CAUTION: You must read these Assembly Instructions before you proceed.



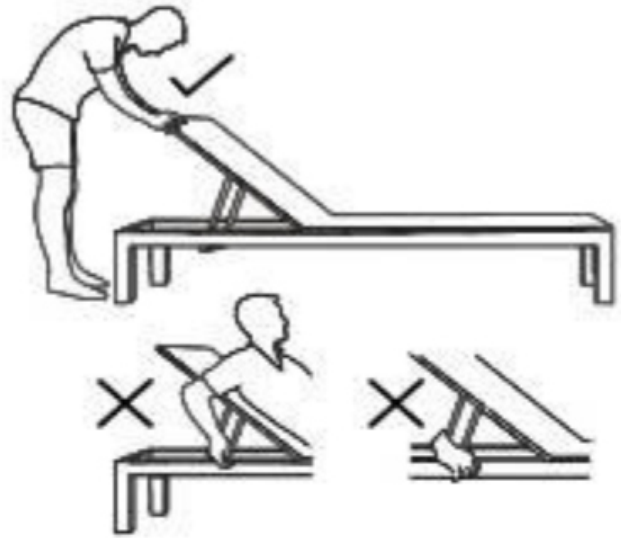
SAFETY WARNING

Never adjust chair lounge or recliner backrest while seated.

Always make sure the backrest is flat before moving the chaise lounge.

Keep all limbs clear from the backrest when it is in a raised position.

Serious finger, hand, or other bodily injuries may result from adjusting the chaise lounge backrest



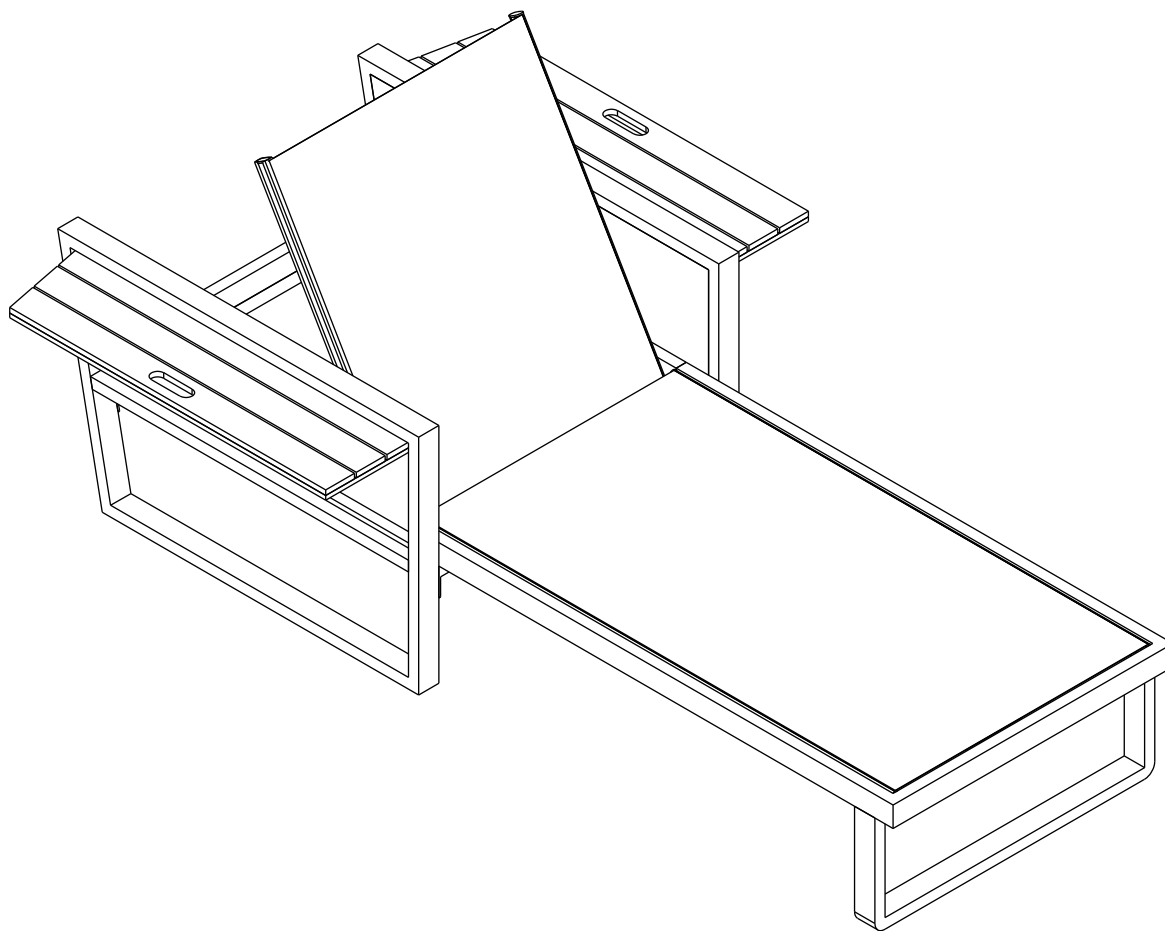
The examples picture above are non exhaustive and are for your reference only.

