Care & Maintenance

- Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.



- Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.



- To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.



- Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.



- Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.



- To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or vawnings.



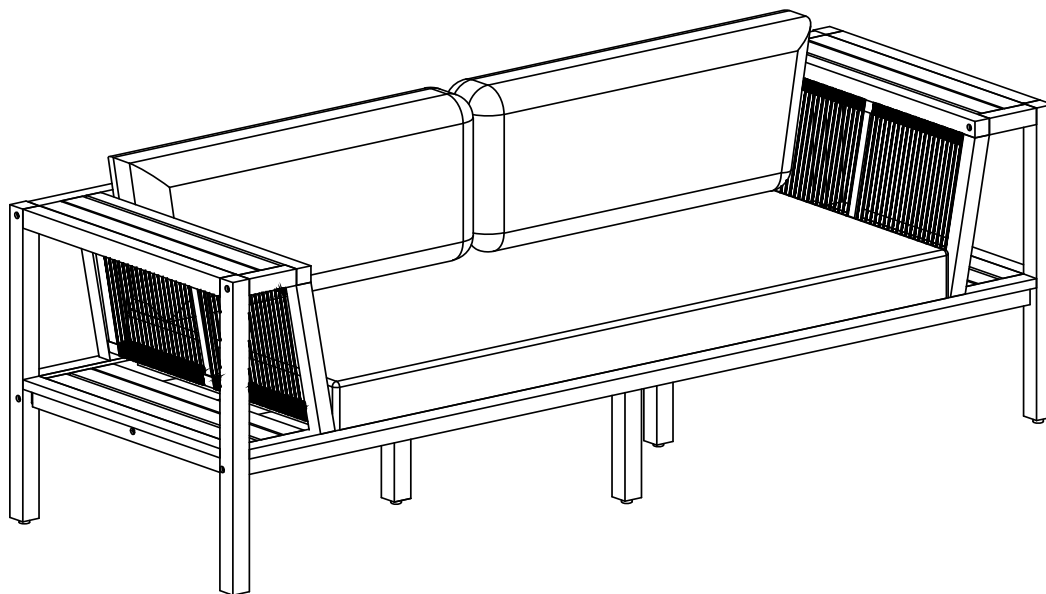
- Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.

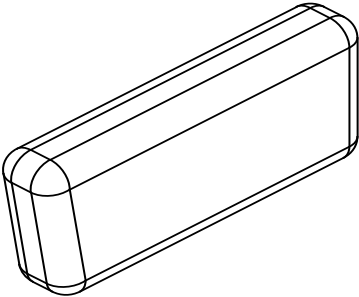
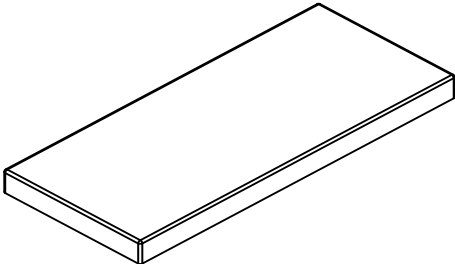
Keep your child/ children at bay during the assembly process.

