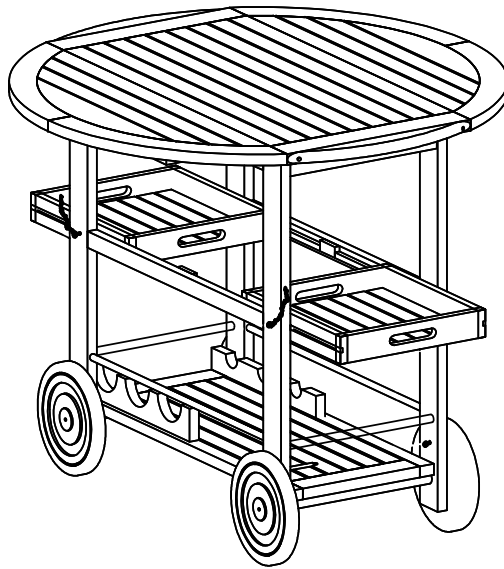

Care & Maintenance

- ⊘  • Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
- ⊘  • Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
- ⊘  • Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
- ✓  • To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
- ⊘  • Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
- ⊘  • Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect surface.
- ✓  • To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
- ⊘  • Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
- ✓  • Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

For turning/ flipping the Bar Cart and to prevent damage to the Bar Cart, 2 persons may be needed to execute this action

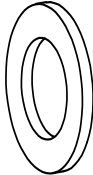
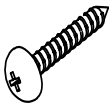
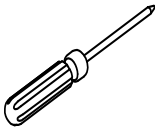

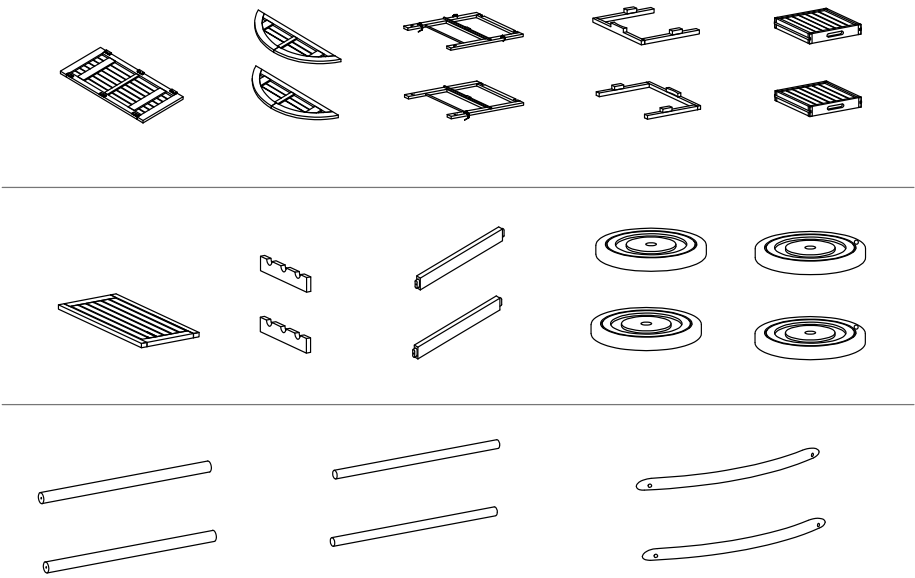
OVERVIEW



This Bar Cart has multiple parts and may require up to some 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Bar Cart, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions here below to familiarise the parts and steps before assembly