Care & Maintenance

-  Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
-  Prolonged exposure to rain may cause rusting which can stain floors.
-  Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
-  Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
-  To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
-  Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
-  Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
-  To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
-  Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
-  Keep away from sources of ignition.
-  Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

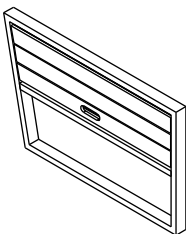
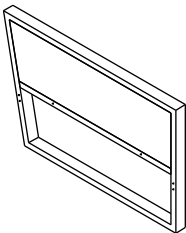
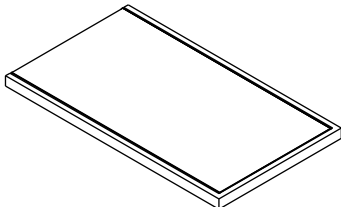
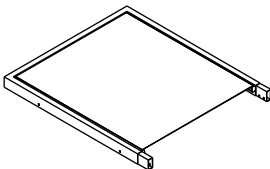
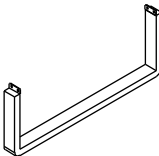
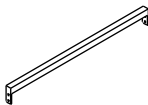

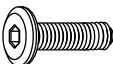
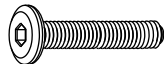


Caution: This Chaise Lounger is NOT a TOY

- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet.