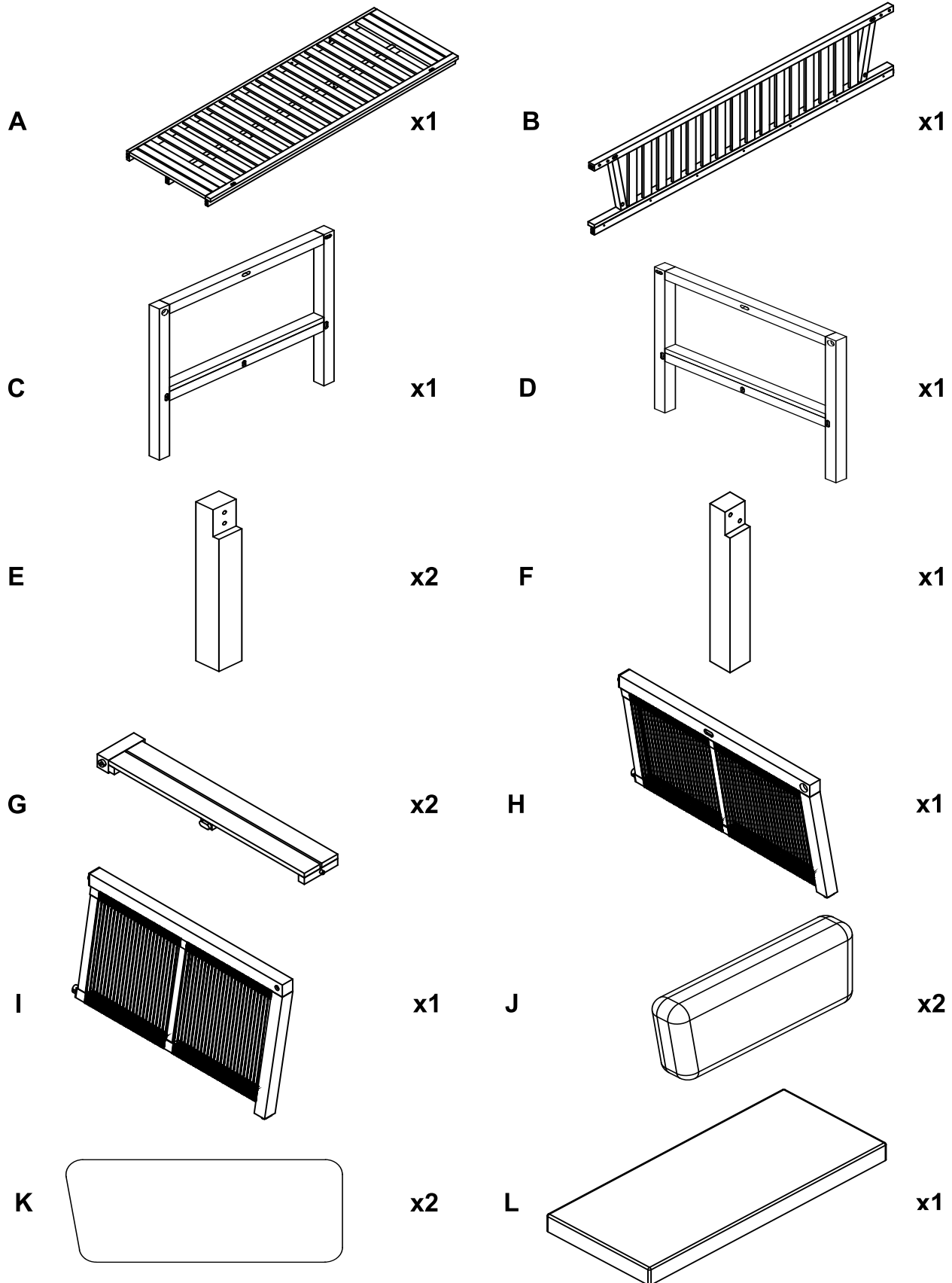

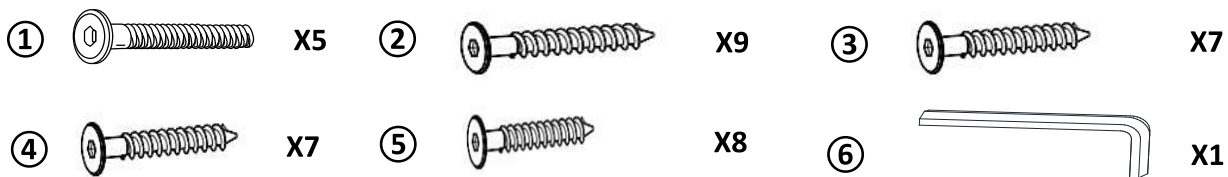

- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



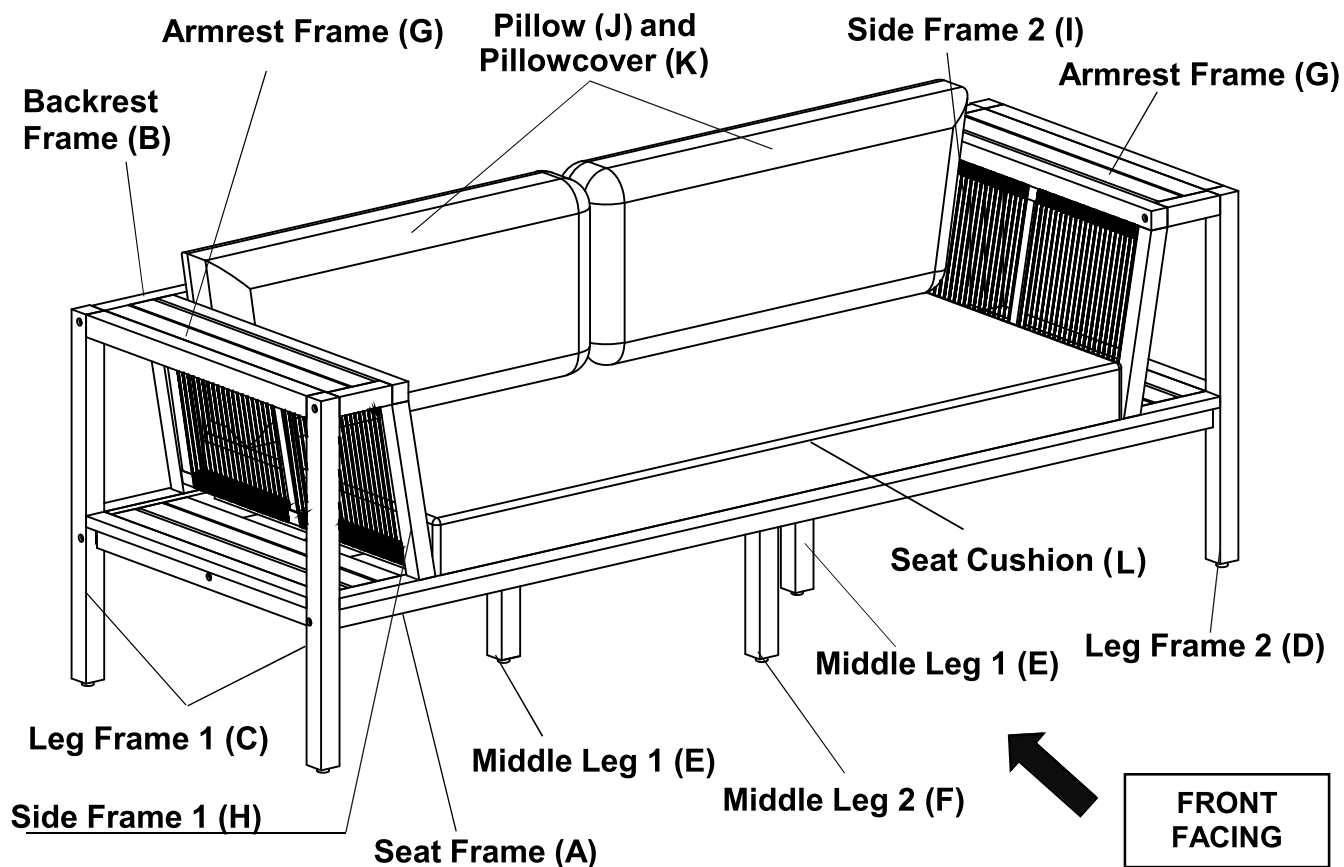
- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