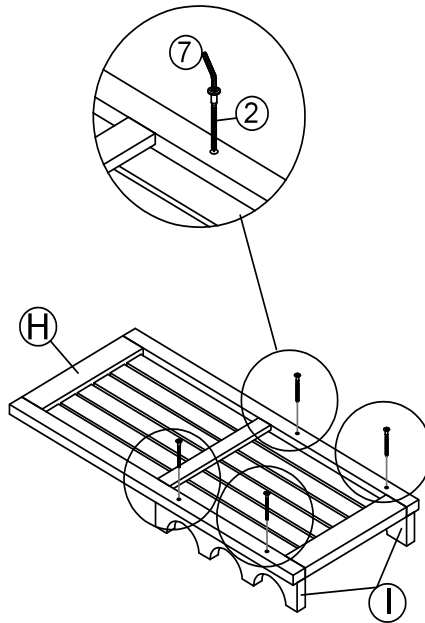
Step 1



Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

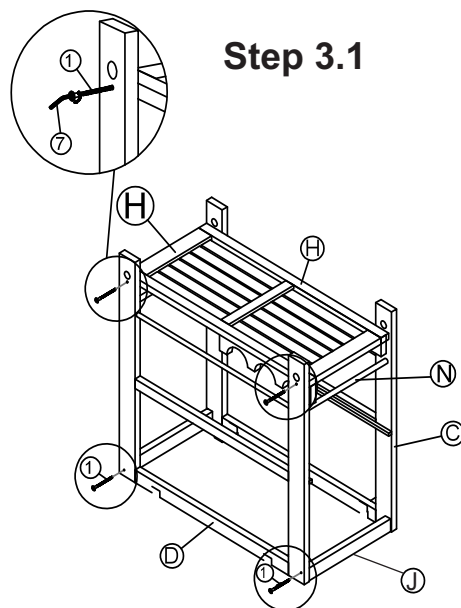

Step 2

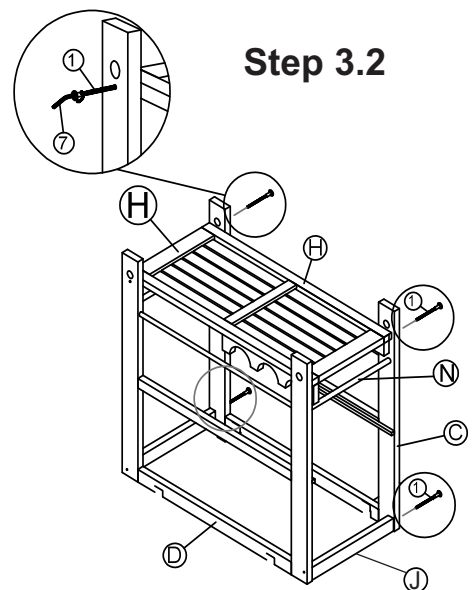


With the help of an adult, attach Bar (I) to the Bottom Shelf (H) using Screws (2). and Allen wrench (7).

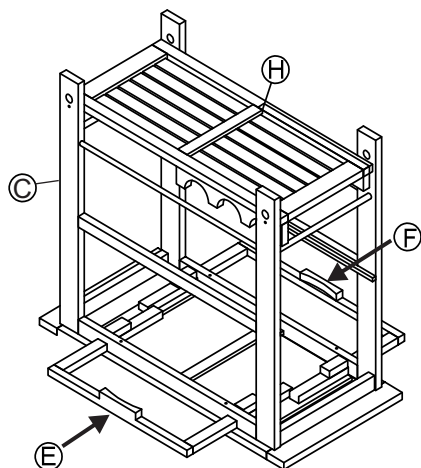
Attach leg frames (C),(D) and (J) to the Bottom Shelf (H) and Handle (N) using Screws (1) and the Allen wrench (7).

Do not fully tighten the bolts.