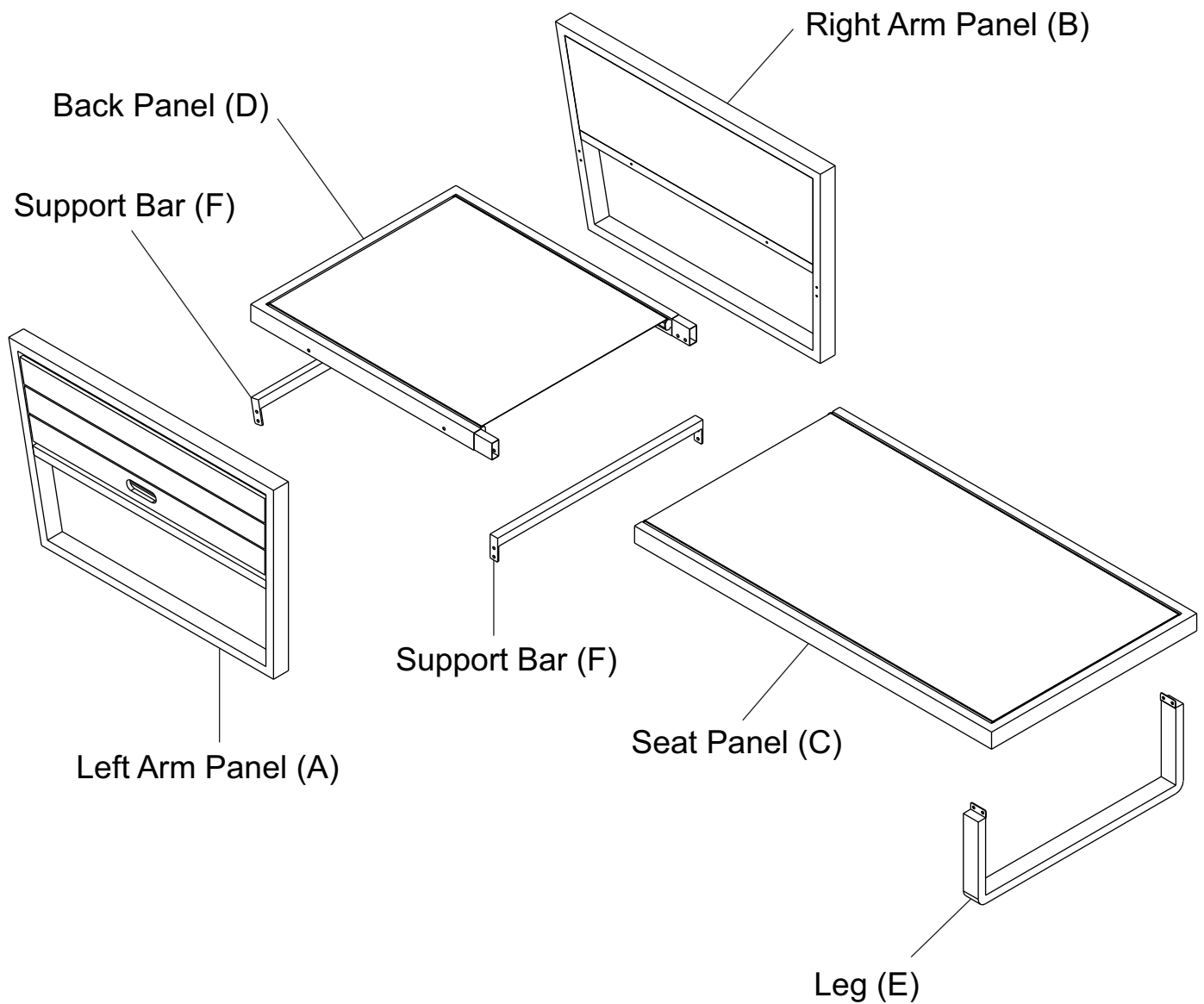
- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam).