- Save all packaging until finished-

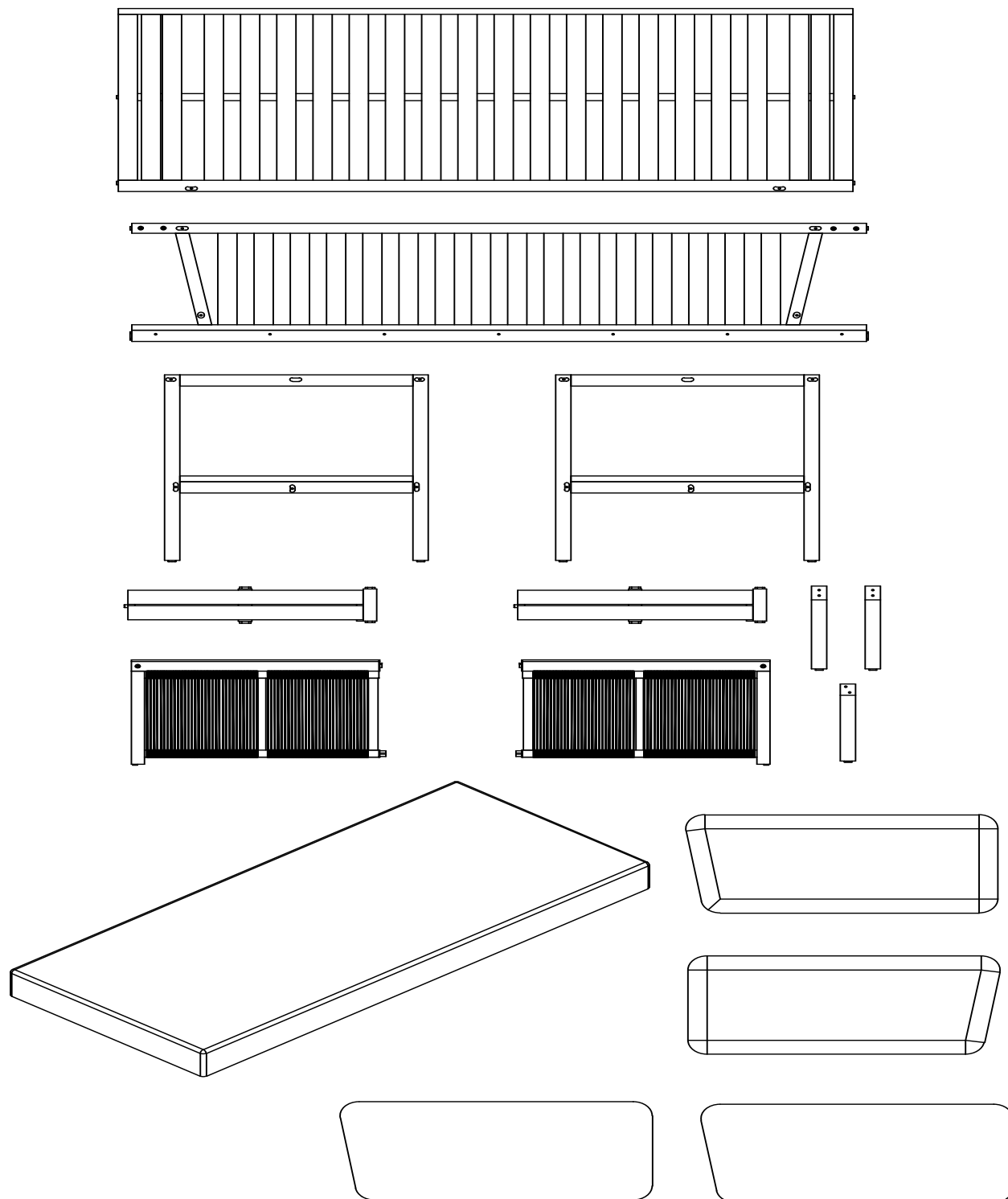
Assembly Steps

Overview



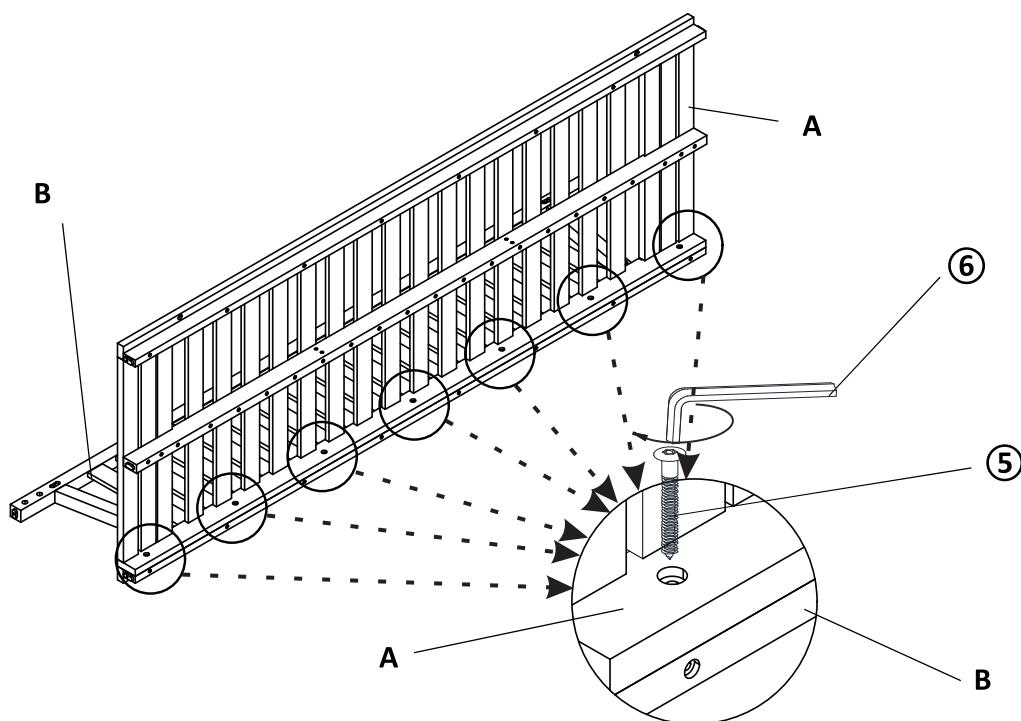
This DayBed has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the DayBed parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1:



Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

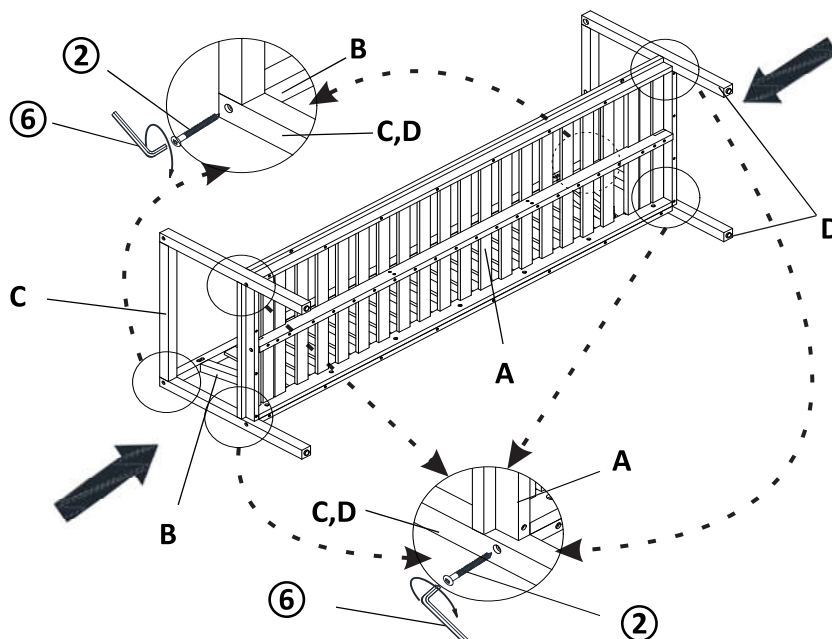
Step 2:



Place the Seat Frame (A) and Backrest Frame (B) on a clean, non-marring surface. Attach the Seat Frame (A) to the Backrest Frame (B) by using Screws (⑤) and the Allen Wrench (⑥) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time .

