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
 -   ● Do not place furniture under direct sunlight.
 -   ● Do not place furniture near heating or cooling vents.
 -   ● Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
 -   ● Do not place furniture outside . For indoor use only .
 -   ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only .
 -   ● Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
 -   ● Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.

-   ● Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth .

•What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

•What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

•What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