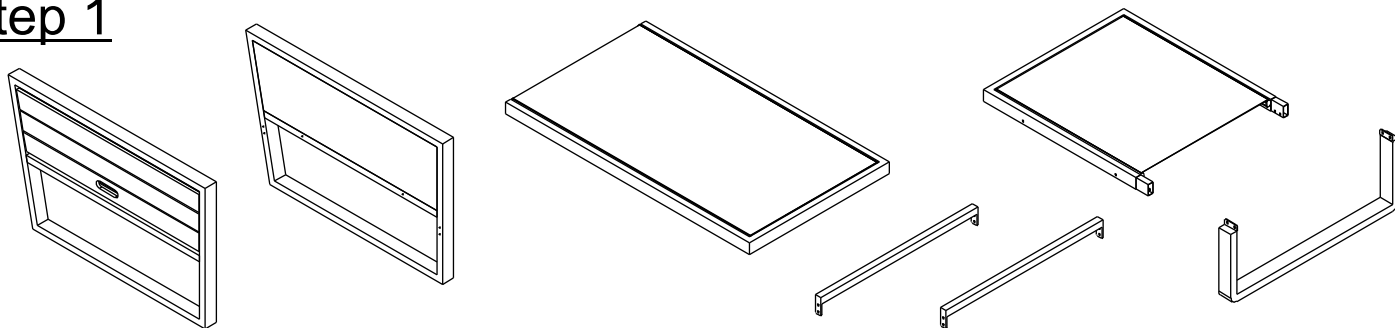
Overview



FRONT FACING

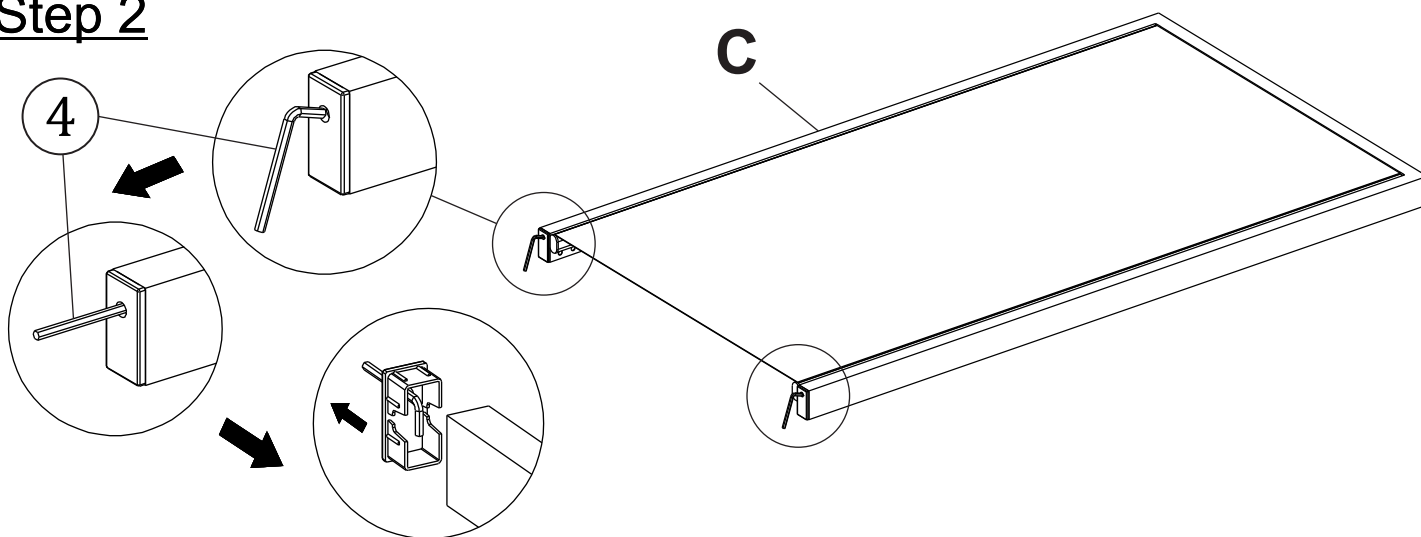
This Chaise Lounger has multiple parts and may require up to 60 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Chaise Lounger parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