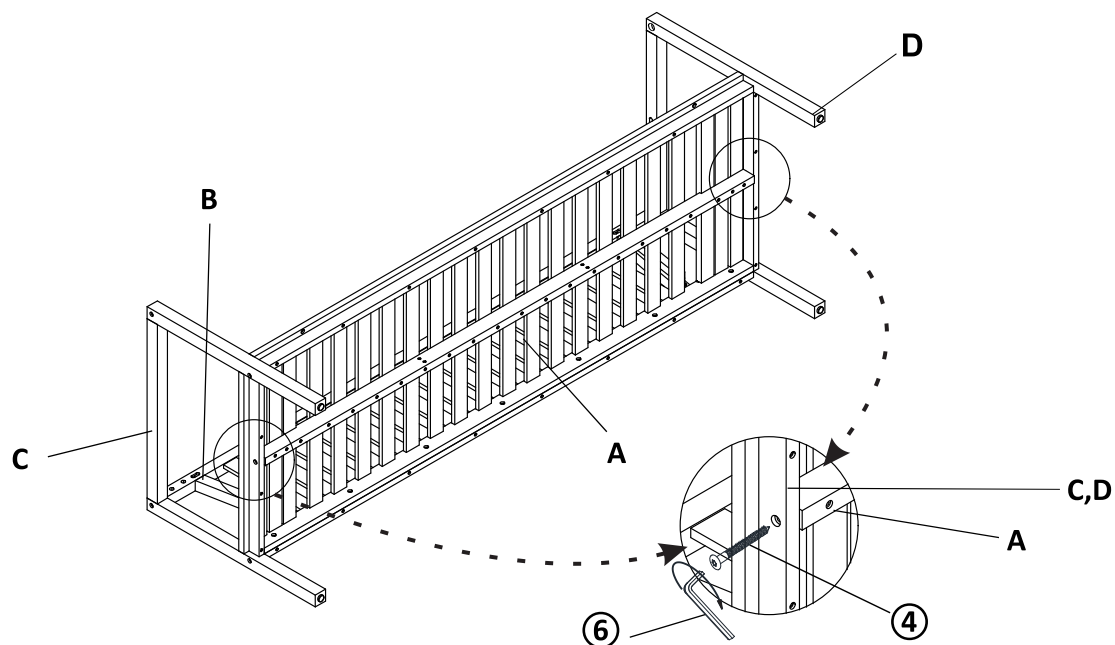
Step 3:



Attach the Leg Frame 1 (C) and Leg Frame 2 (D) to the assembled part in Step 2 by using Screws (②) and the Allen Wrench (⑥) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time .

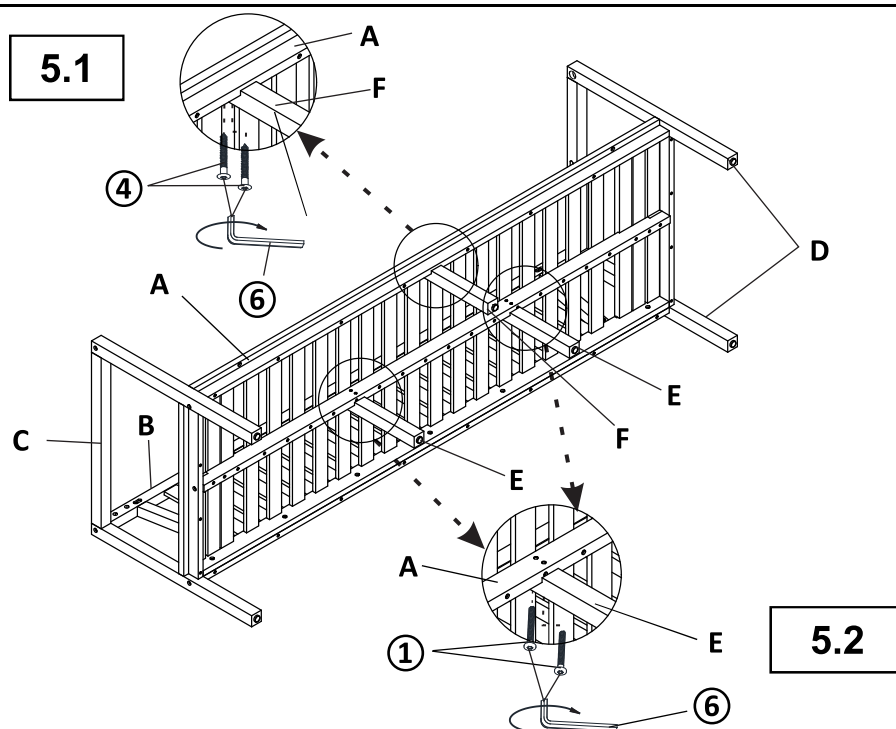
Step 4:



Attach the Leg Frame 1 (C) and Leg Frame 2 (D) to assembled part in Step 3 by using Screws (④) and the Allen Wrench (⑥) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time

Step 5:

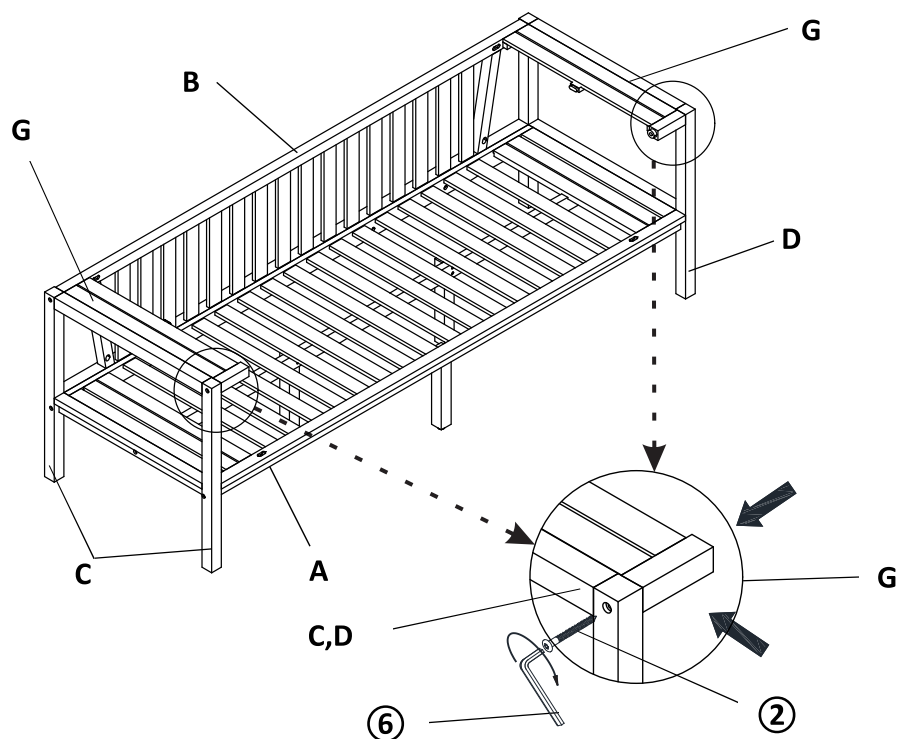


5.1 Attach the Middle Leg 2 (F) to the assembled part in Step 4 by using Screws (④) and the Allen Wrench (⑥).

5.2 Attach the Middle Leg 2 (E) to the assembled part in Step 4 by using Bolts (①) and the Allen Wrench (⑥).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts and Screws at this time