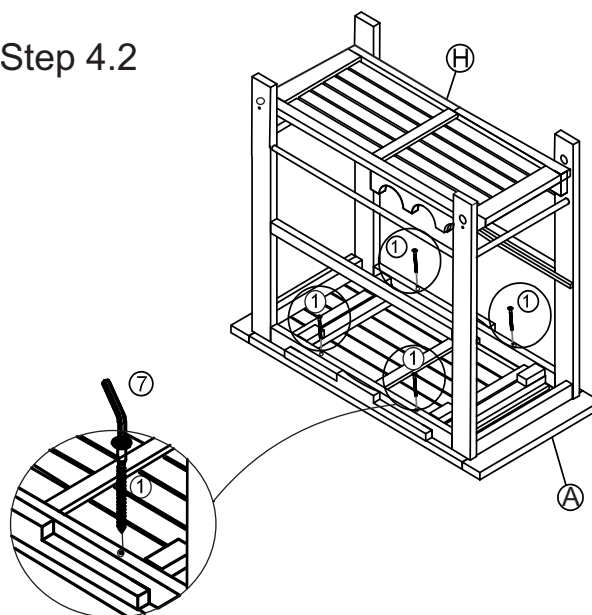

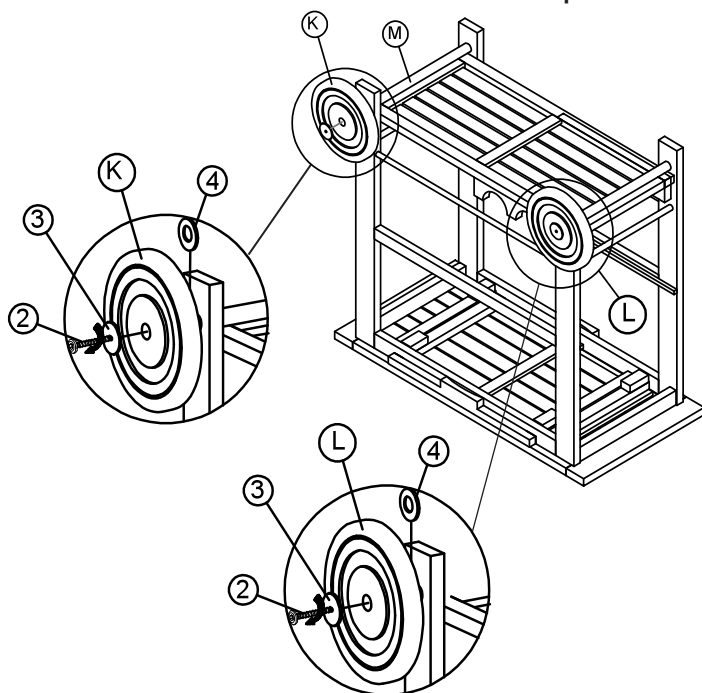

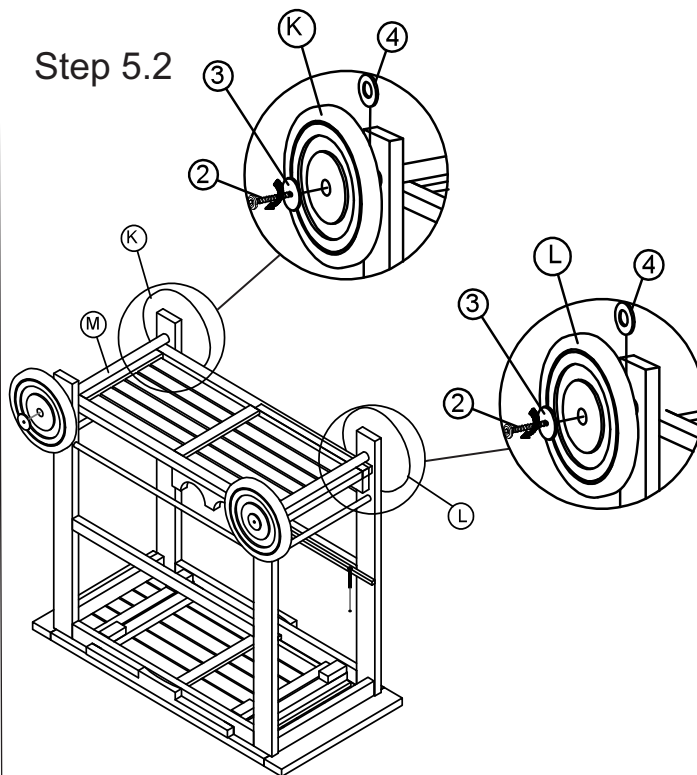
Place the tabletop (A) on a clean, flat surface and attach the extension support arms (E, F). Position the leg frame assembly over the mounting points as shown, and secure it using the Screws (1) and the Allen wrench (7).

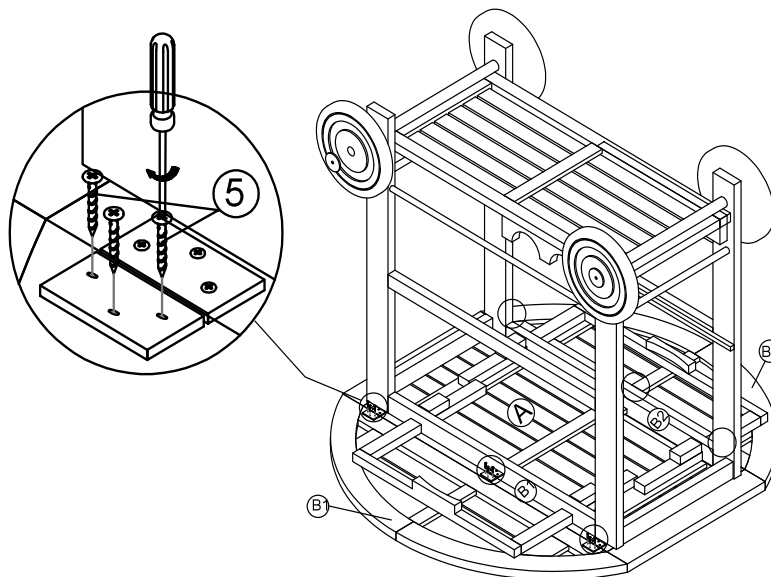

Insert the round axle (M) into legs (C) and (D). Position wheel (K,L) as shown in the image above, noting the small hole on the wheel designed to engage the locking pin on the leg. Secure wheel (K,L) to legs (C) and legs (D) using bolt (2), washer (3), washer (4), Allen wrench (7) .