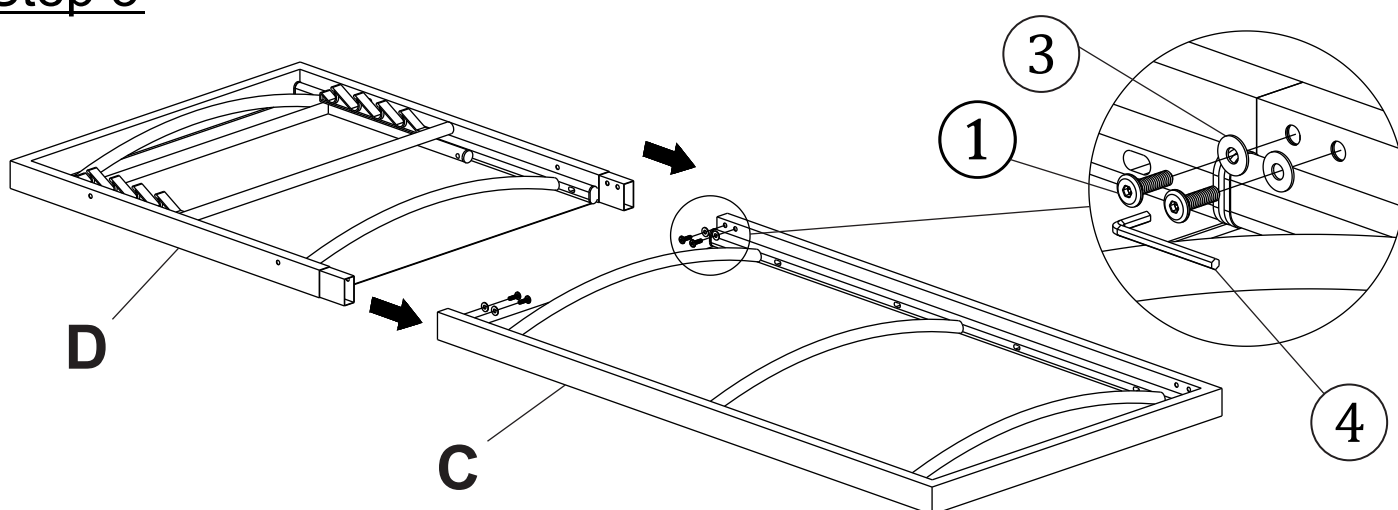
Step 2



Place the Seat Panel (C) upright as show in the picture above onto a clean, soft surface to avoid any scratches or damage to the product.

Remove the Plastic head covers and throw it in the trash from Seat Panel (C) by using the Allen Wrench (④) as shown above.