Step 6:

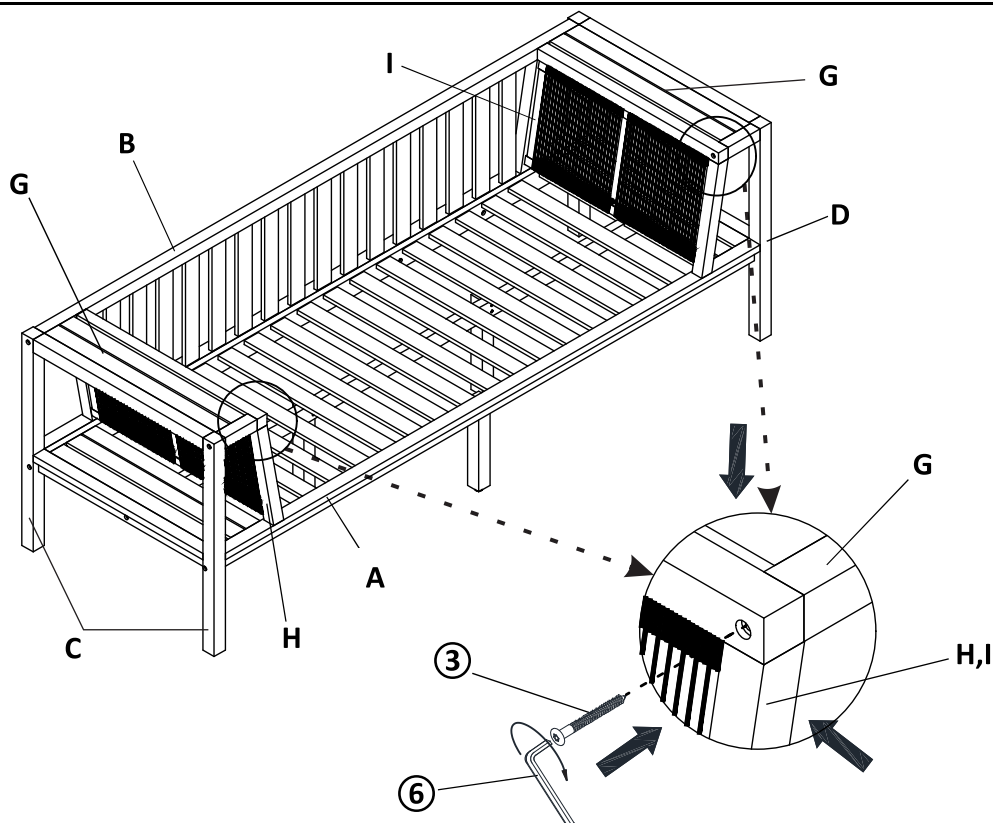


Stand the DayBed up, with assistance from your adult partner.

Attach the Armrest Frame (G) to assembled part in Step 5 by using Screws (2) and the Allen wrench (6) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time

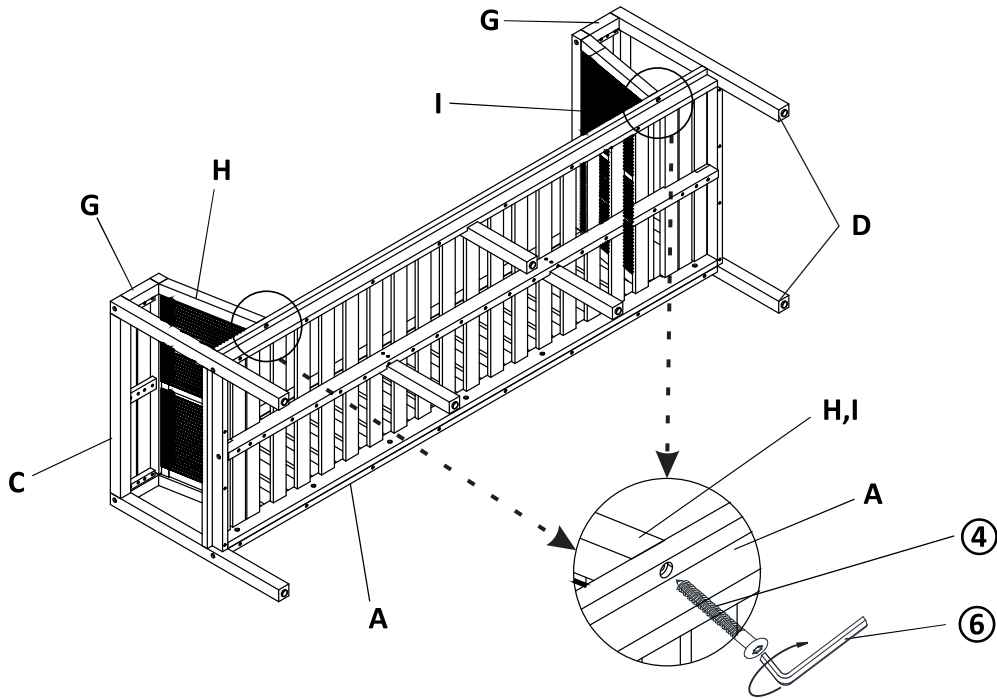
Step 7:



Attach the Side Frame 1 (H) and Side Frame 1 (I) to assembled part in Step 5 by using Screws (③) and the Allen wrench (⑥) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time

Step 8:

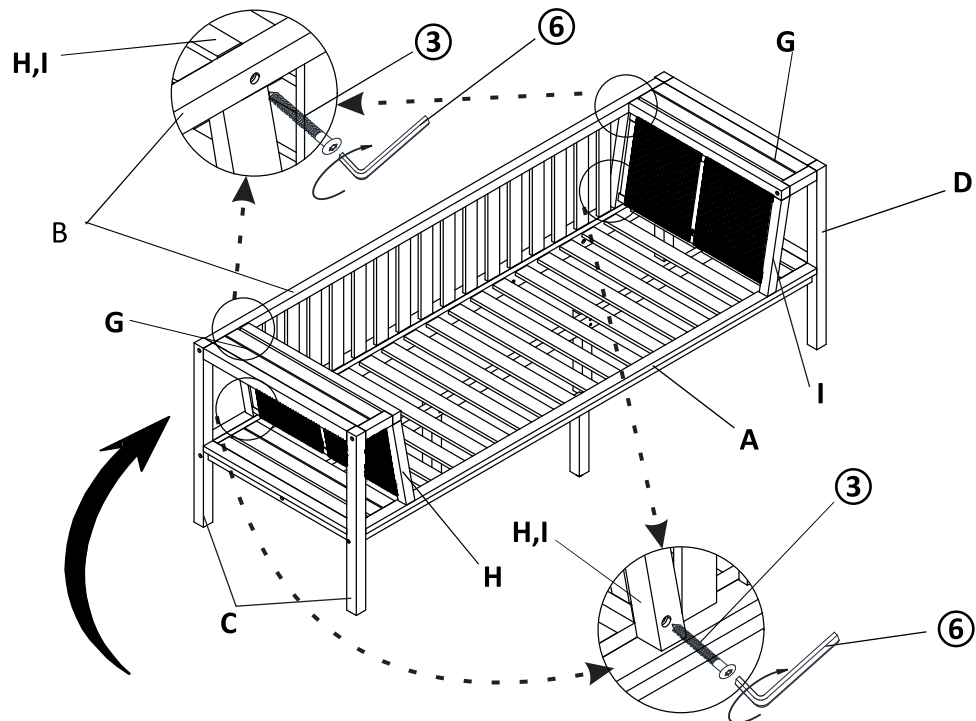


Stand the DayBed up, with assistance from your adult partner.

Continue Attach the Side Frame 1 (H) and Side Frame 1 (I) to assembled part in Step 7 by using Screws (④) and the Allen wrench (⑥) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time

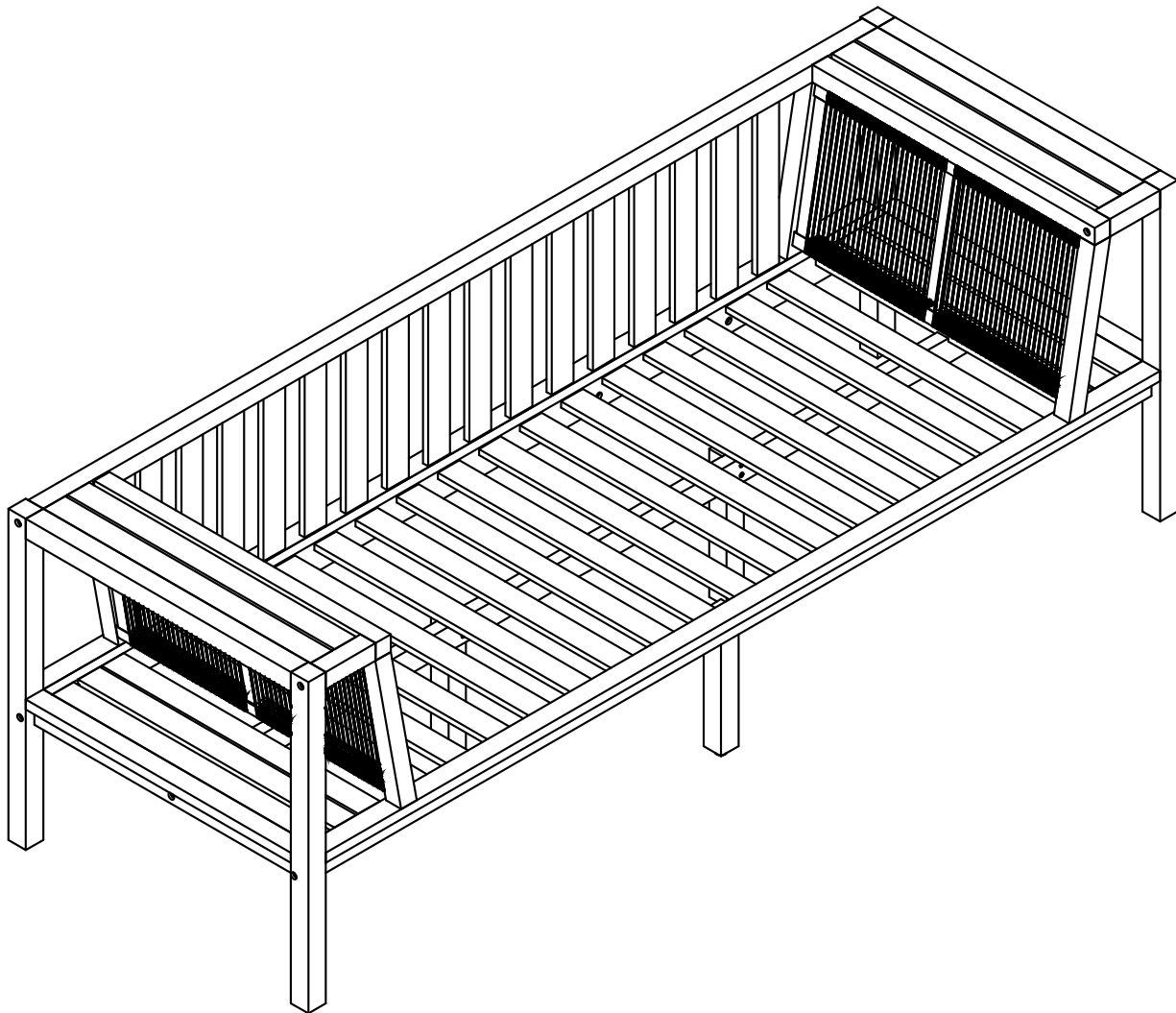
Step 9:



Stand the DayBed up, with assistance from your adult partner.
Continue Attach the Side Frame 1 (H) and Side Frame 1 (I) to assembled part in Step 8 by using Screws (③) and the Allen wrench (⑥) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time

Step 10:



Stand the DayBed up, with assistance from your adult partner.
Exert pressure floorwards, onto the DayBed with both your hands.
This pressure will help the Legs and DayBed Top reach full alignment status.
Check for wobbles on a LEVEL surface.