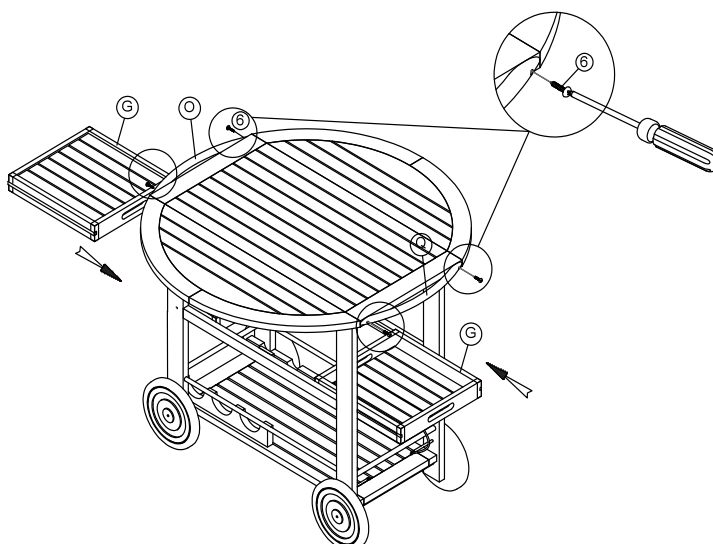
Assembly Steps

Step 6



Installation location: Attach the two extension corner panels (B1) and (B2) to the top panel (A).
Procedure: Position the corner panels (B1) and (B2) over the pre-drilled holes on panel (A).
Use a screwdriver to align the parts and secure them with the short screws (5). A total of 3 hinges are required for each panel, positioned as shown in the illustration. Important note: Do not overtighten.

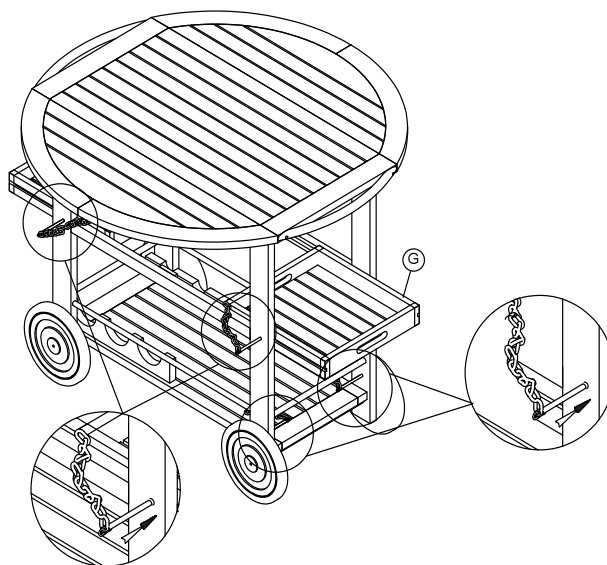
Step 7



Secure the Handle (O) and Top Plate (A) using Screws (6) and a screwdriver.
As illustrated above. Push in the Tray (G) onto the assembly on step 6 as shown picture above.

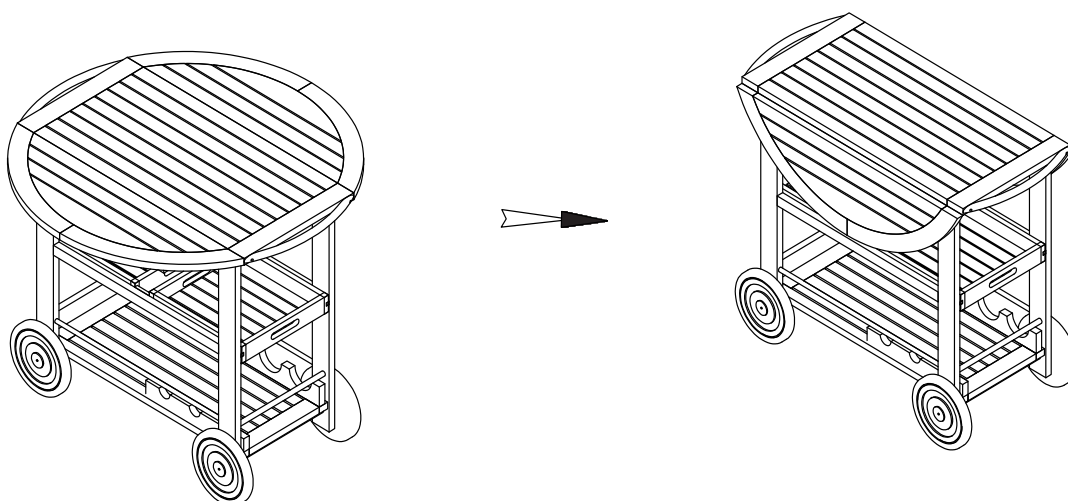

Step 8



Lock two Trays (G) when pushing the barcart as shown in picture above .
The safe lock will be as picture shows above when pushing the Bar Cart

Step 9



In a sequential manner gradually tighten all Screws and Bolts until evenly secured.
Inspect the Bar Cart and make sure all parts are securely connected
In case of closing the Leaf (B1), (B2), please follow step 9
Your Bar Cart is ready for use.
This Bar Cart can only be used on flat, level surfaces.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