Step 3

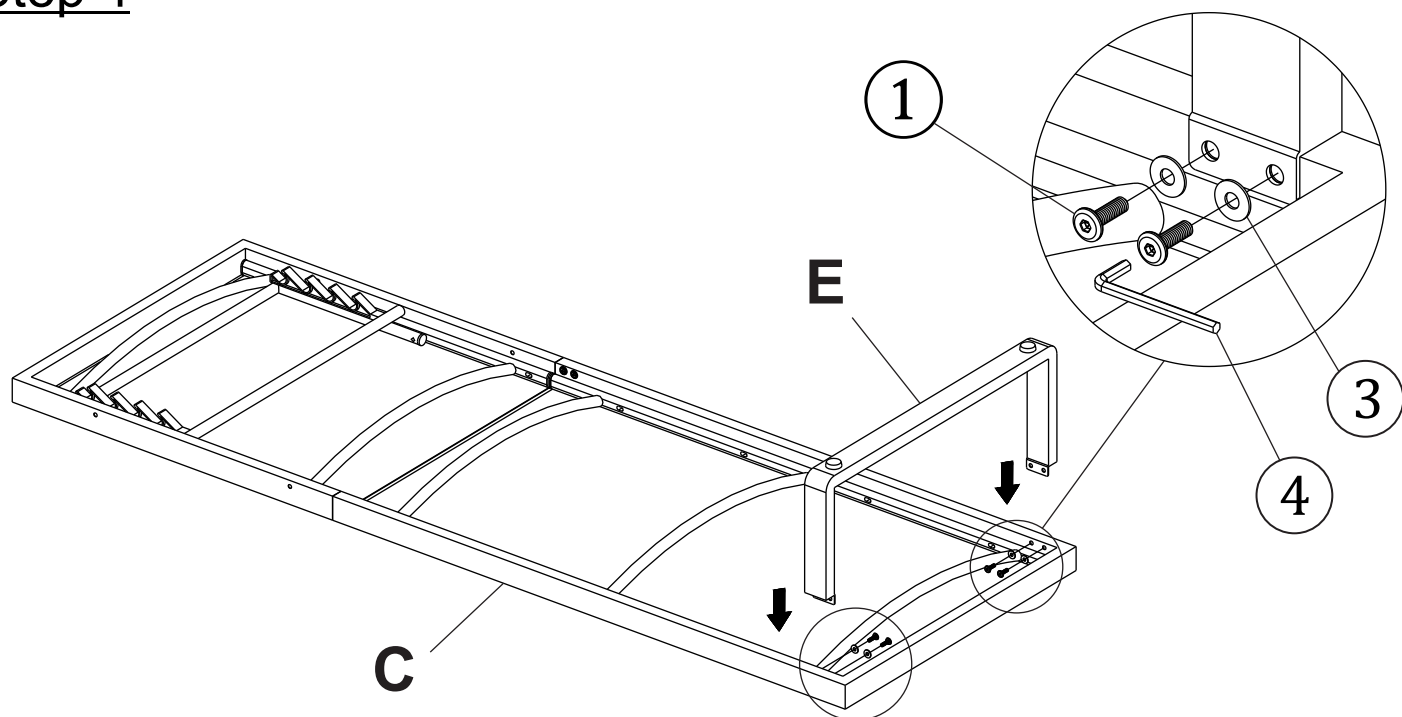


Place the Seat Panel (C), Back Panel (D), upright as show in the picture above onto a clean, soft surface to avoid any scratches or damage to the product.

Attach the Back Panel (D) to Seat Panel (C) by using Bolts (①), Washers (③) and the Allen Wrench (④) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