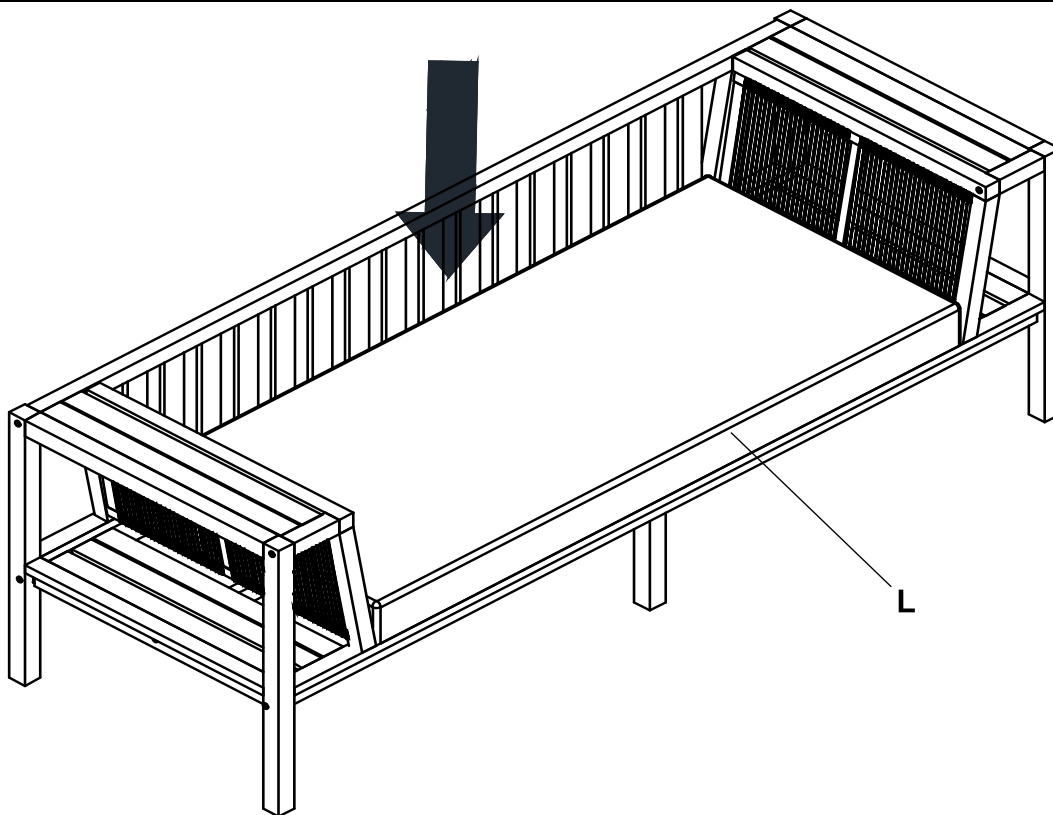
If no wobbles are found proceed to tighten the Bolts and Screws in a sequential manner, until evenly secured.

When tightening the Bolts and Screws tighten sequentially.

Do not tighten any Bolt or Screw fully and then move on towards the next one.

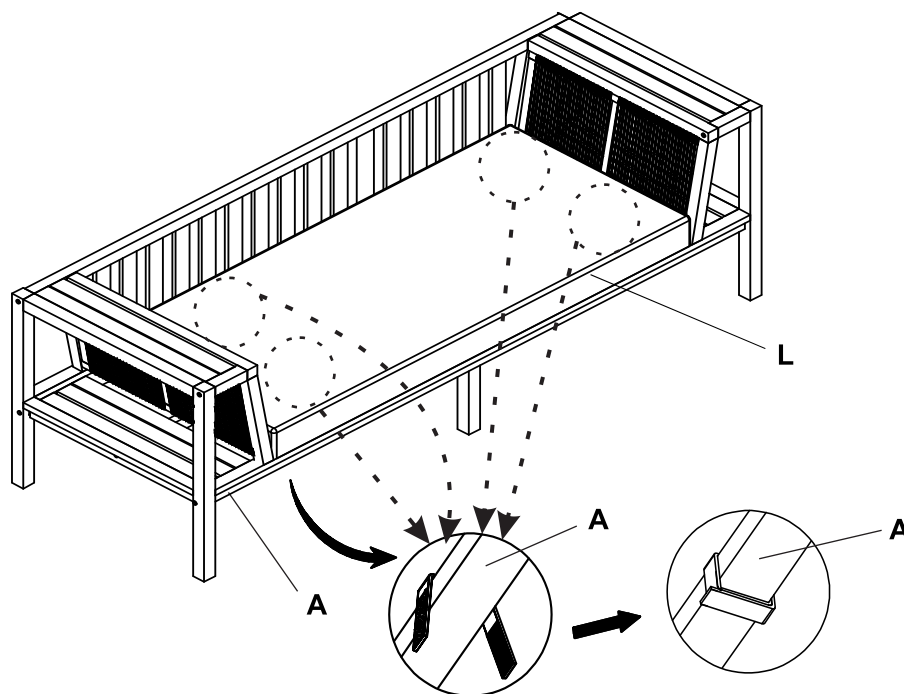
If there are still wobbles, loosen the Bolts and Screws and excute the same above process.

Step 11:



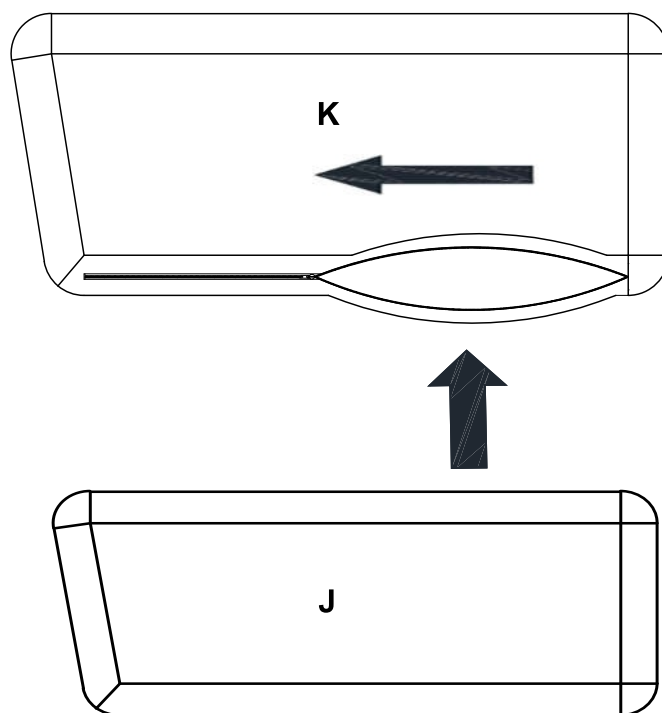
Place the Seat Cushion (L) into the DayBed as shown above.