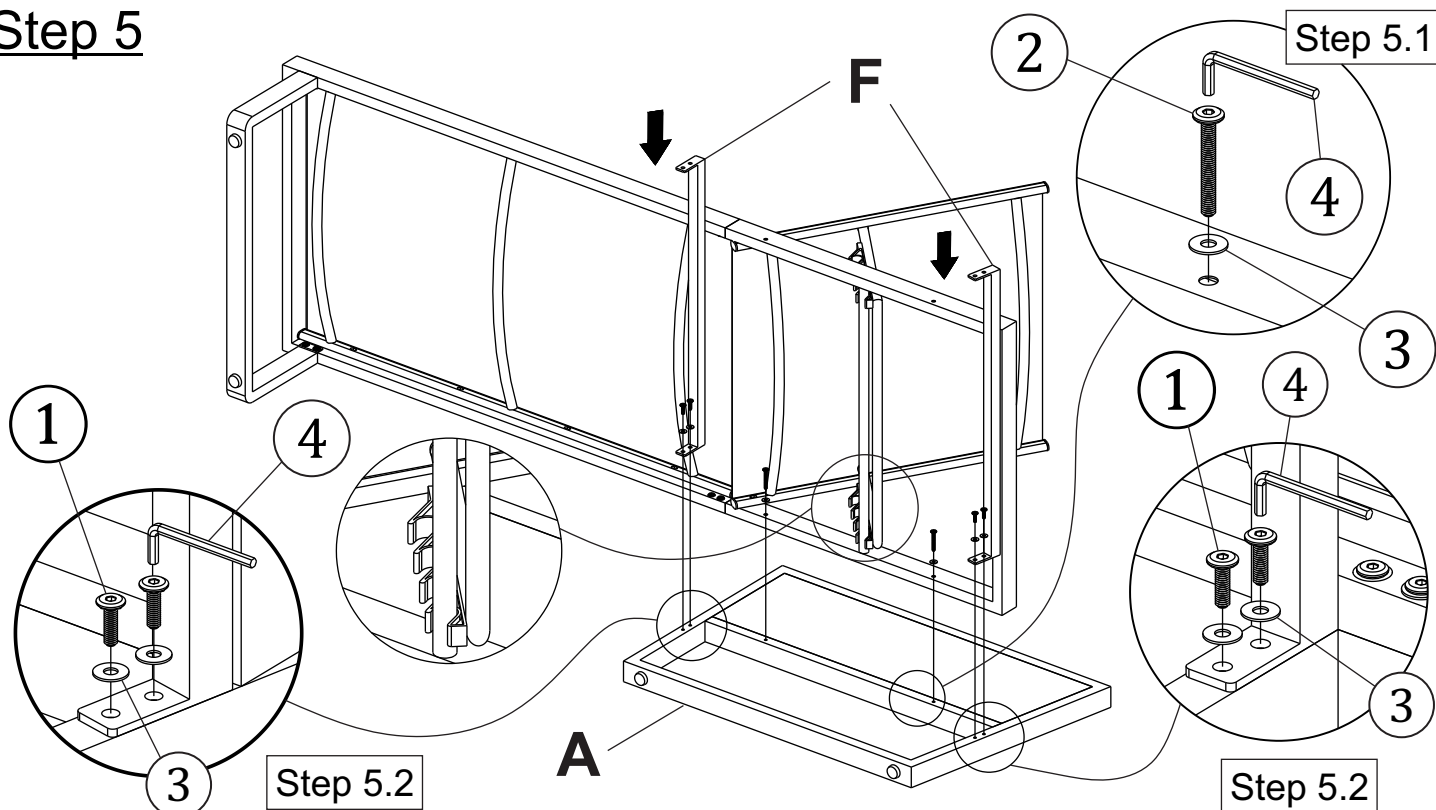
Step 4



Attach the Leg (E) to the assembled parts in step 2 by using Bolts (①), Washers (③) and the Allen Wrench (④) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

Step 5

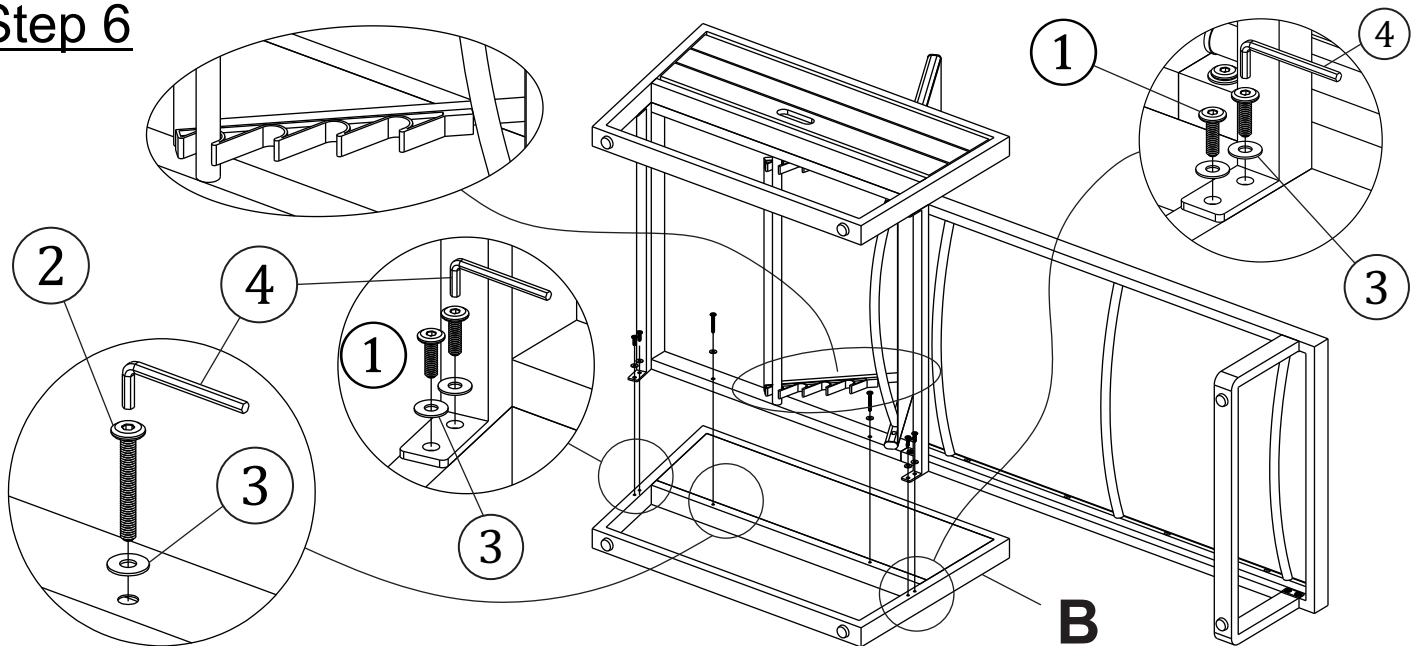


Step 5.1: Attach the Left Arm Panel (A) to the assembled parts in step 4 by using Bolts (②), Washers (③) and the Allen Wrench (④) as shown above.

Step 5.2: Attach the Support Bars (F) to the Left Arm Panel (A) by using Bolts (①), Washers (③) and the Allen Wrench (④) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

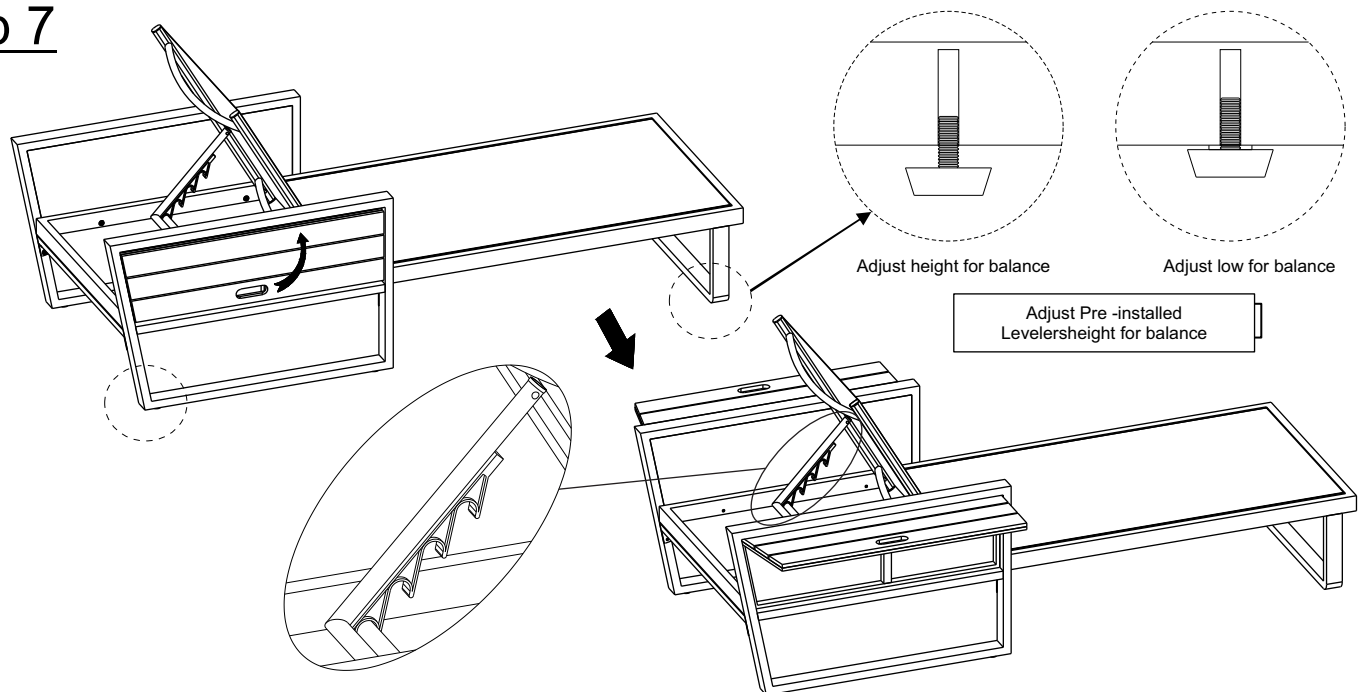
Step 6



With the help from your partner. Attach the Right Arm Panel (B) to the assembled parts in step 5 by using Bolts (①), Bolts (②), Washers (③) and the Allen Wrench (④) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

Step 7



With assistance from your adult partners, turn the Chaise Lounger back to normal flat ground. Place the Chaise Lounger on a **LEVEL** surface. Inspect it and make sure all parts are adequately connected. Check for wobbles on a **LEVEL** surface. If no wobbles are found, proceed to tighten the Bolts and Screws in a sequential manner, until evenly secured. Adjust the Levelers until the Chaise Lounger is level with the ground. To adjust the Levelers, get assistance from an adult partner to lift/lean and hold the Chaise Lounger while you are working.

Your Chaise Lounger is ready for use.
This Chaise Lounger can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm.

These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