Step 12:



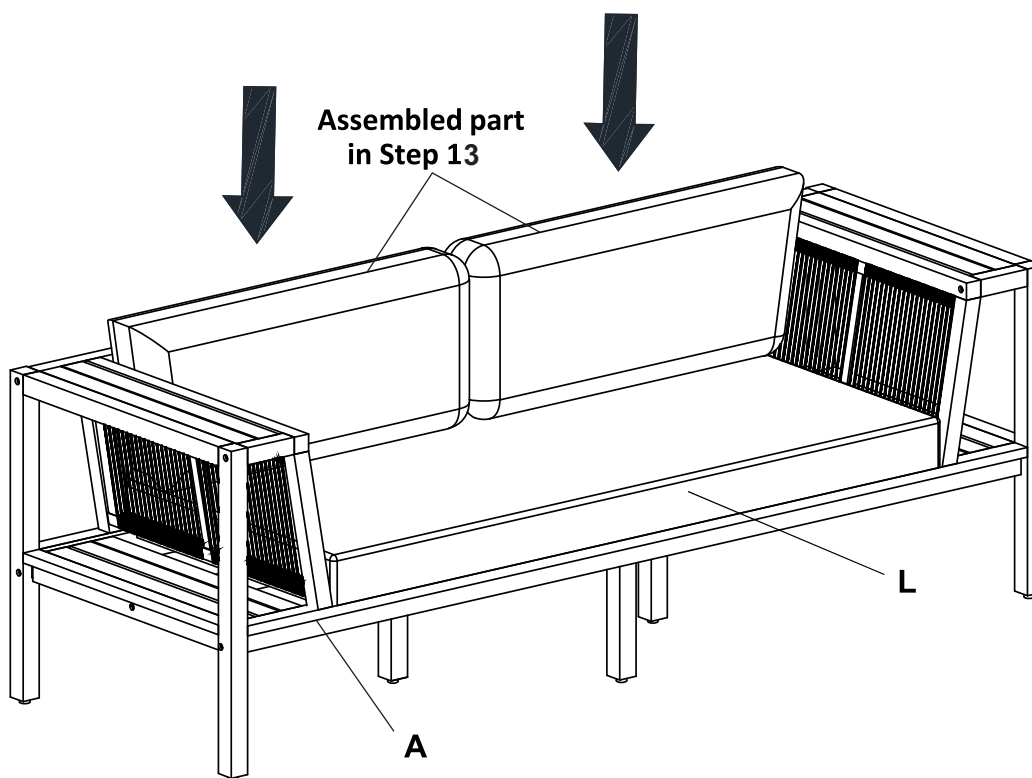
Then affix the "magic tape straps" of Seat Cushion (L) to the slats of Seat Frame (A) as shown above.

Step 13:



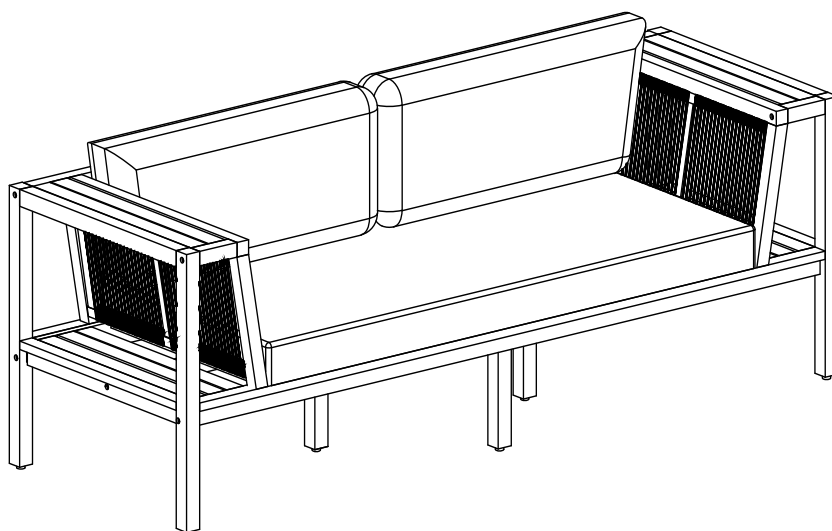
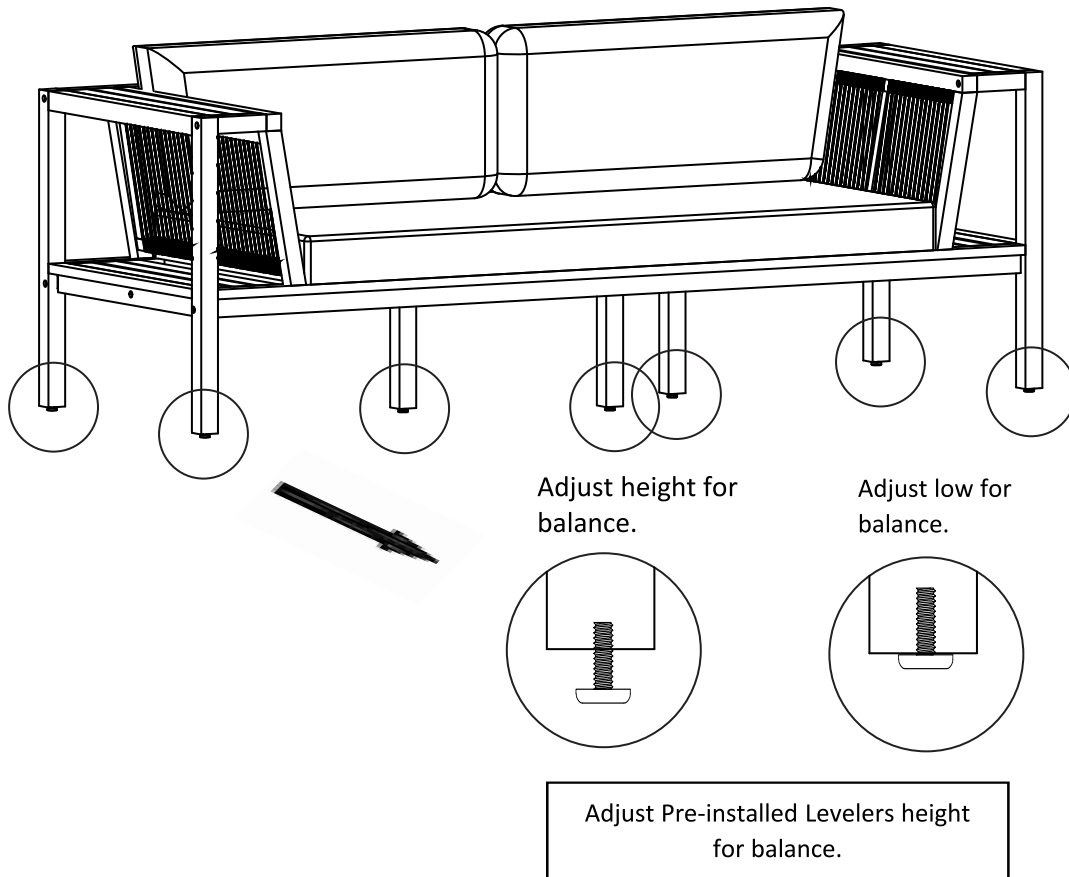
After unfolding the Pillow (J) and Pillowcover (K), unzip the pillowcover and place the pillow inside as shown above.

Step 14:



Continue place the assembled part in Step 13 into the DayBed as shown above.

Your DayBed is ready for use.
This DayBed can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
